“THE TOBACCO ACT 1880.”

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of section 18 of *The Tobacco Act 1880*, the Governor in Council has made the following amendment in and additions to the Amended Regulations dated the 10th day of November 1880.

CLAUSE 2 AS AMENDED.

2. Every manufacturer of tobacco, cigars, and snuff shall apply in writing to the Commissioner of Trade and Customs for the appointment and approval of premises as a tobacco factory, and such manufacturer shall enclose a drawing and full description of his premises; and when he has paid the quarterly fee—at the rate of £50 per annum if a cigar manufacturer, and at the rate of £150 per annum if a tobacco and snuff manufacturer—towards the cost of supervision, and executed a bond to the Government, with two approved sureties, for double the value, duty paid, of the maximum quantity to be in his manufactory at any one time, but no bond to be for less than £250, the Commissioner of Customs may then, if he think fit, grant him a license to manufacture tobacco, cigars, and snuff.

ADDITIONAL REGULATION AND SCHEDULES.

The Commissioner of Trade and Customs may by order approve and license persons to cut on their premises manufactured tobacco upon which full duty has been paid. The licensee will require to enter into a bond with two sufficient sureties in the sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds. Any person found guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Licensing Act 1876 (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the place known as the Township of Shepparton, in the parish of Shepparton, in the county of Moira, a district where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act.

FISHERIES ACTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Fisheries Act Amendment Act 1878 it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, might provide for the more effectual government, management, protection, and improvement of fish, and any waters in which fishing might be carried on: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the eighteenth day of August One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, the use of any kind of nets for taking fish in either Lakes Burrunbeet, Learmonth, or Connewarre, was prohibited: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby revoke so much of the Proclamation dated the eighteenth day of August One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine as refers to Lake Connewarre.

## SHIRE OF ECHUCA.

## BARMAH COMMON.—REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council, on the 1st April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Echuca, having drafted the following regulations for management of the Barmah Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

I. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

II. The fees for depasturing shall, in all cases, be payable quarterly in advance, on the first days of January, April, July, and October in each year, and all cattle remaining on the common seven days after the period for which payment has been made may be impounded without notice.

III. The fees to be paid for depasturing on the common shall be as follow:—For every cow, heifer, bullock, or steer, at the rate of four shillings per annum; for every mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, at the rate of five shillings per annum; for every sheep, at the rate of two shillings per annum.

IV. No person shall be allowed to transfer his or her right of commonage.

V. No entire horse, bull, or ram shall be allowed to run on the common.

VI. All sheep depasturing on the common must be tended by and be in charge of a shepherd.

VII. Persons depasturing sheep shall be responsible for the same being kept on such portion of the common as the managers may from time to time set apart for their use; and sheep trespassing on any other part of the common may be impounded.

VIII. Before placing any cattle on the common, the owners thereof shall hand to the herdsman a memorandum in writing setting forth the extent of land in their occupation, the number of acres of such land under cultivation, and specifying also the number, brands, and description of the cattle to be depastured.

IX. Cattle shall not be removed from the common without notice to the herdsman from the owners thereof, except in cases where they may be frequently required, when the managers may, if they think proper, grant permission in writing to the owners to remove and replace the same at pleasure, in a quiet manner, so as not to interfere with or disturb other stock unnecessarily, but the herdsman shall not be considered to have any supervision whatsoever over such cattle.

X. Any person having right of commonage or the managers of any neighboring common may register with the herdsman of any common the description and brands of any missing cattle in a book to be kept for that purpose, upon payment of a fee of one shilling for every head of cattle so registered, and such cattle, if found on such common, shall not be impounded until notice has been given to the owners or person registering, who shall be required to remove the same within fourteen days of such notice being given, otherwise such cattle shall be impounded.

XI. Cattle becoming diseased after being placed on the common shall be removed within twenty-four hours after notice by the herdsman to the owner thereof; and, in case such cattle be not removed within the time specified, the same shall be removed or destroyed at the expense of the owner. Dead cattle on the common, if not removed within twelve hours after notice has been given to the owner thereof, shall be removed at the owner's expense.

XII. The managers will not be responsible for any cattle placed on the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

## ROCHESTER COMMON.—REGULATIONS.

I. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

II. The fees for depasturing shall, in all cases, be payable quarterly in advance, on the first days of January, April, July, and October in each year, and all cattle remaining on the common seven days after the period for which payment has been made may be impounded without notice.

III. The fees to be paid for depasturing on the common shall be as follow:—For every cow, heifer, bullock, or steer, at the rate of eight shillings per annum; for every mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, at the rate of ten shillings per annum; for

every sheep, at the rate of two shillings per annum; for every milking goat, two shillings per annum; and for every male goat, four shillings per annum.

iv. No person shall be allowed to transfer his or her right of commonage.

v. No entire horse, bull, or ram shall be allowed to run on the common.

vi. All sheep depasturing on the common must be tended by and be in charge of a shepherd.

vii. Persons depasturing sheep shall be responsible for the same being kept on such portion of the common as the managers may from time to time set apart for their use; and sheep trespassing on any other part of the common may be impounded.

viii. Before placing any cattle on the common, the owners thereof shall hand to the herdsman a memorandum in writing setting forth the extent of land in their occupation, the number of acres of such land under cultivation, and specifying also the number, brands, and description of the cattle to be depastured.

ix. Cattle shall not be removed from the common without notice to the herdsman from the owners thereof, except in cases where they may be frequently required, when the managers may, if they think proper, grant permission in writing to the owners to remove and replace the same at pleasure, in a quiet manner, so as not to interfere with or disturb other stock unnecessarily, but the herdsman shall not be considered to have any supervision whatsoever over such cattle.

x. Any person having right of commonage or the managers of any neighboring common may register with the herdsman of any common the description and brands of any missing cattle in a book to be kept for that purpose, upon payment of a fee of one shilling for every head of cattle so registered, and such cattle, if found on such common, shall not be impounded until notice has been given to the owners or person registering, who shall be required to remove the same within fourteen days of such notice being given, otherwise such cattle shall be impounded.

xi. Cattle becoming diseased after being placed on the common shall be removed within twenty-four hours after notice by the herdsman to the owner thereof; and, in case such cattle be not removed within the time specified, the same shall be removed or destroyed at the expense of the owner. Dead cattle on the common, if not removed within twelve hours after notice has been given to the owner thereof, shall be removed at the owner's expense.

xii. The managers will not be responsible for any cattle placed on the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE LAURAVILLE RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, W. Hogarth, L. L. Philpott, J. O'Toole, and George Clayton, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Lauraville Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall any fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee.
6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee being first obtained.
7. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.
8. No person shall interfere with or in any way damage the reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended

by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

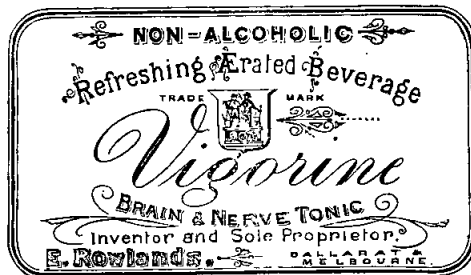
