REVISION COURTS.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the Act No. 279, § 58, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has appointed Revision Courts to be holden at the undermentioned places, for the purpose of revising the Electoral Lists which have not been revised within the time appointed by section 45 of the said Act, viz. :—

At KEILOR, on Friday the 31st January instant, for revising the General List for the Keilor division of the Electoral District of West Bourke.

At TALANGATTA, on Saturday the 8th February next, for revising the General List for the Mitta Mitta division of the Electoral District of Benambra.

At BEALIBA, on Thursday the 15th February next, for revising the General Lists for the Cochran's and Mollagul divisions of the Electoral District of Avoca.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of *The Bank Holidays Act 1875*, I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint

THURSDAY THE 30TH JANUARY INSTANT
a special day to be observed as a Bank Half-Holiday at Geelong, from the hour of Twelve noon;

WEDNESDAY THE 5TH OF FEBRUARY NEXT
a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Horsham;

WEDNESDAY THE 12TH OF FEBRUARY NEXT
a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Elmore.

REGISTRATION DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages Statute 1865* (28 Vict. No. 246, sec 5) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, divide the colony of Victoria into districts and assign the said colony and districts to the Registrar-General and Deputy-Registrars respectively, or to so many of them as he might think fit, and might define the limits of such districts, and from time to time revoke, vary, and alter such division and the limits of such districts. And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the sixth day of July One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, the portion of the colony of Victoria comprising the localities therein mentioned was divided into districts which were therein defined; and whereas it is expedient to divide one of such districts therein distinguished by the designation of North Fitzroy: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions and for the purposes of the said Act, do hereby abolish the said District of North Fitzroy, and do divide the limits thereof into two districts, the designations and boundaries of which said districts are hereunder set forth, that is to say :—

FITZROY NORTH REGISTRATION DISTRICT.—Commencing at a point in the centre of Nicholson street in a line with the centre of Johnston street; thence north by a line through the centre of Nicholson street to Parkside street east, Brunswick; thence east by a line through the centre of Parkside street east to the Merri Creek; thence by that creek to opposite the centre of High street in the town of Northcote; thence south-westward by a line passing through the centre of a Government road to the centre of the Heidelberg road; thence by a line passing through the centre of the Heidelberg Main road to Smith street; thence by a line passing through the centre of Smith street to Johnston street; thence west by a line through the centre of Johnston street to the commencing point.

FITZROY SOUTH REGISTRATION DISTRICT.—Commencing at a point in the centre of Victoria parade in a line with the centre of Nicholson street; thence north by a line through the centre of Nicholson street to Johnston street; thence east by a line through the centre of Johnston street to Smith street; thence south by a line through the centre of Smith street to Victoria parade; thence west by a line through the centre of Victoria parade to the commencing point.
