CENSUS OF 1881.

REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION 20 OF "THE CENSUS ACT 1881."

THE following Regulations are issued by the Governor in Council under the 20th Section of *The Census Act 1881* (44 Vict. No. 667). Any person guilty of a breach thereof is by the said section liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

The sub-enumerators shall on one of the ten days previous to the 3rd day of April 1881 leave at the residence of every occupier, owner, lessee or licensee of any allotment of land of a larger extent than one acre an agricultural schedule in the form of that subjoined marked Schedule A; and at every school of any description whatever a school schedule in the form of that subjoined marked Schedule B; and at every establishment where goods of any description are manufactured of the total value of £100 or upwards per annum, at all works, except those connected with mining, whereat steam, gas, horse or water power is employed, and at every stone quarry a manufactory and quarry schedule in the form of that subjoined marked Schedule C; and at every place where steam engines are used in mining or stampheads or horse puddling machines are in operation a mining machinery schedule in the form of that subjoined marked Schedule D. And the occupiers, owners, lessees or licensees of such allotments of land; the proprietors or teachers of such schools; the proprietors, lessees or managers of such manufactories and quarries; and the proprietors, managers or persons in charge of such mining machinery shall fill up all particulars specified in the schedule relating to their land or establishments to the best of their knowledge and belief, and shall deliver the schedule so filled to the sub-enumerator on his calling therefor. And should the particulars entered in the schedule be incomplete in any respect such persons shall supply the sub-enumerator with all necessary information whereby the same may be perfected.

CENSUS OF VICTORIA, 1881.—AGRICULTURAL SCHEDULE.

[Schedule A to Regulations made by the Governor in Council under the 20th section of "The Census Act 1881," and published in the Government Gazette.]

PARTICULARS to be entered in respect to all occupied allotments of land of a larger extent than one acre, embracing not only that which surrounds the dwelling, but any detached blocks owned or rented by the householder and used by himself. Lands which are let by him to tenants, or are managed for him by other persons, are not to be included in this return, but in that of the tenant, lessee, occupier, or manager. Any person refusing to fill up or supply, or untruly filling up or untruly supplying, the required particulars, is liable

to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and any officer, enumerator, sub-enumerator, or clerk divulging any of the particulars given, is liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILLING UP THE AGRICULTURAL SCHEDULE.

- Names of places, &c.** 1. The County, Parish, and Municipality in which the dwelling or homestead is situated are to be entered in the proper lines of the Schedule, as also is the name and address by post of the occupier, and the purpose for which the land is used.
- All occupied land to be returned.** 2. The return of land is to embrace all that occupied or managed by the holder, although it may extend into or be in other counties, municipalities, census districts, &c., than that in which the homestead is situated.
- Acreage, &c., produce.** 3. The acreage under cultivation, of which a return is demanded, is for the agricultural year ended 31st March 1881, and the produce required to be noted is consequently that of the current season. Exception must, however, be made to vines, respecting which it is deemed preferable, owing to the impracticability of estimating the real yield so early in the season, to ascertain last year's produce, wine made, &c., and the acreage and number of vines for this year.
- Gross yield to be returned.** 4. In returning the produce, the gross quantity of each description of crop is to be given, not the yield per acre.
- Two crops, how dealt with.** 5. Where two crops have been obtained off the same piece of land during the year, the number of acres under the least important crop, and the produce thereof, are to be noted on the margin of the Schedule.
- Produce always to be entered.** 6. Where an entry is made opposite any crop in the acreage column, there should always, except where spots are printed, be a corresponding entry in the produce column; an entry must therefore be made of the probable quantity of produce in cases where the grain crops are not threshed, or the root crops are not dug out of the ground. Even if the crop has absolutely failed, or has been burnt upon the ground, the space in the latter column is not to be left blank, but the word "Failed" or "Burnt" is to be inserted therein. Should the crops after harvesting have been burnt in the stack, the produce must still be noted, the words "Burnt in Stack" being added.
- Gardens.** 7. It is not necessary to make any return of the nature of the crops raised in ordinary vegetable or market gardens, except such crops should be of an unusual character, or unless any considerable area should be under tobacco, chicory, hops, vines, &c. In cases where any garden crops are noted, care must be taken that no portion of the acreage is reckoned twice over—that is, the extent of garden, inclusive of such crops, is not to be inserted when the area under the latter is given separately.
- Permanent artificial grass.** 8. With regard to permanent artificial grass, it is to be understood that not merely the quantity sown during the past year is to be entered, but the total area so laid down; any land on which the sown grass may have died out being of course omitted. Bush land over which rye grass, clover, &c., has spread without cultivation, is not to be included.
- Other crops.** 9. Particulars respecting the acreage and produce of crops of which the names do not appear on the Schedule must be noted in the proper space thereof, under the head "Other Crops." In the case of such crops as broom millet and flax, the quantity of both seed and fibre obtained is to be noted. The following are some of the crops respecting which returns may be expected :—

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE SALE COMMON.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miner's rights, business licensees or carrier's licenses, and farmers, residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four

head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The following is the scale of fees, payable quarterly in advance, for depasturing stock on the common:—

For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule	Twenty shillings per annum.
For every cow or heifer	Eight shillings per annum.
For every bull, bullock, ox or steer	Sixteen shillings per annum.
For every working horse, the <i>bona fide</i> property of a carter and used by him for hire	Ten shillings per annum.
For every sheep or goat	Four shillings per annum.

