REGULATIONS UNDER. "THE DISEASES IN STOCK

ACT 1872."

: 1 - At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of July 1879.

WHEREAS by The Diseases in Stock Act 1872, among other things the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make orders and regulations for the purposes therein mentioned and to rescind the same: And whereas from time to time the Governor in Council has made divers orders and regulations under the powers conferred by the said Act: And whereas it is desirable to amend and consolidate such orders and regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. Resistant of menious resulutions—The regulations of the

- 1. Rescission of previous regulations.—The regulations of the Governor in Council expressed to be made under the powers conferred by The Diseases in Stock Act 1872, and of other powers enabling him in that behalf of the respective dates mentioned in the first schedule hereto, shall be and the same are hereby rescinded
- 2. What to be deemed infectious or contagious diseases and diseased stock.—The diseases mentioned in the second schedule hereto are hereby declared to be contagious or infectious diseases, and all stock affected with any of such diseases, and all stock affected with any of such diseases, and all stock arriving by sea from any place other than the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, until such last-mentioned stock have passed through and been released from quarantine, are hereby proclaimed to be diseased stock.
- 3. Interpretation of terms.—In construing these regulations the following words, if not inconsistent with the context, shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them (that

is to say)—

"Cattle" shall include any bull, cow, ox, calf, or buffalo.

"Horse" shall include any stallion, mare, gelding, or

"Sheep" shall include any ram, ewe, wether, or lamb.
"Sheep" shall include any ram, ewe, wether, or lamb.
"Fittings" and "fodder" respectively shall have the meanings assigned to them by The Diseases in Stock Act

"Chief Inspector of Stock" shall include officer acting for the Chief Inspector of Stock in his absence.

- 4. Stock to which the Act No. 451 is extended.—All the sections of The Diseases in Stock Act 1872 shall extend to all stock of the kinds mentioned in the third schedule hereto.
- 5. Prohibition of the introduction of stock found to be diseased.—
  The introduction of any stock mentioned in the third schedule hereto into the colony, either by sea or land, found to be suffering from any of the diseases mentioned in the second schedule hereto, is prohibited.
- 6. These regulations not to authorize the introduction of certain kinds of stock in certain cases.—Nothing in these regulations shall be taken to authorize the introduction into Victoria of cattle or sheep save and except from the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, or from Great Britain, Ireland, Canada, or the United States of America, or the introduction into, or landing in Victoria, for the purpose of transhipment or otherwise, of pigs, save and except from the Australasian colonies or New Zealand.
- or New Zealand.
  7. Transgression of the regulations forbidden.—No person shall do or attempt to do, cause or permit to be done, or to be attempted to be done, or assist in doing, or attempting to do any act forbidden by these regulations, or obtain or endeavor to obtain, or assist anyone in obtaining or endeavoring to obtain by fraud any certificate or authority under these regulations, or forge any such certificate or authority, or make use of any such forged or fraudulently obtained certificate or authority, or obstruct or refuse to carry out the directions of any inspector or other person acting under the authority of these regulations.

  8. Ambigation of proceeds of sciences—The proceeds of the
- 8. Application of proceeds of seizures.—The proceeds of the sale of anything seized under the authority of these regulations and sold, shall be paid into the consolidated revenue.
- 9. These regulations shall be divided into parts and subdivisions, as follows:—

PART I.—The introduction of stock into the colony:

Subdivision (1).—The introduction of stock from the Australasian colonies and New Zealand. Subdivision (2).—The introduction of stock from places other than the Australasian colonies and New Zealand.

Subdivision (3).—General provisions as to the introduction of stock.

PART II.—The prevention of the spread of disease in the colony.

# PART I.

Subdivision (1).—The Introduction of Stock from the Australasian Colonies and New Zealand.

10. Inspector's authority required for the introduction of stock.—No one shall introduce into the colony, either by sea or land,

any stock of any kind mentioned in the third schedule hereto coming from any of the Australasian colonies or New-Zealand without the authority in writing of an inspector of stock; and except in accordance with the conditions of such-authority; and no inspector shall grant any such authority until he is satisfied that all the provisions of every law and of every regulation or order of the Governor in Council for the time being in force with respect to the introduction of such stock, have been complied with.

11. Places at which stock may be introduced.—No one, except under special circumstances, of which the Chiof, Inspector of Stock shall be the judge, shall introduce any such stock; at any place not being one of the places mentioned in the fourth schedule hereto.

schedule hereto.

