TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP AND COMMERCE BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND SERBIA.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for the information of your Government, a copy of a Treaty of Friendship and Commerce, dated the 7th of February 1880, which has been entered into between this country and Serbia, together with a copy of a Despatch from the British Minister at Belgrade, notifying that Belgrade and Vrania have been designated by the Government of Serbia as the places where goods liable to *ad valorem* duties are to be imported.

TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP AND COMMERCE BETWEEN HER MAJESTY AND THE PRINCE OF SERBIA.

Signed at Nisch { 7th February } 1880.
 { 26th January }

(Ratifications exchanged at Belgrade, May 18, 1880.)

HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and His Highness the Prince of Serbia, being desirous of placing on a satisfactory footing the commercial relations between the two States, have, with this object, determined to conclude a Treaty of Friendship and Commerce, and they have accordingly appointed their respective Plenipotentiaries, that is to say :—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Gerard Francis Gould, Esquire, Her Majesty's Minister Resident at the Court of Serbia, &c., &c., &c. ;

And His Highness the Prince of Serbia, M. Jean Ristitch, Grand Cross of his Order of Takovo, &c., President of his Council of Ministers, and his Minister for Foreign Affairs ;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles :—

ARTICLE I.

British subjects who reside temporarily or permanently in Serbia, and Servian subjects who reside temporarily or permanently in the territories, including the Colonies and foreign possessions, of Her Britannic Majesty, shall enjoy therein, with respect to residence and the exercise of commerce and trade, the same rights as, and shall not be subject to any higher or other imposts or taxes, whether general, municipal, or local, than natives, or the subjects of any other country the most favoured in this respect by either of the Contracting Parties.

British subjects in Serbia, and Servian subjects in the territories, including the Colonies and foreign possessions, of Her Britannic Majesty, shall enjoy the same treatment as natives, or as is now granted, or may hereafter be granted, to the subjects of

SA Majesté la Reine du Royaume-Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, et Son Altesse le Prince de Serbie, désirant placer sur une base satisfaisante les relations commerciales entre les deux Etats, ont, dans ce but, résolu de conclure un Traité d'Amitié et de Commerce, et ont à cet effet nommé pour leurs Plénipotentiaires respectifs, savoir :—

Sa Majesté la Reine du Royaume-Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, Monsieur Gerard Francis Gould, son Ministre Résident près la Cour de Serbie ; et

Lesquels, après s'être communiqué leurs pleins-pouvoirs, trouvés en bonne et due forme, sont tombés d'accord et ont arrêté les Articles suivants :—

ARTICLE I.

Les sujets Britanniques qui résident d'une manière soit temporaire soit permanente en Serbie, et les sujets Serbes qui résident d'une manière soit temporaire soit permanente dans les territoires, y compris les Colonies et les possessions étrangères, de Sa Majesté Britannique, y jouiront par rapport à la résidence et à l'exercice du commerce et de l'industrie, des mêmes droits et ne seront assujettis à aucun impôt ou taxe, général, municipal, ou local autre ou plus élevé que les nationaux ou les sujets de toute autre Puissance la plus favorisée sous ce rapport par les Parties Contractantes.

Les sujets Britanniques en Serbie, et les sujets Serbes dans les territoires, y compris les Colonies et les possessions étrangères, de Sa Majesté Britannique, jouiront du même traitement que les nationaux ou les sujets de la nation la plus favorisée, sous le

any other country the most favoured in this respect, with regard to the acquisition, the holding, and the disposal of property, and all charges on it, with regard to access to Courts of Law and in the prosecution and defence of their rights, and in regard to domiciliary visits to their dwellings, manufactories, warehouses, or shops.

They shall be exempted from billeting, and from all compulsory military service, whether in the army, navy, national guard, or militia. They shall be likewise exempted from all contributions, whether pecuniary or in kind, imposed as a compensation for billeting and for personal service; and, finally, from forced loans and military exactions or requisitions, as well as from all judicial or municipal functions whatever.

ARTICLE II.

