PROCEEDINGS AT AND FOR THE ELECTION FOR
THE EASTERN PROVINCE DECLARED VALID.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it was amongst other things enacted, that no election should be void in consequence only of there having been no Returning Officer at the time of the issue of the writ or of any delay in the return of the writ; and where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission should have happened the Governor-in-Council might take all such measures as might be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission; or might declare any or all of the proceedings at or for any election valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and every such Order in Council should state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and should be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the Returning Officer for the Eastern Province, after the issue of the writ, dated the twenty-seventh day of August last, for the election of a Member to serve in the Legislative Council for the said Province, discovered that he and the Superintendent of Police acting in the locality had in error certified Tatura to be within the Waranga division instead of within the Echuca division of the said Province: And whereas Tatura was, in pursuance of such certificate, appointed by the Governor in Council to be a Polling-place for the Waranga division of the said Province named in such certificate, and was in accordance therewith inserted as such in the writ dated as aforesaid: And whereas the poll was taken at Tatura in accordance with the writ as issued for the Province aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and under the authority given in and by the 131st section of *The Electoral Act 1865*, No. 279, do hereby declare valid all the proceedings at or for the aforesaid election for the Eastern Province, notwithstanding such accidental misfeasance as aforesaid.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this seventh day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty, and in the forty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.
