PROCLAMATION

By His Excéllency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of The Bank Holidays Act 1873, I the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint

SATURDAY THE 27TH OF DECEMBER INSTANT

a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout Victoria.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and in the forty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.