12. Duties of inspectors before authorizing the introduction of stock.—No inspector shall authorize any of the said stock, being cattle or sheep, to be introduced or to travel until he has inspected such stock and is satisfied that the same are free from any of the diseases mentioned in the second schedule hereto, and has counted the same or been otherwise satisfied as to the number of stock to be so introduced, and has received a statutory declaration made by the owner or person in charge stating the number and description of stock which he is desirous to introduce, and that such stock are free from disease.

to introduce, and that such stock are free from disease.

13. Introduction of saddle, draught, or pack horses, mules or asses, or working bullocks.—In the case of the introduction of saddle, draught, or pack horses, mules or asses, and working bullocks; used bond fide for the purpose of riding, draught, or carrying burdens, having been once inspected, special authority may be granted by an inspector of stock, and continue in force until revoked by a notice from such inspector, to enable such horses, mules, asses, or working bullocks to pass and repass without further inspection between any portions of either of the adjoining colonies and this colony.

14. Creditate or the introduction of stack from neighboring

adjoining colonies and this colony.

14. Certificate on the introduction of stock from neighboring colonies that it is the produce of those colonies.—No inspector of stock shall authorize any cattle or sheep brought by sea from any place in any of the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, except sheep from King's Island, in the colony of Tasmania, to be introduced into Victoria, under the provisious of this part of these regulations, unless the certificate of the inspector or other officer charged with the execution of the law relating to the prevention of diseases among stock in the place whence the same are brought, that, the same are the produce of such colony, or have performed a quarantine of not less than ninety days therein and been found free from disease, be produced to him.

disease, be produced to him.

15. Introduction of stock from neighboring colonies not the produce of such colonies.—If any cattle or sheep brought by sea from any of the Australasian colonies or New Zealand be not the produce of such colony, and have not performed a quarantine of ninety days therein and been pronounced free from disease, such cattle or sheep, for the purpose of these regulations, shall be deemed to have been shipped at the place whence the same were originally brought.

16. Introduction of stock in ressels that have been recently in foreign ports or had foreign stock on board.—Stock arriving in Victoria in any vessel which during the preceding six months has been in any port outside the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, or which has during the preceding six months necessived on board stock from any vessel which during the preceding six months has been in any such port, shall not be introduced into Victoria unless upon compliance with all the regulations in force as to the introduction of stock shipped at such port, so far as such regulations may be applicable.

17. Sheep introduced from neighboring colonies.—Every sheep

such port, so far as such regulations may be applicable.

17. Sherp introduced from neighboring colonies.—Every sheep introduced by sea into the colony from any place in any of the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, except King's Island aforesaid, shall, innucdiately on being landed, be removed to some quarantine ground determined by the Governor in Council, or to some store or place in the city of Melbourne of which the Chief Inspector of Stock may, by writing under his hand, approve for that purpose, and which shall be deemed a quarantine ground; and shall be detained there for not less than ten days, and until the Chief Inspector shall, by writing under his hand, authorize its removal; and every such sheep shall, whilst so detained, be dipped not less than twice at intervals of from eight to ten days, the first of such dippings to take place within ten days of its landing, and in the medicaments provided by the regulations under The Scab Act 1870 (No. 370), under the direction and to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector of Stock.

18. Removal of sheep to store to be in waggons.—Every order of

18. Removal of sheep to store to be in waggons.—Every order of the Chief Inspector of Stock approving of any store or place as a quarantine ground shall determine the boundaries thereof, and when any sheep is removed as aforesaid to any such store or place, the same shall be so removed in some waggon or cart, and not otherwise.

19. Introduction of sheep from King's Island.—No inspector of stock shall authorize the introduction into Victoria of any sheep brought by sea from King's Island aforesaid, unless he be furnished with a statutory declaration by the owner of such sheep in the form or to the effect in the fifth schedule hereto.

hereto.

20. Expenses to be borne by owners.—All expenses connected with the landing, detaining in quarantine, and dipping any such sheep, from the time of the arrival of such sheep until the time the same may be destroyed or released from quarantine, including the expenses of the destruction of any such sheep as may be destroyed, and of the removal and disposition of the carcasses of any such sheep as may be destroyed or die, shall be borne and paid by the owners thereof; and no inspector of stock shall authorize the introduction by sea of any such sheep into the colony until some owner thereof, or

some person on his behalf, has executed to the satisfaction of such inspector a bond to the Chief Inspector of Stock, with one surety, conditioned for the due payment of all such expenses, and every such bond shall be in such penalty as such inspector may require, and every such bond may be in the form in the sixth schedule hereto.

