Rule 8 of Rules and Regulations amended.—The Finance Committee shall supervise the receipts and expenditure. No moneys shall be paid out of the bank unless the accounts for the expenditure shall have been passed at a Meeting of the Finance Committee, and then only by cheque signed by three members of the Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary or his substitute. No expenditure shall be sanctioned unless ordered by the Commissioners or by some committee under the authority of the Commissioners. Provided that the Commissioners may from time to time vote such sums as they think fit to committees of the Commission for particular expenditure. But all such sums must be expended only through the Finance Committee.

14. Rule relating to the custody and use of the Seal of the Commission.—The Seal of the Commissioners shall be kept in the custody of the Secretary or his substitute, and shall be attached to all the contracts entered into by the Commissioners as evidencing the execution of such contracts by them, the attachment of the seal being attested by the Secretary or his substitute. substitute.
