VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

*The Public Works Statute 1865, section 128.*—"It shall be lawful for any officer or agent of the board or company, and all persons called by him to his assistance, to seize and detain any person who shall have committed any offence against the provisions of this part of this Act or of the bye-laws made under the authority of this Act, and whose name and residence shall be unknown to such officer or agent, and give him in charge to a police constable who shall convey him with all convenient despatch before some justice without any warrant or other authority than this Act; and such justice shall proceed with all convenient despatch to the hearing and determining of the complaint against such offender."

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint the person named in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purpose of carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the 128th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and also at any time hereafter to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the provisions of Part III. of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, or of any bye-law made or to be made under the authority of such Act; and to summon such person before any justice or justices for such offence, or to charge him or her with such offence.

## REVISED REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTING COLLISIONS AT SEA.

THE Governor has directed the subjoined Circular Despatch and Enclosures to be published for general information.

Sir,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your government, copies of the Order in Council of the 14th of August 1879, respecting the revised regulations for preventing collisions at sea, and also copies of the Order in Council of the 24th of March 1880 on the same subject.

At the Court at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, the 14th day of August 1879.

Present :

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1869*, it was enacted that on and after the first day of June One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, or such later day as might be fixed for the purpose by Order in Council, the regulations contained in the table marked C in the schedule to the said Act should come into operation and be of the same force as if they were enacted in the body of the said Act; but that Her Majesty might from time to time, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, by Order in Council, annul or modify any of the said regulations, or make new regulations in addition thereto or in substitution therefor; and that any alterations in, or additions to, such regulations made in manner aforesaid should be of the same force as the regulations in the said schedule :

And whereas, by the same Act it was further provided, that whenever it should be made to appear to Her Majesty that the Government of any foreign country was willing that the regulations for preventing collisions contained in table C in the schedule to the said Act, or such other regulations for preventing collisions as are for the time being in force under the said Act, should apply to the ships of such country when beyond the limits of British jurisdiction, Her Majesty might, by Order in Council, direct that such regulations should apply to the ships of the said foreign country, whether within British jurisdiction or not; and it was further provided by the said Act, that whenever an Order in Council had been issued applying any regulation made by or in pursuance of the said Act to the ships of any foreign country, such ships should, in all cases arising in any British court, be deemed to be subject to such regulation, and should, for the purpose of such regulation, be treated as if they were British ships :

And whereas by an Order in Council made in pursuance of the said recited Act, and dated the ninth day of January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, Her Majesty was pleased to direct :—First, that the regulations contained in the schedule to the said Act should be modified by the substitution for such regulations of certain regulations appended to the said Order :

Secondly, that the said regulations appended to the said Order should, on and after the first day of June One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, apply to French ships, whether within British jurisdiction or not :

And whereas, by several Orders in Council subsequently made, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the regulations appended to the said Order of the ninth of January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three should apply to ships of the countries specified in the said Orders, whether within British jurisdiction or not :

And whereas, by Order in Council dated the thirtieth day of July One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight Her Majesty, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, was pleased to make certain additions to the regulations appended to the said first-recited Order in Council, for the purpose of explaining articles 11 and 13 of the said regulations, and of removing doubt and misapprehension concerning the effect of the said two articles :

And whereas the Admiralty and the Board of Trade have jointly recommended to Her Majesty, that the regulations contained in the Order in Council dated the ninth day of January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and the additions to the said regulations contained in the said Order in Council of the thirtieth day of July One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, shall be annulled from the first day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty, and that there shall be substituted for the said regulations and additions respectively the new regulations hereinafter set forth :

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the Governments of the several Foreign countries mentioned in the second schedule hereto are respectively willing that the regulations contained in the first schedule hereto shall apply to ships of the said countries respectively, whether within British jurisdiction or not :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct :—

First, that on and after the first day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty the regulations appended to the said Order in Council of the ninth day of January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three and the additions to the said regulations contained in the said Order in Council of the thirtieth day of July One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight shall be annulled, and that there shall be substituted for the said regulations and additions respectively the new regulations contained in the first schedule hereto,

Second, that the said regulations contained in the first schedule hereto shall, from and after the first day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty, apply to ships of the countries mentioned in the second schedule hereto, whether within British jurisdiction or not.