Subdivision (2).—The Introduction of Stock from Places other than the Australasian Colonies and New Zealand.

Zealand.

21. Place and authority for the introduction of stock.—No stock of any kind mentioned in the third schedule from any place other than one of the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, brought by sea to the colony, shall be introduced at any place other than the port of Melbourne, or without the authority in writing of an inspector of stock, and except in accordance with the conditions of such authority, and no inspector of stock shall grant any such authority until he is satisfied that all the provisions of every law and of every regulation or order of the Governor in Council for the time being in force with respect to the introduction of such stock have been complied with. Provided always that the Chief Inspector of Stock may authorize the introduction of cattle or sheep, not-withstanding any non-compliance with regulations 31, 32, and 33 hereinafter contained, in any case in which he may think that compliance with such regulations may be excused with safety.

safety.

22. Master of vestel arriving with stock on board to send list thereof to the inspector.—The master of every vessel which arrives at any port or place in Victoria, having on board any stock of any of the kinds mentioned in the third schedule hereto, shall, in the cases hereinafter mentioned, with the least possible delay, furnish the inspector of stock stationed at or near such port or place with a list, in writing, of all stock on board such vessel, stating where the same respectively were shipped, and the name of every consignes thereof, distinguishing, should there be more consigness than one, the stock consigned to each; stating also, with regard to such stock respectively, whether he desires to introduce the same stock respectively, whether he desires to introduce the same into the colony, or to laud the same for the purpose of the reshipment thereof, or to slaughter the same on shipboard, or to moor and keep moored the said vessel at a distance of more than 160 yards from the shore and from any pier or wharf, and to retain the said stock on board such vessel without landing the same, or to remove the said stock forthwith from Victorian waters without landing the same, that is to say in the following cases:—

If any of such stock has been shipped at any port or place not being in the Australasian colonies or New Zealand.

Zealand.

If such vessel has during the preceding six months been in any port outside the Australasian colonies and New Zealand.

If such vessel has, during the preceding six months, received on board stock from any vessel which during the preceding six months has been in any port outside the Australasian colonies and New Zealand.

- Australasian colonies and New Zealand.

  23. Inspection of stock to be introduced on arrival in port.—All stock of any of the kinds mentioned in the third schedule hereto, from any place other than any of the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, brought by sea to and desired to be introduced into this colony or landed for the purpose of reshipment shall, with the least possible delay after the arrival thereof, be examined by a veterinary surgeon approved by the Governor in Council in that behalf and by an inspector of stock, and such surgeon and inspector shall ascertain whether or not such stock are suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, whether mentioned in the second schedule or not, and if satisfied that any such stock are free from every such disease shall grant a certificate accordingly, in writing under their hands, and forward such certificate to the Chief Inspector, of Stock; and stock consigned to different persons shall not be included in the same certificate be granted, but such certificate shall not of itself be deemed an authority to land such stock. land such stock.
- 24. Notice to be given by inspector.—As soon as conveniently may be after the granting of any such certificate the inspector of stock granting the same shall cause to be delivered to the master of the vessel on board which the stock mentioned in such certificate are a notice in the form or to the effect in the seventh schedule hereto.
- 25. Application to be made to inspector.—At the time of depositing the sum mentioned in such notice with the inspector of stock, the owner or consignee of the stock, or if there is no owner or consignee in Victoria, the master of the vessel in which the stock arrived, shall sign and deliver to the inspector of stock an application in the form in the eighth schedule hereto.
- hereto.

  26. Master to remove or slaughter stock unless the notice is compiled with within the prescribed time.—If the sum of money and bond mentioned in any notice delivered to the master of any vessel under the provisions of these regulations hereinbefore contained be not paid and given respectively to the inspector of stock stationed at or near the port or place where the vessel mentioned in such notice is lying, and arrangements for the removal of the stock to the quarantine ground to the satisfaction of such inspector be not made within the time mentioned in such notice, or any further time that an inspector of stock may from time to time, by writing under his hand, allow, the master of such vessel shall forthwith, after the expiration of such time, cause every head of stock to which such notice refers to be slaughtered on board such vessel, or shall remove and keep removed such vessel with such stock on board a distance exceeding 100 yards from the shore and any

pier or wharf, or shall cause such stock to be removed from Victoria and Victorian waters; and if such master fail to cause any of such stock to be slaughtered or removed as aforesaid, any inspector of stock may seize and slaughter the same, and dispose of the carcasses as he may think fit, and the bond for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned may be in the form or to the effect in the sixth schedule hereto.

