REGULATIONS UNDER "THE STAMP DUTIES ACT 1879."

THE Governor in Council has cancelled the Order dated 17th December 1879 making certain Regulations under *The Stamp Duties Act 1879*, and has made the subjoined Regulations in lieu thereof, the same to take effect from the 18th December 1879.

WHEREAS by *The Stamp Duties Act 1879*, No. 645, power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make regulations respecting the allowance to be made for spoiled duty stamps, and as to the manner in which the opinion of the Comptroller of Stamps may be obtained as to whether any instrument is chargeable with duty, or as to what duty is chargeable on any instrument: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of such powers, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING ALLOWANCES FOR SPOILED DUTY STAMPS UNDER "THE STAMP DUTIES ACT 1879."

1. All applications for the allowance of spoiled stamps must be lodged at the General Post Office, Melbourne, accompanied by an affidavit duly sworn according to the form A in the Appendix hereto, and a receipt for such stamps will be given by the stamp clerk in the form B in the said Appendix.
2. Every receipt for spoiled stamps must be presented within one calendar month from the date thereof, at the General Post Office, Melbourne, or the stamps left for allowance will be forfeited.
3. If, after examination of such stamps, the application for allowance is granted, either impressed or adhesive stamps (or money in the discretion of the Postmaster-General, subject to the deduction of 2½ per cent.), but not a portion of each, will be issued in exchange to the person entitled thereto to the amount so allowed; and such person will thereupon receive an allowance ticket, in the form C in the Appendix hereto, stating the amount (and whether in stamps or money) which he is entitled to receive; and such allowance ticket must be presented at the office within one calendar month from the date thereof or such allowance ticket will be of no avail.
4. All spoiled stamps (if not allowed) will be marked with the word "Disallowed," and the date when so disallowed, and, together with the parchment or paper on which the same are affixed or impressed, will be returned to the person leaving the same for allowance; but the receipt given at the time of the same being left for allowance must be given up to the stamp clerk.

sequence of _____ and that since the same was so signed no addition or other alteration whatever has been made therein or thereto, but that the same is now in the same state and condition as when the same was so signed, and that the same was *bona fide* prepared and signed for the purpose of carrying into effect the transaction appearing upon the face thereof between the parties, and upon the terms and conditions therein set forth, and that the same was so signed within six calendar months preceding the date hereof, and that no action has been brought or suit commenced in which the instrument could or would have been given or offered in evidence. And with regard to such other of the skins, sheets, or pieces of parchment or paper on which the said stamps are affixed or impressed as are written upon, th deponent sa that the same have been inadvertently and undesignedly spoiled, or have become useless within the six months now last past, and that the writing on any of the said skins, sheets, or pieces of parchment or paper hath not been signed by any party, or otherwise completed as a legal instrument, and hath not had any operation or effect whatsoever. And with regard to the several bills of exchange and promissory notes written on the paper whereon the said stamps are affixed or impressed, the same have been inadvertently obliterated or spoiled, or are unfit for the purpose intended, by reason of a mistake therein (or of their being written on wrong stamps, or are become useless through accidental or unforeseen circumstances), and that, although the said bills of exchange and promissory notes are signed by or on behalf of th deponent [affirmant] as the drawer thereof, the same or any of them have not been delivered out of _____ hands to the payees therein named, or any person on _____ behalf, nor been deposited with any person as a security for the payment of money, nor been in any way negotiated, issued, or put in circulation, nor been made use of in any other manner whatsoever, and that the said bills of exchange have not been accepted by the drawees, or tendered for such acceptance: or and with regard to the several bills of exchange and promissory notes (the duplicates or instruments in lieu of which are now produced and exhibited) written on the paper whereon the said stamps are affixed or impressed, although the said bills of exchange have been signed by or on behalf of the drawer thereof, and have been presented for acceptance, or have been accepted and endorsed, and the said promissory notes have been signed by or on behalf of the drawer, and have been delivered to the payee, the said bills of exchange and promissory notes, and the stamps thereon, are useless, on account of (omission or error); and that such of the said bills and notes as are not dated were signed within the period of six calendar months preceding the date hereof.