## First Schedule.

## REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTING COLLISIONS AT SEA.

## Preliminary.

Art. 1. In the following rules every steam ship which is under sail and not under steam is to be considered a sailing ship; and every steam ship which is under steam, whether under sail or not, is to be considered a ship under steam.

## Rules concerning Lights.

Art. 2. The lights mentioned in the following Articles, numbered 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11, and no others, shall be carried in all weathers from sunset to sunrise.

Art. 3. A seagoing steam ship when under way shall carry—

(a.) On or in front of the foremast, at a height above the hull of not less than 20 feet, and if the breadth of the ship exceeds 20 feet then at a height above the hull not less than such breadth, a bright white light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 20 points of the compass; so fixed as to throw the light 10 points on each side of the ship, viz., from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on either side; and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least five miles.

(b.) On the starboard side, a green light so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass; so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on the starboard side; and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least two miles.

(c.) On the port side, a red light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass; so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on the port side; and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least two miles.

(d.) The said green and red side lights shall be fitted with inboard screens projecting at least three feet forward from the light, so as to prevent these lights from being seen across the bow.

Art. 4. A steam ship, when towing another ship, shall, in addition to her side lights, carry two bright white lights in a vertical line one over the other, not less than three feet apart, so as to distinguish her from other steam ships. Each of these lights shall be of the same construction and character, and shall be carried in the same position as the white light which other steam ships are required to carry.

Art. 5. A ship, whether a steam ship or a sailing ship, when employed either in laying or in picking up a telegraph cable, or which from any accident is not under command, shall at night carry, in the same position as the white light which steam ships are required to carry, and, if a steam ship, in place of that light, three red lights in globular lanterns, each not less than 10 inches in diameter, in a vertical line one over the other, not less than three feet apart; and shall by day carry in a vertical line one over the other, not less than three feet apart, in front of but not lower than her foremast head, three black balls or shapes, each two feet in diameter.

These shapes and lights are to be taken by approaching ships as signals that the ship using them is not under command, and cannot therefore get out of the way.

The above ships, when not making any way through the water, shall not carry the side lights, but when making way shall carry them.

Art. 6. A sailing ship under way, or being towed, shall carry the same lights as are provided by article 3 for a steam ship under way, with the exception of the white light, which she shall never carry.

Art. 7. Whenever, as in the case of small vessels during bad weather, the green and red side lights cannot be fixed, these lights shall be kept on deck, on their respective sides of the vessel, ready for use; and shall, on the approach of or to other vessels, be exhibited on their respective sides in sufficient time to prevent collision, in such manner as to make them most visible, and so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side nor the red light on the starboard side.

To make the use of these portable lights more certain and easy the lanterns containing them shall each be painted outside with the color of the light they respectively contain, and shall be provided with proper screens.

Art. 8. A ship, whether a steam ship or a sailing ship, when at anchor, shall carry, where it can best be seen, but at a height

not exceeding 20 feet above the hull, a white light, in a globular lantern of not less than eight inches in diameter, and so constructed as to show a clear uniform and unbroken light, visible all round the horizon, at a distance of at least one mile.

Art. 9. A pilot vessel, when engaged on her station on pilotage duty, shall not carry the lights required for other vessels, but shall carry a white light at the masthead, visible all round the horizon, and shall also exhibit a flare-up light or flare-up lights at short intervals, which shall never exceed fifteen minutes.

A pilot vessel, when not engaged on her station on pilotage duty, shall carry lights similar to those of other ships.

Art. 10. (a.) Open fishing boats and other open boats when under way shall not be obliged to carry the side lights required for other vessels; but every such boat shall in lieu thereof have ready at hand a lantern with a green glass on the one side and a red glass on the other side; and on the approach of or to other vessels such lantern shall be exhibited in sufficient time to prevent collision, so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side nor the red light on the starboard side.

(b.) A fishing vessel, and an open boat, when at anchor, shall exhibit a bright white light.

(c.) A fishing vessel, when employed in drift net fishing, shall carry on one of her masts two red lights in a vertical line one over the other, not less than three feet apart.

