VICTORIA A CLEAN DISTRICT UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property, rights, and liabilities, and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and that every Order severing any district from any subdivided municipal district might abolish all the subdivisions, and either constitute the municipal district an unsubdivided municipal district or resubdivide the same; in case any such Order did not abolish all the subdivisions, the same should be deemed to cancel every entire subdivision severed, and as regards every subdivision of which a portion only was severed should either cancel such subdivision and annex the residue thereof to some other subdivision or in separate portions to some other subdivisions, or should declare that such residue should thenceforth be deemed such subdivision; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Borough of St. Kilda therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the West Ward of the Borough of St. Kilda the portion of the said ward firstly hereinafter described, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such ward of the said Borough of St. Kilda shall be annexed to the Town of Emerald Hill: And the residue of the said West Ward of the Borough of St. Kilda secondly hereinafter described shall thenceforth be deemed the West Ward of the said borough, that is to say:—

Firstly: *The portion annexed to the Town of Emerald Hill.*—Commencing at a point on the shore of Hobson's Bay where the present boundary-line between the town of Emerald Hill and the borough of St. Kilda abuts thereon; thence north-easterly by the said boundary-line to the centre of the Brighton road; thence south-easterly by a line passing through the centre of that road to the centre of Fitzroy street; thence south-westerly by a line passing through the centre of that street to the shore of Hobson's Bay aforesaid; and thence northerly and north-westerly by that shore, including Kenny's bathing-ship baths, to the point of commencement.

Secondly: *The West Ward of the Borough of St. Kilda.*—Commencing at a point on the shore of Hobson's Bay in line with the centre of Fitzroy street; thence north-easterly by a line passing through the centre of that street to the centre of the Brighton road; thence north-westerly by a line passing through the centre of that road to a point in line with the centre of High street; thence easterly by a line passing through the centre of that street to the centre of Funt road; thence southerly by a line passing through the centre of that

road and the centre of Barkly street to the shore of Port Phillip Bay; and thence north-westerly by the shore of that bay and the shore of Hobson's Bay aforesaid to the point of commencement.

And the Honorable Sir Bryan O'Loghlen, Baronet, Her Majesty's Acting Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The births of 849 children, viz., 417 boys and 432 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March. In the month of February 655 births were registered, or 194 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in March numbered 579, viz., 316 of males and 263 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 270. The deaths were more than those in February by 183, and exceeded the average of March during the previous ten years by 180. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been 72 above the average of those ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 95.2° on the 12th, and the lowest was 42.1° on the 31st. The mean temperature of the month (63.2°) was one-fifth of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (40.5°) took place on the 24th, viz., from a maximum of 93.8° to a minimum of 53.3°. The least range (8.1°) was on the 19th, viz., from a maximum of 62.2° to a minimum of 54.1°. The mean daily range was 22.0°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.946 inches) was below the average.

Fifty-five per cent. of the deaths during the month under review were of males, as against 45 per cent. of females; children under 5 years of age contributed 47 per cent. as against 49 per cent. in March 1878 and 1877, 50 per cent. in March 1876, 58 per cent. in March 1875, 46 per cent. in March 1874, 49 per cent. in March 1873, 55 per cent. in March 1872, 52 per cent. in March 1871, 47 per cent. in March 1870, and 48 per cent. in March 1869.

Twenty-three deaths of persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of an artist, a gentleman, a farmer, and a commission agent, each aged 75, who died of diarrhoea, cancer, ileus, and liver disease respectively; a shepherd, aged 76, of apoplexy; a stonemason, aged 77, of stomach disease; 2 females, each aged 77, of typhoid fever and paralysis respectively; a female, aged 78, of convulsions; a male, aged 79, of fracture of the neck and thigh bone; a female, aged 79, of apoplexy; a man, of occupation unstated, aged 80, of old age; a bootmaker and a female, each aged 81, of cancer and old age respectively; a female, aged 82, of heart disease; a laborer and a tinsmith, each aged 82, a weaver, aged 83, three females, one aged 84, and two aged 85, of old age; a female, aged 86, of apoplexy; and a female, aged 88, of diarrhoea.

