SIR,—With reference to your letter of the 21st instant, I am commanded by my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to acquaint you, for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that in view of the standard of qualification for the entry of Naval and Colonial Cadets having been raised, they consider that the Revised Regulations should be issued to the Governors of Colonies, and I am to forward herewith 250 copies for transmission accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE INFORMATION OF CANDIDATES.

1. Nominations for naval cadships will take place half-yearly immediately after the report of the last examination has been received.

2. An examination of the young gentlemen who have obtained nominations will be held at the Royal Naval College, Greenwich, under the direction of the Admiralty Examiners, on the Third Wednesday in June and the last Wednesday in November in each year, but the appointments will date from the 15th July and January following respectively.

3. No candidate will be eligible for examination in June whose age will not be within the following limits on the 15th July following, viz., not less than twelve nor more than thirteen and a half years of age, nor in November whose age will not be within those limits on the 15th January following.

4. Every candidate will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must have been found physically fit for the Royal Navy.

He must be in good health and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age.

Any candidate rejected at the medical examination will, subject to the approval of the board, be finally excluded from the Royal Navy.

5. The candidate will be required to produce (1) a certificate of birth,* or declaration thereof made before a magistrate; (2) a certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutors or the clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) a certificate of good health.

6. The candidates will be required:—

(a) To write English correctly from dictation in a legible hand	100
(b) To read from a modern English author with intelligence, and to parse easy sentences ...	100
(c) Arithmetic, as far as proportion and vulgar and decimal fractions	200

(e) Elementary geometry, viz., definitions, axioms, postulates, and demonstrations of the first twelve propositions of the first book of Euclid's Elements	200
(f) Latin. To read, translate, and parse passages from Latin authors into English, and to translate easy sentences from English into Latin	200
(g) Read, translate, and parse easy passages from French	100
(h) Scripture history	100
	1,200

Four-tenths of the marks assigned must be obtained in each subject, and 720 marks in the aggregate.

7. A candidate whose age does not exceed thirteen on the 15th July or 15th January (as the case may be), who may not be successful, will be allowed to present himself again at the

next examination without undergoing a fresh medical examination, but no candidate will be allowed more than two trials. Candidates whose age exceeds thirteen on the 15th July or 15th January following the examination will not be allowed a second trial.

8. Any candidate who fails to appear at the examination after he has obtained a nomination will not be allowed to present himself at any future examination without a fresh nomination, except in the case of illness, certified by a physician or surgeon, and approved by their Lordships, in which case the candidate will be allowed to present himself at the following examination, provided he is still within the limits of age; but under no circumstances will such a candidate be allowed to appear at more than one examination.

9. For all cadets entered under these regulations, the annual rate of payment will be at the rate of £70 per annum for the period in the "Britannia," to be paid half-yearly in advance to the Accountant-General of the Navy. But the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty reserve the power of selecting, from among the candidates nominated at each half-yearly examination, a number, not to exceed 10, being sons of officers of the Royal Navy, Army, or Marines, or of civil officers under the Board of Admiralty, with respect to whom the annual payment for the two years in the "Britannia" will be £40 only. In selecting these their Lordships will have regard solely to the pecuniary circumstances of the parents or guardians of the cadets.

No application for admission on such reduced scale will be entertained unless made before the candidate is nominated.

10. The period of training on board the "Britannia" will be, as now, four terms; there will be two terms in each year. The first term of each year will be from February to July, the second from August to December.

The vacations will be five weeks at Christmas, two weeks at Easter, and six weeks at midsummer.

11. There will be examinations in seamanship and study at the end of each term.

12. Cadets who pass an satisfactory examinations at the end of any term will be "warned," and they will be liable to be discharged at the end of the following, or any subsequent term, should they again be reported as failing to attain the proper number of marks at the examinations.

13. The same rule will apply to cadets who may be reported for unsatisfactory conduct during their service in the "Britannia."