3. The quarters shall commence on 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October in each year.

4. Widows in indigent circumstances may, by leave of the managers in writing, but not otherwise, depasture four cows or heifers on the common without payment of fees.

5. No fees will be charged for progeny of registered stock in the opinion of the herdsman under six months old.

6. Stock on the common shall be mustered at the common yards for the purpose of registration, at such times during the months of January, April, July, and October in each year as the managers shall direct by advertisement in a local paper, and the managers shall have power to postpone such mustering if necessary.

7. Stock so mustered and upon which the fees have been duly paid shall be registered and returned to the common, and any stock upon which the fees are not paid, during the time appointed by the managers for receiving such fees, shall be liable to be impounded.

8. All horned stock upon which the common fees shall have been duly paid shall be branded by the herdsman with the common pitch brand S at each registration.

9. Previous to the general muster, stock may be registered at any place within the borough at the request of the owner of such stock, provided forty-eight hours' notice be given to the herdsman, and the fees for the depasturing of such stock together with a registration fee of Sixpence per head be paid to the herdsman. Stock so registered shall not be driven to the common yards at the general muster.

10. Owners of stock shall give to the herdsman a written description (on the printed form supplied by the managers) of each beast which they desire to have registered when paying the agistment fees on such stock.

11. If any animal die upon the common, the owner shall, within six hours after notice thereof from the herdsman, cause the carcass to be removed from off the common or to be buried.

12. No person shall unnecessarily disturb registered stock upon the common, or remove any such stock from the common without having given notice to the herdsman.

13. No bulls or entire horses will be allowed on the common without the consent, in writing, of the managers.

14. The managers shall not be responsible for any stock put upon the common.

Every person offending against the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (33 Vict. No. 506, § 19, 38, and 49), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Glenelg therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Glenelg the portion of the shire described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the Shire of Wannon; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Glenelg as hereby diminished, and of the said Shire of Wannon now added to, and also the Nareen Riding of the said Shire of Wannon to which riding the severed portion is hereby attached in manner following, that is to say:—

GLENELG SHIRE (AS REDUCED).

Bounded by a line beginning at the junction of the rivers Stokes and Glenelg; thence up the latter river to a point opposite the south boundary of the township reserve of Lindsay; west to and along said boundary to the west boundary of the colony; north along the latter to Mosquito Creek; eastward along the electoral district boundary of North Harrow to and along the Glenelg River to the junction of the Pigeon Ponds; up these ponds to the north-east angle of the parish of Koolomert; thence westward along the north boundary; southward along the west boundary and eastward along the south boundary of last-named parish to the north-west angle of the parish of Dewrang; thence southward along the west boundary and eastward along the south boundary of the said parish to the road on the west side of section 3, parish of Bruk Bruk; southward along this road, past the south-east angle of allotment 7, section 15, Bruk Bruk, to the Casterton and Coleraine main road at the south angle of allotment 1, section 2, parish of Carapook; south-eastward along said road to and along road on west side of sections 10 and 18 to the west angle of latter section to and up the River Wannon to its intersection with the road from Harrow to Greebilla; along this road to and south-westward along road on the southward boundaries of sections 9, 10, and 12, parish of Tabara, to this parish boundary; south to the River Stokes at the south-east angle of section 7, parish of Digby; and down this river to the starting point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

WANNON SHIRE (AS ENLARGED).

Bounded by a line commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Wookurkook; thence west to the north-west angle thereof; south by the road to the north-east angle of allotment 5A, section 1, parish of Gatum Gatum; west by the road to the north-west angle of said parish; south to the south-west angle of the parish of Urangara; east to the intersection of the road lying between sections 2 and 3 of the parish of Toolang; south by the said road and to the northern boundary of the parish of Redruth; west to the north-west angle of this parish; south by its western boundary to the River Wannon; down this river to opposite the west angle of allotment 1, section 18, parish of Carapook; thence north to, and along a road passing the western boundaries of sections 18 and 10, said parish, to the main road from Coleraine to Casterton; north-westward by said main road to the junction of the road on the west side of section 4, parish of Carapook; northward by this road, along the westward sides of sections 4, 15, 14, and 6, parish of Bruk Bruk, to the northern boundary of this parish; thence west to the south-west angle of the parish of Dewrang; thence northward by the western boundary of the parish of Dewrang to the north-west angle of said parish; thence westward by the south boundary, northward by the west boundary, and eastward by the north boundary of the parish of Koolomert to the north-east angle of said parish; thence by the main channel of the Pigeon Ponds to the River Glenelg; up said river to opposite the eastern boundary of the parish of Pendyk Pendyk and south to the commencing point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.