The Comptroller of Stamps shall, as soon as conveniently may be after receiving such an application in proper form, proceed to consider the same, and shall return an answer containing a statement of his opinion as to whether the instrument respecting which the application is made is chargeable or not with duty, or as to the amount of duty (and penalty if any) chargeable on such instrument as the case may be.

4. The Comptroller of Stamps, in case any such instrument in respect of which such an application is made shall not in his opinion be chargeable with any duty, cause to be placed thereon a particular stamp denoting that such instrument is not chargeable with any duty, and such instrument shall thereupon be returned to the person making such application: Or in case any such instrument in respect of which such application is made shall in his opinion be chargeable with any duty, or with any duty and penalty, then the Comptroller of Stamps shall, on receipt, within one calendar month of the date of his answer

declaring the same to the person making the application, of a sum of money from such person, equal to the duty, or duty and penalty, chargeable on such instrument, cause to be placed thereon duty stamps to such amount together with a particular stamp denoting that such instrument is duly stamped; and in case one calendar month shall elapse from the date of such answer of the Comptroller of Stamps to the person making such application without the Comptroller of Stamps receiving from such person a sum of money sufficient to pay the duty, or duty and penalty as the case may be, chargeable on such instrument, or in case before the expiration of such period of one calendar month he be requested by the person making the application so to do, the Comptroller of Stamps shall return such instrument unstamped.

5. 7. The several duties and powers imposed and conferred on the Comptroller of Stamps by these Regulations (respecting the manner in which the opinion of the Comptroller of Stamps may be obtained as to whether an instrument is chargeable with duty, or as to what duty is chargeable on any instrument) issued by the Governor in Council, shall, so far only as relates to instruments by law directed to be registered, recorded, enrolled, filed, entered, or otherwise dealt with, in or to have stamps thereon cancelled in the Office of Titles or in the office of the Registrar-General, be performed and exercised by the Registrar of Titles or the Registrar-General, as the case may be.

For the purposes of this provision the said Regulations shall be read and construed as if, so far as relates to instruments so directed to be registered, recorded, enrolled, filed, entered, or otherwise dealt with in the Office of Titles, the words "Registrar of Titles" were substituted for the words "Comptroller of Stamps," and as if, so far as relates to instruments to be registered, recorded, enrolled, filed, entered, or otherwise dealt with in the office of the Registrar-General, the words "Registrar-General" were substituted for the words "Comptroller of Stamps."

DISCOUNT OR COMMISSION ALLOWED ON SALE OF DUTY STAMPS.

WHEREAS by *The Stamp Duties Act 1879*, No. 645, power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to direct upon the sale of duty stamps what discount or commission shall be allowed to the purchasers thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth direct that the rate of discount or commission to be allowed to such purchasers shall be as follows:—

Regulations as to rate of discount or commission to be allowed on sale of Duty Stamps by the Post Office and Telegraph Department.

A discount or commission of Sixpence in the One pound (such discount or commission to be paid in duty stamps) shall be allowed by the Post Office and Telegraph Department to—

(1.) Such managers of banks or banking corporations as may be appointed distributors of duty stamps by the Postmaster-General upon each whole Five pounds and upwards of duty stamps purchased from the Chief Office for Stamps at Melbourne.

(2.) Such persons, corporations, and companies as may be licensed by the Postmaster-General to vend and deal in duty stamps upon each whole Five pounds' worth and upwards of duty stamps purchased by such persons, corporations, or companies from the Chief Office for Stamps at Melbourne.

(3.) Such persons not being distributors of stamps, or persons licensed to vend and deal in duty stamps, upon each whole five pounds' worth and upwards of duty stamps purchased by such persons from the chief office for stamps at Melbourne.

Provided that no discount or commission shall be allowed by the Post Office and Telegraph Department on any fraction of a pound over and above any integral number of pounds' worth of duty stamps.