  27. Application of deposit.—The sums of money to be deposited with the inspector of stock as hereinbefore mentioned shall be applicable in defraying the cost of inspection, food, disinfection, dressings for scab if made use of, attendance, housing, and disinfecting the vessel or conveyance in which the transhipment or conveyance of such stock to or from the quarantine ground takes place, but the cost of medicine, veterinary inspection, veterinary treatment, transhipment, or conveyance of stock to and from the quarantine ground, and all other expenses in connection with such stock not mentioned above, shall be paid directly by the owner, and the balance, if any, of such money shall be returned to the person by whom the same was deposited.
- 28. Removal of stock to quarantine ground.—On receipt of the deposit and application hereinbefore mentioned, and the execution of the bond as hereinbefore required, and compliance with all regulations in force in that behalf, the inspector of stock may allow such stock to be conveyed by water to the quarantine ground in his presence and under his supervision. or may, if he think fit, take charge of such stock, and cause the same to be conveyed by water to the quarantine ground. ground.
- 29. Removal of stock from quarantine ground.—No inspector shall authorize the removal from any quarantine ground of any stock until they have been washed, dressed, and disinfected as the Chief Inspector of Stock may direct, and have been detained until he is satisfied that they are free from every infectious or contagious disease, whether mentioned in the second schedule or not. schedule or not.
- 30. Notice of intention to introduce cattle or sheep.—Any person intending to introduce cattle or sheep into Victoria from any place other than one of the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, other than cattle or sheep for the use of the passengers or crew, shall give sixty days' notice in writing of his intention to the Chief Inspector of Stock, stating the kind and number of stock intended to be introduced, the country and place from which the same are to be introduced, and the ages and sexes thereof.
- 31. Inspection prior to shipment.—All such cattle or sheep, prior to their being shipped for this colony, as well as all cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals put or to be put on board the same vessel as the first-mentioned cattle or sheep, for the use of the passengers or crew, shall be carefully inspected by a daily qualified veterinary surgeon approved by the Governor, or by some person authorized in that behalf by the Governor.
- 32. Certificate of inspector.—The exporter of such cattle or sheep shall produce and deliver to the veterinary surgeon inspecting the same a certificate from the inspector or other officer charged with the execution of the law relating to the prevention of diseases among cattle or sheep in the district in which such cattle or sheep were when sold for exportation or from which they started for the port of shipment, to the effect: effect :-
  - 1st. That they have been in the country from which it is intended to ship them for a period of sixty days.
  - 2nd. That they are free from infection.
  - 3rd. That they have not within the sixty days last pre-ceding been in contact with infection.
- eeding been in contact with infection.

  33. Declaration of veterinary surgeon.—If the veterinary surgeon be satisfied that the cattle or sheep intended to be introduced into this colony, and the cattle, sheep, or other animals put on board or to be put on board for the use of the passengers or crew are free from infection, and that all the other requirements of the regulations in force have up to that time been duly complied with, he shall make a declaration to that effect, in the form or to the effect in the unith schedule hereto, and shall deliver the same to the master of the vessel, together, with the certificate required by clause No. 32 of these regulations.
- regulations, at the office of the Chief Inspector of Stock.

  35. Quarantine of cattle and sheep intended to be introduced from abroad.—Cattle or sheep intended to be introduced into the colony from any place other than one of the Australasian colonies or New Zealand shall remain in quarantine for a period of not less than ninety days, during which time they shall be washed, dressed, and disinfected as the Chief Inspector of Stock may direct; and until after the expiration of the said period of ninety days they have been examined by a veterinary surgeon approved by the Governor in Council in that behalf and an inspector of stock, and by them declared, by writing under their hands, to be free from infection; and no person shall, whether before or after the expiration of the said period of ninety days, remove or drive any such cattle or sheep or suffer any such cattle or sheep to escape from the quarantine ground until an inspector of stock, by writing under his hand, may authorize their removal.

