NEGLECTED AND CRIMINAL CHILDREN'S ACT 1864.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by *The Neglected and Criminal Children's Act 1864* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to make regulations for the conduct, management, and supervision of Industrial and Reformatory Schools (established for the purposes of the said Act) for the education and correction of the children detained therein: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth by this present Order make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

Any inmate of a male reformatory, above the age of 14 years, guilty of any of the following offences, that is to say:—

1. Assaulting or attempting to assault any inmate or officer.
2. Wilful destruction of property.
3. Immoral conduct.

4. Bad language (second or further offence) shall be liable to be whipped on the bare breach with a birch rod to the extent of not more than 25 strokes for each offence: Provided that no boy shall be so whipped unless by the direction of the Inspector after an investigation into the facts of the case.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862* it is enacted that "whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for the time being in force under the principal Act have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be remeasured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships:"

And whereas by *The Merchant Shipping Act 1876*, it is enacted that when "Her Majesty has power under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, or any Act passed or hereafter to be passed amending the same, to make an Order in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty from time to time to revoke, alter, or add to any Order so made:"

And whereas by an Order in Council dated 29th day of February 1868, Her Majesty, to whom it was made to appear that the said rules for the measurement of the tonnage of merchant ships had been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the King of Denmark, was pleased to direct that the ships of Denmark, the certificates of Danish nationality and registry of which were dated on and after the 1st October 1867, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the said certificates of Danish nationality and registry:

And whereas certain modifications have been recently made in the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships in force in Denmark, whereby, from and after the 1st day of October 1878, the allowance for engine room in certain steam ships will be estimated in a mode differing from that in force in this country:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that it is desirable to alter the said Order in Council, so far as the same applies or relates to the mode of estimating the allowance for engine room in Danish steam ships; Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct, as regards Danish steam ships, that if the owner or master of any merchant ship belonging to the said kingdom of Denmark, and measured after the said 1st day of October 1878, which is propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine room, desires the allowance for engine room in his ship to be estimated under the rules for engine room measurement and allowance applicable to British ships, instead of under the Danish rule, the engine room shall be measured and the allowance calculated according to the British rules.

Notice issued by the Italian Ministry of Agriculture, Industry, and Commerce.

(Communicated to Lord Salisbury by the Italian Ambassador in London.)

(Translation.)

THE Ministry of Agriculture, Industry, and Commerce, considering the opinion expressed at the meeting of November 6 1878, by the Commission appointed to decide upon the competitions instituted by Royal Decree of February 14 1877, in regard to the essays "On the genus *Citrus*" presented to compete for the prize of 3,000 lire, and which were declared not deserving of the prize;

Considering that the reasons still exist for which it was thought very beneficial to encourage a complete study of the physical nature and biology of the *Hesperidæ*, and for which the competition was instituted;

Accepting the vote passed by the above-mentioned Commission,

Decreets:

Article 1. A reward of 3,000 lire shall be assigned to the author of the most complete and best monographic essay on the structure, the vital functions, and the diseases of the acid fruits, or species and varieties of the genus *Citrus* and kindred genera; provided that the said work, by a sufficient collection of original observations and experiments, should succeed in furnishing an important addition to the present knowledge concerning such subjects, and thereby supply a scientific criterion for the improvement of the cultivation of these acid fruits and for the cure of their diseases.

Art. 2. The date for sending in the works competing for the said prize is fixed for the end of May 1881.

Essays by Italians, or by foreigners written in Italian, are admissible to the competition; but if written in another language they must be accompanied by an Italian translation.

The essays sent in for competition are to be sent to the Ministry of Agriculture, Industry, and Commerce, with the superscription: "Competition for the Prizes for the best Essay on the genus *Citrus*," and they must be distinguished by a motto, to be given also on a sealed cover containing the name and address of the author.

Art. 3. The award upon the essays of the competitors will be issued by the Commission appointed in pursuance of the Royal Decree of February 14 1877, No. 3684, within ten months from the close of the competition.

The cover that bears the motto of the essay to which the reward is to be granted will be opened; the covers corresponding with the unsuccessful essays will be burnt unopened.

The copyright of the essays sent in for competition is reserved to the respective authors; but the essay that obtains the reward may be printed, entire or in part, in the "Annals of Agriculture," published by the Ministry of Agriculture, Industry, and Commerce.

The present decree will be registered at the Court of Accounts.

