THE WESTERN PACIFIC ORDER IN COUNCIL OF 1879, EXTENDING AND AMENDING THE ORDER OF 1877 FOR REGULATING THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

THE Governor has directed the subjoined Order of the Queen in Council, which was brought into effect and operation on the 8th November 1879 by proclamation under the hand and seal of His Excellency the Honorable Arthur Hamilton Gordon, K.C.M.G., the Governor of Fiji, Her Majesty's High Commissioner and Consul-General for the Western Pacific, to be published for general information.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1877 Her WHEREAS by the Western Facine Order in Council of 1817 Her Majesty the Queen was pleased to create and constitute the office of High Commissioner in, over, and for certain islands and places in the Western Pacific Ocean, which islands and places are in the said Order more particularly described, and are therein and in this Order referred to as the Western Pacific Islands, with such powers and jurisdiction as are in the said Order set forth:

And whereas it is expedient to extend and amend in various respects the said Order:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Pacific Islanders Protection Acts 1872 and 1875, and by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts 1843 to 1878, or otherwise, in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Preliminary.

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1879; and the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1877 and this Order may be cited together as the Western Pacific Orders in Council of 1877 and 1879.
- 2. This Order shall be read as if it were part of the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1877 (which Order is herein referred to as the Principal Order).

Successor or Representative of High Commissioner.

- 3. In the event of the death or incapacity of the High Com-3. In the event of the death or incapacity of the High Commissioner, or in any such other event as may be from time to time provided for by Commission under the Sign Manual and Signet of Her Majesty, all the powers and authorities of the High Commissioner shall be transferred to and vested in such person as Her Majesty shall at any time after the making of this Order think fit by such Commission to appoint or designate to succeed temporarily to the office of High Commissioner, and to exercise the powers and authorities thereof, or if there be no person so appointed, then to and in the Chief Justice of Fiji.
- son so appointed, then to and in the Chief Justice of Fiji.

 4.—(1.) Whenever the High Commissioner has occasion to leave his ordinary place of official residence in order to visit any distant places within which he has jurisdiction as High Commissioner, he may, by an instrument under his hand and official seal, appoint a Judicial Commissioner, or some one of Her Majesty's Deputy Commissioners for the Western Pacific, to represent him during his absence; and the person so appointed shall be styled the Assistant High Commissioner, and may, so long as his appointment remains in force, exercise all the powers and authorities No. 117,-DECEMBER 5, 1879.-1.

of the High Commissioner, or so much thereof as is specified in the instrument appointing him.

- (2.) The High Commissioner may revoke any such appointment by a similar instrument; and every such appointment shall cease on the return of the High Commissioner to his ordinary place of official residence.
- (3.) Such appointment shall not affect the right of the High Commissioner to exercise his full power and authority in any place within his jurisdiction.
- 5. In this Order, and in the Principal Order, unless inconsistent with the context, the High Commissioner includes the person for the time being exercising any of the powers and authorities of High Commissioner under the foregoing provisions of this Order.

Proceedings before Deputy Commissioners.

6. All instruments relating to proceedings before a Deputy Commissioner, which under the Principal Order would require to be sealed with the seal of the Court, shall be sufficient without such seal if signed by a Deputy Commissioner.

Regulations by High Commissioner.

- 7.—(1.) The High Commissioner shall, by virtue of this Order, have power and authority to make from time to time in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, by writing under his hand and official seal, such regulations as to him seem fit for the Government of British subjects in the Western Pacific Islands, and for securing the maintenance (as far as regards the conduct of British subjects) of friendly relations between British subjects and, all kings, chiefs, and other authorities in those islands, and persons subject to them.
- (2.) The regulations may define offences against the same; and acts thereby defined to be offences are hereby declared to be offences against the Principal Order; and the Regulations may impose a punishment for any such offence, as follows:—
 - (i.) Imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months, with or without hard labour, and with or without a fine not exceeding ten pounds: or
 - (ii.) A fine alone, not exceeding ten pounds, without any imprisonment; and
- imprisonment; and

 (iii.) In case of a continuing offence, in addition to any such punishment by imprisonment or a fine, or both, as aforesaid, a further fine, not exceeding in any case ten shillings for each day during which the offence continues after the day of the commission of the original offence.

 (3.) The regulations shall be so framed as to allow that less than the highest punishment imposed by the regulations may be adjudged in any case; and the regulations shall not be so framed as to impose a fixed punishment in any case, or to prevent the Court from adjudging in any case as low a punishment as the Court in its discretion may think fit.

 (4.) The regulations shall be affixed and as far as practicable.
- (4.) The regulations shall be affixed, and, as far as practicable, at all times kept exhibited, at each court-house, or at some other public place in each district.

 (5.) Copies of the regulations shall be sold at such price as the High Commissioner directs.

