REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH DUTIABLE GOODS MAY BE IMPORTED AND DELIVERED FOR EXHIBITION PURPOSES AT THE FORTHCOMING INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION, TO BE HELD AT MELBOURNE IN 1880, FREE OF DUTY.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the amendment of clauses 5 and 6 of the above Regulations, dated 18th November 1879, and which appeared in the *Government Gazette* of 21st idem, No. 113. The clauses referred to will now read as follow:—

5. Subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Customs, or such officer as may be duly authorized by him, wines, spirits and beer may be delivered for consumption within the premises of the Commissioners without payment of duty.

6. In the event of any exhibits being cleared for home consumption duty shall be charged thereon, and shall be at the rate and according to the quantities or amounts recorded in the books of the Customs Department on importation and warehousing unless as regards goods liable to a fixed rate of duty, and upon such an abatement may be allowed under the Customs Act; or in the case of goods subject to an *ad valorem* rate of duty upon such value as may be fixed by the Commissioner of Customs, or officer duly authorized by him; a declaration to be made by the seller stating the prices at which such goods have been sold.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

*The Public Works Statute 1865, section 128.*—"It shall be lawful for any officer or agent of the board or company, and all persons called by him to his assistance, to seize and detain any person who shall have committed any offence against the provisions of this part of this Act or of the bye-laws made under the authority of this Act, and whose name and residence shall be unknown to such officer or agent, and give him in charge to a police constable who shall convey him with all convenient despatch before some justice without any warrant or other authority than this Act; and such justice shall proceed with all convenient despatch to the hearing and determining of the complaint against such offender."

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint each and every of the persons named in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purpose of carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the 128th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and also at any time hereafter to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the provisions of Part III. of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, or of any bye-law made or to be made under the authority of such Act; and to summon such person before any justice or justices for such offence, or to charge him or her with such offence.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Board of Land and Works.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506)* it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Order, amongst other things, altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was also enacted that any error in any Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act might be rectified by the Governor in Council by any subsequent Order: And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the third day of November One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, constituting the shire of Euron and re-defining the shire of Benalla, the boundaries of the shire of Benalla were incorrectly described, and it is expedient to rectify and re-define the same: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke so much of the hereinbefore-mentioned Order in Council of the third day of November One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine as relates to the shire of Benalla, and doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said shire in manner following, that is to say:—

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish the undermentioned Common, that is to say:—

THE DRYSDALE COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 26th February 1872, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom two hundred acres, more or less, of land, being the portion comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz. —County of Grant, parish of Bellarine, part of allotments 1 and 2 of section 3: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 1a; thence east by a road forty-five chains forty-two links; thence south forty-seven chains seventy links; thence west forty-seven chains ninety links; and thence northerly by a road to the point of commencement.—(78.R.7619).

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE FRYER'S CREEK DIGGINGS, THE DAYLESFORD, THE YANDOOT, THE HEPBURN, THE TARADALE, THE ANDERSON'S CREEK, AND THE ST. ANDREW'S GOLDFIELD COMMONS, IN THE CASTLEMAINE MINING DISTRICT.

THE Mining Board of Castlemaine, in pursuance of the Regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 1st day of April 1879, having drafted the following Regulations for the Management of the above-named Commons, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Commons.

Regulations.

- 1st. All persons entitled to depasture stock on the above-named Commons will be allowed to do so subject to the following Regulations.
- 2nd. The fees payable for depasturing stock shall be for cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, mules, and swine, 2s per head per annum; and for sheep and goats, 1s. per head per annum.
- 3rd. The fees shall be payable half-yearly in advance, the half-years commencing respectively on the First day of October and the First day of April in each year.
- 4th. Special licenses may be granted to butchers or to slaughtermen to depasture for such periods of time as may be agreed upon cattle intended for slaughter, but the fees charged shall not be at a proportionately less rate than 2s. per head per annum for large and 1s. per head per annum for small cattle.
- 5th. The progeny of stock for whose dams commonage fees have been paid shall be allowed to run free until they are twelve months old.
- 6th. No entire horses, pigs, or animals affected with any contagious disease, shall be allowed to depasture on the Commons.
- 7th. Bulls may be allowed to run on the Commons on payment of the usual fees, but if they are objected to by the managers of the Commons the owners shall be allowed three (3) days to remove the same, and if the owners shall fail to do so, such bulls shall be liable to be impounded.
- 8th. All goats depasturing on the Commons must have a triangle on their necks at least one foot six inches on the side, or they will be liable to be impounded, whether the fees have been paid or not.
- 9th. All stock for which fees shall have been paid shall be branded with the Commons' brand, and the owners shall, when required by the herdsman, muster the same, and render every assistance to the herdsman in carrying out this Regulation.
- 10th. All stock other than travelling cattle found depasturing on the Commons, and for which no commonage fee shall have been paid, shall be liable to be impounded.
- 11th. No person or persons shall knowingly and wilfully depasture without the authority, in writing, of the managers in that behalf, any cattle or sheep on any of the said Commons, or interfere with or disturb any cattle or sheep legally depasturing thereon.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and might from time to time, after one month's notice should be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works might issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee, as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, in accordance with the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, revoke the Proclamations of the timber reserves dated respectively the 14th October 1878 and the 4th May 1874, to the extent hereinafter described, that is to say:—

**BAEL BAEL TIMBER RESERVE.**—The Proclamation, bearing date the 14th October 1878, by which a reserve made for the preservation and growth of Timber, situate in the parish of Bael Bael, and comprising an area of one thousand seven hundred and fifty acres, more or less, of land was proclaimed, is hereby revoked.—(80.S.20801).

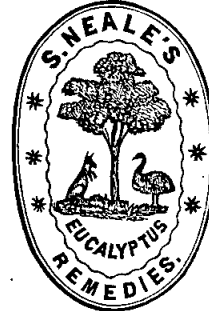