As there are no marks on the adjacent shore by which the position may be fixed, and as it does not show except in heavy weather by breakers, vessels should not approach the coast in the vicinity nearer than four miles, nor bring Point Durnford to bear to the eastward of E.N.E., nor stand into less than ten fathoms. An occasional current has been found setting to the eastward three or four miles from the shore.

Fixed Light at Goapnath Point, Gulf of Cambay.

INFORMATION has been received from the Executive Engineer, Bhaunagar State, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Goapnath Point, at the entrance to the Gulf of Cambay.

The light is a fixed *white* light, elevated 68 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather through an arc of 180°, or between the bearings of S.S.W., through west, to N.N.E. from a distance of 6 miles.

The lighthouse—a buff-colored limestone masonry tower, 32 feet high from base to vane—is situated on a hillock 240 yards inshore from Goapnath Point.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses of the sixth order.

Position: Latitude 21° 11' 35" N., longitude 72° 6' 0" E.
Bearings are magnetic and from seaward. Variation 1° easterly in 1879.

"It being desirable, when light-vessels or other craft are anchored to mark the position of wrecks, that mariners should be able to distinguish them, and to learn on which side of them they should go, notice is hereby given that, with these objects, wreck-marking vessels will in future have their top-sides colored *green*, and will exhibit—

"By day: Three balls on a yard 20 feet above the sea; two placed *vertically* on the side on which navigating vessels may safely pass, and one on the other side.

"By night: Three *white* fixed lights will be shown similarly arranged, but not the ordinary riding light.

"Mariners will thus know, on sighting a wreck-marking craft, that she is so employed; and that they should pass on that side of her on which the two balls or two lights are shown."

MATERIAL FOR COLORING OF REFINED MINERAL OILS.

Act 42 Vict. No. 624, sec. 11.

THE Governor in Council, under the 11th section of *The Duties of Customs Act Amendment Act 1878*, has directed that the following shall be the material to be used for admixture for the coloring of all refined mineral oils which may give off an inflammable vapor at a temperature of less than one hundred degrees of Fahrenheit's thermometer, after being subjected to the test mentioned in the schedule to the above recited Act, by any officer or person duly authorized by the Collector of Customs, and in the proportion hereinafter set forth:—

Alkanet root, in the proportion of not less than 20 grains to each pint, or one ounce to every three gallons of such refined mineral oils.

Such root is to be put into the vessels containing such oils, which shall be delivered by the customs officers with such materials immersed therein.

UNITED SHIRE OF MALDON.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE UNDERMENTIONED COMMONS WITHIN THE UNITED SHIRE OF MALDON, VIZ.:—THE MALDON UNITED TOWN AND GOLDFIELD COMMON, BRADFORD COMMON, KAVENSWOOD COMMON, BARINGHUP WEST FARMERS' COMMON, BARINGHUP EAST, LOADER DOWNS, AND LAANECORIE UNITED FARMERS' COMMON, WALMER FARMERS' COMMON, AND MUCKLEFORD FARMERS' COMMON.

In pursuance of the regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the Council of the United Shire of Maldon, having drafted the following regulations for management of the above-named commons, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such commons.

Regulations.

1. No sheep, entire horse, or bull shall be allowed to depasture or run on the above-named commons without the written consent of the manager of said commons.
2. Persons wishing to depasture cattle on the said commons shall forward to the secretary of the shire council, or other person appointed to receive the same, a statement in writing of the correct brands and description of the cattle they may intend to depasture.
3. All unbranded cattle over six months old found on the said commons will be considered as trespassing and will be dealt with accordingly.
4. All cattle depasturing upon the said commons shall be branded with the distinguishing brand of the said commons, and cattle not so branded will be impounded.
5. Owners of diseased cattle shall immediately on receipt of a written notice, signed by the secretary of the council or other person appointed by the council for the purpose, remove such cattle from off the said commons at their own cost in order that diseased cattle may be kept separate from the herd; and such cattle, after removal, shall, if they require attendance, be looked after and provided for by their owners. The carcasses of cattle dying on the said commons shall be, at their owners' expense, removed, burned, or buried.
6. Fees, as follow, shall be paid half-yearly in advance in each succeeding January and July, viz.:—Large cattle, 4s. per head per annum; small cattle, 2s. per head per annum.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE UNDERMENTIONED COMMONS WITHIN THE SHIRE OF STAWELL, VIZ.:—THE LANDS-BOROUGH COMMON, THE LAKE WILSON COMMON, THE GLEN-ORCHY TOWN COMMON, THE LEDCOURT FARMERS' COMMON, THE WATTA WELLA COMMON, THE KIRKELLA TEMPORARY COMMON, THE MALAKOFF FARMERS' COMMON, THE CALLAWADDA FARMERS' COMMON, AND THE MOKKIPILLY COMMON.

