WHEREAS by The County Court Statute 1869 it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council to direct that county courts should be holden for the determination of certain actions cognizable by courts of common law, and with a limited jurisdiction in equity, probate, and administration, under the said Act, and, with the advice aforesaid, to alter the place of holding any such court or to direct that the holding of any such court be discontinued, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court should be holden; and it was also enacted that the judge of each county court should attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor in Council should have directed that such court should be holden at such times as such judge should appoint for that purpose, so that a court should be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor in Council should in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the County Courts directed to be held at Bright, Chiltern, Rutherglen, and Yackandandah respectively shall be held within the intervals hereinafter mentioned in lieu of the intervals previously directed, that is to say:—

At BRIGHT, once at least in every six months.

At CHILTERN, once at least in every six months.

At RUTHERGLEN, once at least in every six months.

At YACKANDANDAH, once at least in every six months.

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected; and recovered for depasturing thereon; and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation; alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the undermentioned Common the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

THE LAKE BULOKE COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 18th March 1878, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Counties of Borung and Kara Kara, parishes of Corack and Witchipool: Commencing at a point on the western margin of Lake Buloke in line with the north boundary of allotment 1 of section 12; parish of Witchipool; thence west by a line and the said allotment to a point bearing south from the south-west angle of allotment 30, parish of Corack; thence north by a line to that angle; thence east, north-westerly, west, and north by the latter allotment, north-easterly by allotments 29 and 28, and north and west by the last-mentioned allotment to the south-east angle of allotment 31; thence north by that allotment, northerly by allotments 3 and 4A, north-easterly by allotment 8A, easterly by allotment 8, south-easterly by allotments 10A, 11, 20B, and 20C, east by the last-mentioned allotment, south and east by allotment 20A, and south-easterly by allotments 20, 23, and 22, and a road to the south boundary of the parish; thence west by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 25; thence north by that allotment and allotment 26, west and south by the last-mentioned allotment, and west and south-easterly by allotment 27 to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; and thence south-westerly by a direct line and the existing common to the point of commencement. Area of extension Ten thousand acres, more or less.—(79.S.14683.)

WYNDHAM RACE-COURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Michael Wall, Patrick Hobbs, Edmund John Connop, John Harper Gardner, William Ison, Patrick Russell, and Alfred Wills, the duly-appointed committee of management of the Wyndham Race-course and Recreation Reserve, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*:—

REGULATIONS.

1st. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency, as regards dress, language, or conduct.

2nd. No person except the committee of management or the secretary thereof shall be permitted to enter the grand stand; or any enclosure within the reserve, without the consent in writing of the committee.

3rd. No person shall damage in any way trees, shrubs, or flowers, or climb, jump over, remove, or destroy the fences or gates; roll or throw stones or glass in or upon the said reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission in writing of the committee.

4th. No person, unless authorized in writing by the committee, shall graze upon the said reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or geese, or bring any dog or dogs therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.

5th. No person shall be permitted to discharge firearms within the said reserve, unless the written authority of the committee of management or their secretary be first obtained.

6th. No person shall be permitted to train any horse or horses within the said reserve, without the permission in writing of the committee of management.

7th. No person shall erect within the said reserve any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee.

8th. No person shall be allowed to cart any material through or within the reserve, nor remove any turf or other material from any part thereof, nor shall any loaded dray, cart, or waggon be driven through or within the reserve, without the permission in writing of the committee of management.

9th. No person, unless authorized by the committee of management, shall ride or drive any animal with or without vehicles upon that part of the reserve used for racing purposes.

10th. The following is the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the grand stand and saddling paddock and the remainder of the reserve:—

For admission of each person to the grand stand and saddling paddock, on days fixed for racing, such a sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding ...	s. d.
For admission of each person to the remainder of the reserve on days fixed for racing, such a sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding ...	10 0
Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of <i>The Land Act 1869</i> , on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.	2 0

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