The produce and manufactures of, as well as all goods coming from the territories, including the Colonies and foreign possessions, of Her Britannic Majesty, which are imported into Serbia, and the produce and manufactures of, as well as all goods coming from, Serbia which are imported into the territories, including the Colonies and foreign possessions, of Her Britannic Majesty, whether intended for consumption, warehousing, re-exportation, or transit, shall be treated in the same manner as, and, in particular, shall be subjected to no higher or other duties, whether general, municipal, or local, than the produce, manufactures, and goods of any third country the most favoured in this respect, except as regards such special facilities as have been, or may hereafter be, conceded on the part of Serbia to the neighbouring States, with respect to the local traffic between their contiguous frontier districts. No other or higher duties shall be levied in Serbia on the exportation of any goods to the territories, including the Colonies and foreign possessions, of Her Britannic Majesty, or in the territories, including the Colonies and foreign possessions, of Her Britannic Majesty, on the exportation of any goods to Serbia than may be levied on the exportation of the like goods to any third country the most favoured in this respect.

Neither of the Contracting Parties shall establish a prohibition of importation, exportation, or transit against the other, which shall not, under like circumstances, be applicable to any third country the most favoured in this respect.

In like manner in all that relates to local dues, customs formalities, brokerage, patterns, or samples introduced by commercial travellers, and all other matters connected with trade, British subjects in Serbia, and Servian subjects in the territories, including the Colonies and foreign possessions, of Her Britannic Majesty, shall enjoy most-favoured-nation treatment.

ARTICLE III.

The undermentioned goods the produce or manufacture of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the like goods the produce or manufacture of British Colonies and foreign possessions, shall, subject to the stipulations contained in Articles II. and VIII. of the present treaty, pay on importation into Serbia duty not exceeding 8 per cent. *ad valorem*, viz. :—

Metals and metal manufactures, whether of one metal or different metals in combination;
Tools and cutlery of all kinds;
Machines and machinery, and detached parts thereof;

Agricultural implements and machinery;
Yarns, threads, and textile manufactures of all descriptions;

Pottery and porcelain wares, and refined mineral oils.

Other goods, the produce or manufacture of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and British Colonies, and foreign possessions, shall pay, as the case may be, the specific duties in the Servian General or Conventional Tariff, or an *ad valorem* duty of 10 per cent., at the option of the importer.

ARTICLE IV.

British goods imported into Serbia shall not be subject to any other or higher local or other surcharges on customs duties than those which are now levied, namely :—

1. 20 centimes per 100 kilogrammes, for portage, where custom-house porters are employed;
2. 8 centimes per 100 kilogrammes for weighing;
3. 10 centimes per 100 kilogrammes for paving;
4. 5 centimes per 100 kilogrammes for warehousing. This duty shall be 10 centimes per 100 kilogrammes on explosive or combustible goods.

It is further agreed that any reduction in these surcharges which may be granted to the produce or manufactures of any third Power shall be at once extended to the like articles of British produce or manufacture.

ARTICLE V.

The duties *ad valorem* levied in Serbia on goods the produce or manufacture of the territories, including the Colonies and foreign possessions, of Her Britannic Majesty, shall be calculated on the value at the place of production or fabrication of the object imported, with the addition of the cost of transport, insurance, and commission necessary for the importation into Serbia as far as the port of discharge or place of entry.

For the levying of these duties the importer shall make a written declaration at the custom house stating the value and description of the goods imported. If the Custom house authorities shall be of opinion that the declared value is insufficient, they shall be at liberty to take the goods on paying to the importer the price declared, namely, the value at the place of production or fabrication of the object imported, with the addition

ARTICLE II.

Les produits et manufactures, ainsi que toutes les marchandises provenant des territoires, y compris les Colonies et les possessions étrangères, de Sa Majesté Britannique, qui sont importés en Serbie, et les produits et manufactures, ainsi que toutes les marchandises provenant de la Serbie, qui sont importés dans les territoires, y compris les possessions étrangères, de Sa Majesté Britannique, destinés à la consommation, l'entrepôt, la réexportation ou le transit, seront traités de la même manière et, spécialement, ne seront assujettis à aucuns droits généraux, municipaux, ou locaux, autres ou plus élevés que les produits, les manufactures, et les marchandises de toute tierce Puissance la plus favorisée sous ce rapport, excepté en ce qui concerne les facilités spéciales qui ont été ou qui pourront être concédées plus tard par la Serbie aux Etats voisins, par rapport au trafic local entre leurs districts frontiers limitrophes. Aucun droit autre ou plus élevé ne sera prélevé dans les territoires, y compris les Colonies et les possessions étrangères, de Sa Majesté Britannique, sur l'exportation d'aucune marchandise en Serbie, ni en Serbie sur l'exportation d'aucune marchandise dans les territoires, y compris les Colonies et les possessions étrangères, de Sa Majesté Britannique, que ceux qui pourront être perçus sur l'exportation des mêmes marchandises dans un tiers pays le plus favorisé sous ce rapport.

