CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

NOTE.—The Civil Service Commissioners have been requested to inform Candidates for the Indian Civil Service, that "in the event of their being appointed to the Service they will not be admitted to the existing civil funds, but that they will be required, as a condition of their appointment, to subscribe to a new fund which is about to be established by the Secretary of State for India in Council for the grant of pensions to the families of future members of the Indian Civil Service."

REGULATIONS FOR THE OPEN COMPETITION OF JUNE AND JULY 1880.

N.B.—The Regulations are liable to be altered in future years.

1. On 15th June 1880, and following days, an examination, open to all qualified persons, being natural-born subjects of Her Majesty, will be held in London. Not fewer than candidates will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified, viz. :— for the Presidency of Bengal [ for the Upper, and for the Lower Provinces;] for that of Madras; and for that of Bombay.<sup>1</sup>

2. Any person desirous of competing at this examination must produce to the Civil Service Commissioners, before the 1st of April 1880, evidence showing :—

(i.) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.

(ii.) That his age will be above seventeen years on the 1st of June 1880, and under nineteen on the 1st of January 1880.<sup>2</sup> (N.B.—In the case of natives of India this must be certified by the Government of India, or of the Presidency or Province in which the candidate may have resided.)

(iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.<sup>3</sup>

(iv.) That he is of good moral character.<sup>3</sup>

He must also pay such fee as the Secretary of State for India may prescribe.<sup>4</sup>

3. Should the evidence upon the above points be *prima facie* satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, the candidate will, upon payment of the prescribed fee, be admitted to the examination. The Commissioners may, however, in their discretion, at any time prior to the grant of the certificate of qualification hereinafter referred to, institute such further inquiries as they may deem necessary; and if the result of such inquiries, in the case of any candidate, should be unsatisfactory to them in any of the above respects, he will be ineligible for admission to the Civil Service of India, and, if already selected, will be removed from the position of a probationer.

4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge :—

<sup>5</sup> Marks assigned in English Composition and Mathematics will be subject to no deduction.

<sup>6</sup> A considerable portion of the marks for English History and Literature will be allotted to the work selected by the candidate. In awarding marks for this, regard will be had partly to the extent and importance of the periods or books selected, but chiefly to the thoroughness with which they have been studied.

Candidates are at liberty to name, before 1st April 1880, any or all of these branches of knowledge. No subjects are obligatory.<sup>9</sup>

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks; and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. The marks assigned to candidates in each branch will be subject to such deduction as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary, in order to secure that "a candidate be allowed no credit at all for taking up a subject in which he is a mere smatterer."<sup>10</sup>

7. The Examination will be conducted on paper and *visâ voce*, as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the several candidates who shall have obtained, after the deduction above mentioned, a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates, will be set forth in order of merit, and such candidates shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the Civil Service of India, provided they appear to be in other respects duly qualified. Should any of the selected candidates become disqualified, the Secretary of State for India will determine whether the vacancy thus created shall be filled up or not. In the former case, the candidate next in order of merit, and in other respects duly qualified, shall be deemed to be a selected candidate. A selected candidate declining to accept the appointment which may be offered to him will be disqualified for any subsequent competition.

9. Selected candidates, before proceeding to India, will be on probation for two years, during which time they will be examined periodically, with a view of testing their progress in the following subjects :—<sup>10</sup>

In these examinations, as in the open competition, the merit of the candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it at any one examination. The examination will be conducted on paper and *visâ voce*, as may be deemed necessary. The last of these examinations will be held at the close of the second year of probation, and will be called the "Final Examination," at which it will be decided whether a selected candidate is qualified for the Civil Service of India. At this examination candidates will be permitted to take up any one of the following branches of Natural Science, viz. :—Botany, Geology, and Zoology, for which 350 marks will be allowed.

10. Any candidate who, at any of the periodical examinations, shall appear to have wilfully neglected his studies, or to be physically incapacitated for pursuing the prescribed course of training, will be liable to have his name removed from the list of selected candidates.

11. The selected candidates who, at the final examination, shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9, and who shall have satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of nationality, age, health, and character, shall be certified by the said Commissioners to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India, provided they shall comply with the regulations in force, at the time, for that service.

