## ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to a Bill, passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Eight hundred thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine and eighty.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this seventeenth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and in the forty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by The County Court Statute 1869 it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council to direct that county courts should be holden for the determination of certain actions cognizable by courts of common law, and with a limited jurisdiction in equity, probate, and administration, under the said Act, and, with the advice aforesaid, to alter the place of holding any such court or to direct that the holding of any such court be discontinued, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court should be holden; and it was also enacted that the judge of each county court should attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor in Council should have directed, that such court should be holden at such times as such judge should appoint for that purpose, so that a court should be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor in Council should in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a County Court for the determination of certain actions cognizable by courts of common law, and with a limited jurisdiction in equity, under the said Act, shall be holden at the town and within the interval hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

At KERANG, once at least in every six calendar months.

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864 it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council might proclaim any town, township, or borough, not being a seaport town, as a district into which no gunpowder should be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person should bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and should not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it should be forfeited: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the second day of July 1861, certain

The Proclamation dated the nineteenth day of September 1864, the whole.

LEPERS OR AOTA ISLAND, NEW HEBRIDES.

Lepers Island.—The general outline of this island seems to agree very well with the chart.

The Shoal patch, mentioned in South Pacific Directory, is a rock wash at l. w. springs, and lies with the N.E. tangent of island S.E. by S., and a wedge shaped clay colored bluff S.W.

Shoal water extends off the eastern side of island to the distance of half a mile.

The *Wolverene* anchored in four different places on the north side of Lepers Island, and her boats were enabled to land with the greatest ease at each place on sandy beach.

The best anchorage at Lepers Island lies on the north coast towards the east end and has been named "Bice Roads" after the Rev. Mr. Bice, the Melanesian Missionary stationed on the island; it has a nice beach for boats landing, and the tribe of natives living there are very friendly and very obliging to white men. The nearest fresh water is about a mile inland, the only provisions procurable are yams and cocoa nuts which they readily part with for tobacco and pipes.

We experienced a strong current the north side of the island setting to the westward.

MARAU SOUND, GUADALCANAR ISLAND.

The *Wolverene* entered the sound by the southern entrance and found deep water up to Ferguson Island, and anchored there in 18 fathoms, with the left extreme of Ferguson Island S.E. by E. close to the opposite shore. The tides here run very strong.

The *Wolverene* then proceeded out to the northward as shown on a chart which is to be seen on meeting the *Wolverene*, deep water was found all the way out except near the shoal marked 8 fathoms, which must be left well on the starboard hand, then rounding the island marked Round Island steer out about N. by W. for Marau Island leaving a double line of islands on the port hand. The course of the track marked is from the magnetic courses steered by *Wolverene*.

POCKLINGTON REEF.

From observations made in the passage from Isabel Island to the Louisiade Archipelago the south-eastern part of this reef lies in lat.  $10^{\circ} 36' \text{ S.}$ , long. approx.  $156^{\circ} 47' \text{ E.}$  Whilst in the neighborhood of this reef we experienced a set to the N.E. of  $58'$  in one day, and a set to the N.N.E. of  $31'$  the following day.

It was a very thick morning when the Pocklington Reef was sighted, and blowing hard with rain, so that a more accurate account cannot be given.

48. The council of every borough in which this subdivision shall be in force and which shall not be within any common prescribed space may, from time to time, make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

For appointing, subject to the limits herein prescribed, the several sums to be paid for licenses for hackney carriages, borough stage carriages, drivers, and conductors.

For regulating the manner in which the name of the borough, and the number of each carriage, corresponding with the number of its license, shall be displayed thereon.

For regulating the conduct of the owners, drivers, and conductors of hackney carriages, and of borough stage carriages plying within the prescribed space, in their several employments, and determining whether such drivers or conductors shall wear any, and what badges, and for regulating the days and hours within which they may exercise their calling.

For regulating either by relation to the nature and dimensions of the carriage, and the number of horses required to draw the same, or all or any of these, or otherwise the number of persons to be carried by hackney carriages, and borough stage carriages, and in what manner such number is to be shown upon such carriage, and in what position and manner the lamp, where required hereby to be placed inside borough stage carriages, is to be placed therein.

