IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of *The Bank Holidays Act 1873*, I the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint

TUESDAY THE 4TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT

INDIA.—MALABAR COAST.—PORT OF ALLEPPEY.—TRAVANCORE.—
RED BUOY MARKING SMOOTH-WATER ANCHORAGE OFF PORCAUD.

THE Port Officer of Alleppey has given notice that the red buoy
marking the smooth-water anchorage off Porcaud has been re-
placed, and will remain until the 1st November. The buoy lies
in 4½ fathoms at low-water spring tides, with the following
bearings: Alleppey lighthouse, N. 6° 30' W.; Porcaud large
banian tree, S. 85° E.

Steamers or sailing vessels purposing to anchor at Porcaud
should keep out until the banian tree and the buoy are nearly in
line, and then run in and anchor to the south-east of the buoy in
about 4 fathoms, soft mud.

Bearings are magnetic. Variation 0° 40' E., in 1879.

The births of 828 children, viz., 426 boys and 402 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of September. In the month of August 771 births were registered, or 57 less than the month under review.

The deaths registered in September numbered 359, viz., 210 of males and 149 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 469. The deaths exceeded those in August by 14, and also exceeded the average of September during the previous ten years by

41. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by only 4.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 72.8° on the 11th, and the lowest was 38.2° on the 21st. The mean temperature of the month (53.4°) was almost a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (30.8°) took place on the 7th, viz., from a maximum of 70.0° to a minimum of 39.2°. The least range (4.3°) was on the 18th, viz., from a maximum of 55.8° to a minimum of 51.5°. The mean daily range was 15.1°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.9 11 inches) was nearly half a degree below the average.

Fifty-eight per cent. of the deaths registered during the month were of males, and 42 per cent. were of females. Thirty-one per cent. were of children who had not attained the age of 5 years, as against 30 per cent. in September 1878; 38 per cent. in September 1877; 28 per cent. in September 1876; 35 per cent. in September 1875; 25 per cent. in September 1874; 36 per cent. in September 1873; 31 per cent. in September 1872; 37 per cent. in September 1871; 32 per cent. in September 1870; and 33 per cent. in September 1869.

The deaths in the month under notice of those who had arrived at the age of 75 years or upwards numbered 14, as against 15 in the preceding month. The following are the particulars:—A laborer, aged 75, died of phthisis; a farmer, aged 76, of bronchitis; a male teacher, aged 76, of paralysis; a botanist, aged 78, and a male cook, aged 81, of heart disease; a clergyman, aged 79, of "calculus in the bladder;" a brassfounder, aged 79, and a woolbroker, aged 82, of brain disease; a gentleman, aged 83, of diarrhoea; a female servant, aged 77, a laborer, aged 78, a female, aged 80, another female, aged 85, and a laborer, aged 88, of old age.

Twenty-two violent deaths occurred during the month, 13 of which are set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 7 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 13, was killed by a fall into the hold of the steamer *Burrabool*; a laborer, aged 38, died of fracture of the skull; a tailor, aged 43, of fracture of the spine; and a hawker, aged 70, of extravasation of blood upon the brain—death in each case being the result of a fall; a butcher, aged 29, died of fracture of the skull, caused by being thrown from a cart; a female child, aged 2, died of convulsions, caused by lime scalds; a female, aged 27, and a house-painter, aged 44, were burnt to death; a female, aged 39, was poisoned with acetic acid, taken in mistake when in a state of delirium tremens; a seaman, aged 30, was drowned by falling off the Williamstown pier; a cowherd and a female, each aged 36, were found drowned; a female infant was accidentally suffocated immediately after birth. The homicidal deaths were those of 2 female infants, the one being strangled as soon as born, and the other when 2 months old. Of the suicidal deaths, a night watchman, aged 29, a laborer, aged 23, and another laborer and an enginedriver, each aged 60, drowned themselves; a female, aged 45, cut her throat; an enginedriver, aged 28, and an ironmonger, aged 29, hanged themselves. The last three cases of suicide were committed by persons of unsound mind.

Seventy-one deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—37 in the Melbourne Hospital, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Industrial Schools, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, and 1 in the Homeopathic Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 112, of which 70, or 62 per cent., were of males, and 42, or 38 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 75 were under one year of age, 15 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 247. Of these, 140, or 60 per cent., were males, and 207, or 40 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 3 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 19 were between twenty and twenty-five, 28 were between twenty-five and thirty, 15 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 18 were between forty-five and fifty, 20 were between fifty and fifty-five, 18 were between fifty-five and sixty, 18 were between sixty and sixty-five, 14 were between sixty-five and seventy, 11 were between seventy and seventy-five, 8 were between seventy-five and eighty, 6 were upwards of eighty, and 1 was unspecified.