- 36. Within thirty-six hours after the receipt by any owner or consignee of any stock that have been removed to the quarantine ground of a notice from an inspector of stock that such stock are ready to be removed from the quarantine ground, or the delivery of such notice addressed to such owner or consignee, at his last address as known to the Chief Inspector, such owner or consignee shall remove or cause to be removed such stock from the quarantine ground.
- 37. Quarantine of cattle and sheep not intended to be introduced.

  —All stock removed from any vessel to the quarantine ground for the purpose of their reshipment shall remain there until it is desired to reship them, when the Chief Inspector of Stock may permit them to be reshipped.
- Stock may permit them to be reshipped.

  38. Inspection of stock not intended to be introduced or landed and again reshipped on arrival.—All stock of any of the kinds mentioned in the third schedule hereto from any place other than any of the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, brought by sea to this colony, shall, with the least possible delay after the arrival thereof, be examined by an inspector of stock, and such inspector shall ascertain whether or not such stock are suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, whether mentioned in the second schedule or not, and, if satisfied that any such stock are free from every such disease, shall grant a certificate accordingly, in writing under his hand, and forward such certificate to the Chief Inspector of Stock, and in case the master of the vessel on board which such stock are has not given notice as aforesaid of his desire either to introduce such stock into Victoria or to land the same for the purpose of the reshipment thereof, or to remove and keep removed the said vessel with the said stock on board a distance of more than 100 yards from the shore or any pier or wharf, or in case such stock are of a kind which cannot be lawfully introduced into Victoria or landed in Victoria for the purpose of reshipment, shall, as soon as conveniently may be, cause to be delivered to the master of such vessel a notice in the form or to the effect in the eleventh schedule hereto.

  39. Master to remove or slaughter stock within the time specified
- 39. Master to remove or slaughter stock within the time specified in the notice.—The muster of such vessel shall, within the time mentioned in such notice in that behalf, or any further time that an inspector of stock may from time to time, by writing under his hand, allow, cause every head of stock to which such notice refers to be slaughtered on board such vessel, or or move and keep removed the said vessel with the said stock on board a distance of more than 100 yards from the shore or any pier or wharf, or to be removed from Victoria and Victorian waters, and if such master fail to cause any such stock to be slaughtered or removed, any inspector of stock may seize and slaughter the same and dispose of the carcasses as he may think fit.

Subdivision (3).—General Provisions relating to the Introduction of Stock.

- 40. Destruction of stock found to be diseased.—If any stock of any of the kinds mentioned in the third schedule hereto, whether on board any vessel on which they may be introduced or after they may be landed, be found to be diseased, they may be forthwith destroyed by an inspector of stock, or any person acting under the authority of an inspector of stock.
- stock.

  41. Sheep arriving on shipboard suffering from scab.—If any sheep on board any vessel arriving in any port or place in Victoria is, in the opinion of any inspector of stock, infected with scab, such inspector may, in lieu of seizing and destroying the sheep on board such vessel, by writing under his hand, order that every sheep arriving on board such vessel be dressed to his satisfaction in such medicaments as he may prescribe, on board such vessel, within a time to be specified in such order, and to be within a further time, also specified in such order, removed from Victoria and Victorian waters; and every such order shall be served on the master of the vessel on board which such sheep may have arrived; and in case such order, in any particular thereof, is not complied with within the time named in that behalf, or such further time as an inspector of stock may from time to time, by writing under his hand, allow, any inspector of stock may seize and destroy every sheep having arrived in the colony on board such ship in such manner as he may think fit.

  42. Chief Inspector to report outbreak of disease at quarantine
- 42. Chief Inspector to report outbreak of disease at quarantine ground.—Whenever any stock at any quarantine ground shall be found to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, the Chief Inspector of Stock shall report the same, in writing, to the Chief Secretary.
- 43. Transfer of stock from one ship to another.—No one shall, in any river, port, or harbor in Victoria, or elsewhere in Victorian waters, transfer any stock from any one ship or vessel to any other ship or vessel without the written authority of an inspector of stock, and except in accordance with the conditions of such authority.
- 44. Fodder or fittings, and effects of attendants.—No fodder or fittings shall be thrown overboard from any ship in any river, port, or harbor in Victoria, or elsewhere in Victoriau waters, and all fittings used for, with, or about any imported stock, and all effects belonging to their attendants which may be deemed necessary, shall be disinfected as the Chief Inspector shall direct. Inspector shall direct.
- A5. Introduction of fodder and fittings.—No inspector shall authorize the introduction into the colony of any fittings until they have been properly disinfected to the satisfaction of the inspector, nor of any fodder other than oileake, bran, barley, oats, beans, or pease, brought to the colony by any vessel from any place other than one of the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, except for the purpose of burning such other fodder upon the beach; and any fodder or fittings landed

- without the authority of an inspector of stock, or otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of such authority, may be seized by any inspector of stock or any person acting under the authority of any such inspector, and may be sold or destroyed as an inspector of stock may direct. And all bedding which has been used by stock and their droppings shall be burnt or buried, as the inspector may direct.
- 46. Treatment of buried, as the inspector limity direct.

