## ROLLS OF RATEPAYING ELECTORS RECTIFIED AND DECLARED VALID.

At an Executive Council held at Government House, Melbourne, the 9th day of September 1880.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Williams | Mr. Langridge.

WHEREAS by The Electoral Act 1865 it was amongst other things enacted that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission should have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of ratepaying electors, the Governor in Council might take all such measures as might be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or might declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and every such Order in Council should state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and should be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the Secretary of Echuca Shire, in the preparation of the Rolls of Ratepaying Electors, in August last, for the Echuca division of the Eastern Province and the Mount Hope division of the North-Western Province, erroneously inserted the names of the electors set forth in the subjoined schedule (A) in the Roll for the Echuca division instead of in the Roll for the Mount Hope division of the said Provinces: And whereas the said Shire Secretary did also accidentally omit to send to the Registrar of the Mount Hope division a list containing the names set forth in schedule (B) hereto within the time fixed by The Legislative Council Amendment Act No. 334 for that purpose: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 68th section of the Act No. 279, doth by this present order direct that the Rolls of Ratepaying Electors for the Echuca division of the Eastern Province and for the Mount Hope division of the North-Western Province be respectively rectified by expunging the names contained in the subjoined schedule (A) from the Roll of Ratepaying Electors for the Echuca division, and including the same in the Roll of Ratepaying Electors for the Mount Hope division of the Provinces aforesaid, and that the Rolls of Ratepaying Electors for the said Electoral divisions of Echuca and Mount Hope be reprinted accordingly. And the Governor in Council doth hereby also declare valid the Rolls so rectified as aforesaid, and notwithstanding the non-receipt by the Registrar for the Mount Hope division of the list of names contained in schedule (B) hereto within the time fixed by Act No. 334.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

GENERAL BYE-LAWS.

**T**HE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following General Bye-laws as to Railways for the several purposes therein respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

*Melbourne time to be observed.* 1. Melbourne time is to be observed at all Stations.

*Passengers to have tickets, to show and deliver them up when required.* 2. No passenger will be allowed to enter any railway carriage, or to travel therein, unless furnished with a ticket or a free pass entitling him or her to enter or travel therein. Each passenger, on paying his or her fare, will be furnished with a ticket, and he or she must show it and allow it to be marked when required; and every ticket (whether single, return, or periodical) must be delivered up upon demand of any station-master, guard, porter, ticket collector, or other authorized servant of the Board. Any person guilty of a breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

*Penalty for transferring tickets.* 3. Tickets are the property of the Board and are not transferable. A ticket can only be used by the person to whom it may be issued. Any person using or attempting to use a transferred single, return, or periodical ticket, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

*Punishment for attempt to defraud.* 4. Any person using or attempting to use a ticket on any day, or to or from any place for which such ticket is not available, or altering a ticket, or travelling upon a ticket which is not sufficient for the journey, or travelling on a ticket which was previously used, and was not available for the journey then taken, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

*Travelling in a superior class than warranted by ticket punishable.* 5. Any person travelling in a railway carriage of a superior class to that for which his or her ticket was issued, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Ten pounds, and in addition be liable to pay the extra fare according to the class of carriage in which he or she was travelling.

*Return tickets available only at certain stations.* 6. Tickets, whether single or return, shall be available, and shall be used by passengers only to convey them to the stations named thereon, or to any station short of that destination, provided the passenger by so using a ticket derives no advantage as regards fare. In no case, however, shall the "cheap" or "excursion" tickets be used at or for any other station than those named thereon. Any person using or attempting to use a ticket in violation of this bye-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

*Penalty for defacing tickets.* 7. No ticket will be recognised by any officer or servant of the Board, unless the number, date, and names of the stations printed on such ticket are perfectly legible. The holder of any ticket which may be defaced or rendered illegible in any of the above particulars will be regarded as not having paid his fare, and will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

*Penalty for selling return tickets, &c.* 8. Any person, not being duly authorized in that behalf by the Board, who shall sell or offer for sale any free pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

*Passengers not to re-book by same train.* 9. No passenger shall be entitled to re-book or take a ticket at any intermediate station for the purpose of continuing his journey in the same train as that in which he shall have arrived at such station.