(2.) *Reported Rock in Prince of Wales Channel.*

Information has been received of the existence of a dangerous sunken rock, said to lie in the western entrance to Prince of Wales Channel, Torres Strait, and nearly in the track recommended.

This rock on which the ship *Canon Harrison* is reported to have grounded on 8th June 1879, when proceeding from Newcastle, N.S.W., to Bombay, has on it a depth of about 16 feet at low-water, and is about 35 yards in circumference, with depths of 6½ and 8 fathoms close to.

From the rock, as stated by Mr. J. R. Haws, Master of the *Canon Harrison*:—Hammond Rock bears N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E.; Ipihi Reef E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.; Goode Island, south-west extreme, S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.; and White Rocks N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.

These bearings place the rock in latitude 10° 32' 35" S., longitude 142° 8' 10" E.

FRANCIS HINXON.

Consulate of the German Empire,
Sydney, 1st December 1879.

Sir,—I have been requested by Captain Mensing, of H.I.M.S. *Albatross*, to bring under your knowledge the following items about the Samoan Group:—

1. Captain Roger Turpie, of the missionary barque *John Williams*, of Sydney, saw on the 13th of May, a.c., about 4 to 5 sea miles off the entrance to Apia, a coral bank, the exact bearings of which could not be ascertained at that time, and the depth of water on which was estimated to about 12 to 15 fathoms.

H.I.M.S. *Albatross* has ascertained the position of this bank as follows:—

Middle of Island of Apolima ...	S. 73° W.
Mount Tofua, on Upolu ...	S. 54° W.
French Missionary building, over Apia ...	S. 70° W.
Land to be seen east near Uafata, upon Upolu ...	S. 63° E.

According to this, the above bank is lying as per the English Admiralty's chart of the Samoan Group, magnetic bearing N. 5/8 E. 4 sea miles from the beach of Apia, in 13° 45' 4" south 171° 43' 1" west.

The depth over it differs between 8, 5, and 12 fathoms. This bank affords a good anchorage for vessels coming from the east and north when sailing to Apia in event of calms, avoiding thus the danger of being driven by the westerly currents on outlying shoals.

2. On the 19th of August, a.c., H.I.M.S. *Albatross* went through the passage between Salomon Point, the east point of Upolu, and the Island Nuntele, situated before it. Soon after having passed the Salomon Point and N.E. Reef Nuntele (bearing on them), a coral reef of 60 feet in diameter with apparently 2 to 3 fathoms water was discovered in the middle of this passage, in about a ship's width distance at low-tide, which shoal is not mentioned in the sea charts, neither is the situation of this known to the white men acting as pilots on the Island of Upolu. Owing to want of time the position of this bank could not be ascertained exactly, the depth is only 1, 5 fathom at low-tide, breaking in rough weather, according to reports of the natives living on the east point of Upolu. This passage is to be considered dangerous, because of this bank, and it would be advisable for large vessels to avoid it.

3. On the cruise of H.I.M.S. *Albatross* in the Samoan water it was found many times that the islands in and near the east portion of Upolu, as well as those between Upolu and Savaii, in relation to position and bearing, are incorrectly placed on the English Admiralty's charts, and therefore untrustworthy for the purpose of taking bearings.

BYE-LAW No. 3.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Echuca, made under sections 213 and 479 of the Local Government Act 1874, regulating the Market Places, Buildings, &c., therein; for fixing the days and hours on which Market shall be held, and other matters pertaining to management, &c., of the Market.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Echuca order as follows:—

1. That the market buildings, yards, sheds, stalls, &c., situated on the Market reserve, allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 17, 18, 19, and 20, section 22, or which may hereafter be erected thereon, shall be open from sunrise to sunset on every day—Sundays, Christmas Days, Good Fridays excepted—for the supply and sale of provisions, that is to say:—Butchers' meat, pork, fish, poultry, rabbits, wildfowl, fresh butter, cheese, eggs, vegetables, fruits, roots, shrubs, plants, bulbs, seeds, hay, straw, grain, green fodder, and all garden and farm produce, with such other articles as the municipal council may allow to be sold in the said market; and it shall not be lawful for any person to expose or offer for sale or to sell in the said market any other article or thing than is herein enumerated or referred to.

