EXHIBITION OF REVOLVING WHITE LIGHT ON CAPE MARIA VAN DIEMEN, NORTH-WESTERN EXTREMITY OF NORTH ISLAND, NEW ZEALAND.

WITH reference to the preliminary notice issued by this department, dated the 9th day of September 1878, it is hereby notified that on and after Monday the 24th day of March instant, a light will be exhibited from the lighthouse which has been erected on Cape Maria Van Diemen, the position and characteristics of which are as follow:—

The Cape Maria Van Diemen Lighthouse is situated on the small island which lies off the northern end of Cape Maria Van Diemen, at the north-western extremity of the North Island of New Zealand.

The tower is 20 feet in height, built of timber and painted white. The light will be a first order revolving white light, visible all round as far as the land will allow, attaining its greatest brilliancy once every minute.

The light is elevated 330 feet above the sea, and, allowing 15 feet for the height of the eye, will be seen at a distance of about 24½ nautic miles in clear weather, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

From the lower part of the tower a fixed red light, having an arc of about 30 degrees in azimuth, will be shown in the direction of Columbia Reef.

## SOUTH ENTRANCE TO MORETON BAY.

WITH the leading beacons in line, there is now not more than 11 feet at low-water springs on the bar at the south entrance.

With the beacons open to the northward about five times their own width, the bar may be crossed with 15 feet at low water, but immediately the outer ridge is crossed, a vessel entering should, to clear a spit extending off the north bank, haul up to the south-westward for the northern shoulder of the high land near Amity Point, until the beacons are not more than one width apart. A course may then be steered up the channel, gradually opening the beacons to the southward as the north break is neared.

On the southern portion of the spit referred to, there is not more than 11 feet at low water.

As the channel has begun to change, probably further alterations will take place, necessitating due caution before taking the bar.

## WARRNAMBOOL ALBERT PARK AND FLAGSTAFF HILL RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, the Mayor and Councillors of the Borough of Warrnambool, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the lands at Warrnambool called respectively Albert Park and Flagstaff Hill Recreation Reserve, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned park and reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*:—

### REGULATIONS.

1. The park and reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the park or reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, fences, gates, or erections in the park or reserve, or put offensive matter in the water trough or reservoir.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the park or reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
5. No person shall put in the park or reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Borough Council.
6. No person shall engage in any game or sports in the park or reserve on Sunday.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park or reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Borough Council first obtained.
8. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the park or reserve shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the park or reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

EXTERMINATION OF RABBITS.

THE Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has ordered No. 1 of the Regulations relating to the Extermination of Rabbits on Crown Lands in the Mallee Districts, dated 21st January 1879, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th January last, page 239, to be rescinded, and has made the following Regulation in lieu thereof, viz:—

REGULATION.

The Governor in Council shall, on the recommendation of the Board of Land and Works, allow a remission of rent to the extent of (£1 10s.) One pound and ten shillings for each (£1) One pound, in addition to the amount of rent so remitted, expended in the destruction of rabbits on Crown lands by the licensee, authorized as hereinafter prescribed, of any run in the Mallee Districts.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the following Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Five hundred pounds (£500) granted by Parliament to the Horticultural Societies, 1878-9 (Division No. 59, No. 5):—

1. That each society claiming to participate in the grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 21st April 1879, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.
2. The distribution of the vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to the amount of the prize-money awarded and paid away will be allotted to each society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole Five hundred pounds; and if they do exceed this amount, then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly.
3. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January 1878 and the 31st December 1878 amounts in the total to less than Fifty pounds shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

#### Instructions.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form F, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations between the 1st January 1878 and the 31st December 1878, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account is then to be prepared by making the Government Dr. for the amount declared to have been awarded and paid in prizes.

3. The account must be signed by the treasurer, and be countersigned by the president or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Department of Agriculture, with the declaration and statements appended.

[It may expedite the payment of the money to fill in at the top of the account the name of the nearest pay office in the space left blank for the purpose. It is also necessary to bear in mind that, if that space be not filled up, the account will be payable at Melbourne only. A form of order on the Treasury deputing another person to draw the amount granted is appended in case it may be required.]

4. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize-moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

#### PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS, 1878-9.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the following Regulations in connection with the vote of Twelve thousand pounds (£12,000) for fencing and improving public parks and gardens under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c. (Division No. 59, No. 2):—

1. A sum not exceeding One pound shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on the improvement of such park or garden between 1st January 1878 and 31st December 1878 out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 7th April 1879. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the improvement of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the improvement of the same, between the 1st of January and 31st December 1878, but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January 1878.

3. The subsidy last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of total expenditure for the year 1878 (*vide* form A), and the balance, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy, provided that if the claims are in excess of the vote they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim sent in is deemed unsatisfactory, an officer of the department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure, and if such inspection be refused, the claim shall be disallowed.

5. Moneys expended in street planting must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

6. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, nor to the botanical garden of Geelong.

*Regulations fixing the amount to be paid by persons using or carrying away water from the reserve for Water Supply purposes in the parish of West Charlton, known as "The Rock Tank," and for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve.*

- i. For one hogshead of water taken away in any one day, Sixpence.
- ii. For every hogshead after the first hogshead taken away in any one day, One shilling.
- iii. For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Threepence.
2. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the said reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals without the written authority of the committee of management, or their officer duly appointed.
3. No person shall climb or jump over, or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereon.

Every person offending against these regulations or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. No person shall climb or jump over, or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.

Every person offending against these regulations or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable,

and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
