**VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.**

**THE** Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint each and every of the persons named in the schedule hereto annexed (being servants or employés of the Board) as its agent for the purpose of severally carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the undermentioned provisions of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, that is to say :—

Under the 128th section of the said statute to seize and detain any person trespassing on any line of State railway, or on any State railway premises, whose name and residence shall be unknown to such agent, and to give such person in charge to a police constable, whose duty it is to bring the offender before a justice, and also to complain to any justice against such offender, and charge him with an offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*.

Also to complain to any justice against any person trespassing on any line of railway or on any railway premises for an offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and to summon such person before a justice and charge him with such offence.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Board of Land and Works.

**ORDER OF THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF MAFFRA, MADE ON THE 4TH DAY OF DECEMBER 1878.**

*Opening of new roads in the parish of Wadelock, county of Tanjil.*  
WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Maffra deem it expedient for the public benefit to make, under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1874*, certain new roads through land in the said parish of Wa-de-lock, belonging to the trustees of the estate of the late John Foster, of Boisdale: And whereas for the purpose of making such roads the said Council have acquired from the said trustees the following area of land, to wit, twenty acres two roods nine perches hereinafter specifically described by metes and bounds: It is ordered and directed that the land so acquired shall be a new road in lieu of the undermentioned old roads hereinafter specifically described by metes and bounds; and that such new roads shall be public highways from the date of the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.

*Description of New Roads.*

1. Road through allotments 15A and 15B, parish of Wa-de-lock aforesaid, viz.: Commencing at a point five hundred and thirty-seven links south of the north-west angle of said allotment 15A; thence N. 64° 34' E. one thousand one hundred and

forty-one links; thence N. 77° 39' E. five hundred and eighty-six links; thence N. 19° 46' E. one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six links; thence north one thousand nine hundred and two links; thence S. 55° 24' E. one hundred and twenty-two links; thence south one thousand eight hundred and fifty links; thence S. 19° 46' W. one thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine links; thence S. 77° 59' W. six hundred and thirty links; thence S. 64° 34' W. one thousand one hundred and seventy-seven links; thence north one hundred and eleven links to the commencing point; and containing an area of five acres two roods seven perches, more or less.

2. Road through Boisdale pre-emptive section, in parish of Wa-de-lock, county of Tanjil aforesaid, viz.: Commencing at the south-west angle of said pre-emptive section; thence N. 52° 50' E. eight thousand and ninety-seven links; thence N. 77° 43' E. two thousand and eleven links; thence north-westerly by the Avon River; thence to the north-eastern angle of a bridge site; thence S. 59° 38' W. five hundred and twenty-three links; thence S. 30° 24' E. nine hundred and seventy-five links; thence S. 77° 43' W. one thousand four hundred and seventy-seven links; thence S. 52° 50' W. eight thousand five hundred and forty-six links; thence S. 1° 4' E. one hundred and twenty-four links to the commencing point; and containing fifteen acres two perches, more or less.

*Description of Old Roads.*

1. Road south of allotments 15A and 16A, in parish of Wa-de-lock aforesaid, viz.: Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 16A; thence west four thousand five hundred and ten links; thence south one hundred links; thence east four thousand five hundred and ten links; thence north one hundred links to the commencing point; and containing an area of four acres two roods two perches, more or less.

2. Road east of allotment 9, parish of Wa-de-lock aforesaid: Commencing at the south-eastern angle of said allotment; thence north two thousand links; thence east one hundred links; thence south two thousand links; thence west one hundred links to the commencing point; and containing an area of two acres, more or less.

## SUNKEN DANGERS BETWEEN ALGUADA REEF AND DIAMOND ISLAND.

NOTICE is hereby given that a recent examination of the approaches to the Bassein River, made by the Superintendent of Marine Surveys, exhibits five separate shoal ridges—on which are rocky patches with from 4 to 13 feet water on them—lying in a N.E. and S.W. direction, between Alguada Reef and Diamond Island, Bassein River entrance.

The least water discovered was on the Hugh Rose Rock, which lies N.N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., distant  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles from Alguada Reef lighthouse. This rock, on which the ship *Inchmarnock* struck in April 1877, has only from 3 to 4 feet water on it at low-water.