*Ladies' waiting-rooms and carriages to be kept private.* 10. No male passenger will be allowed to enter or remain in any waiting-room or carriage set apart for the accommodation of females, and any person persisting in remaining in any such room or carriage, after being warned to leave the same, may be removed therefrom, and in addition shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Punishment for opening locked carriage doors or getting through window.* 11. Any person who shall let himself or herself in or out of any railway carriage by getting through the window, or, after the carriage doors have been duly locked, by the use of a private key or other instrument, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Punishment for attempting to travel outside.* 12. No person shall be permitted to travel outside any railway carriage, truck, or van, under any circumstances whatever; and no person, except the guard of the train, shall get into or upon or quit any railway carriage when the train is in motion; and any person committing a breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Smoking prohibited.* 13. Smoking tobacco or any other substance is strictly prohibited in any of the railway sheds, yards, offices, or waiting-rooms, or on any platform, pier, or wharf in respect of which notice is given that smoking is prohibited; and any person found so smoking on or in any such platform, shed, yard, office, pier, wharf, waiting-room, or premises, after being warned to desist by any officer or servant of the Board, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and in addition may be removed therefrom.

*Punishment for abusive language.* 14. Any person making use of obscene or blasphemous language in any railway carriage, or at or upon any railway station, shed, waiting-room, yard, pier, wharf, platform, or premises of the Board, or any person making use of insulting or abusive language to any officer or servant of the Board while in the execution of his duty, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Dogs.* 15. No dog or other animal will be allowed to accompany any passenger into any railway carriage. And any person taking a dog or other animal into any railway passenger carriage shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

*Gratuities forbidden.* 16. No gratuity is under any circumstances allowed to be received by any servant of the Board; and any such servant receiving a gratuity may be immediately dismissed. Any person giving or offering a gratuity to any such servant shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

*Lost property.* 17. Any officer or servant of the Board or any person finding any lost property or documents upon any railway station or premises, or in or upon any carriage of the Board, shall immediately hand over the same to the station-master of the railway station at or nearest where such property or documents were found; and any person committing a breach of this bye-law will be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.

*Cabmen and others not allowed to tout.* 18. No carman, hackney-coachman, drayman, porter, carter, or other person, unless licensed by the Board of Land and Works in that behalf, will be allowed to come into or upon any railway station, land, pier, yard, or premises of the Board for the purpose of plying for hire, or touting, or soliciting custom or hire, or removing passengers or luggage, either with or without a cab, car, dray, handcart or truck, unless by permission of

the station-master or pier-master in charge of such station, land, pier, or premises; and any carman, hackney-coachman, drayman, carter, porter, or other person evading or attempting to evade or being guilty of a breach of this bye-law, or refusing or neglecting to quit the premises of the Board when thereto required by an officer or servant of the Board, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Owner of vehicle must be in attendance.* 19. The driver of every carriage, cab, dray, stand for hire upon the premises of the said Board, must be constantly attendant on his conveyance, and shall not at any time be more than three yards distant from it; and such driver shall not tout or solicit custom or hire, and such driver shall obey the reasonable directions of the officers or servants of the Board, and shall stand in the place directed by the station-master; and any person guilty of a breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Cabs, &c., not to be driven into or out of railway station, &c., save at a walking pace.* 20. Any person driving any horse or horses attached to any carriage, cab, dray, lorry, or other vehicle through, into, or out of any railway station yard or premises of the Board save at a walking pace, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Penalty for crossing the line when train is in sight.* 21. Any person riding or driving or attempting to ride or drive any animal or animals, with or without any vehicle, across any line of railway, at any place when a train is in sight and in motion coming towards such place, or when warned not to do so by any railway gatekeeper or crossing-keeper, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Penalty for allowing cattle to stray.* 22. Any person or persons wilfully driving or negligently allowing any cattle, horse, sheep, or other animal to stray on any railway or any railway lands or premises of the Board, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

*Penalty for holding sale.* 23. Any person, unless with the permission of the Board, who shall hold any sale on any railway premises shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Persons not allowed to sell fruit, newspapers, &c., unless licensed.* 24. No person shall come or remain upon any railway pier, jetty, station, or other premises of the Board for the purpose of selling or offering for sale any fruit, pastry, confectionery, newspaper, book, pamphlet, or other article of merchandise, unless licensed in that behalf by the Board; and any person committing a breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Bill sticking prohibited.* 25. Any person, unless duly authorized by the Board, who shall be found posting or sticking bills or placards, or assisting in posting or sticking same, within or upon any railway fence, wall, building, property or premises, shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