Aucune des Parties Contractantes n'établira à l'égard de l'autre une prohibition contre l'importation, l'exportation ou le transit, qui, dans les mêmes circonstances, ne sera pas applicable à tout tiers pays le plus favorisé sous ce rapport.

De même pour tout ce qui concerne les droits locaux, les formalités de douane, le courtage, les dessins de fabrique ou les échantillons introduits par des commis-voyageurs, ainsi que toutes autres affaires commerciales, les sujets Britanniques en Serbie et les sujets Serbes dans les territoires, y compris les Colonies et les possessions étrangères, de Sa Majesté Britannique, jouiront du traitement de la nation la plus favorisée.

ARTICLE III.

Les marchandises ci-dessous mentionnées d'origine ou de manufacture du Royaume-Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, ou les marchandises similaires d'origine ou de manufacture des Colonies et des possessions étrangères Britanniques, paieront, sauf les stipulations contenues dans les Articles II et VIII du présent Traité, à leur importation en Serbie, un droit *ad valorem* n'excédant pas 8 pour cent, savoir :—

Les métaux et manufactures de métaux, qu'elles soient d'un seul métal ou de plusieurs métaux combinés;
Les outils et la coutellerie de tout genre;
Les machines et mécaniques de tout genre, ainsi que les pièces détachées de machines ou de mécaniques;
Les instruments et machines agricoles;
Les fils à tisser et à coudre, ainsi que les manufactures textiles de tout genre;
La poterie et la porcelaine;
Les huiles minérales raffinées.

Les autres marchandises d'origine ou de manufacture du Royaume-Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, ou des Colonies et des possessions étrangères Britanniques, paieront à leur entrée en Serbie, au choix de l'importateur, soit les droits spécifiques du Tarif Serbe Général ou Conventionnel, selon le cas, soit un droit de 10 pour cent *ad valorem*.

ARTICLE IV.

Les marchandises Britanniques importées en Serbie ne seront assujetties à aucunes taxes additionnelles aux droits de Douanes, locales ou d'autre nature, nouvelles ou plus élevées, que celles qui sont perçues aujourd'hui, savoir :—

1. Pour le factage, 20 centimes par cent kilogrammes, et là seulement où ce service est fait par des employés de la Douane;
2. Pour le pesage, huit centimes par cent kilogrammes;
3. Pour le pavage, dix centimes par cent kilogrammes; et
4. Pour le magasinage, cinq centimes par cent kilogrammes. Cette taxe sera portée à dix centimes par cent kilogrammes pour les marchandises inflammables et explosibles.

Il est en outre convenu que toute réduction de ces taxes additionnelles qui pourra être accordée aux produits ou manufactures de toute tierce Puissance, sera immédiatement étendue aux mêmes articles d'origine ou de manufacture Britannique.

ARTICLE V.

Les droits *ad valorem* prélevés en Serbie sur les marchandises d'origine ou de manufacture des territoires, y compris les Colonies et les possessions étrangères, de Sa Majesté Britannique, seront calculés sur la valeur de l'objet importé, au lieu de production ou de fabrication, en y ajoutant les frais de transport, d'assurance, et de commission nécessaires pour l'importation en Serbie, jusqu'au port de décharge ou lieu d'entrée.

Pour la perception de ces droits, l'importation remettra à la Douane une déclaration écrite indiquant la valeur et la nature des marchandises importées. Si la douane est d'avis que la valeur déclarée est insuffisante, elle pourra garder les marchandises en payant à l'importateur le prix déclaré, c'est-à-dire la valeur de l'objet importé, au lieu de production ou de fabrication, augmentée des frais de transport, d'assurance, et de commission

of the cost of transport, insurance, and commission necessary for the importation into Servia as far as the port of discharge or place of entry, with an addition of 5 per cent.