Also that the Alguada Reef lighthouse lies S.  $9^{\circ}$  30' W. (true), distant 15 $\frac{1}{2}$  miles from the pagoda on Pagoda Point, and S.W. by W., distant nearly three quarters of a mile from the position at present assigned to it on the charts.

Mariners are cautioned that the passage between Alguada Reef and Diamond Island is absolutely barred, and is most dangerous.

THE following Sailing Directions for Port Campbell are taken from the remarks of Mr. J. W. T. Norgate, Marine Surveyor.

Port Campbell in latitude  $38^{\circ}$  37' S., longitude  $143^{\circ}$  E., lies about midway between Cape Otway and Warrnambool, and its proximity is easily ascertained by Hesse Point to the westward, distance  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles, and a remarkable island 2 cables off shore, distance  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles to the eastward, about 200 feet high, and perpendicular.

Upon approaching Port Campbell from either side the sea will appear to break right across the entrance, but, when the sandy beach becomes well open, a passage will be seen between the breaks, and can with confidence be taken in moderate weather on the fairway marks laid down on chart.

The eastern break is very defined, as it is one continuous break from its outer extreme to the shore, with bold water immediately clear of break on its west side.

Fairway Marks.—The left extreme of East Head (33 feet high) in line with beacon on hummocks N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. leads between the east and west breaks, until the two poles on Napier Bluff are in line N. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., which line keep until the beacon on hummocks shows a little to the westward of mooring buoy, then steer straight for moorings.

Moorings.—There are moorings laid at Port Campbell, viz., two 15-cwt. one-fluked anchors, with 15 fathoms of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch stud chain on each anchor, shackled together to a ring through which is rove 15 fathoms of  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch chain to the mooring buoy.

Vessels making use of these moorings must have a spring out astern to the beach, as there is a reef of 6 feet to the southward which will not allow of vessels swinging. This reef is a great protection to the anchorage, as the sea mostly breaks upon it, making the anchorage comparatively smooth.

Tides are influenced greatly by the winds. The set of the tide is principally south-easterly, or outward across the east break. Mean rise and fall 4 feet.

Jetty.—The proposed site for jetty is on the east side of the bay, and there will be from 12 to 14 feet of water at its outer end at low-water spring tides.

The name of the locality known as "Moonee Ponds" is hereby altered to "KALENG."

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.—PARCELS RATES.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing the Charges for Parcels, Carriages, and Luggage, whether carried or stored at the risk of the owners thereof or of the said Board, that is to say—

1. On and after 1st July 1879 the Rates for Parcels, whether prepaid or to pay, forwarded at the owner's risk, or at the risk of the Board as common carriers, will be according to the rates and conditions here following:—

2. Packed parcels in hampers, crates, bags, cases, or other packages to be charged *quadruple* the above rates, and the onus of proving that parcels are not packed to rest with carriers, consignors, or consignees.

3. Victorian newspapers, in parcels containing *not less than twelve*, sent direct from the publishers or their agents on the day of publication, and press parcels, to be forwarded free at owner's risk. See Clause 11.

4. All stamps affixed to parcels must bear the *signature of the sender* as agreeing to the conditions of carriage, otherwise the stamps will be treated as informal and cancelled, and the parcels will be waybilled at unstamped parcels rates. When two or more parcels are consigned to one person, the above rates are charged on each parcel separately.

PERISHABLES (TO BE PREPAID).

5. Fish, fruit, butter, eggs, milk, dead game or poultry, ice and vegetables, when sent in single packages, to be charged the above rates, stamped or not stamped, as the case may be; but when two or more packages are sent from one consignor to one consignee *4th Class Goods Rates* to be charged if carried at *owner's risk* and consigned on *owner's risk notes* (Form 86 A), and *9d. per ton per mile* if carried at the risk of the carrier. The minimums as per Goods Tariff to be enforced. All perishables carried at either of these rates to be prepaid in cash, and waybilled on the usual Parcels Waybill.

6. Bicycles, feathers, furniture, glass, hats, paper, bonnet or hat boxes, cases of millinery, straw bonnets, mirrors (loose), musical instruments, perambulators, pictures, sewing machines, wickerwork, wire cages (loose), or other articles light or fragile, are considered admeasurement goods, and will be charged 50 per cent. additional on the above rates. Unstamped parcels containing articles and property of a description not mentioned or specified in the first section of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria numbered 78, such articles and property being over £10 in value, shall, in addition to the amount chargeable by the foregoing scale of rates, be charged a further sum equal to one per centum upon the declared value thereof.