*Scratching or drawing upon stations prohibited.* 26. Every person, unless duly authorized by the Board, writing, drawing, scratching, or cutting any letter, word, or figure upon any of the railway carriages, stations, or premises of the Board, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Bathing in reservoirs prohibited.* 27. Any person bathing in or swimming dogs in any of the railway reservoirs or tanks, or in any way fouling or polluting the water in any of such railway reservoirs or tanks, shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Fishing or shooting in reservoirs not allowed.* 28. No person shall be allowed to fish in, or shoot in or on, the railway reservoirs of the Board, or within the fences enclosing such reservoirs, without the consent of the Board; and any

person committing a breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Poison not to be placed on railway station, &c.* 29. Any person putting or placing any poison, or any poisoned meat, grain, or any poisoned substance whatsoever, on or upon any railway, railway station, or railway reserve, save with the authority of the Board, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Persons suffering from contagious disease not to travel.* 30. No person suffering from small-pox, scarlatina, measles, typhoid fever, diphtheria, whooping-cough, or erysipelas, shall travel in any railway carriage, except in such carriage (if any) as may be set apart for such purpose; and any person committing a breach of this bye-law, or knowingly or negligently causing, procuring, or assisting any person to commit a breach of this bye-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

*Punishment for driving diseased cattle on railway premises.* 31. No person shall willingly, knowingly, or negligently drive or attempt to drive, or allow to stray into any railway station, yard, shed, or premises, or upon any lands, or within any railway fences, any sheep, cattle, horses, or live stock having or suffering from any disease whatsoever; and any person committing a breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty for every such offence not exceeding Twenty pounds.

*Board not required to carry diseased cattle or sheep.* 32. No sheep, cattle, horses, or live stock which, in the judgment of the Board, their officers, or servants, may be infected with any disease, shall be carried on any railway, and the Board, their officers, or servants may refuse to take any sheep, cattle, horses, or live stock suspected by them to be diseased. Any person causing or procuring any diseased sheep, cattle, horses, or live stock to be carried upon or along any railway, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

*Checks to be issued for passengers' luggage.* 33. The Board will not undertake any liability in respect to passengers' luggage unless the regulations in reference thereto made or to be made by the Board shall have been complied with by the passenger.

34. The Board will not be responsible for articles left by passengers at any station unless the same be duly registered, for which a charge per article will be made, and a ticket given; and no article will be given up without the production of such ticket, or satisfactory evidence of the ownership and the loss of such ticket. The article will be delivered to the bearer of the ticket unless notice to the contrary be given by the owner.

*Live stock to be removed immediately.* 35. All live stock must be removed from the railway premises immediately after the arrival of the train; or, if left, they will remain at the owner's risk and expense, and may be sent to agistment or livery, the cost of which shall be paid by the owner, and such cost must be paid on demand as part of the authorized charges. And such stock, if not removed within seven days, may be sold by auction by the Board, and the proceeds thereof applied in payment of all expenses incurred, and the balance thereof handed over to the owner.

*Sale of goods.* 36. All goods, merchandise, and luggage, except perishable articles, unclaimed by the owner for the space of six calendar months after arrival will be sold by the Board; but unclaimed perishable articles may, if the Board thinks fit, be sold by the Board forthwith, and, after deducting what may be due to the Board for railway carriage, storage, and charges (including expenses of sale), the Board will pay over the surplus, if any, to the owner.

*Demurrage.* 37. In all cases where, in accordance with the goods classification and scale of charges, the loading is to be performed by the owner, two working hours will be allowed for loading, and if not completed within

that time demurrage at the rate of One shilling per truck per hour or fractional part of an hour will be charged; and where unloading is to be done by the owner eight working hours after arrival will be allowed, and if not completed within that time demurrage at the rate of One shilling per truck per hour or fractional part of an hour will be charged; or the Board may load into or discharge from the railway trucks such goods at the risk of the owner, consignor, or consignee, and such goods shall be subject to the cost of such loading or unloading, as the case may be, in addition to the freight and to such other costs or charges as may become due under the next preceding bye-law.

*Increase of rate for valuable parcels.* 38. Upon every parcel or package containing any of the articles mentioned beneath (and also in the first section of *The Innkeepers and Carriers Act, No. 78*), brought or delivered either to be carried for hire or to accompany the person of any passenger, and its value and contents declared, as in the said section is mentioned, and where such value shall exceed the sum of Ten pounds, there shall be paid an increased rate of charge, that is to say, double parcels or excess luggage rate if the declared value be over Ten pounds and under Fifty pounds, and quadruple parcels or excess luggage rate if the value exceed Fifty pounds, as a compensation for the greater risk and care to be taken for the safe custody or conveyance, as the case may be, of such valuable articles, or any precious stones, jewellery, watches, clocks, or time-pieces of any description; trinkets, bills, notes of any bank in Her Majesty's dominions, or of any foreign banks; order notes or securities for payment of money, whether foreign or otherwise; stamps, maps, writings, title deeds, paintings, engravings, pictures, gold or silver plate, or plated articles; glass, china, silks in a manufactured or unmanufactured state, and whether wrought up or not wrought up with other materials; furs or lace, or any of them, contained in any parcel or package delivered either to be carried for hire or to accompany the person of any passenger.

