## SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD.—"HALLIDAY'S DAM."

*Regulations fixing the amount to be paid by persons using or carrying away water from the Reserve for Water Supply purposes, in the parish of Wooronook, known as "Halliday's Dam;" and for the care, management, and protection of the said Reserve.*

WHEREAS by a Regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the fourth day of August 1879, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order of the fourteenth day of July 1879 as a site for Water Supply purposes, in the parish of Wooronook, and hereinafter styled "Halliday's Dam Reserve": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, having framed the following Regulations for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

*Regulations.*

1. Every person using or carrying away water from "Halliday's Dam Reserve" shall pay therefore to any person duly appointed by the Committee of Management in that behalf, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—

i. For one hogshead of water taken away in any one day, Sixpence.

ii. For every hogshead of water after the first hogshead taken away in any one day, One shilling.

iii. For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Threepence.

2. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the said reserve, any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the Committee of Management, or their officer duly appointed.

3. No person shall climb or jump over or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.

Every person offending against these Regulations, or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

The foregoing Regulations were framed and approved by the Shire Council of St. Arnaud this fourth day of September 1879.

*Regulations fixing the amount to be paid by persons using or carrying away water from the Reserve for public purposes in the parish of Swanwater, known as "Feeney's Dam;" and for the care, management, and protection of the said Reserve.*

WHEREAS by a Regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the thirty-first day of March 1879, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by order of the sixteenth day of October 1876 as a site for public purposes, in the parish of Swanwater, and hereinafter styled "Feeney's Dam Reserve": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud having framed the following Regulations for the care, management, and protection of the said Reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

*Regulations.*

1. Every person using or carrying away water from "Feeney's Dam" Reserve shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the Committee of Management in that behalf, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—

i. For one hogshead of water taken away in any one day, Sixpence.

ii. For every hogshead of water after the first hogshead taken away in any one day, One shilling.

iii. For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Threepence.

2. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the said reserve, any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals without the written authority of the Committee of Management, or their officer duly appointed.

3. No person shall climb or jump over, or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.

Every person offending against these Regulations, or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

WHEREAS by a Regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the seventeenth day of May 1879, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order of the sixth day of May 1879, as a site for affording access to water, in the parish of Kellalac, and hereinafter styled "Beilby's Tank Reserve": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud having framed the following Regulations for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

*Regulations.*

1. Every person using or carrying away water from "Beilby's Tank Reserve" shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the committee of management in that behalf, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—

i. For one hogshead of water taken away in any one day, Sixpence.

ii. For every hogshead of water after the first hogshead taken away in any one day, One shilling.

iii. For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Threepence.

2. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the said reserve, any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the committee of management, or their officer duly appointed.

3. No person shall climb or jump over, or break, or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.

Every person offending against these regulations or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

The foregoing regulations were framed and approved by the Shire Council of St. Arnaud this 4th day of September 1879.

# PROCLAMATION OF A DISTRICT WHERE PUBLICANS' LICENSES MAY BE SPECIALLY GRANTED REVOKED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44), it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part the proclamation hereinbefore mentioned: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation dated the eleventh day of November One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, so far as the same constitutes the district hereinbefore set forth a district wherein publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

Portion of the shire of Goulburn within a radius of one mile from the junction of the Main road from Seymour to Murchison with the Main road from Murchison to Violet Town.

## AFRICA—EAST COAST.—ZANZIBAR HARBOUR.—BUOYS AND BEACONS.

THE Hydrographic Department of the British Admiralty has published the following information, received from Captain H. E. G. Earle, H.M.S. *London*, relative to alteration in the buoyage of Southern Pass, and in the leading mark and buoyage of English Pass, approaches to Zanzibar Harbour:—  
*Southern Pass*.—Mtwana Shoal buoy, conical and painted black, now lies one cable S.S.W. of its former position, with the shoalest spot of Outer Mtwana Shoal bearing E. by S. distant two cables.

The buoy marking the eastern edge of Kisiki Bank is now painted black and white in vertical stripes, with staff and square.

*English Pass*.—Walleso House being hidden by trees, and no longer available as a leading mark, two beacons have been erected on the shore in front of Mtoni Palace, which, kept in line with a white door in the centre of the palace, bearing S.S.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., lead through the northern portion of English Pass.

The beacons, 30 feet high, consist of poles painted black and white; the outer beacon is surmounted by a square painted white, the inner by a triangle painted white.

The buoys marking the eastern edge of Chapani Reef are now cask-shaped and painted red.

The bearings are magnetic. Variation,  $10\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  westerly in 1879.

*Description of land.*—Ten acres twelve perches, county of Bourke, city of Melbourne: Commencing at the north-west angle of the Church of England Affiliated College Reserve, being a point on the southern side of College Crescent; bounded thence by the said crescent bearing north-easterly seventeen chains eighty-one links in an arc of a circle whose centre lies south-easterly thirteen chains sixty-six links; thence by the Wesleyan Affiliated College Reserve bearing south eight chains; thence by the University and Affiliated Colleges Recreation Reserve bearing south-westerly seven chains thirty-eight links in an arc of a circle whose centre lies south-easterly five chains sixty-six links; and thence by the Church of England Affiliated College Reserve aforesaid bearing N. 74° 48' W. eight chains to the point of commencement.

*Names of trustees.*—James MacBain, Andrew Scott, William Kerr Thomson, Robert J. Jeffray, John L. Currie, John Cumming, Alexander Morrison, Francis Ormond.

*Power of disposition.*—Such power as is conferred by the Act to be exercised only in accordance with the provisions of a deed of trust to be prepared under the direction of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church of Victoria, and duly signed by the trustees. Provided that no portion of the land shall be dealt with either by sale, lease, transfer, or mortgage without the consent of the Governor in Council thereto having been first obtained.

*Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.*—To be applied exclusively to the purposes of an Affiliated College in connection with the University of Melbourne or to other educational purposes of a kindred nature.