(d.) A trawler at work shall carry on one of her masts two lights in a vertical line one over the other, not less than three feet apart, the upper light red and the lower green, and shall also either carry the side lights required for other vessels, or, if the side lights cannot be carried, have ready at hand the colored lights as provided in Article 7, or a lantern with a red and a green glass as described in paragraph (a.) of this article.

(e.) Fishing vessels and open boats shall not be prevented from using a flare-up in addition, if they desire to do so.

(f.) The lights mentioned in this article are substituted for those mentioned in the 12th, 13th, and 14th Articles of the Convention between France and England scheduled to *The British Sea Fisheries Act 1868*.

(g.) All lights required by this article, except side lights, shall be in globular lanterns so constructed as to show all round the horizon.

Art. 11. A ship which is being overtaken by another shall show from her stern to such last-mentioned ship a white light or a flare-up light.

#### *Sound Signals for Fog, &c.*

Art. 12. A steam ship shall be provided with a steam whistle or other efficient steam sound signal, so placed that the sound may not be intercepted by any obstructions, and with an efficient fog-horn to be sounded by a bellows or other mechanical means, and also with an efficient bell. A sailing ship shall be provided with a similar fog-horn and bell.

In fog, mist, or falling snow, whether by day or night, the signals described in this article shall be used as follow, that is to say:—

(a.) A steam ship under way shall make with her steam whistle, or other steam sound signal, at intervals of not more than two minutes, a prolonged blast.

(b.) A sailing ship under way shall make with her fog horn, at intervals of not more than two minutes, when on the starboard tack one blast, when on the port tack two blasts in succession, and when with the wind abaft the beam three blasts in succession.

(c.) A steam ship and a sailing ship, when not under way, shall, at intervals of not more than two minutes, ring the bell.

#### *Speed of ships to be moderate in fog, &c.*

Art. 13. Every ship, whether a sailing ship or steam ship, shall, in a fog, mist, or falling snow, go at a moderate speed.

#### *Steering and Sailing Rules.*

Art. 14. When two sailing ships are approaching one another, so as to involve risk of collision, one of them shall keep out of the way of the other as follows, viz:—

(a.) A ship which is running free shall keep out of the way of a ship which is close-hauled.

(b.) A ship which is close-hauled, on the port tack, shall keep out of the way of a ship which is close-hauled on the starboard tack.

(c.) When both are running free, with the wind on different sides, the ship which has the wind on the port side shall keep out of the way of the other.

(d.) When both are running free, with the wind on the same side, the ship which is to windward shall keep out of the way of the ship which is to leeward.

(e.) A ship which has the wind aft shall keep out of the way of the other ship.

Art. 15. If two ships under steam are meeting end on, or nearly end on, so as to involve risk of collision, each shall alter her course to starboard, so that each may pass on the port side of the other.

This article only applies to cases where ships are meeting end on, or nearly end on, in such a manner as to involve risk of collision, and does not apply to two ships which must, if both keep on their respective courses, pass clear of each other.

The only cases to which it does apply are, when each of the two ships is end on, or nearly end on, to the other; in other words, to cases in which, by day, each ship sees the

masts of the other in a line, or nearly in a line, with her own; and by night, to cases in which each ship is in such a position as to see both the side lights of the other.

It does not apply, by day, to cases in which a ship sees another ahead crossing her own course; or by night, to cases where the red light of one ship is opposed to the red light of the other, or where the green light of one ship is opposed to the green light of the other, or where a red light without a green light, or a green light without a red light, is seen ahead, or where both green and red lights are seen anywhere but ahead.

Art. 16. If two ships under steam are crossing, so as to involve risk of collision, the ship which has the other on her own starboard side shall keep out of the way of the other.

Art. 17. If two ships, one of which is a sailing ship, and the other a steam ship, are proceeding in such directions as to involve risk of collision, the steam ship shall keep out of the way of the sailing ship.

Art. 18. Every steam ship, when approaching another ship, so as to involve risk of collision, shall slacken her speed or stop and reverse, if necessary.