For fixing the following local matters, namely, the standings of hackney carriages and of borough stage carriages, whether separately or otherwise, and the number of such carriages to be allowed at any such standing, and the mode in which such carriages are to stand thereon, and the routes and places of call for borough stage carriages, and the time during which each such stage

carriage shall be allowed to remain at any such place, and the times and succession for the starting and the running of such stage carriages.

For fixing the rates or fares, as well for time as for distance, to be paid for hackney carriages, and by passengers in borough stage carriages; and the mode in which such rates or fares are to be painted or marked on every such carriage.

1. The words "prescribed space" shall, for the purpose of this subdivision, mean for any borough the space within the circumference of a circle whose radius is five miles in length from the principal post-office of such borough.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MELBOURNE, FOR KEEPING ORDER UPON AND PREVENTING OBSTRUCTION OF THE CARRIAGE AND FOOTWAYS OF THE SAID CITY; AND FOR ANY BREACH WHEREOF THE OFFENDER WILL BE LIABLE TO A PENALTY NOT EXCEEDING FIVE POUNDS.

In exercise of the power conferred by the second section of the "Act to Amend the Police Offences Statute 1865," 42 Victoria No. 630, it is ordered and directed by the Council of the City of Melbourne that the following Regulations shall be observed and in force within the said city, on and after the first day of August 1879:—

1. All persons standing or loitering upon any of the carriageways, footways, or other public places of the city, shall discontinue to do so on requirement by any member of the police force.

2. All persons walking along the footways, shall in passing each other keep on their respective right hand side of the footway.

3. Any street musician or vocalist shall, when requested by any householder or his servant, or by any member of the police force, depart from the neighborhood of the premises of such householder.

4. The driver of any vehicle shall give way, if he conveniently can, to any other vehicle during the taking up or setting down of any person into or from such other vehicle.

5. The driver of any hackney carriage or omnibus shall not stop the same, for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passenger at any part of the street, except as near as may be to the left or near side thereof.

6. No driver of an omnibus or hackney carriage shall drive the same so as to immediately and closely precede or follow and intentionally conform to the progress of any other omnibus or hackney carriage in competition against or to the annoyance of any other person.

7. The driver of any vehicle of whatsoever kind it may be, and whether private or public, before stopping the same in any carriageway for any purpose, shall give notice of his intention so to do, if riding upon such vehicle by holding up his whip or his hand, so that the same may be seen by the driver of any other vehicle in rear of his, and upon stopping he shall so place his vehicle as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic, and if the stoppage prevent the passing of any other vehicle, or interrupt or delay traffic, he shall upon being so required by the driver of such other vehicle, or by any member of the police force, remove his vehicle so as to permit such other vehicle to pass, or so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

8. Between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening of any day no person shall cause interruption or annoyance to passengers along the public roadways or footways by raising or discharging dust upon or across any such roadway or footway, whether from buildings in process of demolition or otherwise.

9. No person shall swing or hoist goods across or over the footway of any street, by means of any lift, hoist, or tackle, projecting over any such footway.

##### AS TO PROCESSIONS, &c.

10. No procession of persons or of vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes, shall parade or pass through any of the streets, unless with the previous consent in writing of the Mayor, or in his absence, the Town Clerk, of the city, and only by the route specified in such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given, at the least, twenty-four hours' notice, with particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge of the city police.

11. Whenever, for the prevention of accident or the maintenance of order, and for such time as by notice in writing under the hand or by the direction of the Mayor, or in his absence or the case of sudden emergency, under the hand of the Town Clerk or the officer in charge of the city police, any carriageway, footway, street, or other public place shall be declared to be closed against traffic of vehicles or persons, or both, the drivers of vehicles and all persons contemplated by such notice shall, when so required by any member of the

police force, obey and conform to such notice by abstaining from going or by withdrawing and removing from where mentioned therein. And the drivers of all vehicles, whether private or public, which may be there, whether plying for hire on any duly appointed stand or otherwise, shall, when so required by any member of the police force, remove their vehicles thence, and if desiring to remain in the vicinity, shall proceed to any other carriage-way, street, or public place which may be indicated by the police for that purpose, and there arrange and order their vehicles in manner directed by any member of the police force.

12. Upon any occasion when any number exceeding ten vehicles shall be assembled and waiting at any one and the same place, the driver of every such vehicle shall as to the placing and ordering thereof comply with the directions given by any member of the police force placed on duty there for the preservation of safety and order.