  The skins of all stock of any of the kinds mentioned in the third schedule hereto or other animals which have died or been slaughtered during the voyage on board any vessel having on board any stock shipped at any place other than one of the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, shall be salted and kept on board in a manner which the inspector may consider safe; and no such skins shall be landed in the colony. colony.
- colony.

  47. Appointment of quarantine places for stock.—The places or buildings at which stock may be kept in quarantine may be from time to time determined and varied by the Governor in Council, and on the publication in the Government Gazette of an order of the Governor in Council declaring any place or building a place at which stock may be kept in quarantine, herein called a quarantine ground, and defining the boundaries of such place or building, such place or building, together with any adjoining land, the boundaries whereof are defined by such order and declared fo form part of the district hereinafter mentioned, shall become, and until the variation or revocation of such order continue, a quarantine district.
- 48. Restriction on persons entering or leaving the quarantine ground.—No person shall enter any quarantine ground, and no person employed at or about any quarantine ground, shall leave the same, except in accordance with the directions of the Chief Inspector of Stock.
- 49. Restriction on removal of articles from quarantine ground.—
  No article of clothing used at any quarantine ground by any person in charge of or attending any stock, and no covering for any such stock, fodder, fittings, or other article or thing which may have come in contact with or been in use about such stock, shall be removed from the quarantine ground without the written authority of an inspector of stock, and except in accordance with the conditions of such authority, and no inspector shall grant such authority when he is of opinion that the removal might lead to the introduction into or spread of disease in the colony.
- or spread of disease in the colony.

  50. Risks connected with the introduction of stock to be borne by the owner.—All risks in connection with the removal of any stock to the quarantine ground, and the detention and treatment thereof, whether on shipboard or at the quarantine ground, whether from disease (whether contracted at the quarantine ground or not) or from accidents incurred in transhipping, landing, feeding, watering, or in any other way, or from the destruction of such stock to prevent the spread of disease, shall be borne by the owner of the stock, and no owner of any such stock shall be entitled to compensation for any loss arising from any such risk. arising from any such risk.

## PART II.

TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF DISEASE IN THE COLONY.

- To prevent the Spread of Disease in the Colont.

  51. An inspector may declare premises on which he has discovered disease a quarantine district.—When an inspector finds any of the diseases mentioned in the second schedule hereto, except the diseases known as seab and influenza or catarrh in sheep, to exist in stock, he shall forthwith make a statutory declaration thereof under his hand, and deliver a notice under his hand of such declaration to the occupier of the premises where the diseased stock is found, and thereupon such premises and all lands and buildings contiguous thereto in the same occupation, and all other lands and buildings the inspector may think fit to include, and on the occupiers of which, if any, he shall serve notice, shall become a quarantine district until the determination and declaration of the Governor in Council relative thereto.
- Council relative thereto.

  52. Steps to be taken by an inspector after discovery of disease.—
  When an inspector makes a statutory declaration of the existence of disease, he shall forthwith forward a copy thereof, and a notification of the boundaries of the quarantine district as fixed by him, to the Chief Inspector of Stock, and the Governor in Council may either declare such district a quarantine district and prescribe the boundaries thereof, or that such district be released from quarantine, and, on the publication of such declaration in the Government Gazette, such district shall either continue a quarantine district with the boundaries prescribed by the Governor in Council, or shall cease to be a quarantine district, as the case may be.
- 53. Owners of diseased stock may be required to keep notices affixed.

  The inspector may from time to time direct persons in the occupation of any premises included in a quarantine district to affix and keep affixed notices to such effect, on such portions of such premises and in such manner as the inspector may order, and such persons shall affix and keep affixed the same accordingly.
- 54. Inspector may seize diseased stock, &c.—When an inspector finds diseased stock, he may seize the same and take such steps as he may deem expedient to ensure the isolation and safe custody of such stock, and he shall at once report the circumstances to the Chief Inspector.
- 55. Quarantine districts may be altered.—The Governor in Council may by order alter from time to time the boundaries of or abolish any quarantine district.
- 56. Stock not to be removed from quarantine without authority.—No stock shall be moved out of any quarantine district without the written authority of an inspector.