Typhoid fever, which caused 20 deaths in June, 13 in July, and 9 in August, caused only 5 deaths in the month under review. The most fatal zymotic diseases in September were whooping-cough and diarrhoea, each of which caused 9 deaths as against 8 deaths from the former and 5 deaths from the latter complaint in August. Phthisis together with hæmoptysis caused 61 deaths in September as against 36 deaths in August, and only 28 deaths in July.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506, §19, 23, 38, and 39), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders amongst other things to unite any two or more municipalities forming one continuous area, and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the date of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition under the respective seals of the Council of the Borough of Steiglitz and of the Council of the Shire of Meredith, praying that such municipalities should be united and constituted a municipality by the name of the "Shire of Meredith," and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act, and no counter petition in opposition thereto has been presented: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth hereby make orders uniting the said area forming the Borough of Steiglitz and the Shire of Meredith, described in such petition, and constituting and describing a shire to be named the "Shire of Meredith" and defining the boundaries of the same in manner following, that is to say:—

MEREDITH SHIRE ADDED TO AND DEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the Yarrowee River where the north boundary of the parish of Carrah abuts thereon; thence north-westerly by the said river to the south boundary of allotment 35 B, parish of Cargerie; thence easterly by that allotment and allotments 34 B and 33 B and north-easterly by a road to the south-west angle of the Cargerie pre-emptive section; thence east by that section and allotment 63 B and north-easterly by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 182 A, parish of Meredith; thence easterly by a road to the Ballarat and Geelong Railway; thence south-easterly by that railway to a point in line with the centre of the road forming the north-west boundary of allotment 109; thence north-easterly by a direct line and that road and easterly by that road to the north-west angle of allotment 80; thence northerly and north-westerly by a road to the south-west angle of the Borhoneyghurk pre-emptive section; thence easterly by that section and allotments 46 and 47 to the Moorabool River; thence northerly by that river to the south boundary of the parish of Ballark; thence easterly by that boundary and the south boundary of the parish of Beremboke to the Little River, and further easterly by a direct line to the north-west angle of allotment 8 of section B in the last-named parish; thence east by the north boundary of that allotment and of allotment 5 to the north-east angle of the latter allotment; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 4; thence east by the north boundary of that allotment to the west boundary of the parish of Balliang; thence south by that boundary to the Little River aforesaid; thence easterly by that river to the west boundary of the parish of Lara; thence south by that boundary to the north boundary of the parish of Yowang; thence west by that boundary and the north boundary of the parish of Darrivill to the Moorabool River aforesaid; thence southerly by that river to the north boundary of the parish of Waddallah; and thence westerly by that boundary and the north boundary and the parishes of Burtwarrah and Carrah aforesaid to the point of commencement, including the borough of Steiglitz.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

MEREDITH SHIRE.—SOUTH RIDING.

Commencing on the shire boundary at the south-west corner of block 1, parish of Durdidwarrah; thence northerly by the Geelong and Steiglitz road to the south end of Regent street in the township of Steiglitz; thence northerly by the said Regent street to New Chum Bridge, crossing Sutherland's Creek; thence westerly by the Steiglitz and Meredith road to the River Moorabool; thence southerly by the said river to the north-east corner of the parish of Coolebarghurk; thence westerly along the northern boundaries of the last-named parish and the parish of Bamganite to Cargerie Creek; thence southerly by Cargerie Creek to the western boundary of the shire; thence south by the west boundary and east by the south boundary of the shire to the commencing point.

BYE-LAWS OF THE VICTORIA RACING CLUB.

WE, FREDERICK CHARLES STANDISH, JAMES BLACKWOOD, CHARLES BROWN FISHER, THOMAS NACHTEN FITZGERALD, ALEXANDER WILLIAM ROBERTSON, WILLIAM LEONARD, and WINFIELD ATTENBOROUGH, constituting an absolute majority in number of the Committee of the Victoria Racing Club, do hereby, in exercise of our powers under The Victoria Racing Club Act 1871, repeal all the bye-laws made and passed by the Committee of the Victoria Racing Club on the 4th day of April A.D. 1872, and, in further exercise of our powers under the said Act, we make the Bye-laws following, that is to say:—

i. The divisions into which the land by the said Act vested in the Chairman of the Committee of the said Club and his successors in office, with the buildings and other erections and fences thereon, is parcelled out, are hereby defined as being—

1. The grand stand, the saddling paddock, and the paddock for members' carriages and horses, called "The members' paddock."
2. The weighing yard and the passage thereto, the stewards' and committee rooms, the stands set apart for the stewards, and committee and the judge's box.
3. The paddock called "The hill."
4. The paddock called "The training ground."
5. All the residue of the said land.

ii. Subject to the provisions of the eleventh of these bye-laws, all members of the Victoria Racing Club shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted at all race and other meetings to the first, third, and fifth of the divisions hereinbefore specified, and with their own horses and carriages (not being licensed horses or vehicles) to the members' paddock.