14. Any cadet who shall have been specially reported to their Lordships as for any reason unfit for the service will be removed from the Navy.

15. Cadets will, on passing out of the training ship, take the order in which they pass their final examination.

16. The parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to provide outfit as under the regulations in force hitherto, and to sign a declaration (on the admission of the cadet to the "Britannia") to the effect that he shall be immediately withdrawn on the receipt of an official intimation of his being considered unfit for the Royal Navy.

17. Candidates entered under these Regulations must understand that they are liable, at any period of their service subsequent to the date of their leaving the training ship, to be selected to qualify for the gunnery or navigating branches of the service at the discretion of their Lordships, who will, however, only exercise such power of selection in the event of there not being a sufficient number of volunteers for such duties.

THE QUARANTINE STATION AT POINT NEPEAN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Public Health Statute 1865*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, from time to time, by any order notified by proclamation appoint certain stations or places within or near any harbor or place within Victoria for the performance of quarantine under this Act, where all vessels liable to quarantine, and the crews, passengers, and persons on board thereof should perform the same; and also (if necessary) appoint lazarets and other places where the crews, passengers, and other persons, and the things which should or might be on board the said vessels should be detained and kept for the performance of quarantine: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor, and the seal of the colony bearing date the twenty-fourth day of October One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four made in accordance with the provisions of certain Acts then in force in the said colony, the description of the limits of the Quarantine Station, at Point Nepean, was amended as therein described: And whereas it is expedient to further amend the description of the limits of the said Quarantine Station: Now therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation, dated the twenty-fourth day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, so far as it relates to the description of the limits of the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean; and with the advice aforesaid I do by this my Proclamation, in accordance with the provisions of the said in part recited Act, appoint the station or place hereinafter described for the performance of Quarantine under the law now in force relating thereto, within the limits of which station or place I do hereby strictly prohibit all persons, not being themselves under quarantine, or duly authorized for the purpose of necessary communication with persons under quarantine, from going, under any pretence whatever, when any person or persons, goods, wares, or merchandise are undergoing quarantine, within such limits, under the pains and penalties prescribed by law, that is to say:—

THE QUARANTINE STATION.

The Quarantine Station at Point Nepean shall be that portion of the county of Mornington, in the colony of Victoria, bounded as follows, viz.: Commencing at the flagstaff, near Observatory Point, distant from Point Nepean one and a half nautic miles, which flagstaff bears from the high lighthouse at Shortland's Bluff south thirty-three degrees ten minutes east; and bounded on the north by the shores of Port Phillip Bay easterly to a flagstaff bearing from the said lighthouse south forty-five degrees east; on the east by a line bearing south to the sea-coast; on the south by Bass' Straits westerly; and on the west by a line bearing north to the commencing point.

NEGLECTED AND CRIMINAL CHILDREN'S ACT 1864.
REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by *The Neglected and Criminal Children's Act* 1864 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to make regulations for the conduct, management, and supervision of Industrial and Reformatory Schools (established for the purposes of the said Act), and for the education and correction of the children detained therein: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth by this present Order make the following regulations, that is to say:—

JIKA REFORMATORIES—REGULATION RESPECTING PETTY OFFICERS.

1. Petty officers shall be appointed by the superintendent as follows, viz.:

- (a.) Mess-captains.
- (b.) Book-monitors.
- (c.) Ward-monitors.

They shall be in two grades—first and second; conduct to be the rule for classification. Promotion to the first grade to be confined to upper division boys, and to be contingent upon a boy earning the full number of good marks, and no bad ones, for four consecutive weeks, and reduction to the second grade to follow upon the earning of any bad marks or the deprivation of five good ones during any one week.

2. Petty officers shall be on duty as stated hereunder. When not actually on duty they shall be free from the special responsibility attaching to their office, but are expected at all times to set a good example to the other boys, and assist in maintaining order and discipline within the establishment.

TIMES OF DUTY.