 (6.) The regulations shall, as soon as practicable, be published in the Royal Gazette of Fiji, and be printed separately.

 (7.) The High Commissioner on making regulations shall forthwith report them to the Secretary of State.

 (8.) Every regulation shall, unless approved by the Secretary of State, cease to be in force at the expiration of eighteen months from the making thereof, except as regards things done and rights and liabilities accrued and incurred thereunder before the expiration of that time, and the institution and prosecution thereafter of any proceeding, civil or criminal, in respect of any such thing, right, or liability.

- (9.) The High Commissioner may at any time, in manner aforesaid, revoke or alter any regulation; and the Secretary of State may at any time direct the revocation of any regulation.
- 8.—(1.) The last foregoing Article is hereby substituted for Article 24 of the Principal Order.
- Article 24 of the Principal Order.

 (2.) But all regulations made under Article 24 of the Principal Order, before the commencement of this Order, shall remain in force as if this Order had not been passed, subject to be revoked or altered by the High Commissioner, and so that they shall, unless approved by the Secretary of State before or after the commencement of this Order, cease to be in force at the expiration of twelve months from the commencement of this Order, except as regards things done and rights and liabilities accrued and incurred thereunder before the expiration of that time, and the institution and prosecution thereafter of any proceeding, civil or criminal, in respect of any such thing, right, or liability.

Deportation.

9. Article 26 of the Principal Order shall be read and have effect as if the words "from the Western Pacific Islands" were omitted from the first paragraph thereof.

Extension of judicial power of High Commissioner.

- Extension of judicial power of High Commissioner.

 10.—(1.) Notwithstanding anything in the Principal Order, the High Commissioner may, when at a place distant from his ordinary place of official residence, and in a case being, in his opinion, a case of urgency, and in the absence of a judicial commissioner, exercise so much of the jurisdiction and authority of the Court as is by Articles 27 and 28 of the Principal Order confined to a judicial commissioner.
- (2.) The High Commissioner shall forthwith make a special report to the Secretary of State in every case in which he exercises such jurisdiction and authority, setting forth therein the reasons for his proceedings.
- the reasons for his proceedings.

 (3.) If in any case the sentence passed by the High Commissioner, under the authority of this Article, is a sentence of death, it shall not be executed unless and until the High Commissioner has referred the minutes and notes of evidence in the case to the Chief Justice of Fiji, or if, in the opinion of the High Commissioner, by reason of the remoteness of the place or otherwise, a reference to the Chief Justice would be inconvenient, then to another judicial commissioner, being a barrister of ten years standing, and the Chief Justice or that other judicial commissioner has certified in writing to the High Commissioner his concurrence in the sentence. concurrence in the sentence.
- concurrence in the sentence.

 (4.) In every such case the High Commissioner shall postpone the execution of the sentence pending such reference, and shall commit the person convicted to prison for safe custody, or shall cause him to be detained in custody, and to be removed to any part of the Western Pacific Islands, or to Fiji, and to be there detained in custody pending such reference.

 (5.) Nothing in this article shall affect the right of appeal or the power of the Court to reserve for the judgment of the Supreme Court any question of law or fact arising on a trial.

 (6.) Where there is such an anneal or reservation, a reference
- (6.) Where there is such an appeal or reservation, a reference under this Article to the Chief Justice of Fiji or another judicial commissioner shall not be made.

Confirmation of Sentence.

- 11. Article 47 of the Principal Order shall be read and have effect as if the following two paragraphs were therein substituted for paragraph (2) thereof:—
- (a.) Where a sentence of a Judicial Commissioner is a sentence of death, and where a sentence of a Deputy Commissioner comprises imprisonment for nine months or upwards, or a fine of Twenty-five pounds or upwards, the sentence shall not be executed without the direction of the High Commissioner, by writing under his hand and official seal.
- (b.) In every such case the Court shall postpone the execution of the sentence pending the submission thereof to the High Commissioner, and shall, if necessary, commit the person convicted to prison for safe custody, or shall admit him to bail, and shall take security by recognisance, deposit of money, or otherwise, for his payment of any fine.
- (c.) In case there is, under Article 54 of the Principal Order, an appeal to the Supreme Court, or a reservation for the judgment of the Supreme Court of a question of law or fact arising on the trial, the sentence (if any) of the Supreme Court shall, for the purposes of this Article, be deemed to be the sentence of the Judicial Commissioner, or Deputy Commissioner, before whom the trial was had.

Mitigation or Remission of Punishment; Pardon.

- 12. (1.) The High Commissioner, or the Secretary of State, may, if he thinks fit, mitigate or remit any punishment adjudged by the Court.
- (2.) Nothing in the Principal Order, or this Order, shall be deemed to affect Her Majesty's prerogative of pardon.
- (3.) This Article is hereby substituted for Article 48 of the

Appeal.