12. Applications from persons desirous to be admitted as candidates are to be addressed to the "Secretary to the Civil Service Commissioners, London, S.W.," from whom the proper form for the purpose may be obtained.

<sup>7</sup> The examination will range from Arithmetic, Algebra, and Elementary Geometry, up to the elements of the differential and integral calculus, including the lower portions of applied Mathematics.

<sup>8</sup> The standard of marking in Sanskrit and Arabic will be determined with reference to a high degree of proficiency, such as may be expected to be reached by a native of good education.

<sup>9</sup> Applications for leave to alter or to add to the list of subjects named will not be entertained unless received on or before the 15th of May 1880.

<sup>10</sup> Full instructions as to the course of study to be pursued will be issued to the successful candidates as soon as possible after the result of the open competition is declared.

The Civil Service Commissioners are authorized by the Secretary of State for India in Council to make the following announcements:—

1. Selected candidates will be permitted to choose,<sup>11</sup> according to the order in which they stand in the list resulting from the open competition, as long as a choice remains, the Presidency (and in Bengal the Division of the Presidency) to which they shall be appointed; but this choice will be subject to a different arrangement, should the Secretary of State, or the Government of India, deem it necessary.

2. The probationers, having passed the necessary examinations, will be required to report themselves to their Government in India not later than the close of December 1883.

3. The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the final examination.

4. An allowance of £150 a year will be given during each of the two years of their probation to all candidates who pass their probation at one of the Universities or Colleges which have been approved by the Secretary of State, viz., the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, Glasgow, Edinburgh, St. Andrew's, and Aberdeen, Trinity College, Dublin, University College, London, and King's College, London, provided such candidates shall have passed the required examinations to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected candidates.

5. All selected candidates will be required, after having passed the second periodical examination, to attend at the India Office for the purpose of entering into an agreement binding themselves, amongst other things, to refund in certain cases the amount of their allowance in the event of their failing to proceed to India. A surety will be required.

6. After passing the final examination, each candidate will be required to attend again at the India Office, with the view of entering into covenants. The stamps payable on these documents amount to £1.

7. Candidates rejected at the final examination of 1882 will in no case be allowed to present themselves for re-examination.

#### EVIDENCE OF AGE TO BE REQUIRED FROM CANDIDATES FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

I.—Every candidate born in England or Wales should produce a certificate from the Registrar-General of Births, Marriages, and Deaths, or from one of his provincial officers. This certificate may be obtained at Somerset House, or from the superintendent registrar of the district in which the birth took place.

II.—A candidate who is a native of India must have his age certified by the Government of India, or of the presidency or province in which he may have resided.

III.—Every other candidate *not producing the certificate* mentioned in Clause I, must prove his age by statutory declaration, and should also, if possible, produce a record of birth or baptism from some official register; under which term may be included the parochial registers of baptisms, the non-parochial registers of baptisms and births deposited at Somerset House under Acts of Parliament, the register kept at the India Office of persons born in India, &c., &c. This regulation applies—

1. To all candidates not born in England or Wales.

2. To candidates, who, though born in England or Wales, cannot produce the Registrar-General's Certificate.

The Civil Service Commissioners reserve to themselves the right of deciding in each case upon the sufficiency of the evidence produced, but they subjoin the following general rules for the guidance of candidates:—

(a.) The declaration should specify precisely the date and place of birth, and should, if possible, be made by the father or mother of the candidate. If made by any other person, it should state the circumstances which enabled the declarant to speak to the fact. If an entry in a Bible or other family record be referred to, the Bible or other record must be produced at the time of making the declaration, and must be mentioned in the declaration as having been so produced.

(b.) If the candidate was born in England or Wales, the declaration must contain a statement, that after due inquiry no entry has been found in the books of the Registrar-General; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.

<sup>1</sup> If a General Register Office certificate cannot be obtained, the instructions printed on the other side will show what evidence should be supplied. If evidence is already in the hands of the Commissioners, strike out "A certificate of my birth," and insert "Evidence is already in the possession of the Commissioners."

<sup>2</sup> The terms indicated by the marks of quotation must appear in the certificate, which must be given after personal examination, and bear date not earlier than 1st March 1880.