Art. 19. In taking any course authorized or required by these regulations, a steam ship under way may indicate that course to any other ship which she has in sight by the following signals on her steam whistle, viz:—

One short blast to mean "I am directing my course to starboard":

Two short blasts to mean "I am directing my course to port":

Three short blasts to mean "I am going full speed astern".

The use of these signals is optional; but, if they are used, the course of the ship must be in accordance with the signal made.

Art. 20. Notwithstanding anything contained in any preceding article, every ship, whether a sailing ship or a steam ship, overtaking any other shall keep out of the way of the overtaken ship.

Art. 21. In narrow channels every steam ship shall, when it is safe and practicable, keep to that side of the fairway or mid-channel which lies on the starboard side of such ship.

Art. 22. Where by the above rules one of two ships is to keep out of the way, the other shall keep her course.

Art. 23. In obeying and construing these rules due regard shall be had to all dangers of navigation; and to any special circumstances which may render a departure from the above rules necessary in order to avoid immediate danger.

*No Ship, under any Circumstances, to neglect proper Precautions.*

Art. 24. Nothing in these rules shall exonerate any ship, or the owner, or master, or crew thereof, from the consequences of any neglect to carry lights or signals, or of any neglect to keep a proper look-out, or of the neglect of any precaution which may be required by the ordinary practice of seamen, or by the special circumstances of the case.

*Reservation of Rules for Harbors and Inland Navigation.*

Art. 25. Nothing in these rules shall interfere with the operation of a special rule, duly made by local authority, relative to the navigation of any harbor, river, or inland navigation.

*Special Lights for Squadrons and Convoys.*

Art. 26. Nothing in these rules shall interfere with the operation of any special rules made by the Government of any nation with respect to additional station and signal lights for two or more ships of war or for ships sailing under convoy.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862* it was enacted that, on and after the first day of June One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, or such later day as might be fixed for the purpose by Order in Council, the regulations contained in the table marked C in the schedule to the said Act should come into operation and be of the same force as if they were enacted in the body of the said Act; but that Her Majesty might from time to time, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, by Order in Council, annul or modify any of the said regulations, or make new regulations in addition thereto or in substitution thereof; and that any alterations in or additions to such regulations made in manner aforesaid should be of the same force as the regulations in the said schedule.

And whereas, by the same Act, it was further provided that, whenever it should be made to appear to Her Majesty that the Government of any foreign country was willing that the regulations for preventing collisions contained in table C in the schedule to the said Act, or such other regulations for preventing

collisions as aro for the time being in force under the said Act, should apply to the ships of such country when beyond the limits of British jurisdiction, Her Majesty might, by Order in Council, direct that such regulations should apply to the ships of the said foreign country, whether within British jurisdiction or not; and it was further provided by the said Act that, whenever an Order in Council had been issued applying any regulation made by or in pursuance of the said Act to the ships of any foreign country, such ships should, in all cases arising in any British court, be deemed to be subject to such regulation, and should, for the purpose of such regulation, be treated as if they were British ships:

And whereas, by an Order in Council made in pursuance of the said recited Act, and dated the ninth day of January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that there should be substituted for the regulations contained in the schedule to the said Act certain regulations appended to the said Order, and that the said appended regulations should, on and after the first day of June One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, apply to French ships, whether within British jurisdiction or not:

And whereas by several Orders in Council subsequently made Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the regulations appended to the said recited Order should apply to ships of the countries specified in the said Orders, whether within British jurisdiction or not:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the thirtieth day of July One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight Her Majesty was pleased to make certain additions to the regulations appended to the said first-recited Order in Council:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the fourteenth day of August One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine Her Majesty, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, was pleased to direct that on and after the first day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty the said regulations and the additions thereto should be annulled, and that there should be substituted therefor the new regulations contained in the first schedule thereto, and that the same should, from and after the first day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty, apply to ships of the countries mentioned in the said second schedule thereto, whether within British jurisdiction or not:

And whereas article numbered 9 of the regulations appended to the said recited Order in Council of the ninth day of January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, is as follows, that is to say:—

Art. 9. Open fishing boats and other open boats shall not be required to carry the side lights required for other vessels, but shall, if they do not carry such lights, carry a lantern having a green slide on the one side and a red slide on the other side; and on the approach of or to other vessels, such lantern shall be exhibited in sufficient time to prevent collision, so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side, nor the red light on the starboard side.