Mess-captains.—From the time they are called to prepare the tables before each meal until the mess-tables and dining-room have been cleaned after meals, and they are allowed to go by the instructor who is in charge of the room.

Book-monitors.—From the time the boys receive their books in the evening, to read or learn lessons, until the books are again collected before bedtime, also when books are being issued and received by the teacher.

Ward-monitors.—From the time the boys leave the yard in the evening till they return to it next morning.

DUTIES, ETC.

A mess-captain will be appointed to each table, and will be held responsible for receiving the proper amount of rations for the number of boys at his mess, and also for seeing the same properly and fairly divided among them. He will have two helpers at each meal time—the boys taking their turns at helping for a day at a time. The captains must see that the tables and forms, the mess utensils, the presses, and the floor of the messroom are thoroughly cleaned after each meal, and that the utensils are neatly placed in the presses, and also must personally collect all the knives, forks, and spoons from the boys of their respective messes on parade after dinner, and see those articles locked up by an instructor. Also when the tables are being laid they must see whether any article is deficient, and if so report the matter to an instructor at once.

A Book-monitor will be appointed to each group of about 10 boys. He will receive from the teacher all books for the use of the boys in his subdivision, and will keep a note-book

containing the names of all his boys, showing the books given to each boy, the date of issue and date of return. He will be provided with a box or press in which to lock his books up, and will be responsible for distributing and collecting all school and library books used by his subdivision and for their safe keeping while in his possession. Should any book in his collection be damaged, he must make an entry thereof in his book, and on returning the same to the teacher call his attention to such damage and entry. He will not be held personally blamable for any damage so reported, unless on complaint to the Superintendent, and after special investigation there be good reason to suppose the monitor has been personally to blame.

A Ward-monitor will be appointed to each 10 or 15 boys. The ward-monitors will be required to exercise supervision over the boys of their ward, while going to, remaining in, and coming from the reading rooms and dormitories, and to be able to give information about any misconduct during those times; also to see that the boys keep order in the rooms, and keep clothes-presses, beds, &c., in order.

3. Petty Officers shall be entitled to the following privileges and rewards, viz.:

- (1.) Mess-captains to be exempt from actual mess-work.
- (2.) Each petty-officer to receive extra good marks up to 7 for the satisfactory discharge of his duty for each week.
- (3.) Each class of petty-officers to wear a distinctive badge.

In addition to the above petty officers in the upper grade will be allowed—

- (1.) To wear a distinctive uniform jacket and cap.
- (2.) To be employed as messengers (if required) outside the school bounds.
- (3.) Leave of absence to see friends, one day in every 3 months. If not considered advisable for them to see their friends, they may, as an equivalent, accompany an officer to see any public institution or fête. In special cases the inspector may allow leave of absence to the extent of 3 days, but such leave will, as a rule, only be to visit friends at a distance from town.
- (4.) To receive at the rate of sixpence (6d.) for every 20 good marks earned in the capacity of petty-officer, and be permitted to spend the money so earned while on leave.

shall those named therein. Any person using or attempting to use a ticket in violation of this Bye-Law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

No. VIII. No ticket will be recognised by any Collector or Servant of the Board authorized to collect or examine tickets unless the number, date, and names of the Stations printed on such ticket are perfectly legible. The holder of any ticket which may be defaced or rendered illegible in any of the above particulars will be regarded as not having paid his fare, and will be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

No. IX. Any person, not being duly authorized by the Board, who shall sell or offer for sale any free pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

No. X. No male Passenger will be allowed to enter or remain in any waiting-room or Carriage set apart for the accommodation of females, and any person persisting in remaining in any such room or Carriage, after being warned to leave the same, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

No. XI. Any person, not being a Servant of the Board, who shall open any Carriage, for the purpose of entering the same, with a key or other instrument, after the tickets have been examined, and the carriage doors locked by the Station-master, Guard, or other person appointed for that purpose, or any person who shall let him or herself out of any Carriage on arrival at any Station, or at any time during the journey, by the use of a private key or other instrument, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

