“THE BEER DUTY ACT 1880.”

THE following sections of the above-named Act, and Regulation framed under the provisions thereof, are published for general information.

SECTIONS.

18. *Penalty for refusal or neglect to cut Stamp.*—Every person who shall open any hogshead, barrel, cask, vessel, or other receptacle to which any stamp is affixed, shall cut such stamp into two or more pieces at the time of such opening; and if any person refuses or neglects so to do, he shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each hogshead, barrel, cask, vessel, or other receptacle in respect of which there is any such refusal or neglect.

19. *Penalty for withdrawing Beer without destroying Stamp.*—Whenever any retail dealer in beer knowingly and wilfully withdraws or aids in the withdrawal of any beer from any hogshead, barrel, cask, vessel, or other receptacle containing the same without destroying or defacing the stamp affixed thereon, or withdraws or aids in the withdrawal of any beer from any hogshead, barrel, cask, vessel, or other receptacle upon which the proper stamp has not been affixed, or on which a false or fraudulent stamp is affixed, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

23. *Penalty for certain offences.*—Whenever any brewer, carrier, or other person knowingly sells, removes, receives, or purchases, or in any way aids in the sale, removal, receipt, or purchase of any beer contained in any hogshead, barrel, cask, vessel, or other receptacle from any brewery upon which the proper stamp or permit in case of removal required by law has not been affixed, or on which a false or fraudulent stamp or permit is affixed, or on which a stamp or permit once cancelled is again used, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

REGULATION.

7. When beer is being delivered or forwarded from any brewery, it must be accompanied by a cart note, upon which the words *duly stamped* shall be written or printed in red ink by the person to whom the beer is delivered.

ADDITIONAL REGULATION UNDER “THE TOBACCO ACT 1880.”

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following Additional Regulation under Clause 18 of *The Tobacco Act 1880*, viz. :—

If any person shall carry on the trade or business of a dealer in tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, or snuff without first having registered or renewed the registration of his or her name and premises, or provided a license, as required by *The Tobacco Act 1880*, every such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds (£100); and no registration shall be considered complete until the license fee, as aforesaid, shall have been paid to a Receiver of Revenue or other person appointed to receive the same.

SHIRE OF WIMMERA AND PROPOSED BOROUGH OF HORSHAM.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 39th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to the Governor in Council, are published, viz:—

The Petitioners are 153 in number, and state they are inhabitant householders within the area sought to be constituted a Borough; that during the last few years the Town of Horsham has grown rapidly in size and importance, and they are of opinion that its sanitary condition and commercial prospects would be improved if constituted a separate municipality; further, that a strong feeling of distrust and jealousy exists between the town and country ratepayers which would be removed if such action was taken, and they pray, therefore, that the area hereinafter described shall be severed from the Shire of Wimmera, and constituted a separate municipality, to be named the Borough of Horsham; that the number of Councillors be nine, and that the proposed Borough be not subdivided.

loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove stone from the unappropriated Crown lands lying between the north-eastern boundary of sections 14 and 15, town of Wyndham and the Werribee River, and extending from the north-west boundary of section 2A to the eastern boundary of allotment 5B of section 18, parish of Mambourin, or shall exercise on any such portions of Crown lands the powers or any of them conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act.—(80. W. 14635).

The committee may refuse admission of any vehicle which they may consider would damage the reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