13. Article 54 of the Principal Order, relating to appeals to the Supreme Court in criminal cases, and to the reservation for the judgment of the Supreme Court of questions of law or fact arising on criminal brials, shall not apply where the trial is had before the Chief Justice of Fiji as a Judicial Commissioner, if and as long as there is no Judge of the Supreme Court other than the Chief Justice.

Indemnity.

14. Where, after the commencement of the Principal Order, and before the commencement of this Order, any person has been erroneously tried and sentenced to imprisonment, or other punish-

ment, for an offence committed before the commencement of the Principal Order, and the punishment has been discontinued as soon as practicable after the discovery of the error, all persons are hereby indemnified against, and discharged from, all actions, suits, indictments, and proceedings whatever in respect of such trial, sentence, and punishment, and in respect of any act precedent to, or consequent thereon, done in good faith.

Fugitive Offenders.

- 15. (1.) The Fugitive Offenders Act 1843, or so much thereof as is for the time being in force, and any enactment for the time being in force amending or substituted for the same, are hereby extended, with reference to British subjects, to the Western Pacific Islands, with the adaptations following, namely:—
 - (a.) In sections two and six of the Fugitive Offenders Act 1843 the High Commisioner's Court by a Judicial Commissioner shall be deemed to be substituted for a judge of a superior court in a colony:
 - (b.) In sections three, five, six, and seven of that Act the High Commissioner shall be deemed to be substituted for the Governor of a colony.
- (2.) This article is hereby substituted for article 50 of the Principal Order.

Offences out of Jurisdiction.

- 16. The Admiralty Offences Colonial Act 1840, or so much thereof as is for the time being in force, and any enactment for the time being in force amending or substituted for the same, are hereby extended, with reference to British subjects charged with offences, to the Western Pacific Islands, with the adaptation following, namely:
- In the Admiralty Offences Colonial Act 1849, the High Com-issioner shall be deemed to be substituted for the Governor of a colony.
- 17. The Admiralty Offences Colonial Act 1860 is hereby extended to the Western Pacific Islands, with such adaptations and modifications that it will read as follows, namely:

and modifications that it will read as follows, namely:

Where a person, being feloniously stricken, poisoned, or otherwise hurt, in the Western Pacific Islands, dies of such stroke, poisoning, or hurt, on the sea, or out of the Western Pacific Islands, then every offence committed by a British subject in respect of any such case, whether amounting to murder, or to manslaughter, or to the being accessory before the fact of the murder, or after the fact to murder or to manslaughter, may be dealt with, inquired of, tried, determined, and punished, in the Western Pacific Islands in all respects as if such offence had been wholly committed in the Western Pacific Islands.

18. Section eleven of the Merchant Shipping Act 1867 is hereby extended to the Western Pacific Islands, with such adaptations and modifications that it will read as follows,

If, out of the waters mentioned in article 5 of the Principal Order, a British subject commits an offence on board a British ship, or on board a foreign ship to which he does not belong, the High Commissioner's Court, by a Judicial Commissioner, shall have jurisdiction to hear and determine the case, as if the offence had been committed on board a British ship in those waters.

19. Article 31 of the principal order shall be read and have effect as if the following words in the first clause thereof, (that is to say,) "on a charge for an offence committed within the Western Pacific Islands, and not within the jurisdiction of the Admiralty," were omitted therefrom; and article 21 of the Principal Order shall have effect as if the reference in clause 2 thereof to article 31 were omitted therefrom.

Local Criminal Jurisdiction.

20. For the purposes of criminal jurisdiction, every offence and cause of complaint committed or arising in the Western Pacific Islands shall be deemed to have been committed or to have arisen either in the place where the same actually was committed or arose, or in any place in the Western Pacific Islands where the person charged or complained of happens to be at the time of the institution or commencement of the charge or complaint.

Probate and Administration.

- Probate and Administration.

 21.—(1.) Where probate, administration, or confirmation is granted in England, Ireland, or Scotland, and therein, or by a memorandum thereon signed by an officer of the Court granting the same, the testator or intestate is stated to have died domiciled in England, Ireland, or Scotland (as the case may be), and the probate, administration, or confirmation, is produced to, and a copy thereof is deposited with the High Commissioner's Court, the Court, by a Judicial Commissioner, shall write thereon a certificate of that production and deposit; and thereupon not-withstanding anything in the Principal Order, the probate, administration, or confirmation shall, in respect of the personal property in the Western Pacific Islands of the testator or intestate, have the like effect as if he had been resident in the Western Pacific Islands at his death and probate or administration to his personal property there had been granted by the High Commissioner's Court.