7. Returned empties by passenger trains, if prepaid, will be carried according to the following scale, but only provided the station master is satisfied that the packages have been previously sent at parcels rates by passenger trains, and that they are unlocked or open for inspection when brought for carriage, and remain so until they are discharged from the van. If not prepaid, either by stamps or cash, ordinary parcels rates will be charged:—

8. The stamps to be used for the prepayment of parcels freight are in number and value as follows:—

9. The freight stamp should be affixed, as nearly as possible, in the same relative position on the parcel as is the postage stamp on a letter, that is, on the right-hand side and close to the address. Where the package, being such as meat, a bag, a crate, a cage, &c., does not admit of this, the freight stamp should be attached on a separate and secure label.

10. In regard to stamped parcels upon which, when brought to a station to be carried by railway, charges have been already incurred, the Board will not recognise such charges in any way, either by cash payment thereof or by account as "paid on."

11. Newspapers in packages and press parcels must be open at the sides, so that the contents can be ascertained. Packages entirely covered, or covered so that the contents cannot be ascertained, will be carried at the rates for ordinary parcels. Milk cans must be legibly stamped with the name of the station from which they are sent, so as to facilitate the punctual return of empty cans. The labels should be durable, made of wood or metal, and distinctly addressed. "Money parcels," whether stamped or not, must be so addressed, and if over the value of £10 such value must be declared.

12. The Board will not be common carriers of live poultry, nor are they to be received if tied by the legs; they must be in coops, cases, or crates.

13. The rates for perishables do not include loading or unloading, in which the servants of the senders and consignees must assist if required. These rates are strictly conditional that the regulations in reference thereto are complied with; in default thereof, the rates for ordinary parcels will be charged.

14. All parcels, whether stamped or not, must be brought to the station at least fifteen minutes before the time fixed for the departure of the train they are to be sent by.

15. The delivery of stamped parcels after they have been carried by railway may be made, irrespective of the ownership thereof, to the person who, from his description of the parcel or other evidence, appears to represent the owner or his agent, or to any licensed carrier.

16. Every care will be taken for the delivery of parcels stamped, but without responsibility, as per conditions set forth on the stamps, as the rates in clause 1 are strictly conditional that stamped parcels to whomsoever delivered are solely at the risk of the owner.

17. A receipt will be given, if demanded, for parcels not stamped carried at the rates provided by clause 1, and for perishables carried at goods rates.

18. Although no receipt will be given or liability undertaken for stamped parcels, yet for the convenience of the public the parcels clerk will, if required to do so, mark the merchants' delivery-book, provided the stamped parcels are correctly described therein.

19. Each stamped parcel must be securely covered and addressed to its destination irrespective of the writing upon the freight stamp. Separate parcels which are merely tied together must each be stamped. Returned empties, if securely tied together, may be prepaid by one or more stamps of the required value on the outside package.

20. When the freight stamps affixed are not of full value for the weight or distance, and the sender omits or refuses to affix the additional stamps necessary, the stamp will be cancelled and the parcel forwarded at unstamped parcels rates.

21. Freight stamps will be sold at all stations, and also by licensed vendors.

22. The parcels clerk on receiving a stamped parcel for carriage will mark the freight stamp thereon with the name of the station. This mark is to be made on the right-hand side of the freight stamp. The receiving station will also mark the stamp on the left-hand side of the freight stamp.

23. Nothing in these regulations affects the rate for gold, live stock, wool, dangerous goods, horses, dogs, and the exceptions provided by the Act of Parliament of Victoria numbered 78.

24. Unstamped parcels containing any of the articles mentioned in the first section of the Act of Parliament of Victoria numbered 78 shall be charged the following increased rates, namely:—Over £10 and under £50 in value, double, and over £50 in value, quadruple unstamped parcels rates, as shown above.

25. Nothing in these rates affects the parcels rates now in force on the Williamstown and Essendon lines.

26. Corpses, under 40 miles, 20s. each; above 40 miles, 6d. per mile. Corpses will not be forwarded unless a certificate is produced from the medical attendant at time of decease setting forth that death was not caused by any contagious or infectious disease.