Fishing vessels and open boats when at anchor, or attached to their nets and stationary, shall exhibit a bright white light.

Fishing vessels and open boats shall, however, not be prevented from using a flare-up in addition, if considered expedient.

And whereas the article numbered 10 of the said new regulations contained in the first schedule of the said recited Order in Council of the fourteenth day of August One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, which said article is to be in substitution for the said recited article numbered 9, is as follows, that is to say:—

Art. 10. (a.) Open fishing boats and other open boats when under way shall not be obliged to carry the sidelights required for other vessels; but every such boat shall in lieu thereof have ready at hand a lantern with a green glass on the one side and a red glass on the other side; and on the approach of or to other vessels, such lantern shall be exhibited in sufficient time to prevent collision, so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side, nor the red light on the starboard side.

(b.) A fishing vessel, and an open boat, when at anchor, shall exhibit a bright white light.

(c.) A fishing vessel, when employed in drift net fishing, shall carry on one of her masts two red lights in a vertical line one over the other, not less than three feet apart.

(d.) A trawler at work shall carry on one of her masts two lights in a vertical line one over the other, not less than three feet apart, the upper light red, and the lower green, and shall also either carry the side lights required for other vessels, or, if the side lights cannot be carried, have ready at hand the colored lights as provided in Article 7, or a lantern with a red and a green glass as described in paragraph (a.) of this article.

(e.) Fishing vessels and open boats shall not be prevented from using a flare-up in addition, if they desire to do so.

(f.) The lights mentioned in this article are substituted for those mentioned in the 12th, 13th, and 14th Articles of the Convention between France and England scheduled to *The British Sea Fisheries Act 1868*.

(g.) All lights required by this article, except side lights, shall be in globular lanterns so constructed as to show all round the horizon.

And whereas the Admiralty and the Board of Trade have jointly recommended to Her Majesty that the operation of the said recited article numbered 10 of the new regulations contained in the first schedule of the said Order in Council of the fourteenth day of August One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, shall be suspended until the first day of September One thousand

eight hundred and eighty-one, and that, in lieu thereof and in substitution therefor, the recited article numbered 9 of the regulations appended to the said Order in Council of the ninth day of January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, shall continue and remain in force until the said first day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that the operation of the said recited article numbered 10 of the new regulations contained in the first schedule of the said Order in Council of the fourteenth day of August One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, shall be suspended until the first day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and that, in lieu thereof and in substitution therefor, the said recited article numbered 9 of the regulations appended to the said Order in Council of the ninth day of January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, shall continue and remain in force until the first day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF STAWELL.—RESERVE FOR CRICKET AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION.—REGULATIONS.

THE Council of the Borough of Stawell, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation, in section 24, municipal district of Stawell, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

- The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
- No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.
- No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
- No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the undermentioned Common the Crown land hereinafter described, that is to say:—

PROCLAMATION OF A TIMBER RESERVE PARTLY REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and might from time to time, after one month's notice should be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works might issue licenses to

cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee, as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Administrator of the said Government of the colony of Victoria and the seal of the said colony, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of June One thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, a reserve was proclaimed under the designation of the "Dereel Timber Reserve": And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, in accordance with the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, revoke the said Proclamation, so far as it relates to the portion thereof hereinafter described, that is to say:—

DEREEL TIMBER RESERVE.—The Proclamation bearing date the 28th June 1875, by which a reserve made for the preservation and growth of Timber, situated in the parish of Dereel, was proclaimed, and which was in part revoked by another Proclamation bearing date the 10th January 1876, is hereby revoked so far as it relates to the portion of land hereinafter described, viz.:—Twenty-three acres, more or less, county of Grenville, parish of Dereel: Commencing at a point bearing east one chain from the north-east angle of allotment A<sup>24</sup>; bounded thence by a line bearing east fifteen chains; thence by a line and allotment A<sup>2</sup> bearing south to the south-west angle of the latter; thence by a line bearing west fifteen chains; thence by a road bearing north five chains; thence by allotment A<sup>3</sup> bearing east, north, and west to the north-west angle thereof; and thence again by the aforesaid road bearing north to the point of commencement.—(D.172<sup>b</sup>) (80.B.18152).

