WHEREAS by The Electoral Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission shall have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of ratepaying electors, the Governor in Council may take all such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or may declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and every such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and shall be forthwith published in the Government Gazette: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 68th section of the Act No. 279, doth hereby declare valid the Rolls of Ratepaying Electors for the divisions of the Provinces specified in the subjoined schedule, notwithstanding the non-receipt by the Electoral Registrars for the said divisions of the rolls or portions thereof from the Municipal Officers hereunder set forth within the time fixed by Act No. 334 for that purpose, viz. :--

WHEREAS by The Electoral Act 1865 it was amongst other things enacted that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission should have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of ratepaying electors, the Governor in Council might take all such measures as might be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or might declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and every such Order in Council should state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and should be forthwith published in the Government Gazette: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 68th section of the said Act, doth by this present order direct that the Roll of Ratepaying Electors for the Wangaratta division of the Eastern Province be rectified by including therein the names of the Ratepaying Electors as set forth in the subjoined schedule notwithstanding the accidental omission on the part of the Municipal Officers therein named to furnish the Electoral Registrar with Lists containing such names within the time fixed by The Legislative Council Amendment Act No. 334 for that purpose, and that the Roll of Ratepaying Electors so rectified be reprinted accordingly. And the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby also declare the said Roll valid notwithstanding such accidental omissions as aforesaid.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the county of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

In pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of The Bank Holidays Act 1873, I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint

FRIDAY THE 17TH OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT

a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Wangaratta and Oxley.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty, and in the forty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.
