HINDOSTAN.—WEST COAST.—COCHIN.—REPLACING BAR BUOYS AND AN EXTINGUISHING NARRAKEL LIGHT.

The Master Attendant of Madras has notified that the buoys moored to mark the entrance to Cochin Harbor were replaced in position on the 15th instant.

Intimation has also been received that the light at Narakel will be extinguished on the 1st October next.

BAY OF BENGAL.—COAST OF BURMAH.—RANGE OF VISIBILITY OF LIGHT EXHIBITED FROM KRISHNA SHOAL LIGHT-VESSEL.

Information has been received from the Chief Commissioner of British Burmah that, since the small light-vessel *Colombo* has replaced the light-vessel *Star* (moored off the Krishna Shoal, Gulf of Martaban), the light exhibited is reported as being visible barely eight miles in clear weather.

The height of the light above the sea is now 30 feet.

A blue light every half-hour, and a maroon at the intermediate quarter hours, will continue to be exhibited from the light-vessel as heretofore.

CEYLON.—EAST COAST.—BATTICALOA LIGHT.

The Master Attendant, Colombo, has given notice that, in consequence of the encroachment of the sea on the step of the Batticaloa flagstaff, the port light will, on and after the 15th September 1879, be hoisted to an elevation of 35 feet above the sea on a temporary mast placed near the present one, until the flagstaff can be erected on a new site, notice of which will be given.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RE-STOVING AND RE-PACKING OF TOBACCO IN BOND.

THE following Regulations, which have been approved by the Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions of the 9th clause of *The Customs Laws Amendment Act 1874*, 38 Vict. No. 503, are published for general information.

REGULATIONS.

1. The re-stoving and re-packing of tobacco in bond will be allowed upon the following conditions:—
2. Applications to be made in writing, specifying the building in which it is desired that re-stoving or re-packing tobacco in bond shall be carried on.
3. The buildings shall be subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, and must be constructed of stone or brick, and shall be so arranged that there shall be a store for all the tobacco which it is intended to re-stove and re-pack; and also a store wherein the tobacco after re-stoving and re-packing shall be placed, together with any residue. The re-stoving and re-packing house shall be capable of being secured under the locks of the Customs Department, as well as all other places for the storage of tobacco above-mentioned.
4. The proprietor or occupier shall provide, at his own cost, all such locks and weighing-machines as the Collector of Customs may require, and a suitable "Locker's Office," and shall keep the same in good repair.
5. Tobacco may be transferred from any bonded warehouse to the re-stoving and re-packing house, into which it must be weighed, and a correct account kept by the officer in charge.
6. The re-stoved tobacco, when re-packed, must at once be replaced in a bonded warehouse or exported, the residue remaining in the store appointed for the purpose, and none of the residue

shall be removed except it be destroyed to the satisfaction of the Landing Surveyor, or duty paid thereon.

7. The hours for receiving or delivering tobacco or residue shall be the same as in Bonded Warehouses, but the re-stoving and re-packing of tobacco may be carried on at any time at the discretion of the Collector of Customs, subject to payment for the services of an officer at the undermentioned rates, viz:—

From 6 a.m. to 10 p.m.	...	1s. 6d. per hour.

PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED TO THE SHIRE OF MEREDITH.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it was amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the said Act should apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, had been in force, and all or some of the provisions of Part II. aforesaid should also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council should by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council might at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-second day of June One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, Part II. of the said Act was extended to the Borough of Steiglitz: And whereas by another Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, the said Part II. of the said Act was also extended to the Meredith Road District: And whereas the boundaries of the said Borough and Road District were subsequently included within the Shire of Meredith: And whereas it is expedient to extend Part II. aforesaid to the said Shire of Meredith: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the Proclamations aforesaid bearing date respectively the twenty-second day of June One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight and twenty-ninth day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine as relate to the said Borough of Steiglitz and Meredith Road District respectively: and, with the advice aforesaid, I do by this my Proclamation direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above-recited Act, 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the following Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Nine thousand pounds (£9000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies 1879-80. (Division No. 61, No. 1.)

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1880, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. The distribution of the vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to) will be allotted to each society, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, on condition that this sum do not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. Of the whole grant (£9000) a sum not exceeding Eight thousand five hundred pounds (£8500) shall be so divided, and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount, they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. Five hundred pounds shall be paid to the Glendaruel, Beechworth, Clunes, Eglinton, and Glengower Agricultural Society towards the expenses of its Spring Show, held at Clunes on the 23rd and 24th October 1879, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

5. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st of January 1879 and the 31st December 1879, amounts in the total to less than One hundred pounds (£100) shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

INSTRUCTIONS.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration form E for the sums awarded and paid in prizes, and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January 1879 and the 31st December 1879, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account is then to be prepared by making the Government debtor for two-thirds of the amount declared to have been awarded and paid in prizes, if the members' subscriptions and private donations were not less than two-thirds. If the members' subscriptions and private donations were, however, less than two-thirds of the amount awarded and paid in prizes, the amount of the claim must be made equal to the amount of members' subscriptions and private donations.

3. The account must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president, or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Department of Agriculture with the declaration and statement appended.

"It may expedite the payment of the money to fill in at the top of the account the name of the nearest pay office in the space left blank for the purpose. It is also necessary to bear in mind that, if that space be left unfilled, the amount will be payable at Melbourne only. A form of order on the Treasury, deputing another person to draw the amount granted, is appended in case it may be wanted."

4. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith, by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicants, and be of uniform size and pattern.

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the most distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its dependencies &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and might from time to time, after one month's notice should be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation; and the Board of Land and Works might issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee, as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighth day of May One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, a reserve was proclaimed under the designation of the "Enfield Timber Reserve;" And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, in accordance with the provisions of the 33rd section of the above-recited Act, revoke the said proclamation, so far as

POSTAGE STAMPS cannot in any case be received in payment from any place at which Post Office Orders are issued, unless ONE SHILLING EXTRA IN THE POUND IS ADDED, as commission, without which the Post Office will not cash them.

Single copies of the GOVERNMENT GAZETTE will be Sixpence each (if paid in stamps, Sevenpence).