DISPOSITION OF CHURCH LANDS ALLOWED.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of Wesleyan Methodists, under the provisions of *The Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion*, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the twenty-second day of November 1880, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

*Description of land.*—One acre one rood twenty-seven perches and eight-tenths of a perch or thereabouts, county of Bourke, parish of South Melbourne, town of Emerald Hill, being allotments 10, 11, 12, and 13, and portions of allotments 6, 7, and 9, of section 13: Commencing at the intersection of the south side of Dorcas street and the west side of Cecil street; bounded thence by the latter street bearing south 28° east three chains fifty-six links; thence by a line bearing south 62° west four chains; thence by allotments 5 and 14 bearing north 28° west three chains fifty-six links; and thence by Dorcas street aforesaid bearing north 62° east four chains to the point of commencement.

*Names of trustees.*—John Bee, Robert McGregor, George Wharton, John Elder.

*Powers of disposition.*—(1.) The land, whether in whole or in part, that shall be retained shall, except in the particulars hereinbefore specified, be held subject to the trusts and provisions of the Wesleyan Model Deed enrolled in the Supreme Court of New South Wales under the Act of Council of that colony, 2 Victoria, No. 7, so far as such trusts and provisions can be applied and are not inconsistent herewith.

*Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.*—To such Wesleyan Methodist building purposes in the town of Emerald Hill as shall be approved by a majority of the trustees and the Annual Conference aforesaid.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506, § 19, 38, and 49), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Benalla therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Benalla the portion of the shire described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the Shire of Shepparton; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Benalla as hereby diminished, and of the said Shire of Shepparton now added to, in manner following, that is to say:—

SHEPPARTON SHIRE ENLARGED.

Commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Strathmerton; thence south by the east boundary of the parish of Strathmerton, Katunga, Drummanure, and Congupna, to the south-east angle of the last-named parish; thence east by the centre of a road and the north boundary of the parish of Pine Lodge to the north-east angle of said parish; thence south by a one-chain road to the Broken River; thence westerly and north-westerly down the Broken River to its junction with the Goulburn River; thence northerly down the Goulburn River to a point where it intersects the southern boundary of the main road from Echuca to Benalla; thence westerly by the southern boundary of the said road 28-00 links to the intersection of the eastern boundary of Redgum Flat reserve; thence by a line bearing 23° 52' six hundred and ninety links to the centre of the Goulburn River; thence down the Goulburn River to the intersection of the west boundary of the parish of Kaarimba; thence north by the said west boundary to the south-east angle of the parish of Barwo; thence west to the south-west angle of the parish of Barwo; thence by the west boundaries of the parishes of Barwo and Yielima north to the Murray River; thence easterly by the Murray River to the commencing point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a creek or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such creek or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

BENALLA SHIRE REDUCED.

Commencing at a point on the Broken River due south of the centre of a road forming the eastern boundary of the parish of Pine Lodge; thence north by a direct line and said road to the north-east angle of that parish; thence east by the south bound-

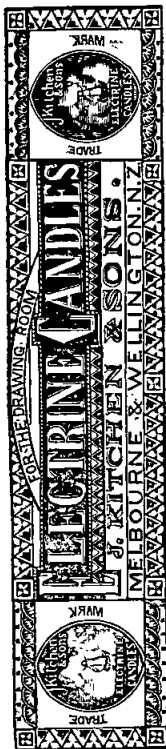

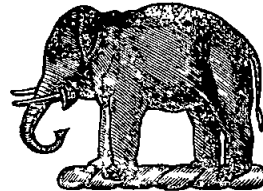

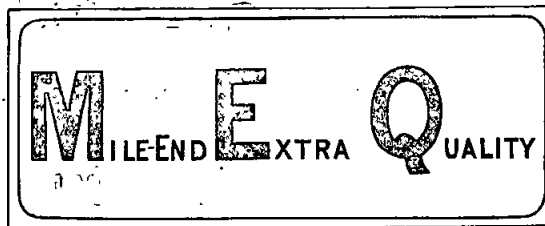
