PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the county of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**I**N pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of *The Bank Holidays Act 1873, I*, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint

THURSDAY THE 26TH OF FEBRUARY INSTANT

a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Dandenong;

THURSDAY AND FRIDAY THE 26TH AND 27TH FEBRUARY INSTANT

to be observed as Bank Half-holidays at Bairnsdale, from the hour of Twelve noon;

FRIDAY THE 27TH OF FEBRUARY INSTANT

a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Talbot.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty, and in the forty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.