 (2.) Any person who, in religance on an instrument purporting
- (2.) Any person who, in reliance on an instrument purporting (2.) Any person who, in reliance on an instrument purporting to be a probate, administration, or confirmation granted in England, Ireland, or Scotland, and to bear such certificate of the High Commissioner's Court as in this Article prescribed, makes or permits any payment or transfer, in good faith, shall be, by virtue of this Order, indemnified and protected in respect thereof, in the Western Pacific Islands, notwithstanding anything affecting the validity of the probate, administration, or confirmation.
- 22. Section fifty-one of the Conveyancing (Scotland) Act, 1874, and any enactment for the time being in force amending or sub-

stituted for the same are hereby extended to the Western Pacific Islands with the adaptation following, namely:—

In that section the High Commissioner's Court by a Judicial Commissioner shall be deemed to be substituted for a Court of Probate in a colony.

Evidence.

- Evidence.

 23. A document purporting to be executed in the presence of any person, or to be attested by a witness or witnesses, whether required by law to be so executed or attested or not, may be proved by any person able to give avidence touching the requisite facts, without the production or evidence of any person in whose presence the document was executed or any attesting witness; but nothing in this Article applies to probate of wills.

 24. Sections seven and eleven of the Evidence Act, 1851, are hereby extended to the Western Pacific Islands.

with the adaptation following, namiely:

Commissioner shall be deemed to be substituted for a

Supreme Court in a colony.

26.—(1.) Any person who by reason of any defect of religious knowledge or belief is incapable of comprehending the nature of an oath, or on whose conscience the Court is satisfied that the taking of an oath would have no binding effect, shall, in any criminal or civil proceeding, instead of taking an oath be permitted to make an affirmation or declaration to the effect that he will in that proceeding tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth.

(2.) Nothing in this article shall prevent any person from being sworn according to the ceremonies of his own religion, or in such manner as he deems binding on his conscience.

(3.) If a British subject, who so affirms, declares, or is sworn, wilfully and corruptly gives false evidence, he shall be guilty of

Ascertainment of Law.

27. The following Acts, namely:

The British Law Ascertainment Act, 1859.
The Foreign Law Ascertainment Act, 1861,
or so much thereof as is for the time being in force, amending or substituted for the same, are hereby extended to the Western Pacific Islands, with the adaptation following, namely:

In those Acts the High Commissioner's Court by a Judicial Commissioner shall be deemed to be substituted for a Superior Court in a colony.

Plaintiff out of jurisdiction of Court.

28.—(1.) Where a person bringing an action, either alone or jointly with another, is out of the Western Pacific Islands, or is only temporarily therein, he shall file in the Court, at or before the commencement of the action, a written statement of a fit place within the district where notices and other papers in the action may be served on him.

(2.) He shall also give security for costs in the action by deposit of such sum not exceeding £50, or by such bond, with or without such surety or sureties, for securing such sum, not exceeding £50, as the Court thinks fit.

(3.) The Court may at any time during an action, either of its own motion or on the application of any defendant, order a plaintiff, being out of the Western Pacific Islands, or only temporarily therein, to give security, or further or better security, for costs, to such amount as aforesaid, and may direct the proceedings in the action to be stayed until the same is given.

Counsel, Solicitors, and Agents.

29. The following paragraph is hereby added to Article 159 of the Principal Order (that is to say):—

the Principal Order (that is to say):—
(5.) Where the counsel, solicitor, attorney, procurator, or agent is not a British subject, he shall, before doing any act or taking any proceeding, obtain, and file in the proper office of the Court, the consent in writing of the competent authority on behalf of his own nation to his submitting himself, and shall submit himself, the purposes of the intended or pending action or proceeding, to the aithority of the Court: and thereupon he shall be subject to the authority of the Court, in all respects as if he were a British subject.

Orders in Shipping cases.

30. Where money ordered by the Court to be paid is due for seamen's wages, or is other money recoverable under the Merchant Shipping Acts or other law relating to ships, and the person ordered to pay is master or owner of a ship, and the money is not paid as ordered, the Court, in addition to other powers for compelling payment, shall have power to direct that the amount unpaid be levied by seizure and sale of that ship.

Form in Probate cases.

31. The following form is hereby added to the Appendix of Forms to the Schedule to the Principal Order (that is to say):— Certificate, to be written on Probate, Administration, or Confirmation, of production thereof, and of deposit of copy.

(General Heading.)

This probate has [or these letters of administration have or this confirmation has] been produced to this Court, and a copy thereof has been deposited with this Court.

Judicial Notice.

32. Judicial notice shall be taken of the Principal Order, and of this Order, and of any Regulations made by, and of any proclamation issued by, the High Commissioner thereunder, and of any Rues made and lists of fees prescribed thereunder, and of all appointments thereunder, and of the signatures of all Commissioners and others acting thereunder, and of all seals used thereunder; and no proof thereof shall be necessary.