This payment, together with the restitution of any duty which may have been levied upon such goods, shall be made within the fifteen days following the declaration.

Goods unaccompanied by the above-mentioned declaration shall not be entitled to the benefit of paying the *ad valorem* duties stipulated in the present Treaty, but shall be subjected to the specific or other duties charged in the Servian General or Conventional Tariff.

ARTICLE VI.

The Servian Government reserves to itself the right, after an understanding with Her Majesty's Legation, to limit to certain places the custom houses through which goods charged *ad valorem* may enter Servia.

The Servian Government likewise reserves to itself the right to require that the importer shall produce, together with his declaration of value on the entry of the goods into Servia, one or other, at his option, of the following documents, namely:—

- (1.) A declaration of value made before a magistrate at the place of production or manufacture;
- (2.) A certificate of value from the Chamber of Commerce at the place; or
- (3.) A declaration of value made before the nearest Servian Consul. The fee of such Consul on certifying this declaration shall not exceed five shillings.

ARTICLE VII.

If one of the Contracting Parties shall impose an excise tax, that is to say, an inland duty, upon any article of home production or manufacture, an equivalent compensatory duty may be imposed on articles of the same description on their importation from the territories of the other Power, provided that the said equivalent duty is levied on like articles on their importation from all foreign countries.

In the event of the reduction or suppression of excise taxes, that is to say, inland duties, a corresponding reduction or suppression shall at the same time be made in the equivalent compensatory duty on manufactures of British or Servian origin, as the case may be.

ARTICLE VIII.

Every reduction in the Tariff of import and export duties, as well as every favour or immunity which has been or may hereafter be granted by one of the Contracting Parties to the subjects or commerce of a third Power, shall be granted simultaneously and unconditionally to the other, except as regards such special facilities as have been, or may hereafter be, conceded on the part of Servia to the neighbouring States, with respect to the local traffic between their continuous frontier districts.

ARTICLE IX.

British subjects in Servia and Servian subjects in the territories, including the Colonies and foreign possessions, of Her Britannic Majesty, shall enjoy the same rights as natives, or as are now granted, or may hereafter be granted, to the subjects of any third Power the most favored in this respect in everything relating to the property in trade marks and trade labels or tickets, as well as in patterns and designs for manufacturers. It is understood that any person who desires to obtain the aforesaid protection must fulfil the formalities required by the laws of the respective countries.

ARTICLE X.

Each of the Contracting Parties may appoint Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, Pro-Consuls, and Consular Agents to reside respectively in towns and ports in the territories of the other power. Such Consular officers, however, shall not enter upon their functions until after they shall have been approved and admitted in the usual form by the Government to which they are sent. They shall exercise whatever functions, and enjoy whatever privileges, exemptions, and immunities are, or may hereafter be, granted there to Consular officers of the most favoured nation.

ARTICLE XI.

It is agreed that, as regards freights and all other facilities, British goods conveyed over Servian railways, and Servian goods conveyed over British railways, shall be treated in exactly the same manner as the goods of any other nation the most favoured in that respect.

ARTICLE XII.

British ships and their cargoes shall, in Servia, and Servian vessels and their cargoes shall in the territories, including the Colonies and foreign possessions, of Her Britannic Majesty, from whatever place arriving, and whatever may be the place of origin or destination of their cargoes, be treated in every respect as national ships and their cargoes.

The preceding stipulation applies to local treatment, dues, and charges in the ports, basins, docks, roadsteads, harbours, and rivers of the two countries, pilotage, and generally to all matters connected with navigation.

Every favour or exemption in these respects, or any other privilege in matters of navigation which either of the Contracting Parties shall grant to a third Power, shall be extended immediately and unconditionally to the other party.

All vessels which, according to British law, are to be deemed British vessels, and all vessels which, according to Servian law, are to be deemed Servian vessels, shall, for the purposes of this Treaty, be respectively deemed British or Servian vessels.

Le Gouvernement Serbe se réserve le droit de limiter, d'accord avec la Légation de Sa Majesté Britannique, à certaines localités les douanes par lesquelles les marchandises assujetties aux droits *ad valorem* pourront être introduites en Serbie.

