FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he may think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," now stand prorogued until Friday the fourth day of April next, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Friday the fourth day of April next until Friday the twenty-third day of May now next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and in the forty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

The births of 655 children, viz., 346 boys and 309 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of February. In the month of January 635 births were registered, or 20 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in February numbered 446, viz., 250 of males and 196 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 209. The deaths were less than those in January by 46, but exceeded the average of February during the previous ten years by 10. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of those ten years by 46.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 104.0° on the 6th, and the lowest was 46.9° on the 25th. The mean temperature of the month (66.4°) was nearly a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (46.3°) took place on the 10th, viz., from a maximum of 101.3° to a minimum of 55.0°. The least range (8.1°) was on the 11th, viz., from a maximum of 66.5° to a minimum of 58.4°. The mean daily range was 22.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.839 inches) was a sixteenth of an inch below the average.

Males and females died during the month in the proportions of 56 and 44 per cent. respectively. The mortality of children under 5 years of age was 45 per cent. of the total number of deaths as against 52 per cent. in February 1878, 51 per cent. in February 1877, 53 per cent. in February 1876, 63 per cent. in February 1875, 54 per cent. in February 1874, 53 per cent. in February 1873, 56 per cent. in February 1872, 65 per cent. in February 1871, 55 per cent. in February 1870, and 60 per cent. in February 1869.

Ten deaths of persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month under review, viz.—Those of a gentleman and a laborer, each aged 75, who died of bronchitis and dysentery respectively; a female, aged 75, of fracture of femur; an artist and a laborer, each aged 78, of kidney disease and old age respectively; a gardener, aged 79, who was found in a waterhole; a female, aged 80, of diarrhoea; a soldier, aged 83, of bronchitis; a laborer and a gentleman, aged 82 and 84 respectively, of old age.

Twenty-nine of the deaths registered during the month of February were from external causes; of these twenty-eight are set down as the result of accident, and one as suicidal. The following are the particulars:—A boy, aged 12, died of compound fracture of the thigh, a case having fallen on him; two carters, aged 20 and 24 respectively, were killed, the former through falling from a night cart, and the latter by being thrown out of a cart; another carter, aged 21, succumbed to internal injuries occasioned by a cart passing over him; a wood cutter, aged 29, died of stricture of the larynx, a waggon wheel having passed over him; a boot-salesman, aged 35, was killed, whilst intoxicated, by being struck by a locomotive; a butcher, aged 44, dislocated his neck whilst bathing; three laborers, aged 27, 32, and 52 respectively, died of fracture of the skull, of fracture of the spine, and of dislocation of the neck respectively, the result of a fall in each case; a grazier, aged 55, died of rupture of the spine, his horse having fallen on him; a seaman, aged 65, was killed by a log of wood falling on him; a bricklayer, aged 60, and a female, aged 75, died of fracture of the thigh; a butcher, aged 18, died of tetanus, consequent on compound fracture of the leg; a male child, aged 3, and a female, aged 37, died of accidental burns; a female, aged 40, was burned to death, her clothes having caught fire; a female infant, aged 12 months, a laborer, aged 18, and a squatter, aged 38, died of sunstroke; a groom, aged 50, a money-lender, aged 54, and a gardener, aged 79, were found drowned, the first in the River Yarra and the last in a waterhole; three female infants, two aged 1 month and one aged 4 months, were suffocated in bed; and a female infant died of umbilical hemorrhage at birth. The suicidal death was that of a laborer, aged 56, who strangled himself whilst of unsound mind.

Eighty-four deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—48 in the Melbourne Hospital, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 202, of which 107, or 53 per cent., were of males; and 95, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 150 were under one year of age, 38 were between one and two, 2 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 244. Of these, 143, or 59 per cent., were males, and 101, or 41 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 10 were between fifteen and twenty, 19 were between twenty and twenty-five, 15 were between twenty-five and thirty, 7 were between thirty and thirty-five, 26 were between thirty-five and forty, 29 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 21 were between fifty-five and sixty, 11 were between sixty and sixty-five, 14 were between sixty-five and seventy, 12 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 4 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from scarlatina increased from 1 in January to 9 in the month under review, and those from diarrhoea from 66 to 69, but those from typhoid fever decreased from 19 to 12. Under the heads of Constitutional, Local, and Developmental diseases the deaths in February were not so numerous as in the previous month—the decrease appearing principally in phthisis; diseases of the respiratory system and debility, which caused 59, 46, and 42 deaths respectively in January, as against 43, 36, and 25 in the month under notice.

WHEREAS by the Regulations made in pursuance of *The Diseases in Stock Act 1872* the places or buildings at which stock may be kept in quarantine may be from time to time determined and varied by the Governor in Council, and on the publication in the *Government Gazette* of an Order of the Governor in Council, declaring any place or building a place at which stock may be kept in quarantine, and defining the boundaries of such place or building, such place or building, together with any adjoining land the boundaries whereof are defined by such order and declared to form part of the district hereinafter mentioned, shall become, and until the variation or revocation of such order, continue a quarantine district: And whereas it is expedient to determine and declare the land hereinafter described a place at which stock may be

kept in quarantine: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order determine and declare the land hereinafter described to be a quarantine district for the purposes aforesaid, viz.:—

STOCK QUARANTINE DISTRICT, Point Nepean, county of Mornington, parish of Nepean: Commencing at a point bearing S. 27° 30' E. about seventy-five feet from the Western Flagstaff of the Point Nepean Quarantine Station; bounded thence by a line bearing S. 64° E. nine hundred and twenty feet along the shore of Port Phillip Bay at a distance of about one hundred and fifty feet from high-water mark thereon; thence by a line bearing south five hundred and sixty-three feet; thence by a line bearing N. 87° W. one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five feet; thence by a line bearing west four hundred and fifty-eight feet; thence by a line bearing north eight hundred and thirty-three feet; and thence by a line bearing east one thousand five hundred and ten feet to the point of commencement. The bearings have reference to the magnetic meridian.

And the Honorable Sir Bryan O'Loughlen, Baronet, Her Majesty's Acting Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep up a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives for ever.

3. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery at least eight working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, if not, an extra charge will be made (see Miscellaneous Charges). No free interment will be allowed without the above notice.

4. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick, or other grave, or vault, is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent in writing of such person must be left with the order.

5. No grave to be of less depth than six feet.

6. When giving the order for interment, a form of application for burial containing the name, age, and late place of residence of the deceased, will be provided, and must be filled up where practicable, and entered in the interment book.

7. The time fixed for the funeral to be at the cemetery must be punctually observed.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. The hours fixed for interments will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m., in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months of the year.

10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.

11. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair they may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.

12. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, and registers of all grants will be kept by the Secretary for inspection.

13. Any person wilfully or wantonly destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery will be prosecuted in accordance with the Cemeteries Statute.

14. No funeral will be allowed to take place in the cemetery without a certificate from a duly authorized person, such certificate to be delivered to the person in charge at the cemetery before the funeral enters the gates.

15. The trustees reserve the right to add to and make alterations from time to time in the regulations.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small, will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied, the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender, it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Telegrams will not be entertained.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne. The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses be required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desire it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

7. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so

doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.

9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1879; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
