EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

#### CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

Note.—The Civil Service Commissioners have been requested to inform Candidates for the Indian Civil Service, that "in the event of their being appointed to the Service they will not be admitted to the existing civil funds, but that they will be required, as a condition of their appointment, to subscribe to a new fund which is about to be established by the Secretary of State for India in Council for the grant of pensions to the families of future members of the Indian Civil Service."

REGULATIONS FOR THE OPEN COMPETITION OF JUNE AND JULY 1880.

N.B.—The Regulations are liable to be altered in future years.

1. On 15th June 1880, and following days, an examination, open to all qualified persons, being natural-born subjects of Her Majesty, will be held in London. Not fewer than candidates will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified, viz.—for the Presidency of Bengal [ for the Upper, and for the Lower Provinces;] for that of Madras; and for that of Bombay.

- Any person desirous of competing at this examination must produce to the Civil Service Commissioners, before the 1st of April 1880, evidence showing:—
  - (i.) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.
  - (i.) I hat he is a natural-oorn subject of her Majesty.

    (ii.) That his age will be above seventeen years on the lat of June 1880, and under nineteen on the lat of January 1880.<sup>2</sup> [N.B.—In the case of natives of India this must be certified by the Government of India, or of the Presidency or Province in which the candidate may have resided.]

    (iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.<sup>3</sup>

  - (iv.) That he is of good moral character. $^3$
- He must also pay such fee as the Secretary of State for India may
- 3. Should the evidence upon the above points be primá facie satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, the candidate will, upon payment of the prescribed fee, be admitted to the examination. The Commissioners may, however, in their discretion, at any time prior to the grant of the certificate of qualification hereinafter referred to, institute such further inquiries as they may deen necessary; and if the result of such inquiries, in the case of any candidate, should be unsatisfactory to them in any of the above respects, he will be ineligible for admission to the Civil Service of India, and, if already selected, will be removed from the position of a probationer.
- 4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge:—

English Composition 5	larks. 300
History of England—including a period selected by the candidate 5	300
English Literature—including books selected by the candidate *	300

- <sup>1</sup> The number to be selected will be announced hereafter. Notice of the days and place of Examination will be sent to each candidate about the end of May.

  <sup>2</sup> At subsequent competitions, candidates will be required to be above 17 and under 19 on 1st June of the year in which the competition is held.
- <sup>3</sup> Evidence of health and character must bear date not earlier than the 1st March 1880.
- <sup>4</sup> The fee will be £5, payable by means of a special stamp according to instructions which will be communicated to candidates.
- <sup>5</sup> Marks assigned in English Composition and Mathematics will be subject to no deduction.
- 6 A considerable portion of the marks for English History and Literature will be allotted to the work selected by the candidate. In awarding marks for this, regard will be had partly to the extent and importance of the periods or books selected, but chiefly to the thoroughness with which they have been studied.

- 5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks; and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.
- 6. The marks assigned to candidates in each branch will be subject to such deduction as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary, in order to secure that "a candidate be allowed no credit at all for taking up a subject in which he is a mere smatterer." <sup>3</sup>
- 7. The Examination will be conducted on paper and vivá roce.

EVIDENCE OF AGE TO BE REQUIRED FROM CANDIDATES FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

- I.—Every candidate born in England or Wales should produce a certificate from the Registrar-General of Births, Marriages, and Deaths, or from one of his provincial officers. This certificate may be obtained at Somerset House, or from the superintendent registrar of the district in which the birth took place.
- II.—A candidate who is a native of India must have his age certified by the Government of India, or of the presidency or province in which he may have resided.

  III.—Every other candidate not producing the certificate mentioned in Clause 1, must prove his age by statutory declaration, and should also, if possible, produce a record of birth or baptism from some official register; under which term may be included the parochial registers of baptisms, the non-parochial registers of baptisms and births deposited at Somerset House under Acts of Parliament, the register kept at the India Office of persons born in India, &c., &c. This regulation applies—

All persons paying for admission to the first and second divisions, or to any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which they shall on demand produce and (if required) surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand the production or surrender of the same.
- 3. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 4. No person shall damage, in any way, the trees, shrubs, or flowers, fences, gates, or erections, or put offensive matter in the water-tank in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 5. No person shall clamber over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage the same, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
- 6. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, nor bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing; of the committee of management.
- No person shall engage in any game or sport in the reserve on Sunday.
- 8. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve; nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.
- 9. Any person who may have obtained the consent, in writing, of the committee of management to the erection within the reserve of any structure, booth, &c., for special purposes, shall be bound by any order made by the committee of management in regard thereto.
- 10. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- 11. It shall be competent for the committee of management to allow any part of the reserve to be depastured by quiet cattle or horses, the proceeds of such agistment to be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, or may or shall be in possession of, a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:

2. Being drunk.
3. Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during a cricket match or sports, or during practice of cricket, or crossing, or trespassing on the running ground during the time any race is being run, or when crossing or trespassing on such cricket ground or racecourse would be injurious to the same as a cricket ground or racecourse.
4. Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
5. Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
6. Behaving improperly or riotously.
7. Not surrendering (if required) to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production of the same any ticket duly authorizing admission to that part where such person shall be found.