Le Gouvernement Serbe se réserve de même le droit d'exiger de l'importateur qu'il produise, à l'introduction en Serbie des marchandises, outre la déclaration de valeur, un des documents suivants, laissé à son choix:—

- (1.) Une déclaration de valeur dressé par devant le magistrat du lieu de production de la marchandise;
- (2.) Un certificat de valeur délivré par la Chambre de Commerce du lieu de production;
- (3.) Une déclaration de valeur dressée par devant le Consul Serbe du lieu le plus proche. La taxe à percevoir par le dit Consul pour la délivrance de cette pièce ne pourra excéder 5 shillings (soit 6 fr. 25).

ARTICLE VII.

Si l'une des Parties Contractantes établit un droit d'accise, c'est-à-dire un droit intérieur sur un produit quelconque du sol ou de l'industrie nationale, un droit compensateur équivalent pourra être perçu sur les produits similaires importés du territoire de l'autre Puissance, pourvu que le dit droit compensateur soit perçu sur les produits similaires de tout autre pays étranger, à leur importation.

Dans le cas de réduction ou suppression des droits d'accise, c'est-à-dire droits intérieurs, une réduction équivalente ou suppression sera en même temps opérée sur le droit compensateur prélevé sur les produits d'origine Britannique ou Serbe, selon le cas.

ARTICLE VIII.

Toute réduction dans le Tarif des droits d'importation, ou d'exportation ainsi que toute faveur et immunité, qui ont été ou qui pourront être accordées par l'une des Parties Contractantes aux sujets ou au commerce d'une tierce Puissance, seront accordées simultanément et sans conditions à l'autre, excepté en ce qui concerne les facilités spéciales qui ont été ou qui pourront être accordées plus tard par la Serbie aux Etats voisins, par rapport au trafic local entre leurs districts frontières limitrophes.

ARTICLE IX.

Les sujets Britanniques en Serbie et les sujets Serbes dans les territoires, y compris les Colonies et les possessions étrangères, de Sa Majesté Britannique, jouiront des mêmes droits que les nationaux ou de ceux qui sont présentement accordés ou qui pourront être accordés à l'avenir, aux sujets de toute tierce Puissance la plus favorisée sous ce rapport, pour tout ce qui concerne la propriété, soit des marques de commerce ou autres marques particulières indiquant l'origine ou la qualité des marchandises, soit des modèles ou dessins de fabrique.

ARTICLE X.

Chacune des Parties Contractantes pourra nommer des Consuls-Généraux, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, Pro-Consuls, et Agents Consulaires pour résider dans les villes et ports des territoires de l'autre Puissance. Ces Agents Consulaires n'entreront cependant pas en fonctions avant d'avoir été reconnus et admis, dans la forme habituelle, par le Gouvernement auprès duquel ils sont accrédités. Ils auront le droit d'exercer les mêmes fonctions, et ils jouiront des mêmes privilèges, exemptions, et immunités, qui sont ou qui seront à l'avenir accordés aux Agents Consulaires de la nation la plus favorisée.

ARTICLE XI.

Il est convenu que, en ce qui regarde les frais de transport et toute autre facilité, les marchandises Britanniques transportées sur les chemins de fer Serbes, et les marchandises Serbes transportées sur les chemins de fer Britanniques, seront traitées exactement de la même manière que les marchandises de toute autre nation la plus favorisée sous le dit rapport.

ARTICLE XII.

Les navires Britanniques et leurs cargaisons en Serbie et les navires Serbes et leurs cargaisons dans les territoires, y compris les Colonies et les possessions étrangères, de Sa Majesté Britannique, à leur arrivée d'un port quelconque, et quel que soit le lieu d'origine ou de destination de leur cargaison, jouiront, sous tous les rapports du même traitement que les navires nationaux et leurs cargaisons.

La stipulation précédente se réfère au traitement local, aux droits et aux frais dans les ports, les bassins, les docks, les rades, les havres, et les rivières des deux pays, au pilotage, et en général à tout ce qui se rapporte à la navigation.

Toute faveur ou exemptions sous ces rapports, ou tout autre privilège en fait de navigation, que l'une des Parties Contractantes accordera à une tierce Puissance, sera immédiatement et sans conditions étendu à l'autre partie.

Tout navire qui, en conformité des lois Britanniques, doit être considéré comme navire Britannique, et tout navire Serbe qui, en conformité des lois Serbes doit être considéré comme navire Serbe, seront pour l'application du présent Traité, considérés réciproquement comme navires Britanniques ou Serbes.