Twenty-five deaths from external causes were registered during the month of March, of which twenty are ascribed to accident and five to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 6, and a carter, aged 24, were passed over by vehicles; a laborer, aged 21, a railway porter, aged 22, and a blacksmith, aged 30, were killed by locomotives passing over them; two jockeys, aged 19 and 35 respectively, died of fracture of the skull, having been thrown from their horses whilst engaged in a race; a contractor, aged 52, died of an accidental injury to the spine; a pensioner, aged 68, and a coachsmith, aged 79, died of fracture of the neck and thigh bone; a female child, aged 4, died of scalds; a male infant, aged 10 months, died of sunstroke; a boy, aged 6, was accidentally drowned in the River Yarra; a laborer, aged 34, a farmer, aged 36, a seaman, aged 45, and a male, of occupation unstated, aged 50, were found drowned; and a male and female infant, aged 24 days and 1 year respectively, were suffocated in bed. Of the suicidal deaths:—A house painter, aged 50, cut his throat; a female, aged 27, and a convict, aged 28, poisoned themselves with laudanum and strychnine respectively, the former whilst under the influence of drink; and a female, aged 28, and a clergyman, aged 48, hanged themselves. They are all supposed to have been laboring under temporary insanity.

One hundred deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—56 in the Melbourne Hospital, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Pentridge Stockade, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, 1 in the St. Vincent de Paul's Boys Orphanage, 2 in the Homœopathic Hospital, and 1 in the Industrial Home.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 272, of which 149, or 55 per cent., were of males; and 123, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 213 were under one year of age, 37 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 307. Of these, 167, or 54 per cent., were males, and 140, or 46 per cent., were females; 22 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 28 were between twenty and twenty-five, 23 were between twenty-five and thirty, 23 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 22 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 21 were between fifty-five and sixty, 18 were between sixty and sixty-five, 21 were between sixty-five and seventy, 10 were between seventy and seventy-five, 11 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 12 were upwards of eighty.

Under the first four classes of disease the deaths show a considerable increase on the numbers in the preceding month. The principal diseases which caused this increase were typhoid fever, which resulted fatally in 12 cases in February as against 34 in March; cancer, 8 as against 18; phthisis, 43 as against 62; lung diseases, 36 as against 51; diseases of the digestive organs, 41 as against 60; and atrophy and debility, 25 as against 46. The most fatal disease during the month under review, as also in the previous month, was diarrhoea, which caused 69 deaths in each month. As many as 14 deaths were set down to childbirth and metria during March, or 1 death of a mother to 61 births, which is an unusually high average.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Postmaster-General will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles, and such quantities of those articles, as the Postmaster-General may order from time to time; neither will the Postmaster-General be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will he be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Postmaster-General require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery as a rule is to be of the full quantity ordered.

4. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and for the purposes of these contracts Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Officer in Charge of Stores, General Post Office.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in condition 5, or the head of the department, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer named in condition 5. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must within twenty-four hours after objection is made give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Postmaster-General may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Postmaster-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized.

13. It will be competent either for the contractor on his own behalf, or for the Postmaster-General, to terminate the contract by giving notice in writing of three full calendar months to the opposite party; it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

14. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Postmaster-General or the contractor, as the case may be, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from, or increase of, the price of the item so affected.

15. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Electric Telegraph Service, or by any contracts made by the Imperial Commissariat or the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works, or the Tender Board, or on account of other Governments; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment; or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

1. The services are to be performed upon an order signed either by a Justice or by a Member of the Police Force. Under 31 Victoria No. 310, section 9, cemetery fees are not payable in the cases of paupers buried upon an order signed by a Justice, and in such cases the contractor's account for the burial will be correspondingly reduced.

2. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under seven years of age, to be provided.

3. Coffins to be sufficiently long, deep, and wide for the corpse to lie extended the full length, and to be fastened down with screws. Coffins to be properly lowered into the grave.

4. The graves to be of the proper depth.

5. In the event of the contractor failing to attend punctually to the order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense, if any, incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. When burials are required to take place on Sunday no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the cemetery authorities will be repaid to the contractor.

7. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the contractor gives the order for interment. The contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service, should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed, and that he received the fee for so doing; the receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

8. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

9. In the event of any charge of impropriety or neglect in conducting the funerals being established against the contractor, the Government may for the first offence deduct from the security money, by way of fine, £5; and for the second offence a similar amount, and, in addition thereto, may forthwith cancel the contract.

10. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. The contract will be terminable by three months' notice either from the Secretary to the Tender Board on the part of the Government, or from the contractor; such notice to date from the first day of a month.
