MIDDLE CHANNEL—ENTRANCE TO MORETON BAY.
FURTHER alterations having taken place in the Middle Channel, giving only 13 feet at low-water springs, with the lighthouses in line; vessels requiring a greater depth of water should now, on entering, cross the Fast Banks, with the lights open to the southward, a distance equal to the difference between their heights. When nearing the Venus Bank, they should cross the line of lights and round the spit with the lights open to the northward, a distance equal to half the difference between their heights.

No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property, rights, and liabilities, and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipallities concerned; and that every Order severing any district from any subdivided municipal district might abolish all the subdivisions, and either constitute the municipal district an unsubdivided municipal district or resubdivide the same; in case any such Order did not abolish all the subdivisions, the same should be deemed to cancel every entire subdivision severed, and as regards every subdivision of which a portion only was severed should either cancel such subdivision and annex the residue thereof to some other subdivisions, or should declare that such residue should thenceforth be deemed such subdivision; and every such Order should be published in the Government Gazeite, and should take effect as from the day of such publication; And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Borough of St. Kilda therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Exceutive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the West Ward of the Borough of St. Kilda the portion of the said ward firstly hereinafter described, and Major Smith

The births of 849 children, viz., 417 boys and 432 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March. In the month of February 655 births were registered, or 194 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in March numbered 579, viz., 316 of males and 268 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 270. The deaths were more than those in February by 133, and exceeded the average of March during the previous ten years by 130. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been 72 above the average of those ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 95.2° on the 12th, and the lowest was 421° on the 31st. The mean temperature of the month (63.2°) was one-fifth of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (40.6°) took place on the 24th, viz., from a maximum of 93.8° to a minimum of 53.9°. The least range (81°) was on the 19th, viz., from a maximum of 62° to a minimum of 541°. The mean daily range was 22.0°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.946 inches) was below the average.

Fifty-five per cent. of the deaths during the month under review were of males, as against 45 per cent. of females; children under 5 years of age contributed 47 per cent. as against 49 per cent. in March 1876, 58 per cent. in March 1875, 46 per cent. in March 1874, 49 per cent. in March 1873, 55 per cent. in March 1870, and 48 per cent. in March 1869.

Twenty-five deaths from external causes were registered during the month of March, of which twenty are ascribed to accident and five to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 6, and a carter, aged 24, were passed over by vehicles; a laborer, aged 21, a railway porter, aged 22, and a blacksmith, aged 30, were killed by locomotives passing over them; two jockeys, aged 19 and 35 respectively, died of fracture of the skull, having been thrown from their horses whilst engaged in a race; a contractor, aged 52, died of an accidental injury to the spine; a pensioner, aged 68, and a cacchsmith, aged 79, died of fracture of the neck and thigh bone; a female child, aged 4, died of scalds; a male infant, aged 10 months, died of sunstroke; a boy, aged 6, was accidentally drowned in the River Yarra; a laborer, aged 34, a farmer, aged 36, a seaman, aged 45, and a male, of occupation unstated, aged 50, were found drowned; and a male and iemale infant, aged 24 ays and 1 year respectively, were suffocated in bed. Of the suicidal deaths:—A house painter, aged 50, cut his throat; a female, aged 28, poisoned themselves with laudanum astrychnine respectively, the former whilst under the influence of drink; and a female, aged 28, and a clergyman, aged 48, hanged themselves. They are all supposed to have been laboring under temporary insanity.

One hundred deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—56 in the Melbourne Hospital, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Lying-in, Hospital, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Merbourne Gaol, 2 in the Pentridge Stockade, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, 1 in the St. Vincent de Paul's Boys Orphanage, 2 in the Homocopathic Hospital, and 1 in the Industrial Home.

Under the first four classes of disease the deaths show a considerable increase on the numbers in the preceding month. The principal diseases which caused this increase were typhoid fever, which resulted fatally in 12 cases in February as against 34 in March; caucer, 8 as against 18; phthisis, 43 as against 62; lung diseases, 56 as against 51; diseases of the digestive organs, 41 as against 60; and atrophy and debility, 25 as against 46. The most fatal disease during the month under review, as also in the previous month, was diarrhea, which caused 69 deaths in each month. As many as 14 deaths were set down to childbirth and metria during March, or 1 death of a mother to 61 births, which is an unusually high average.

The contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service, should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed, and that he received the fee for so doing; the receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed.

8. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

9. In the event of any charge of impropriety or neglect in conducting the funerals being established against the contractor, the Government may for the first offence deduct from the security money, by way of fine, £5; and for the second offence a similar amount, and, in addition thereto, may for them contract, the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited.