In pursuance of the regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the Council of the shire of Stawell, having drafted the following regulations for management of the above-named commons, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such commons:—

Regulations.

1. The following fees shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of February and the 1st day of August in each year, in respect of all stock to be depastured on any such commons, viz.:—For each head of large cattle, at the rate of 4s. (four shillings) per annum; for each head of small cattle, at the rate of 1s. 4d. (one shilling and fourpence) per annum; progeny of same, not being over six months old, free. No male entire animals shall be depastured on such commons without the written consent of the herdsman.
2. The brands of all licensed stock must be registered with the herdsman, and all sheep must have the common brand affixed prior to depasturing, if required. The owners or persons in charge must, when required, assist in mustering and branding their stock.
3. All stock found upon the common upon which the fees have not been paid, or of which the brands have not been duly registered, or upon which, where required, the common brand has not been affixed, will be deemed trespassing, and the managers will impound such stock or proceed against the owners for trespass.
4. Separate accounts shall be kept for each common. The herdsman is empowered to impound all trespassing stock, and also to proceed at law for trespass against the owners.

5. The managers reserve to themselves the right to issue licenses for any less period than six months, at a proportional amount of the annual rate per head above named.

6. Wherein by these regulations or by the regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on 1st April 1879, any act, matter, or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be deemed to be well and effectively done under the signature of any two of them.

7. Notice of the intended passing of travelling stock across any common must be given to the herdsman or stockman as for the managers.

8. Wherever through the failure of feed on any common, or diminution of its area, or from any other cause, it shall appear to the managers necessary to reduce the number of stock depasturing thereon, the managers reserve to themselves the right to direct the removal of such stock, and returning a proportion of the fees paid thereon equal to the unexpired portion of the time for which the license has to run. After the return of such fees, or the due tender thereof to the licensee, such stock as may have been directed to be removed depasturing thereon will be deemed trespassing.

9. The managers may appoint one or more assistant herdsman for each common, whose duty it shall be to prevent trespass, muster all cattle when necessary, brand all stock when required, eradicate thistles, keep fences in order, and generally to take care of such common; such herdsman to be paid out of the fees received.

10. One clear month before the above-named half-yearly dates of the 1st of February and the 1st of August all persons entitled to depasture stock and desirous of obtaining licenses must send in an application to the managers, who shall direct what licenses shall issue for the then ensuing six months.

Where the claims for licenses are in excess of the grazing capabilities of the common, licenses will issue according to the ratable value of the holdings of the respective applicants.

11. If the managers shall see fit they may set aside a portion of such common for the depasturing of large cattle; and in any such case any small cattle depasturing thereon, although licensed, shall be deemed trespassing, and may be impounded, or the owner proceeded against for trespass.

12. In the event of infectious disease appearing in the stock on a common, the herdsman must see that immediate report is given to the sheep inspector.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

The foregoing regulations were drafted by the Stawell Shire Council on the 4th day of February 1879.

SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE UNDERMENTIONED COMMONS WITHIN THE SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA:—BURRAMINE COMMON, YOWARANG COMMON, BUNDALONG-CUM-PEECHELBA COMMON.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of Chapter XVIII. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council, on the 26th day of May 1873, and of Chapter II. of the regulations made on the 26th September 1873, the Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga, as managers of the above-named commons submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations for the management of the said commons.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers and other persons entitled to commonage, residing within five miles of any one of the said commons, may depasture thereon, subject to these regulations, and upon payment, in advance, of the fees specified in the Schedule hereto annexed, four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle.

A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on any such common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall depasture cattle on any such common who is not the *bona fide* owner of the same.

3. Bulls or entire horses over the age of nine months will not be allowed on the commons, without the written sanction of the managers; and sheep will be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the said commons as may be set apart for that purpose by the managers.

4. The herdsman of the commons shall attend on the seven days immediately preceding the first day of each quarter, at a place to be named, for the purpose of registering cattle and receiving fees; and due notice of such attendance, and the time and place thereof, shall be given by the managers.