2. That it shall be lawful for the said council to let for any period, not exceeding the current municipal year, at such rent as they may affix thereon, any shed, shop, stall, standing, or other convenience within the market, and to relet the same as often as the periods of such lettings shall expire or otherwise be determined; and for the good regulation of the said market each or every lease or arrangement shall contain a clause setting forth the class of articles for the sale of which such shed, shop, or other convenience has been let, and that no other class of articles shall be exposed or offered for sale or be sold in or on the said shed, shop, stall, site, or other convenience, than is named or referred to in the said agreements, except with the consent, in writing, of the said council.

3. That it shall be lawful for the said council, and they are hereby empowered to impose and collect all such rates, rents, tolls, and dues in respect of and on all such articles which are enumerated in Table A in the schedule appended to this bye-law, which may be brought into the said market to be sold therein.

4. That any person wishing his or her name or business affixed to any shed, stall, &c., or to have the shed or stall, &c., enclosed in any particular way, shall apply to the market inspector, in writing, under whose direction the same may, if approved, be done at the cost of the applicant.

5. That any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglect, shall, on conviction thereof, for every such offence or omission, pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds:—

- A. Selling or exposing for sale in the said market any marketable commodity before the times appointed of opening, or after the times appointed for closing such market, or on other days than those named for holding the market.
 - B. Selling or offering for sale in the said market any commodity not named in and allowed by this bye-law to be sold there.
 - C. Refusing or neglecting to pay, on demand being made by the officer appointed by the council to collect the same, any rate, rent, toll, or dues which may be due for any shed, stall, or convenience, or for any article sold or exposed for sale in the market.
 - D. Placing any matter or thing so as to cause an obstruction, and refusing or neglecting to remove the same on being requested to do so by the market inspector.
 - E. Placing or keeping any cart, carriage, barrow, or other vehicle in any part of the said market contrary to the direction of the market inspector.
 - F. Placing any hook, nail, or peg, or otherwise injuring or defacing any part of the market building, or fitting up or enclosing any part of it without the consent or contrary to the directions of the inspector, or refusing or neglecting to remove any hook, nail, peg, or fittings when required to do so by the inspector.
 - G. Sweeping or causing to be swept, or placing any dirt or rubbish into or upon any of the paths, gutters, roads, &c. of the said market, and allowing the same to remain.
 - H. Being in the market in a drunken or disorderly state, or exciting any riot or disturbance, or cursing or swearing, or using any gross, indecent, or abusive language, or being guilty of any gross or indecent conduct therein.
 - I. In any way obstructing the market inspector in the discharge of his duties.
 - J. In any other manner than those specified interfering with the proper regulation and good management of the market.
6. That the Council shall appoint an officer, to be called the Market Inspector, whose duties shall be generally as described in Appendix B.
7. That the said council shall from time to time, as they may see fit, repeal any of the rules and conditions contained in this bye-law, and substitute others for those repealed, or alter and amend all or any of the said rules, conditions, tables, and forms in this bye-law, or in the schedule or appendix attached; and such substitutions, alterations, and emendations shall have the same force and effect as they would have had had they been original.

Appendix B.—Duties of the Market Inspector.

To see that the market regulations, as provided in this bye-law, are duly observed.

To preserve order and regularity in the market, and to cause to be apprehended all persons causing a riot or disturbance or offending against decency, or in any manner or way provoking to a breach of the peace within the precincts of such market.

To inspect all articles exposed for sale in the market and to seize all unwholesome meat or provisions and deal with same as provided by section 459 of Local Government Act 1874. To prohibit the sale of any articles in such market which he may consider noisome or offensive.

To inspect all scales, weights, and measures used in the market, and to seize such as are found fraudulent or defective.

To collect all rates, rents, tolls, and dues connected with the market, according to the table in Schedule A.