Commencement.

33. This Order (except where it is expressed to operate from its making) shall commence and have effect on a day fixed by proclamation, under the band and official seal of the High Commissioner, published in the Royal Gazette of Fiji.

And the Most honorable the Marquess of Salisbury, and the Right Honorable Sir Michael Edward Hicks-Beach, Baronet, two of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

- 1. At any meeting of the corps the senior officer present shall take the chair.
- 2. The commanding officer may at any time convene a special meeting of the corps; and must do so on receiving a requisition signed by not less than twenty members, provided the subject to dealt with be not of a military nature. Such special meeting shall be deemed duly convened by notice being given at parade or company drill, and an advertisement inserted in one or other of the local papers one week previous to such meeting.
- 3. Any member changing his permanent address, and failing to ive notice of the same to the commanding officer, in writing, rithin fourteen days thereof shall be fined Two shillings and
- sixpence.

 4. Any member appearing at parade or company drill with uniform, arms, or accourtements dirty or unserviceable from neglect, or who may at any time wear a portion only of the uniform, may be fined by the officer in command or the captain commanding the sum of Two shillings and sixpence.

 5. Every member of the corps who shall fail to attend muster for parades or drills twice a month shall pay Two shillings and sixpence fine to the corps; if a corporal or sergeant Five shillings; if a commissioned officer Ten shillings; unless such member has not made himself effective for that year or be on leave or medical certificate.
- 6. A list of all fines imposed in any month shall be signed by the commanding officer and posted in the orderly room or other appointed place during the first week in the following month.
- 7. All fines must be paid to the commanding officer within the month in which the list is posted and failing such payment he shall take legal proceedings for the recovery of the same.

 8. An account of all fines imposed and paid shall be kept in a book open to the members at the orderly room on drill days.
- 9. A general meeting of the corps shall be held in the second week of August in each year, at which meeting a detailed statement of the financial position of the corps shall be laid before the members; the meeting to be convened by advertisement, and notice to be given at parade or drill one week previous to such meeting
- notice to be given at parade or drill one week previous to such meeting.

 10. All money arising from fines and other sources other than those of the Government grant shall be paid into a separate account to the credit of the corps, and a balance-sheet of such fines, &c., shall be submitted to the corps at each yearly meeting.

 11. The civil business of the corps shall be managed by a general committee consisting of (12) twelve members of whom not less than five (5) shall be non-commissioned officers, to be chosen at each yearly meeting, candidates to be proposed and seconded; should the number proposed exceed the number required a ballot to be taken. The committee to consider and recommend all candidates for admission to the corps; consider, pass, and recommend to be paid all expenditure of corps funds other than those derived from the Government grant; to take into consideration any matter submitted to them by the officer commanding. The committee to meet monthly, and as often as occasion may require. A secretary shall be elected from the committee to take minutes of all meetings and transact all correspondence connected with the civil business, to convene all meetings of the committee when necessary; no committee meeting shall be deemed convened unless all the members are duly warned. The commanding officer to be ex officio a member of the committee.
- 12. No general, committee, or other meeting of the corps shall be dissolved without a motion having been carried to that effect.
- 13. The name, address, and occupation of any person desirous of joining the corps shall be posted for at least one week in the orderly room; any member objecting to the candidate shall communicate the same to the committee, who shall decide as to
- his admission.

 14. A yearly account shall be kept between the corps and each of its members, wherein the member shall be debited with the liabilities incurred by the corps on his hebalf and credited by the amount earned by him as an effective. Any member desirous of leaving the corps under the provisions of the Act shall be fined the amount (if any) that his debit exceeds his credit, and no member shall receive his discharge until such amount (if any) be paid: Provided always that the amount of such fine shall in no case exceed £3; but the committee may remit such fine, or portion of it, or defer payment of it in their discretion.
- 15. Any member who in any year he may continue in the battery shall fail to render himself effective shall be fined the sum of £2 10s., and failing payment thereof the commanding officer shall take legal proceedings for the recovery of the same: Provided always that if any member shall have been a member of the battery for two years or over and provided that he be not indebted to the battery the committee may in their discretion remit the fine.

Marine Board Act Amendment Act, No. 155 of 1879. PILOTAGE.

PHOTAGE.

By section 31 of the Marine Board Amendment Act, No. 6 of 1873, the master of any ship which had left the coasting or intercolonial trade was bound to pay full pilotage on the return of the vessel to the colony, and for every subsequent voyage until such coasting or intercolonial trade was resumed. That provision, however has been cancelled by section 4 of Act No. 155 of 1879, and the master of any ship registered in the Australian Colonies or New Zealand will, in future, always be exempt from the employment of a pilot at any port or ports for which the Marine Board has granted him an exemption certificate.

STEAM HOISTING ENGINES.