No. XII. No person shall be permitted to travel outside a Carriage or vehicle on the Railway, under any circumstances whatever, or to get into or upon or to quit any Carriage or vehicle when the Train is in motion; and any person doing so, or attempting to do so, shall be liable to a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

No. XIII. Smoking is strictly prohibited in any of the Railway sheds, yards, offices, pier, or waiting rooms; and any person found smoking in any goods or other shed, yards, offices, pier, or premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

No. XIV. Smoking is strictly prohibited in any of the Railway Carriages, to the annoyance of any Passenger, and any person who persists in smoking after being requested by a Passenger, or warned by any Servant of the Board to desist, shall forfeit a penalty not exceeding two pounds, and may be removed from the Carriage by any of the Railway Servants.

No. XV. Dogs will be conveyed and charged for according to printed conditions, but they will not on any account be allowed to accompany passengers in the Carriages. Any person persisting in taking a Dog into any Passenger Carriage, in breach of this Bye-Law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

No. XVI. No gratuity is under any circumstances allowed to be received by the Servants of the Railway Department, on pain of immediate dismissal. Any person giving or offering a gratuity to any such Servant shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

No. XVII. Any person making use of insulting or abusive language to any Officer or Servant of the Railway Department of the Board, while in the execution of his duty, or any person making use of obscene or blasphemous language in any carriage or upon any platform or premises of the Board, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

No. XVIII. Any person driving or attempting to drive sheep or cattle, or attempting to ride or drive any horse across the Line, either at an authorized crossing place or elsewhere, when a Train is in sight, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

No. XIX. Any person or persons wilfully driving, or negligently allowing to stray, any cattle, horses, sheep, or other animal, on the Railway or any lands or premises of the Board, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

No. XX. (*Repeated. See No. XL.*)

No. XXI. Any person found bathing, swimming dogs, or otherwise polluting the water in any of the Railway Reservoirs or Tanks, shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

No. XXII. Any person or person, unless those duly authorized by the Board, who shall be found posting or sticking bills, &c., within or upon any of the Railway property or premises, shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

No. XXIII. No person shall be entitled to require to be carried upon or along any Railway of the Board any sheep, cattle, horses, or live stock which, in the judgment of the Board, their Officers, or Servants, may be infected with any disease of whatsoever nature, and the Board, their Officers, or Servants, may refuse to take any sheep, cattle, horses, or live stock suspected by them to be diseased. Any person causing or procuring any diseased sheep, cattle, horses, or live stock to be carried, or offering, or causing any of them to be offered for the purpose of being carried, upon or along any such Railway, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

No. XXIV. If any person shall willingly, knowingly, or negligently drive or attempt to drive, or allow to stray into any Railway Station, yard, shed, or premises, or upon any lands, or within any fences, the property of the Board, any sheep infected with scab or other disease, or any cattle, horses, or live stock having or suffering from any disease whatsoever, he shall be liable to a penalty for every such offence not exceeding twenty pounds.

No. XXV. All goods and merchandise (whether bonded or free), and all luggage arriving by Train at any Station or pier shall be removed from the platform, sheds, or pier within forty-eight hours, or such less time as may be fixed, and any free goods, merchandise, or luggage not removed by that time, may be stored at the risk and expense of the consignees or owners, and may then become subject to such charges as may from time to time be fixed by the Board; and any bonded goods or merchandise which shall not be removed within the period aforesaid, shall be subject to the payment of the sum of one shilling per ton per diem, until the removal of the same from the premises of the Board. And all goods, merchandise, and luggage unclaimed by the owner for the space of seven days after arrival, may be sold by the Board, and after deducting what may be due to the Board for railway carriage, storage, and charges (including expenses of sale), to pay over the surplus, if any, to the owner on demand.