iii. Subject to the provisions of the said eleventh bye-law, all persons who have duly paid for admission to the grand stand shall, upon production of their tickets be admitted on the days for which their tickets are issued to the first, third, and fifth of the said divisions.

iv. Subject to the provisions of the said eleventh bye-law, all persons who have duly paid for admission to the third of the said divisions shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted thereto on the days for which their tickets are issued, but shall not be permitted to remain therein for a longer period than half an hour after the last race of the day shall have been run.

v. Subject to the provisions of the said eleventh bye-law, all persons who shall have duly paid for admission to the fourth of the said divisions, for the purpose of training or exercising horses shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted thereto with their horses for the period for which such tickets are issued, subject however to such orders as the committee, or the stewards appointed by the committee, may from time to time give, as there may be occasion with reference to such division.

vi. All persons shall be admitted at all race meetings to the fifth of the said divisions free of charge.

vii. No person except the judge, or any person he may call to his assistance, shall enter the judge's box. On breach of this bye-law the person offending shall be liable to the following penalties, that is to say, a penalty of Two pounds for the first offence, and of Five pounds for every subsequent offence.

viii. No person shall enter the weighing stand, the weighing yard, or the approaches thereto except the officers of the club, the jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the owners and trainers of horses desirous to see their jockeys weighed. On breach of this bye-law the person offending shall be liable to the following penalties, that is to say, a penalty of Two pounds for the first offence, and of Five pounds for every subsequent offence.

ix. No person shall enter the stands set apart for the stewards and committee except the officers of the club, and such persons as the committee or the stewards may invite to do so. On breach of this bye-law the person offending shall be liable to the following penalties, that is to say, a penalty of Two pounds for the first offence, and of Five pounds for every subsequent offence.

x. No person shall enter any of the first four of the said divisions of the said land without a ticket duly authorizing him in that behalf. On breach of this bye-law the person offending shall be liable to the following penalties, that is to say, a penalty of Two pounds for the first offence, and of Five pounds for every subsequent offence.

xi. The following persons shall not be admitted into any of the said divisions of the said land:—

1. Any person proved to the satisfaction of the committee or stewards to have been, at any time, guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connection with racing.
2. Any person proved to the satisfaction of the committee or stewards to be a defaulter.
3. Any person declared to be a defaulter by the committee of Tattersall's Club, in Melbourne, Victoria.

On breach of this bye-law the person offending shall be liable to the following penalties, that is to say, a penalty of Two pounds for the first offence, and of Five pounds for every subsequent offence.

xii. Each member of the club, and all persons paying for admission to any of the said first four divisions shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he or she shall upon demand produce, or (if required) surrender to all gatekeepers and other persons having authority from the Club to demand the production or surrender of the same. On breach of this bye-law the person offending shall be liable to the following penalties, that is to say, a penalty of Two pounds for the first offence, and of Five pounds for every subsequent offence.

xiii. Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting the grand stand or any portion thereof, or any booth upon the said land, shall abide by any order given by the committee or stewards in reference to the said land and the buildings and other erections thereon. On breach of this bye-law the person offending shall be liable to the following penalties, that is to say, a penalty of Two pounds for the first offence, and of Five pounds for every subsequent offence.

xiv. No person shall take any dog on the said land, or in any building thereon. On breach of this bye-law the person offending shall be liable to the following penalties, that is to say, a penalty of Two pounds for the first offence, and of Five pounds for every subsequent offence.

xv. No person shall bring on to, or place upon the third division of the land hereinbefore specified (being the paddock called The hill), any box, log, pile, platform, scaffold, erection, or other structure or article, or shall stand thereon or upon any box, log, pile, platform, scaffold, erection, structure, or article in and upon the said land. On breach of this bye-law the person offending shall be liable to the following penalties, that is to say, a penalty of Two pounds for the first offence, and of Five pounds for every subsequent offence.

xvi. Any person committing on the said land, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being hereon, any of the following offences, shall be removed from such land, notwithstanding such person may be a member of the club, or may have purchased and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission.

1. Assaulting any other person.
2. Being drunk.
3. Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course or any part of it during a race meeting, or when the horses are prepared to start, or are running for any race.
4. Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
5. Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
6. Behaving improperly or riotously.
7. Being found in any of the first four of the said divisions, and not producing upon demand, or (if required) not surrendering to any gatekeeper, or other person having authority from the club to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to such division, unless the person so found shall forthwith satisfy the stewards, or one of them, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by him, and that his ticket has been lost.
8. Obtaining admission to any of the first four of the said divisions when disentitled to such admission under these bye-laws.

On breach of the 3rd, 4th, and 7th divisions of this bye-law, or either of them, the person offending shall be liable to the following penalties, that is to say, a penalty of Two pounds for the first offence, and of Five pounds for every subsequent offence.
