No. 506, § 19, 33, and 49), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Alberton therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Alberton the portion of the shire described in such petition and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the Shire of Traralgon; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Alberton as hereby diminished, and of the said Shire of Traralgon now added to, in manner following, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF ALBERTON.—Commencing at the mouth of Merriman's Creek, in the county of Buln Buln; thence by that creek to its source, being the south-west angle of the Shire of Rosedale; thence westerly by a line to the junction of the tracks from Morwell and Rosedale to Stockyard Creek, *via* Mt. Fatigue; thence southerly by that track to Mt. Fatigue; thence by a line due west from Mt. Fatigue to the Tarwin River; thence northerly by the Tarwin River and Lydiard's track to the south boundary of the Shire of Narracan; thence west by that boundary to the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington; thence southerly by the boundary of that county to the sea-coast; and thence by the sea-coast to the commencing point.

ALEXANDRA RACE-COURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, George Whiting, Richard Edwards, William Dodd, Calvert Harker, and Frederick Wheeler, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Alexandra Race-course and Recreation reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

- The reserve is parcelled out into the following divisions, viz.—1st, grand stand; 2nd, saddling paddock; 3rd, running ground; 4th, garden and cricket ground; 5th, residue of the reserve.
- Every person paying for admission to the 1st and 2nd divisions, or to any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission which shall on demand be produced and, if required, surrendered to any gate-keeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production or surrender of the same.
- No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- No person shall climb over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage the same, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
- No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, or light fires therein without the permission in writing of the committee of management.
- No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
- Any person who may have obtained the consent in writing of the committee of management to the erection within the reserve of any structure, &c., for special purposes, shall be bound by any order made by the committee of management in regard thereto.
- The committee of management may allow any part of the reserve to be depastured by quiet stock, the proceeds of such agistment to be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.
- Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, or may or shall be in possession, of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof.
 - Assaulting any other person.
 - Being drunk.
 - Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during a cricket match or sports, or during practice at cricket, or crossing or trespassing on the running ground during the time any race is being run, or when crossing or trespassing on such cricket ground or race-course would be injurious to the same as a cricket ground or race-course.
 - Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
 - Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
 - Behaving improperly or riotously.

(7.) Not producing or surrendering (if required) to any gate-keeper or other person having authority from the committee of management, to demand, produce, or surrender a ticket duly authorizing admission to that part of the reserve where such person shall be found.

10. The following fees shall be charged and taken for admission on such days as the committee shall appoint:—

Of each person to the first division, such sum as the committee may determine, not exceeding ten shillings (10s.).

For admission of each person to the second division, such sum as the committee may determine, not exceeding five shillings (5s.).

For admission at the gates of a truck or wheelbarrow, 2s. 6d.

For each horse not entered for any race, 2s. 6d.; for each vehicle drawn by one horse, 2s. 6d.; for each vehicle drawn by more than one horse, 2s. 6d., for each horse, and for admission to the reserve for training purposes, £1 for each half-year.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations and shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and may be taken before a justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

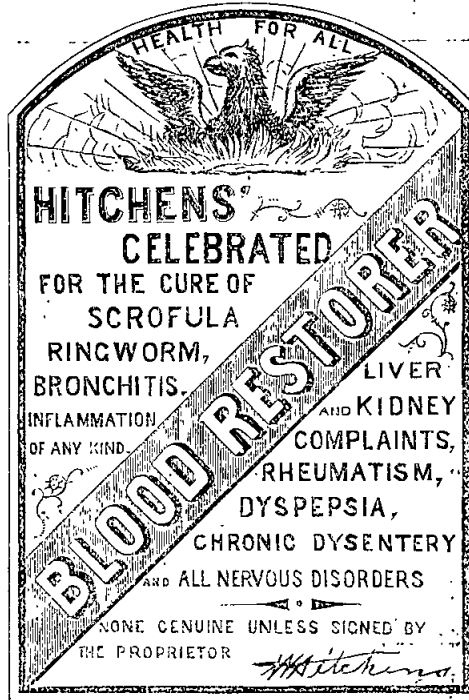

BYE-LAW No. 19, FIXING A SCALE OF CHARGES FOR WATER SUPPLIED BY MEASURE, AND A MINIMUM QUANTITY OF WATER TO BE CHARGED FOR IN CASES WHERE WATER IS SO SUPPLIED, AND DETERMINING THE TIME AT WHICH SUCH CHARGE SHALL BE PAYABLE.