5. All persons taking cattle to depasture shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman at the time and place appointed as aforesaid, together with a written statement of the number and brands of such cattle; and the herdsman shall, on receiving the fees payable on such cattle, give a receipt

for the same on behalf of the managers; and shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owner or person in charge, brand such cattle in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar; and such brand shall be renewed whenever necessary, so as to be plainly legible during the whole period that such cattle depasture on the commons.

On presentation of the before-mentioned receipt the managers shall deliver, or cause to be delivered, to the person named therein, a license for the period specified.

6. No cattle registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the commons, unless notice of intention to remove be first given to the herdsman who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the cattle removed.

7. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of any cattle from the commons, save as provided in the next section.

8. The herdsman shall, on any cattle straying or being otherwise removed, without the owner's consent, notify the owner within ten days thereof. And in default of giving notice within that time, should such cattle be lost, the herdsman shall be held responsible for the loss, to be computed at the rate of Two pounds sterling per head for horses and Two pounds sterling for horned cattle, to be deducted from the remuneration payable to the herdsman.

9. The managers may grant to butchers or slaughtermen special licenses to depasture, for such periods of time as may be agreed upon, cattle intended for slaughter, on the following terms, viz.:—Large cattle (not to exceed 15 in number) Sixpence per head per week, to be paid in advance.

And the managers may grant to dairymen special licenses to depasture a number of cattle for dairy purposes, only not exceeding 20 head of large cattle, upon payment at the rate of Four shillings (4s.) per head for each period of three months.

10. The herdsman shall impound all cattle trespassing on the commons, and keep correct accounts of the same, so that the fees arising therefrom may be properly accounted for; and all fees arising from this source shall go to credit of commons account.

11. All fees must be paid quarterly in advance to the herdsman of the commons. Licenses to date from the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in each year.

12. All stock on which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid within ten days after date for renewal of license, will be deemed to be trespassing and may be impounded.

13. All carcasses found on the commons which the owner or owners may refuse or neglect to remove after receiving twenty-four hours' notice in writing from the managers or herdsman, the managers or herdsman shall have power to remove or cause such carcasses to be removed or destroyed by burning, or otherwise, at the expense of such owner or owners.

14. No animal affected with any disease shall be allowed to depasture on the commons, and as soon as the herdsman of the commons shall discover that any cattle registered on the commons is infected with any such disease he shall forthwith give notice thereof to the owner of such cattle and also to the nearest inspector of stock having jurisdiction in the district in which the common is situated, and shall also forthwith give notice to the managers of the commons. It shall be the duty of the herdsman to observe and carry out all the requirements of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria in force for the time being, relating to diseases of animals which are demanded of owners or persons in charge of diseased cattle, so far as such requirements can be held to apply to the commons, or the managers or persons in charge thereof.

15. The herdsman shall conform to any special instructions issued to him by the managers relative to the registration, custody, and delivery to the owners of cattle on the commons, and to the prevention of trespass thereon of cattle (other than travelling cattle) for which commonage fees have not been paid, or which are not allowed to depasture as herein provided.

16. The herdsman shall pay all moneys received by him in respect of depasturing or trespass fees, within ten days after receiving the same, to the treasurer of the shire, who shall then pay the same, to the credit of the managers, into the National Bank, Yarrowonga.

17. The remuneration to be paid to the herdsman out of the commons fund shall be determined by the managers.

18. The herdsman shall, before entering upon his duties, provide a guarantee for the due performance thereof to the satisfaction of the managers to the amount of not less than Twenty pounds.

19. Whenever in these regulations any act or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be considered to be well and truly done if done by any two or more of them duly appointed from time to time to act on their behalf.

Any person who shall infringe any of these regulations shall, on conviction thereof, pay for every such infringement a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and every such penalty may be recovered in a summary way before a court of petty sessions.

Schedule of Fees.

For each head of large cattle, Ten shillings per annum (10s.).
For each head of small cattle, Five shillings per annum (5s.).
Progeny of horned cattle and horses under six months old and running with their mothers, Free.

The foregoing rules and regulations were framed by the Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga this ninth day of April 1879.

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might from time to time, at the request of the council of any shire or borough, alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and might also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the Colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of February One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the town of Ballyshanassy was amongst others defined and proclaimed: And whereas it is expedient to alter the name of such town: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the name of the town of Ballyshanassy which is described in the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned, and do declare that the said town shall henceforth be distinguished by the name of—

BURWOOD.
