EXHIBITION OF REVOLVING WHITE LIGHT ON CAPE MARIA VAN DIEMEN, NORTH-WESTERN EXTREMITY OF NORTH ISLAND, NEW ZEALAND.

With reference to the preliminary notice issued by this department, dated the 9th day of September 1878, it is hereby notified that on and after Monday the 24th day of March instant, a light will be exhibited from the lighthouse which has been erected on Cape Maria Van Diemen, the position and characteristics of which are as follow:—

The Cape Maria Van Diemen Lighthouse is situated on the small island which lies off the northern end of Cape Maria Van Diemen, at the north-western extremity of the North Island of New Zealand.

The tower is 20 feet in height, built of timber and painted white. The light will be a first order revolving white light, visible all round as far as the land will allow, attaining its greatest brilliancy once every minute.

The light is elevated 330 feet above the sea, and, allowing 15 feet for the height of the eye, will be seen at a distance of about '24\frac{1}{2} nautic miles in clear weather, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

From the lower part of the tower a fixed red light, having an arc of about 30 degrees in azimuth, will be shown in the direction of Columbia Reef.

South Extrance to Moreton Bay.

With the leading beacons in line, there is now not more than II feet at low-water springs on the bar at the south entrance. With the beacons open to the northward about five times their own width, the bar may be crossed with 15 feet at low water, but immediately the outer ridge is crossed, a vessel entering should, to clear a spit extending off the north bank, haul up to the south-westward for the northern shoulder of the high land near Amity Point, until the beacons are not more than one width apart. A course may then be steered up the channel, gradually opening the beacons to the southward as the north break is neared.

WARRNAMBOOL ALBERT PARK AND FLAGSTAFF HILL RECREATION RESERVE.

- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, fences, gates, or erections in the park or reserve, or put offensive matter in the water trough or reservoir.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the park or reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 5. No person shall put in the park or reserve any cattle goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Borough Council.
- No person shall engage in any game or sports in the park or reserve on Sunday.
- 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park or reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Borough Council first obtained.
- 8. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the park or reserve shall enter any plots which may be en-closed within the park or reserve for plantations of young

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of The Land Act 1869, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowns shall not after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS, 1878-9.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the following Regulations in connection with the vote of Twelve thousand pounds (£12,000) for fencing and improving public parks and gardens under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c. (Division No. 59, No. 2):—

- 1. A sum not exceeding One pound shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on the improvement of such park or garden between 1st January 1878 and 81st December 1878 out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 7th April 1879. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.
- 2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the improvement of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the improvement of the same, between the 1st of January and 31st December 1878, but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January 1878.
- 3. The subsidy last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of total expenditure for the year 1878 (vide form A), and the balance, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy, provided that if the claims are in excess of the vote they shall be reduced pro rata.
- 4. In every case in which a claim sent in is deemed unsatisfactory, an officer of the department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure, and if such inspection be refused, the claim shall be disallowed.
- 5. Moneys expended in street planting must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

6. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melhourne, nor to the botanical garden of Geelong.