CARRIAGE RATES.

27. Carriages, gigs, dog carts, and vehicles of a similar description, will be charged for at the rate of 6d. per mile, subject, however, that the sum of £1 shall be the minimum charge in any case. Two vehicles belonging to the same owner, and loaded on one truck, 9d. per truck per mile, if owner accepts all risks. Three vehicles on same terms, 1s. per truck per mile; minimum, Twenty shillings. For vehicles sent for repair, return tickets available for four weeks will be issued at 50 per cent. additional on these rates.

LUGGAGE.

28. First-class passengers are allowed to carry 84 lbs., second-class passengers 56 lbs., free of charge, the same to consist of *wearing apparel only*, and to be contained in a bag, carpet bag, trunk, box, portmanteau, or valise, or any other package commonly used for its carriage (if in chests of drawers, cases, or other packages which usually contain merchandise, they will be charged as parcels). All excess above that weight will be charged at the undermentioned "Excess Luggage" Rates. Passengers having luggage must deliver it to the station porter fifteen minutes before the starting of the train, so as to give sufficient time to have it weighed (if in excess), checked, and stowed. No luggage will be allowed to be placed in the carriages unless of such size that it can be placed under or over the seat without inconvenience to other passengers; but the Department does not hold itself liable for the loss of luggage, whether free or at excess rates, unless the regulations for the carriage of the same exhibited at all stations have been complied with.

Passengers must have their names, and the station to which they are proceeding, distinctly marked on their luggage, and satisfy themselves that it is placed on the trains. The Department will not hold itself liable for any package not distinctly addressed, or for which the owner has not obtained a luggage check, as per regulations dated 31st July 1874; nor for any package of luggage whether "checked" or "excess" whose value shall exceed the sum of £10 unless such value shall be declared at the time of booking, and a further sum equal to one per centum upon such declared value paid.

LEFT LUGGAGE OR CLOAK ROOM CHARGES.

30. Every large parcel 6d.; every small parcel 3d., for twenty-four hours. Over that time an extra charge of 2d. per diem on large; and 1d. per diem on small parcels to be made. Passengers' luggage left in a train or at a station, and subsequently claimed, is also charged these rates; and likewise parcels arriving at stations addressed "To be left till called for," if such parcels are not taken delivery of in forty-eight hours after arrival at the respective stations. The Board will not, however, be responsible for any parcel left in cloak room whose value shall exceed the sum of £10 unless such value shall at the time of booking be declared, and a further sum equal to one per centum upon such declared value be paid.

IN pursuance of section 229 of the Local Government Act 1874, the Council of the City of Ballarat does hereby rescind By-law No. 52 of the said Council, and in lieu thereof and in pursuance of section 481 of the said Act the said Council hereby makes the following By-law for the management of the Corporation Baths of the said Council:—

**BY-LAW No. 60.**

1. That the baths shall be known as and styled the "Ballarat Corporation Baths."
2. That the said baths shall be open for the use of the public during the following hours in the months of October, November, December, January, February, and March, on week days from Six o'clock a.m. to Eight o'clock p.m.; and for the remaining months of the year the baths shall be opened at daylight and closed at Six o'clock p.m., excepting on Saturdays, when they shall remain open until Eight p.m.; and on Sundays throughout the year the baths shall be open from Six o'clock a.m. to Nine o'clock a.m.
3. That no person shall smoke in any part of the baths except in the cooling-room.
4. That no person shall use soap in the swimming bath.
5. That no person under the influence of intoxicating liquors shall be permitted to use the baths.
6. That no person shall deface the walls in any portion of the baths by writing or drawing thereon.
7. That no person shall use obscene language within the baths.
8. That no person shall spit in the swimming bath or on the floor or walls of any portion of the building.
9. That the council shall have power, from time to time, to regulate the fees to be paid for the various classes of baths.
10. That the council shall have power, from time to time, to give such directions as it may consider necessary for the proper internal management of the baths.
11. That the council shall have power, from time to time, to set apart any portion, or the whole, of the baths for the use of ladies.
12. That all dogs found within the precincts of the baths shall be liable to be destroyed.
13. That no person shall use any of the warm baths for a greater period than half an hour at any one time.
14. That no person shall be allowed to use the swimming bath unless wearing a screen.
15. That any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.
