NOTE.—The Melbourne Hospital and the Gaol are in Gipps Ward; the Alfred Hospital is in Albert Ward; the Immigrants' Home is partly in Albert Ward and partly in Emerald Hill Town; the Lying-in Hospital and the Children's Hospital are in Smith Ward; the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum is in Kew Borough; the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum and the Pentridge Stockade are in "Remainder of District;" the Benevolent Asylum is tabulated in Hotham Town.

The births of 771 children, viz., 408 boys and 363 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of August; in the month of July, 739 births were registered, or 32 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in August numbered 345, viz., 192 of males and 153 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 426. The deaths were fewer than those in July by 40, but exceeded by 1 the average of August during the previous ten years. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been 39 less than the average of those ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 73.2° on the 31st, and the lowest was 30.5° on the 6th. The mean temperature of the month (50.6°) was three-fifths of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (30.6°) took place on the 31st, viz., from a maximum of 73.0° to a minimum of 42.4°. The least range (7.0°) was on the 29th, viz., from a maximum of 56.2° to a minimum of 49.2°. The mean daily range was 15.9°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.020 inches) was slightly above the average.

Males contributed 56 per cent. and females 44 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Thirty-six per cent. of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age as against 31 per cent. in August 1878; 34 per cent. in August 1877; 32 per cent. in August 1876; 33 per cent. in August 1875; 30 per cent. in August 1874 and in August 1873; 33 per cent. in August 1872; 45 per cent. in August 1871; 40 per cent. in August 1870; and 35 per cent. in July 1869.

The deaths of 15 persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were registered during the month, viz.:—Those of a female aged 75, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 77, and a printer, aged 78, of apoplexy; a carrier, aged 78, of rheumatism; a female, also aged 78, of brain disease; a gentleman, aged 80, of paralysis; a female, aged 80, of cancer; a female, also aged 80, of bronchitis; a carpenter, aged 81, of diarrhoea; a blind male beggar, also aged 81, of peritonitis; a female, aged 84, of apoplexy; a female, aged 79, a bootmaker, aged 86, a fellmonger, aged 87, and a farmer, aged 89, of old age.

Sixteen deaths, from external causes were recorded during the month, of which, 12 are ascribed to accident, 1 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 10, died of internal injuries received by a butchers' cart passing over him; a bricklayer, aged 29, was killed by a fall of clay in a pit; a hotel-keeper, aged 44, died of laceration of the brain caused by a fall whilst hunting; a laborer, aged 57, died of fracture of the ribs occasioned by a fall from a scaffold; a male child, aged 3 years, died of scalds; an infant, aged 12 months, and a street mendicant, aged 60, were burned to death; a traveller, aged 44, died of sunstroke; a female, aged 29, was found drowned in the Saltwater River; another female, aged 63, was accidentally drowned; 2 female infants, aged respectively 15 days and 3 months, were suffocated in bed. The homicidal death was that of a secretary of railways, aged 52, who was shot dead at the Hobson's Bay Railway station (offender convicted of wilful murder). Of the suicidal deaths, a female, aged 42, died of wounds in the arm, self-inflicted, whilst of unsound mind; a male, of occupation unstated, aged 35, poisoned himself, and a shoemaker, aged 30, hanged himself.

Eighty-two deaths, or 24 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—84 in the Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 8 in the Alfred Hospital, 9 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 12 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Industrial Schools, 2 in the Immigrants' Home, and 1 in the Blind Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 125, of which 71, or 57 per cent., were of males; and 54, or 43 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 83 were under one year of age, 18 were between one and two, 7 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 220. Of these, 121, or 55 per cent., were males, and 99, or 45 per cent., were females; 13 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 8 were between fifteen and twenty, 10 were between twenty and twenty-five, 14 were between twenty-five and thirty, 11 were between thirty and thirty-five, 19 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 21 were between forty-five and fifty, 24 were between fifty and fifty-five, 14 were between fifty-five and sixty, 16 were between sixty and sixty-five, 15 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 9 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from typhoid fever, which numbered 20 in June and 13 in July, again decreased to 9 in the month under review. Deaths from phthisis increased from 28 in July to 36 in August; but deaths from lung diseases fell from 73 in the former to 47 in the latter month. Childbirth was set down as the cause of 6 deaths in the month under review; the total number of such deaths since the beginning of the year is 40 or 1 death of a mother to every 145 births registered.