ARTICLE XIII.

In consideration of the present Treaty, and as contemplated by the xxxviiith Article of the Treaty concluded at Berlin on the 13th July 1878, Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland consents to surrender the privileges and immunities hitherto enjoyed by her subjects in Servia, in virtue of the Capitulations between Great Britain and the Ottoman Empire as agreed upon, augmented, and altered at different periods, and finally confirmed by the Treaty of Peace concluded at the Dardanelles on the 5th January 1830.

Provided always, and it is hereby expressly agreed, that the said Capitulations shall, as regards all judicial matters except those affecting real estate in Servia, remain in full force as far as they concern the mutual relations between British subjects and the subjects of those other Powers, which, having a right to the privileges and immunities accorded by the aforesaid Capitulations, shall not have surrendered them.

ARTICLE XIV.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications exchanged at Belgrade as soon as possible after it shall have been approved by the Serbian National Assembly. It shall come into force immediately after the exchange of the ratifications, and shall remain in force for ten years from that date. In case neither of the two Contracting Parties shall have given notice, twelve months before the expiration of the said period of ten years, of their intention of terminating the present Treaty, it shall, in fact, continue to be in force until the expiration of a day on which either of the Contracting Parties shall have given such notice.

Mr. Gould to the Marquis of Salisbury—(Received March 20.)

My Lord,

Nisch, February 7, 1880.

The 6th Article of the Treaty of Friendship and Commerce concluded this day contains a stipulation reserving to the Servian Government the right, after an understanding with Her Majesty's Legation, to limit the places of entry for goods liable to *ad valorem* duties. I have, therefore, lost no time in ascertaining their views on the subject. The result is, as your Lordship will see from the correspondence herewith enclosed, that the Servian Government have decided to restrict for the present the importation of goods liable to *ad valorem* duties to Belgrade and Vranja, the two principal places of entry on their northern and southern frontiers.

WE, the Council of the Shire of Dandenong, being the duly appointed Committee of Management of Dandenong and Attenborough Parks, within the Shire of Dandenong, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

Regulations.

- 1st. The parks shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
- 2nd. No person shall enter or remain in either of the parks who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3rd. No person shall damage in any way the ti-tree, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the parks.
- 4th. No fires shall be lit in the parks without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.
- 5th. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the parks.
- 6th. No person shall put in the parks any cattle, goats, or pigs without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
- 7th. No person shall erect any dwelling in the parks nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any

article without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

8th. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the parks shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 (Five pounds) for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10 (Ten pounds).

RULES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE RUTHERGLEN MUNICIPAL COMMON.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these Regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, horses, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, mules, asses, and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

2. Every ratepayer shall be entitled to depasture four head of large cattle, or an equivalent number of small cattle.

3. The fees payable shall be 3s. per head for horned cattle; small cattle, 1s. 4d. per head; horses, 6s. per head.

The fees shall be paid in advance every 3 months, commencing on the 1st day of October 1880. No fee will be charged for any cattle under 9 months old, but stock under 9 months old shall be registered by the herdsman.

4. No bull shall be permitted on the common, unless under the permission of the managers.

The managers shall appoint a herdsman, whose duty it shall be to brand all cattle entitled to be depastured with the common brand, and he shall register the same in a book to be provided for that purpose.

He shall also muster, into the commons yard, all cattle running upon the common unbranded, and in the event of non-payment of commonage fees, after notice shall have been given to the owners of such cattle unbranded, he shall forthwith impound such cattle.

The borough herdsman shall collect the commonage fees, and pay such fees to the Clerk of the Rutherglen Borough within 7 days after collection; such payment must be accompanied with a written statement of the amounts collected, and the receipt of the Clerk of the borough will be a sufficient acknowledgment of such payment.

Payment of fees may be enforced before any court of petty sessions.

The herdsman shall impound all trespassing stock, and he shall pay over weekly to the Clerk of the Rutherglen Borough all fees received from poundage.

Travelling stock shall be allowed the privilege allowed by law.

The herdsman shall inspect the pound list at Rutherglen twice a week, and the Chiltern pound list once a week, and in the event of stock registered upon the common being impounded he shall send notice immediately to the owners thereof.