*Increase of rate for valuable animals.* 39. The percentage or increased rate of charge to be paid in respect of animals mentioned in the 121st section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, namely, "In respect of any horse declared to be above the value of Fifty pounds, any head of neat cattle above the value of Twenty pounds, any sheep, pig, or other small animal above the value of One pound," shall be at the rate of five per centum upon the value so declared above the respective sums so limited as aforesaid, and which percentage shall be paid in addition to the ordinary rate of charge.

*Conditions not to be waived.* 40. No station-master, or clerk, or officer, or servant of the Board, has any authority to waive, dispense with, or vary these bye-laws or conditions, or any of them.

*Interpretation clause.* 41. The word "Board" in these bye-laws shall mean the Board of Land and Works. The word "officer" or "servant" shall mean an officer or servant of the Board employed in the Victorian Railway department.

The following sections of *The Public Works Statute 1865* are published with the bye-laws:—

*Penalty for smoking in railway carriage.* 142. If any person smoke tobacco opium or any other substance in or upon any railway carriage or in any railway station except in such carriage or place if any as may be set apart for

such purpose, every person so offending shall for every such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

*Penalty for fraudulent evasion of fare.* 151. If any person take a seat in any carriage without having either a free pass or a ticket entitling him to such seat with intent to evade payment of his fare, or if any passenger by any railway do not produce or deliver up his ticket when required, or continue his journey in any railway carriage beyond the distance for which he has paid his fare, or refuse or neglect on arriving at the point to which he has paid his fare to quit such carriage, or if any person by any fraudulent or collusive means or by any false representation obtain any free pass or ticket or claim or take the benefit of any exemption from the payment of any toll fare or charge, every person so offending shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds; and the proof of such exemption shall be upon the person claiming the same.

*Penalty for misconduct in railway or injury to railway property.* 152. If any person be in and upon any carriage station jetty pier or other place in a state of intoxication or commit any nuisance or otherwise wilfully interfere with the comfort of other passengers, or wilfully damage or injure any carriage or any cushion or other furniture thereof, or wilfully pull down any gate mile-post board or notice, or obliterate or deface any of the letters or figures thereon in and upon any railway pier station or any land or premises in connection therewith or in and upon any railway carriage or engine, every person so offending shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

*Penalty for sending dangerous goods without notice.* 153. If any person knowingly send by any railway any goods of a dangerous nature and neglect at the time of so sending them to mark distinctly their nature on the outside of the package containing the same or otherwise to give notice in writing to the bookkeeper or other officer or servant with whom the same are left, every person so offending shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

*Penalty for obstruction of officer and for trespass and neglect to shut gates.* 155. If any person wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Board or company in the execution of his duty upon any railway pier station or any land or premises in connection therewith, or wilfully trespass upon any such railway pier station land or premises, or neglect and omit to shut and fasten any gate set up across or at either side of any railway so soon as he or they and the carriage, cattle or other animals under his or their care have passed through the same, every person so offending shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS:

### BYE-LAWS FOR RAILWAY PIERS.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Bye-laws as to Railways for the several purposes therein respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

*Vessels to remove from pier when cargo is discharged.* 1. When and so soon as the discharge of the cargo of any vessel at the pier shall have been completed, and whether or not such discharge shall happen within the period fixed therefor, the master of the vessel whose discharge shall have been completed shall immediately thereafter cause to be taken on board thereof such sand or stone ballast as may be required to steady such vessel, and shall thereupon leave the pier and anchor such vessel outside of the buoy's laid down by the Railway department: Provided always that such vessel is not receiving or about to receive loading from

the pier or the wagons or trucks belonging to the Board. Any person guilty of a breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

*Vessels to be removed when notice is given by pier-master.* 2. Every vessel, whether about to receive loading or not, shall be removed by the master thereof from the pier within twelve hours after written notice shall have been left on board by the pier-master requiring the removal of such vessel, and any master failing to remove his vessel within the period aforesaid shall pay to the Board a sum of Twenty pounds per day for every day or fractional part of a day thereafter during which such vessel may occupy a berth at the said pier.