STEAM HOISTING ENGINES.

Part 7 of the Act of 1873 (Sections 34 to 44), which provided for the survey of steam hoisting engines used on the wharves and on board ships, and for the issue of certificates to persons duly qualified to take charge of such engines has also been repealed, and certificates for steam hoisting machines and drivers of the same will, therefore, no longer be issued by the Board.

GUNPOWDER.

The expression "gunpowder," whenever used in the Acts of 1860, 1873, and 1879, will, from a date shortly to be fixed, be deemed to include nitro-glycerine, dynamite, lithofracteur, gun

cotton, blasting powder, fulminate of mercury or other metals, colored fires, and every other substance (whether similar to those above-mentioned or not), used or manufactured with a view to produce a practical effect by explosion or a pyrotechnic effect, as well as fog signals, fireworks, fuzes, rockets, percussion caps, detonators, cartridge, ammunition of all descriptions, and every adaptation or preparation of any of these substances, and also every other material or substance which the Governor may, by proclamation published in the Government Gazette, direct to be included within the meaning of the expression "gunpowder."

We alter the description of this inprovement, and make it as follows:—This invention consists of a novel construction of capsule, applied in a peculiar way in the stoppering of aerated water bottles. It is made of stiff metal (by preference cast), and instead of covering the whole of the mouth, as in ordinary capsules, it sits on the rim, and on an indiaribber washer let into a recess just inside such rim, leaving an orifice as large, or very nearly as large, as the mouth of the bottle or the contents to be poured out. On the outside it reaches just below the shoulder formed by the neck of the bottle, underneath which it is pressed so as to give it a firm arip, and thus enable it to resist the outward pressure of the stopper against the indiarubber washer. In our drawing, a is the stiff metal capsule, b the indiarubber washer, c the recess in the mouth of the bottle, and d the shoulder thereon.

We claim as our improvement in the stoppering of aerated water bottles the capsule a, substantially as herein described and explained.

THE Council of the United Shire of Beechworth doth hereby, The Council of the United Shire of Beechworth doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by "The Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872," make the following rate from the date hereof upon all lands and tenements within the water supply district of Beechworth (that is to say):—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied, otherwise than by measure, for domestic purposes.

On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) and under, Ten shillings per annum.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

The charges for water supplied by measure—except in cases of special agreement with the council—shall be at the rate of Two shillings per thousand gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate if water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

The rates shall be paid in advance, by equal payments on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year. And for water supplied by measure, payments shall be made quarterly on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in each year.

Every person who agrees with the council for a supply of water by measure shall, at his own expense, provide a meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working condition, to the satisfaction of the council, or such officer or servant as the council may appoint; and in the event of any repairs being required, notice in writing shall be immediately given by such person to such officer or servant and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such repairs are effected. The keys of such meters shall be in the custody of the council, or of any officer or servant whom they may appoint.

2. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

3. All service pipes with the necessary stop and bib cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the council may appoint.

4. Any person desiring to affix any service pipe to the main pipe shall make application in writing to the council, or to its officer or servant, three clear days before tapping the main pipe.

4. Any person desiring to affix any service pipe to the main pipe shall make application in writing to the council, or to its officer or servant, three clear days before tapping the main pipe.

5. No pipes, bibs, cocks, or attachments shall be affixed until the same are approved of by the shire engineer, or other officer or servant duly authorized in that behalf, to the main pipe or service pipe.

6. The drawing bit, stop and ball cocks shall be of strong hard brass, sanctioned and approved from time to time by the shire engineer (and unless and until due notification to the contrary) the drawing cocks shall be of the best and most approved kinds, of those called screw-down cocks, high pressure, and in all exposed places to be opened and shut by a movable key or handle, protected by wooden or iron casing, at the discretion of the shire engineer. No other description of cocks shall be used without the written permission of the shire engineer first had and obtained.

7. No pipes shall be affixed to the main pipe, or to any service pipe or apparatus cennected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus without notice, in writing, of such alteration being given to the council, and the consent thereto of the council, or duly authorized in that behalf, shall be allowed to shut off and turn on water in the main pipes of the council, when required for the purpose of affixing service pipes thereto.

9. If any person neglects to repair any service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the council into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer or servant of the council that such service pipe requires repairing, the council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, and if atter the expiration of twelve hours from the time of receiving such notice such person has not repaired such service pipe, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of his continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day

for horses, or for washing carriages, when such horses or carriages are kept for hire, or for the purpose of any trade, manufacture, or business whatever, or for watering gardens, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose.

13. The water supplied shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with the regulations and bye-laws, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations and bye-laws, and not otherwise.