- 57. Inspector may order premises, fittings, \$6.; to be disinfected—
  The inspector may direct any quarantine district or any portion thereof, or anything thereon, or that has been in contact
  with any diseased stock, or any clothes of anyone who has
  been in contact with any diseased stock, to be disinfected in
  such manner as he may think fit, and all persons shall permit
  the same to be disinfected accordingly.
- 58. Owners to disinfected accordingly.

  58. Owners to disinfect and treat stock for diseases.—The inspector may direct the owners of any stock of any of the kinds mentioned in the third schedule to subject them to any treatment for the cure of any of the diseases mentioned in the second schedule, or for the purposes of disinfecting them, and the owners of such stock shall with all diligence carry out such directions.
- 59. Stock illegally moved out of quarantine to be taken back.—
  Any inspector of stock or any constable may require that any animal mentioned in the third schedule hereto or thing moved out of a quarantine district in contravention of these regulations or of the said Act be forthwith taken back at the cost of the owner within the limits of such district, and may enforce and execute such requisition.
- enforce and execute such requisition.

  60. Discased stock not to be exposed for sale at markets or travelled, fa.—If any person exposes in a market or other public place where stock are commonly exposed for sale, or exposes in any sale yard, whether public or private, or places in any lair or place adjacent to or connected with any market, or where stock are commonly placed before exposure for sale, or sends or causes to be carried on a railway or on a canal or river, or by any other inland navigation, or on a coasting vessel; or carries, leads, or drives, or causes to be carried, led, or driven on a highway or thoroughfare, or keeps on any common or on the side of a highway, or unless such stock be constantly followed and kept in sight on any unenclosed land, or in any field or other place insufficiently fenced, any stock of any of the said kinds infected with any of the diseases mentioned in the second schedule, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these regulations unless he show to the satisfaction of the justices before whom he is charged that he did not know of the said stock being so infected, and that he could not with reasonable diligence have obtained such knowledge.

  61. Owner of diseased stock required to give notice thereof.—The
- not with reasonable diligence have obtained such knowledge.

  61. Owner of diseased stock required to give notice thereof.—The owner or the person having the charge or custody of any stock affected with any of the diseases mentioned in the second schedule, shall forthwith give notice to the inspector of the district, and if any inspector shall find any stock to be diseased before such notice has been given, every such owner and person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these regulations, unless he show to the satisfaction of the justices before whom he is charged that he did not know of such stock being diseased, and that he could not, with reasonable diligence, have obtained such knowledge. Provided that no notice, if given to any inspector after he has entered upon any premises for the purpose of inspecting the stock thereon, shall be deemed a notice for the purpose of this section.
- 62. This part not to apply to catarrh or scab in sheep.—The provisions of this part of these regulations shall not apply to the disease known as scab or to the disease known as influenza or catarrh in sheep.

WHEREAS by the 30th section of an Act initiuled An Act to amend the laws relating to or affecting the Public Health; and numbered 310, among other things the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make, alter, or vary and revoke such orders as may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony, or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever; is known to exist), of all sheep, cattle, horses, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever; or of meat, skins, bides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: Provided that nothing in the said section should apply to the disease in sheep called scab: And whereas the diseases in swine hereinafter mentioned (that is to say), foot and mouth, anthrax, rabies, trichinosis, and typhoid fever, and the diseases in cattle and sheep hereinafter mentioned (that is to say), catarrh, Cumberland disease, foot and mouth disease, glanders, small-pox in sheep, scab, pleuro-pneumonia, rinderpest, and murrain, are known to exist in the countries following (that is to say), the Continents of Europe, Asia, Africa, and America, and the Islands in the Atlautic, Pacific, and Indian Oceans: And whereas the Governor in Council has from time to time made divers orders under the powers conferred by the said section, and it is desirable to amend and consolidate the same: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the

advice of the Executive Council; doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