THE Council of the Borough of Hamilton doth hereby, in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by "The Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872," fix the following scale of charges for water supplied by measure, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied, and determine the time at which such charge shall be payable, that is to say:—

The charges for water supplied by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Council, shall be at the rate of Two shillings per thousand gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

The charges shall be paid in advance quarterly, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in each year.

The charge for water supplied at stand-pipes shall be Sixpence for each 100 gallons, or fraction of 100 gallons, provided that any person rated for water supplied shall not be called upon to pay for water drawn from stand-pipes if such water is to be used only for domestic purposes at the premises assessed.

The foregoing Bye-law was made and passed by the Council of the Borough of Hamilton on the twenty-seventh day of October A.D. 1880.

BOROUGH OF HAMILTON.

BYE-LAW No. 20 OF THE BOROUGH OF HAMILTON, MADE UNDER SECTION 213 OF "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1874," AND NUMBERED 20, FOR REGULATING THE SUPPLY AND DISTRIBUTION OF WATER FROM WATERWORKS UNDER THE MANAGEMENT OF THE COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Hamilton order as follows:—

1. All service-pipes, with the necessary ferrules, stop and bib cocks, shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Council may appoint.

2. Lead piping of not less than the following weights per yard, viz:—¾ inch internal diameter, 3 lbs.; ½ inch, 3½ lbs.; ⅝ inch, 4½ lbs.; ¾ inch, 8 lbs.; 1 inch, 10½ lbs.; 1½ inch, 12½ lbs.; and 1½ inch, 15 lbs.; and galvanized iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services. Ordinary connections with mains must be made with proper ferrules, and those to the 9-inch main to have screw-down stop-cock ferrules. For iron services, a length of not less than three feet of lead pipe must be attached to the ferrules. In making connections to 3-inch and 4-inch mains, the ferrule is not to be let into the main but into a wrought-iron bolted strap 3 inches wide by ½ inch thick, with vulcanized indianrubber washer under.

3. Every service-pipe must be provided with a stop-cock, with movable key or handle, fixed in the footway or open space in front of any house or tenement, protected by an iron box or casing, according to pattern to be seen at the Borough Surveyor's office.

4. The ferrules, stop, bib, and ball cocks shall be of strong hard brass, as nearly as possible similar to patterns at the Borough Surveyor's office; the drawing cocks shall be high-pressure screw-down cocks. No other description of cocks shall be used without the written permission of the Borough Surveyor first had and obtained.

5. No person, except the officer or servant of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, on some member of a Fire Brigade for the purpose of extinguishing a fire, shall be allowed to shut off or turn on water in the main pipes of the Council.

6. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

7. Overflow pipes to baths will not be permitted.

8. No screwed tap attached to a pipe supplied with water by the Council, to which a hose could be attached, shall be placed in any garden or yard, or in or outside of any dwelling or premises, unless a water meter be fixed, and the water supplied by such pipe be by measure.

9. Every service-pipe or branch service-pipe connected with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water shall have affixed thereto a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the index of the meter.

10. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Council for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden, footpath, or road, unless where a water meter is fixed, and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this provision shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

11. In the foregoing bye-law, whenever the word "Council" occurs it shall be held to mean "The Council of the Borough of Hamilton," and whenever the words "officer" or "servant" occur, the same shall be deemed and taken to be an officer or servant of the Council duly authorized in that behalf.