In this subdivision the term "hackney carriage" shall include every wheeled carriage, whatever may be its form or construction, used in standing or plying for hire for a passenger in any street within the prescribed space for the borough, and which shall upon every journey go from or come to any place within the prescribed distance for such borough to or from any other place within such prescribed distance; and the word "owner" shall include every person who, either alone or in partnership with any other person, shall keep or be concerned, otherwise than as a driver or attendant, in the keeping, employing, or letting to hire of any hackney carriage; and the word "conductor" shall include every director or other person, except the driver, who shall attend upon the passengers in any hackney carriage; and the

word "passenger" shall include every person carried by any hackney carriage except one driver and (where there shall be a conductor to such hackney carriage) one conductor.

Council may License Carriages.

3. The council of the borough may, from time to time, license to ply for hire, within the prescribed space for the same, such hackney carriages of any kind adapted for the carriage of persons as such council shall see fit.

4. For every such license there shall be paid to the council granting the same for a hackney carriage the sum of Five shillings.

Any driver of a hackney carriage standing at any of the stands appointed for hackney carriages, or being in any street public or private within the prescribed space for the borough the council of which shall have licensed such carriage, who without reasonable excuse refuses or neglects to drive such carriage to any place within such prescribed space to which he is directed to drive by the person having hired or wishing to hire such carriage, or refuses to drive any such carriage for any time not exceeding three hours if so required by any such person, or who shall not drive the same at a reasonable and proper speed, or when required by the hirer thereof to drive at any slower pace, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

Carrying Others without Consent of Hirer.

15. Every owner or driver of any hackney carriage who permits or suffers any person to be carried in or upon or about such hackney carriage during the hire thereof without the express consent of the person hiring the same shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

Agreement for Excessive Fare not Binding.

Agreement for Excessive Fare not Binding.

16. No agreement made with the owner or driver of any hackney carriage for the payment for the hire thereof of more than the proper sum limited by some regulation in that behalf shall be binding on the person making the same; and every owner or driver of a hackney carriage who exacts or demands for the hire thereof more than such proper sum, whether in pursuance of any such agreement or not, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings; and the adjudicating justice may upon the hearing order in addition that such owner or driver pay to the party aggrieved the amount of such overcharge if paid.

Omission to Fulfil Agreement where Fare stipulated for.

17. No owner or diver of any hackney carriage, having agreed to take any fare for any time, or from or to any place, shall refuse, neglect, or delay to fulfil such agreement; and every owner or driver offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

Driver, &c., of any Hackney Carriage not to carry Persons Misbehaving, &c.

Misbehaving, &c.

18. Every driver or conductor of any hackney carriage who shall knowingly carry or permit to be carried in such carriage any person who so violently, noisily, or indecently conducts himself, or otherwise so misbehaves as to annoy any other passengers, save for such time only as may be necessary to procuring the delivery of such person into proper custody, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

Furious Driving, &c.—Damage to Persons or Property.
Other Offences.

Other Offences.

19. Every driver of a hackney carriage who shall be guilty of wanton or furious driving, or who by carelessness or wilful misbehaviour shall during his employment cause any hurt or damage to any person or property being in any public or private street, or be drunk, or make use of any insulting or abusive language, or be guilty of any insulting gesture or any misbehaviour, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and if the adjudicating justice see fit shall without or in addition to any penalty awarded be imprisoned for a period not exceeding three months.

Compensation for Damage done.

Compensation for Damage done.

20. In every case in which any such hurt or damage as in the last section aforesaid shall have been caused, the justice upon the hearing may also adjudge as and for compensation to any party aggrieved as aforesaid a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and may order the owner of the carriage the driver or conductor of which shall have caused such hurt or damage forthwith to pay such sum with costs; and any sum and costs so paid may be recovered by such owner in a summary way before a justice from the driver or conductor through whose default such sum shall have been paid, or the justice in the first instance may adjudge that such compensation be paid by such driver or conductor to the party aggrieved.

Carriage Lights.

21. The owner of every hackney carriage used in plying for hire or passengers, and of every private vehicle travelling or being driven after sunset and before sunrise, shall cause the same to be provided with proper carriage lights, and the driver or conductor of such carriage shall keep the same properly lighted while such carriage shall be so used; and every owner or driver offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

Lamps inside Hackney Carriages.

22. The owner of every covered hackney carriage shall cause to be placed and kept inside thereof a lamp in such manner and position as shall have been appointed by some regulation

in that behalf, and the conductor, or if there be no conductor the driver of such carriage, shall keep the said lamp properly lighted whenever such carriage shall be used to ply for hire or carry passengers at any time after sunset and before sunrise; and every owner, conductor, or driver offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forte shillings Forty shillings.

Leaving Carriages Unattended.

Leaving Carriages Unattended.

23. If the driver of any hackney carriage shall leave such carriage unattended in any street, whether public or private, or at any place of public resort or entertainment, whether such carriage, if a hackney carriage, be hired or not, any constable may drive away such carriage and deposit the same, with the horses harnessed thereto, at some neighboring place of safe custody, and such driver shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for such offence.