- 1. The orders of the Governor in Council expressed to be made under the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of other powers enabling him in that behalf, for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria of sheep, cattle, horses, swine, or other animals, of the respective dates mentioned in the schedule hereto, shall be and the same are hereby revoked. are hereby revoked.
- 2. The introduction of swine into Victoria from the countries following, that is to say, Europe, Asia, Africa, America, and the Islands in the Atlantic, Pacific, and Indian Occaus, not forming part of any of the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, is hereby prohibited.
- 3. The introduction of cattle or sheep into Victoria from the countries following, that is to say, Europe, Asia, Africa, America, and the Islands in the Atlantic, Pacific, and Indian Oceans, save and except Great Britain, Ireland, Canada, the United States of America, the Australasian colonies, and New Zealand is hereby prohibited.
- 4. No manure shall be introduced into Victoria from any of the countries hereinbefore mentioned, or from any of the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, without the authority, in writing, of an inspector of stock, and except in accordance with the conditions of such authority.
- 5. The introduction of cattle or sheep shall not take place 5. The introduction or cattle or sneep snail not take place from any of the countries hereinbefore mentioned in which any infectious or contagious disease not known in the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, other than foot and mouth disease, exists, or in which there are more than one hundred centres of that disease.

  6. No person shall do or attempt to do, cause to be done or to be attempted to be done, or assist in doing or attempting to do any act forbidden by this Order, or obtain or endeavour to obtain, or assist anyone in obtaining or endeavouring to obtain by fraud any authority under this Order, or forge any such authority, or make use of any such forged or fraudulently obtained authority, or fraudulently grant or issue any such authority, or obstruct or refuse to carry out the directions of any inspector or other person acting under the authority of this Order. this Order.
- 7. All persons offending against this Order shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £50.

## THE NEGLECTED AND CRIMINAL CHILDREN'S AMENDMENT ACT 1874.

FURTHER CONDITIONS RELATING TO WET-NURSES.

IN pursuance of The Neglected and Criminal Children's Amendment 4ct 1874, whereby it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to make regulations and conditions for generally regulating the apprenticing, licensing out, and Reformatory Schools established under The Neglected and Criminal Children's Act 1884, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following further conditions, that is to say:—

Schedule No. 5-Conditions relating to Wet-nurses.

No. 1. Wet-nurses must be married women, and be approved by the medical officer of the industrial school as regards health

by the medical officer of the state of good character and fitness.

No. 2. They must produce certificates of good character from a clergyman or some well-known person of good social state.

No. 2. They must produce certificates of good character from a clergyman or some well-known person of good social position.

No. 3. After a child has been placed with a wet-nurse in a district in which there is a ladies' visiting committee which undertakes the supervision of infants at wet-nurse, the ladies will be requested to visit, and if they are not satisfied with the healthiness of the nurse's house, and also of the locality in which she resides, will report the same to the Inspector of Industrial and Reformatory Schools.

No. 4. The child must be treated with proper attention and kindness. It must be kept very clean and suitably clothed as regards the season of the year. Special care must be taken to protect the child's head and spine when exposed to the sun in hot weather, without, however, heating or oppressing the child's head with unsuitable covering.

No. 5. The child should be taken out in the fresh air every day when the weather and other circumstances permit.

No. 6. When the child requires medical attendance it is to be taken, without delay, to the medical officer of the district; but if not fit to be taken out (as, for example, in croup, inflammation of the lungs, or convulsions), then the child's illness must be reported immediately to the district medical officer, and intimation given at the same time that the case is urgent. In any case of great urgency, when the medical officer is from honne, or when he resides at a distance, the nearest doctor should be called in till the medical officer arrives.

No. 7. The wet-nurse must give the whole of her breast-milk to the school child, and give it no other food unless by the directions of the medical officer.

No. 8. Wet-nurses not directed to place themselves under the supervision of a ladies' committee will receive instructions respecting medical attendance for the children placed in their care from the medical officer of the industrial school.

No. 9. Payment will be made for each child at wet-nurse at the rate of Twelve shillings per week up to the age of twelve months.

months.

No. 10. Clauses 10, 15, 16, 18, 21, and 22 of the conditions relating to the boarding-out of children (Schedule 1) will also apply to nurses having children under this schedule, and clauses 19 and 20 to the medical officers attending such

clauses 19 and 20 to the medical omcers attending such children. No. 11. In addition to the foregoing conditions, &c., the wetnurses are required to give careful attention to such instructions as they may receive from time to time from the medical officer; and they are desired to make themselves acquainted with the "Printed Rules for the General Management of Infants," published by the Obstetrical Society of London, a copy of which will be furnished to them by the medical officer or the committee an application. committee on application.
