PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the county of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Waranga has requested that certain streets in the township of Mooroopna in the Shire of Waranga beso declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate in the township of Mooroopna in the Shire of Waranga aforesaid, to be respectively Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—