Feeding Horses in Street, &c .- Muzzles.

24. No driver of any hackney carriage in any street, whether public or private, or in any public place, shall feed any horse attached to such carriage, save by means and out of a nose-bag containing the forage and attached to the head of such horse, or shall remove the blinkers of any such horse, and every driver of any such carriage to which any vicious horse shall be attached shall keep such horse whilst standing on any stand or in any such street or place as aforesaid properly muzzled; and every driver oftending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

Compensation where Complaint against Driver, &c., Dismissed, &c.

Compensation where Complaint against Driver, &c., Dismissed, &c.
25. If the driver of any backney carriage be summoned or brought before a justice to answer any complaint or information made or laid by a private person touching or concerning any offence alleged to have been committed by such driver or conductor against the provisions of this Act, or of any regulation made under this Act, and such complaint or information shall afterwards be withdrawn, quashed, or dismissed, or if such driver be acquitted of the offence charged against him, such justice, if he shall think fit, may order the complainant or informant, in addition to any costs awarded, to pay to such driver or conductor such compensation for his loss of time in attending such justice touching or concerning such complaint or information as to such justice may seem reasonable. reasonable.

Lawful Fare how Recovered.

26. If any person without lawful excuser refuse to pay on demand to any owner or driver of any hackney carriage the fare allowed and limited by any regulation in that behalf and due under such regulation, any justice may order payment of the same.

Wiful Injury to Carriage by Passengers.

27. Any passenger in or by any hackney carriage plying under a license granted hereunder who wilfully injures the same shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and shall also pay to the owner of such carriage such reasonable satisfaction for the damage so caused as shall upon the hearing be awarded and ordered by the adjudicating justice.

Regulations.

28. The council of the borough may from time to time make egulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is

regulations for all or any or the purpose to say):—

For regulating the conduct of the owners, drivers, and conductors of hackney carriages plying within the prescribed space in their several employments, and for regulating the days and hours within which they may exercise their calling:

For fixing the rates or fares as well for time as for distance to be paid for hackney carriages by passengers, and the mode in which such rates or fares are to be painted or marked on every such carriage.

(2.) CARTS AND CARTERS.

Prescribed Space for Licensing, &c.

29. The words "prescribed space" shall mean for the borough the space within the circumference of a circle whose radius is five miles from the principal post office of such borough.

Interpretation.

30. The word "cart" shall for the purposes of this sub-30. The word "cart" shall for the purposes of this sub-division include every waggon, dray, van, or other such car-riage, whatever be its construction, drawn by horses or other animals, used wholly or chiefly for the carriage of burthens or heavy goods; the word "woodcart" shall mean a cart used in the hawking of firewood for sale; and the word "nighteart" shall mean a cart used in the carrying or removing of night-soil, offal, or other offensive refuse.

Licenses for Carts.

Licenses for Carts.

31. The council may if they shall see fit from time to time license to ply for hire within the prescribed space for the borough such carts as respectively, after inspection had by the authority of the council, shall be found fit for public use, and also such carts to be employed as nightcarts within the prescribed space as shall after an inspection be found fit for such purposes: and for every such license there shall be paid to the council granting the same the sum of Five shillings.

Application for License.

32. Every such license shall be granted on the written application for the same of the owner, or if there be more owners than one of some one owner of the cart to be licensed; and in every such application shall be set forth truly the name and surname and place of abode of the applicant; and the like shall be set forth in the license when granted; and

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any person who shall wilfully omit from any such application any particular hereby required to be stated therein or shall wilfully state anything falsely touching any such particular, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Numbering, &c., of Licenses and Carts.

33. Every such license shall be numbered so that no two or more licenses granted under this subdivision by the council of the borough shall bear the same number, and shall be registered with such number by the town clerk in a registry book to be kept for the purpose, and shall be in force for one year only from the date hereof, or until the next general licensing day (if any) which shall have been appointed by the council; and the owner named in any such license shall cause to be painted or marked and to be kept so painted or marked on some conspicuous place on the right or off side of the cart thereby licensed the name of the borough the council of which shall have granted such license, with the number of such license, in legible letters and figures one inch in length and of a proportionate breadth, and the words "licensed cart', in the like letters; and every such owner who shall omit or fail to comply with the provisions of this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

34. Every owner or driver of any cart who shall use or employ the same in loading, carrying, removing, or depositing any nightsoil, offal, or other offensive refuse or matter within the borough, save between such hours of the night, or shall deposit the same save at such places as respectively shall have been appointed by some regulation in that behalf, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

Regulations.

39. The council of the borough may from time to time make regulations for all or for any of the purposes following (that is to say):—