<sup>3</sup> Two testimonials must be sent bearing date not earlier than 1st March 1880. One of them should be given by an intimate acquaintance (not a relative) of not less than three or four years' standing; the other, if the candidate has recently left school, should be given by his late schoolmaster, or, if he has had employment of any kind, by his late employer. If the candidate has been at any University, he should send a certificate of good conduct from his College tutor.

<sup>4</sup> This should be given on the form annexed. If the History of England or English Literature be named, the last schedule should also be filled up.

(c.) If no extract from any register is produced, the declaration must contain a statement, that after due inquiry no such record is believed to exist; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.

(d.) Statutory declarations must be exactly in the form prescribed by the Act of 5 and 6 William IV., c. 62. A printed form, if required, will be supplied on application to the Civil Service Commissioners.

N.B.—Clergymen, as such, are not qualified to take declarations.

YARRAWONGA PUBLIC PARK AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, John Joseph Reilly, John Cornelius Caffin, Alfred Hunt, Charles Burley, John Davis, Thomas Elvin Bradstreet, and Frederick Dudley, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land at Yarrowonga reserved for Public Park and Recreation purposes, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve is divided into the following divisions, viz. :—
  - 1st. Grand stand.
  - 2nd. Saddling paddock.
  - 3rd. Running and playing ground.
  - 4th. Residue of the reserve.
2. All persons paying for admission to the first and second divisions, or to any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which they shall on demand produce and (if required) surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand the production or surrender of the same.
3. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
4. No person shall damage, in any way, the trees, shrubs, or flowers, fences, gates, or erections, or put offensive matter in the water-tank in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
5. No person shall clamber over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage the same, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
6. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, nor bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management.
7. No person shall engage in any game or sport in the reserve on Sunday.
8. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.
9. Any person who may have obtained the consent, in writing, of the committee of management to the erection within the reserve of any structure, booth, &c., for special purposes, shall be bound by any order made by the committee of management in regard thereto.
10. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
11. It shall be competent for the committee of management to allow any part of the reserve to be depastured by quiet cattle or horses, the proceeds of such agistment to be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.
12. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, or may or shall be in possession of, a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof :—
  1. Assaulting any other person.
  2. Being drunk.
  3. Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during a cricket match or sports, or during practice of cricket, or crossing or trespassing on the running ground during the time any race is being run, or when crossing or trespassing on such cricket ground or racecourse would be injurious to the same as a cricket ground or racecourse.
  4. Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
  5. Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
  6. Behaving improperly or riotously.
  7. Not surrendering (if required) to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production of the same any ticket duly authorizing admission to that part where such person shall be found.
13. The following fees shall be charged and taken for admission on such days as the committee of management shall appoint :—
 

For each person to the first division such sum as the committee shall fix, not exceeding Ten shillings (10s.).

For each person to the second division such sum as the committee may fix, not exceeding Five shillings (5s.).

For admission at the gates of a truck or wheelbarrow, or for each horse not entered in any race, or for each vehicle drawn by one horse or other animal, or for each vehicle drawn by more than one horse or other animal, for each additional horse or other animal, such sum or sums respectively as the committee may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) for each such horse, truck, wheelbarrow, or vehicle respectively.

And for admission to the ground for training purposes, One pound (£1) for each half-year.
14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any public sports, races, cricket matches, &c., may be required to deposit any sum, not exceeding Ten pounds, which the committee of management may determine by way of guarantee that due care is taken of such stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure; and the committee of management may make repairs to or make good any damage or loss sustained by such buildings, erection, stand, or enclosure, or any

thing contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by such lessee by way of guarantee and for liquidated damages.

15. This license shall not be deemed to prevent the land comprised therein or any part or parts thereof from being sold, leased, or licensed under any of the provisions of parts I., II., or III. of *The Land Act* 1869, except subdivision VII. of the 47th section thereof, or proclaimed a common, or occupied by virtue of any miner's right or business license, or alienated or dealt with under the authority of *The Land Act* 1869, or any other Act now or hereafter to be in force, otherwise than for pastoral or depasturing purposes, or resumed by order of the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, for railways, roads, telegraph lines, dams, reservoirs, races, catchwater drains, pipe-tracks, quarries, or other public purposes; and no licensee shall in any such case be entitled to compensation other than the return of such portion of the fee paid by him as the Minister may think fit.

2.
