**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.:

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. Note.—The gain to the population during the quarter by excess of births over deaths was 2460, viz., 1510 males and 1950 females; that by excess of arrivals over departures was 1239, viz., 1171 males and 68 females. The total increase was

thus 4,699, as shown in the table. The total increase of population since the beginning of the year was 7992 as against 6847 during the corresponding period of 1878. Of the increase in the first six months of the current year 6297 was due to excess of births over deaths, and 1695 to excess of arrivals over departures; and of that in the first six months of 1878, 5528 was due to excess of births over deaths, and 1319 to excess of arrivals over departures.

It is right to point out that the population estimates are not absolutely reliable, since in the first place no account is or can be taken of the arrivals or departures overland, and the calculated population is in consequence liable to be greater or less than the truth, according as the latter or the former preponderate; secondly, some persons going from Victoria by sea do not take their passages beforehand, and consequently no record is made of their departure, whilst, as the arrivals by sea are all duly reported, the estimated population is, from this cause, apt to exceed the correct number; thirdly, as the registration of death must precede burial, all, or very nearly all, the deaths are registered, but as there is no such absolute necessity for registering births, many are always left unregistered. From this cause the estimate of population is likely to understate the truth. Until another census is taken it will not be possible to ascertain which of these disturbing influences is the most potent, or whether they counteract one another.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normandy, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described as a Common, that is to say :—

#### CROWN LANDS DEPARTMENT—SURVEY BRANCH. PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN.

APPLICATIONS will be received up to the fifteenth day of August next from candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen, in connection with this Department.

##### CONDITIONS.

An applicant must be not more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age; he will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution and not affected with any physical infirmity which could interfere with the proper exercise of his profession.

He must possess one of the following qualifications:—Having matriculated at the Melbourne or other recognised University, passing in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic; or, having passed the Civil Service Examination, including the subjects above named; or, he shall produce such a certificate to his competency in those three subjects as shall satisfy the Board of Examiners for Authorised Surveyors. He shall also, with such certificate, send in a specimen of his plan drawing.

##### COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting, and plan drawing, when the four competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

##### TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the department will be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing; he will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field-book and plan drawing. He will next be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

He shall afterwards attend for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

##### REMUNERATION.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year, £60; 4th year, £84.

##### CONDITIONAL SERVICE.

At the examination for authorised surveyors next ensuing after the completion of his attendance at the Observatory, or sooner if required, he shall present himself for examination. Should he successfully pass such examination he shall, if required, serve the department as a surveyor for one year from the date of such examination, at a salary of £200 per annum; should he fail to pass he shall, if required, serve the department as a draughtsman and computer for one year from the date of such examination, at a salary of £150 per annum. If he shall pass at the next ensuing examination for authorised surveyors, he shall, if required, serve the department as a surveyor for the unexpired portion of the year (dating from the first examination), at a salary at the rate of £200 per annum.

##### SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Civil Service of Victoria dated 31st of December 1866, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations.

##### BONDS REQUIRED.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds of £150 each that he will duly and faithfully carry out his part of these conditions.

**SHIRE OF WIMMERA.**

**BYE-LAW MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.**  
THE Council of the Shire of Wimmera doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the power and authorities conferred on it by "The Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872," make the following rate from the 1st August 1879 upon all the lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Horsham, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied:—

On every house or tenement of the annual value of £40 and under, the annual sum of Two pounds.

On every house or tenement of the annual value of £40 and not exceeding £100, the annual sum of £5 per centum on the amount of the valuation.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of £100, the annual sum of Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation additional.

On property within the water district in streets where water is not supplied, £5 per centum on the amount of the valuation.

On property within the water district, except in streets where water is not supplied, £1 per centum on the amount of the valuation.

Gardens to be charged at the following rates:—

½ acre and under ... £1

Over ½ acre and not exceeding 1 acre ... £2

Over 1 acre and not exceeding 1 acre ... £3

And at the rate of £3 per acre for each additional acre.

Stables to be charged at the rate of 7s. 6d. per stall or shed used for stabling horses, five feet to be allowed in open shed for each horse.

Water-troughs to be charged £2 each.

Steam boilers to be charged at the rate of 30s. per annum on each inch measurement of the cylinder of the engine. If not attached to an engine, a special rate to be agreed upon.

2. The council may cause meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meter to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by special arrangement. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons.

3. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repair, the council shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

4. Any person receiving water from the council who shall enter and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the council, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the council, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the council, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the council, he shall obtain from the council a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

7. Before any such license shall be granted by the council the person applying for same shall satisfy the council that he is a competent plumber, and pay the sum of One pound, as the fee for such license. The council shall have the power of cancelling such license at any time.

8. Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the council, without giving two days' notice to the council of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the council without the permission in writing of the council first being obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

9. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the council without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the council, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the council, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the council of a strength and material not sanctioned by the council, shall be liable for each such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council. Wrought iron and lead piping of approved quality only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services. No service of a larger bore than 4-inch will be permitted, unless by special consent of the council.

10. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the council into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the council that such service-pipe requires repairing, the council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said council may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

11. Any person supplied with water by the council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

12. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

13. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

14. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

15. If any person supplied with water by the council does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of any of

these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the council may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, and may cease to supply with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

16. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the directions of the officers of the council, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

17. All parties laying water on to their premises must have a stop-cock attached to the council service-pipe inside their fence.

18. In the construction of this bye-law, the word "council" shall mean the Shire Council of Wimmera.

**BOROUGH OF STAWELL.**

**BYE-LAW No. VII.**

*A Bye-law of the Borough of Stawell, made under section 479 and under Part 21 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 7, for regulating the Market-place, and the Buildings, Stalls, Pens, and Standings therein; and for preventing Nuisances or Obstructions therein, or in the immediate approaches thereto; for fixing the Days and the Hours during each day on which the Market shall be held; for regulating the Carriers resorting to the Market, and fixing the Rates for carrying articles carried therefrom within the limits of the municipal district; for regulating the use of the Weighing-machines provided by the Council, and for preventing the use of false or defective Weights, Scales, or Measures; for preventing the sale or exposure for sale of Unwholesome Provisions in the Market.*

**I**n pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Stawell, order as follows:—

1. The market known as the Stawell market, situate in the market reserve in Skene street, Stawell, shall be open on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 5 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m., and on Saturdays from 5 o'clock a.m. to 11 o'clock p.m., in every week, for the sale of the following goods, that is to say: Butchers' meat, pork, fish, poultry, rabbits, wild-fowl, and game, butter, cheese, eggs, vegetables, fruit, roots, shrubs, plants, trees, flowers, bulbs, seeds, hay, corn, straw, green fodder, and all garden or farm produce, with such other articles as the council may from time to time allow to be sold therein, and no other article or thing.

2. There may be appointed by the council of the said borough officers of the said market, namely, an officer to be called the market inspector, whose duties shall be to inspect all provisions offered for sale within the market, and generally to carry out and enforce the provisions of part 22 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and these Bye-laws; and they may also appoint the same or some other officer to be a collector to collect all rents and market dues, and keep all weights and weighing-machines; and such other officers as the council may require to assist in carrying out the provisions of the said Act.

3. It shall be lawful for the lessee of any stall to affix his name thereto, subject to the approval of the market inspector, and to alter such stall with the leave of the council, subject to such conditions as they may impose.

4. It shall be lawful for the council, and they are hereby empowered to impose and collect all such rents, rates, tolls, and dues in respect of and on all such articles which are enumerated in table A in the schedule appended to this Bye-law which may be brought into the said market to be sold therein.

5. That any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglect, shall, on conviction thereof, for every such offence or omission, pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds:—

A. Selling or exposing for sale in the said market any marketable commodity before the time for opening, or after the time appointed for closing such market, or on other days than those named for holding the market.

B. Selling or offering for sale in the said market any commodity not allowed by this bye-law to be sold there.

C. Refusing or neglecting to pay, on demand being made by the officer appointed by the council to collect the same, any rate, rent, toll, or due which may be due for any shed, stall, or convenience, or for any article sold or exposed for sale in the market.

D. Placing any matter or thing so as to cause an obstruction, and refusing or neglecting to remove the same on being requested to do so by the market inspector.

E. Placing or keeping any cart, carriage, barrow, or other vehicle in any part of the said market contrary to the direction of the market inspector.

F. Placing any hook, nail, or peg, or otherwise injuring or defacing any part of the market building, or fitting up,

or enclosing any part of it without the consent, or contrary to the directions of the inspector, or refusing to remove any hook, nail, peg, or fittings when requested to do so by the inspector.

G. Sweeping, or causing to be swept, or placing any dirt or rubbish into or upon any of the paths, gutters, roads, &c., of the said market, and allowing the same to remain.

H. Being in the market in a drunken or disorderly state, or exciting any riot or disturbance, or cursing or swearing, or using any gross, indecent, or abusive language, or being guilty of any gross or indecent conduct therein.

I. In any way obstructing the market inspector in the discharge of his duties.

J. In any other manner than those specified interfering with the proper regulation and good management of the market.

To inspect all articles exposed for sale in the market, and to seize such as are bad or unwholesome, and on such being examined by any two members of the municipal council, and declared by them, in writing, to be bad or unwholesome, to cause the same to be destroyed, and to prohibit the sale of any articles in such market which he may consider noisome or offensive.

To have charge of and inspect all scales, weights, and measures used in the market, and to seize such as are found fraudulent or defective.

To collect all rates, rents, tolls, and dues connected with the market, according to the table in Schedule A.