*Vessels to discharge cargo beyond working hours.* 3. The master of any vessel arriving at the pier shall cause the discharge thereof to be proceeded with beyond the usual working hours—that is to say, in the summer, from six o'clock in the morning until six o'clock in the evening; and in winter, from seven o'clock in the morning until five o'clock in the evening—if so required by the pier-master. And if the master of any vessel, when so required, shall neglect or refuse to cause the discharge of his vessel to be proceeded with accordingly, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for every such neglect or refusal.

*To be discharged at expense of agent or master.* 4. The Board may at any time order that any vessel shall be discharged by stevedores, and such stevedores shall be employed by and at the expense of the master or agents of such vessel, and not by or on behalf of the Board.

*Demurrage charge for detaining trucks.* 5. Trucks shall be loaded or unloaded, as the case may be, within twelve hours after the same have been placed on the pier in a position accessible for such purpose; and the master of any ship or vessel, or the stevedore thereof, not loading or unloading any such truck within such time shall be liable to a demurrage charge of Ten shillings a truck for every day or part of a day that the truck is not loaded or unloaded as aforesaid.

*No person to supply ballast unless authorized.* 6. No person, not authorized by the Board to supply ballast to vessels lying at the pier, will be allowed to come upon such pier with ballast for any vessel. Any person guilty of a breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*Spars, &c., not to be placed or left on pier.* 7. The time allowed for goods to remain on the pier or approach thereto shall be two hours, and no ship's spars, boats, hen-coops, empty casks or cases, or other things belonging or appertaining

to any ship or vessel lying at the pier, shall be placed or left lying on any part of the pier without the permission in writing of the pier-master. Any person committing, permitting, or causing a breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.

*No boats to ply from pier without license.* 8. No boatman, waterman, or other person will be allowed to ply for hire to or from the pier unless licensed by the Board to do so; and any person infringing this bye-law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*No vessel to be moored without authority.* 9. No ship or vessel of any kind or description whatsoever shall be moored or fastened to the pier, or attached to any ship or vessel of any kind or description whatsoever so moored or fastened without the consent in writing of the pier-master; and the master or other person causing any such ship or vessel to be so moored or fastened or attached without such consent as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds; and should the pier-master not have given his consent to the mooring or fastening of such vessel, he may proceed to remove the vessel in the manner pointed out by the 131st section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*.

*Pier-master not to be hindered in execution of duty.* 10. Any person hindering, preventing, or obstructing the pier-master in the execution of his duty, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.

*Tolls on vessels.* 11. The tolls to be paid to the Board by every vessel using the pier shall be at the rate of 1s. for every ton of goods, and 9d. for every bale of wool taken from or brought to such vessel while lying alongside the pier, by lighter or other craft.

*Interpretation.* 12. The words "the pier" in these bye-laws shall mean any railway pier or jetty, or any railway breakwater if used as a pier, vested in the Board of Land and Works; and the word "pier-master" any railway pier-master for the time being of the Victorian Railway department, and any acting or assistant pier-master of the Victorian Railway department.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE HORSHAM RACECOURSE AND PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE.**

WE, Carl Godfred Rasmussen, Joseph Fechler, John Charles Lynott Bowden, and Frederick Meredith, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Horsham Racecourse and Public Recreation Reserve, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or shall throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and might from time to time, after one month's notice should be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works might issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee, as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, in accordance with the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, revoke the Proclamations of the timber reserve called the Grampians State Forest which bear the dates hereinafter mentioned, so far as they relate to the portion of land hereinafter described, that is to say:—

## FISHERIES ACT AMENDMENT ACT 1878.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mount Normanby, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act Amendment Act 1878* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might provide for the more effectual government, management, protection, and improvement of fish and any waters in which fishing might be carried on: And whereas by a proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of September One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, all persons excepting aboriginal natives of the colony were prohibited from fishing in Lake Condah or Lake Tyers, and the use of any trammell, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in the said lakes was also prohibited: And whereas it is expedient that such prohibition should be restricted: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby revoke so much of the above-mentioned proclamation as refers to Lake Tyers during the months of July, August, and September in any year.

2. If the licensee, or any person claiming an interest through or under the licensee in the land comprised in this license, shall, at any time during the period for which the license has been issued, employ any person to apply for a license of an allotment under *The Land Act* 1869, contrary to the true intent of the provisions thereof, or shall make or cause to be made any agreement or contract, or shall give or take, or cause to be given or taken, any negotiable security for the purpose of defeating or evading the provisions of, or shall in any way whatsoever, directly, or indirectly, commit or be privy to a fraud upon the said Act, this license shall be void.
