A REGULATION

(Made in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty under the provisions of the Western Pacific Order in Council, 1879.)

TO PROHIBIT THE SUPPLY OF INTOXICATING LIQUORS TO NATIVES OF TONGA, AND OTHERS RESIDENT IN THE FRIENDLY ISLANDS.

[L.S.] ARTHUR GORDON, H.C.

I. If any British subject in Tonga sells or gives, or otherwise supplies to any native Tongan, or any native of any island in the Pacific Ocean resident in Tonga, any wine, spirits, or any other intoxicating liquor, he shall, on conviction thereof before the Court of Her Majesty's High Commissioner, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and in default of payment shall be liable to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month.

II. If it shall appear to the Court that such wine or spirits have been given *bona fide* for medicinal purposes, or other cause which shall, in the judgment of the Court, be reasonable and sufficient, it shall be lawful for the Court to dismiss the charge.

If any British subject in Samoa sells, gives, or otherwise supplies to any native Samoan, or any native of any island in the Pacific Ocean resident in Samoa, any wine, spirits, or any other intoxicating liquor, he shall, on conviction thereof before the Court of Her Majesty's High Commissioner, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and in default of payment shall be liable to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month.

II. If it shall appear to such Court that such wine or spirits have been given *bona fide* for medicinal purpose, or other cause which shall, in the judgment of the Court, be reasonable and sufficient, it shall be lawful for the Court to dismiss the charge.

TO PROHIBIT THE SUPPLY OF INTOXICATING LIQUORS TO NATIVES OF ROTUMAH, AND OTHERS RESIDENT IN ROTUMAH.

[L.S.] ARTHUR GORDON, H.C.

I. If any British subject in Rotumah sells, gives, or otherwise supplies to any native Rotuman, or any native of any island in the Pacific Ocean resident in Rotumah, any wine, spirits, or any other intoxicating liquor, he shall, on conviction thereof before the Court of Her Majesty's High Commissioner, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and in default of payment shall be liable to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month.

II. If it shall appear to the Court that such wine or spirits have been given *bona fide* for medicinal purposes, or other cause which shall, in the judgment of the Court, be reasonable and sufficient, it shall be lawful for the Court to dismiss the charge.

I. If any British subject in Savage Island sells, gives, or otherwise supplies to any native of Savage Island, or any native of any island in the Pacific Ocean, resident in Savage Island, any wine, spirits, or any other intoxicating liquor, he shall, on conviction thereof before the Court of Her Majesty's High Commissioner, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and in default of payment shall be liable to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month.

II. If it shall appear to the Court that such wine or spirits have been given *bona fide* for medicinal purposes, or other cause which shall, in the judgment of the Court, be reasonable and sufficient, it shall be lawful for the Court to dismiss the charge.

A REGULATION

(Made in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty under the provisions of the Western Pacific Order in Council, 1879.)

TO REGULATE THE SALE OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION IN SAMOA.

[L.S.] ARTHUR GORDON, H.C.

I. No British subject resident in Samoa shall sell arms or ammunition without a license to that effect under the hand of

the Deputy-Commissioner or Consul, which license such Deputy-Commissioner or Consul is hereby authorized, if he see fit, to issue subject to the following provisions:—

II. Every British subject selling arms and ammunition without such license shall be guilty of an offence against the Western Pacific Orders in Council of 1877 and 1879, and shall be liable, on conviction before the Court of the High Commissioner to imprisonment with hard labor for a period not exceeding three months, as the Court may direct.

III. Every license issued under this regulation shall specify the name of the party to whom it is issued, and his residence, and the number of arms and amount of ammunition which he is licensed to sell; and every such license shall remain in force until the 31st day of December, in the year in which it is issued, and no longer.

IV. A fee of One shilling shall be payable on the issue of every such license.

V. No such license shall be issued to any British subject unless he have previously entered into a bond conditioned for the payment to Her Majesty of the sum of Fifty pounds sterling, should he sell any arms or ammunition to any native of Samoa, or any native of any island in the Pacific Ocean resident in Samoa, and every such bond shall have two good and sufficient sureties to the satisfaction of such Deputy-Commissioner or Consul.

VI. Every license to sell arms or ammunition shall be *ipso facto* cancelled, on proof before the Court of the High Commissioner that the holder of it has sold any arms or ammunition to any native of Samoa or of any island in the Pacific Ocean resident in Samoa, and the holder thereof shall be liable to the same penalties as if he had sold arms or ammunition without license.

I. Any British subject who sells or gives to any native of the Groups of Islands named in the Schedule hereto annexed, or to any other natives of Polynesia resident in any such islands, any dynamite, shall be guilty of an offence against the Western Pacific Orders in Council of 1877 and 1879, and shall, on conviction before the Court of Her Majesty's High Commissioner, be liable to a fine not exceeding Ten pounds and to imprisonment not exceeding three months, as the Court may determine.

CONFIRMATION OF MARRIAGES ON HER MAJESTY'S SHIPS ACT 1879.

(42 & 43 Vict. Ch. 29.)

CHAPTER 29.

An Act to remove doubts as to the validity of certain Marriages of British subjects on board Her Majesty's ships. [21st July 1879.]

WHEREAS officers commanding Her Majesty's ships on foreign stations have permitted marriages to be solemnized according to

religious rites or ceremonies, or to be contracted per verba de presenti in the presence of such officers, in the belief that marriages were authorized by law to be so solemnized and contracted, and doubts have arisen with respect to the validity of such marriages, and it is expedient to confirm the same:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the Confirmation of Marriages on Short title. Her Majesty's Ships Act 1879.

2. All marriages, both of the parties being British subjects, which before the passing of this Act have been solemnized on board one of Her Majesty's vessels on a foreign station in the presence of the officer commanding such vessel, whether solemnized according to any religious rite or ceremony, or contracted per verba de presenti, shall be valid in like manner as if the same had been solemnized within Her Majesty's dominions with the due observance of all forms required by law.

Provided that this enactment shall not render valid any marriage which before the passing of this Act has been declared invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction in any proceeding touching such marriage, or any right dependent on the validity or invalidity thereof, or render valid any marriage where either of the parties has before the passing of this Act and during the life of the other party lawfully intermarried with any person.

The births of 672 children, viz., 354 boys and 318 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of January. In the month of December 762 births were registered, or 90 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in January numbered 463, viz., 239 of males and 224 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 209. The deaths exceeded those in December by 25, but were less than the average of January during the previous ten years by 60; and if allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of those ten years by 121.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 106.5° on the 20th, and the lowest was 45.9° on the 10th. The mean temperature of the month (65.9°) was nearly half a degree below the average. The greatest

range of the thermometer in any one day (48°) took place on the 20th, viz., from a maximum of 106°5' to a minimum of 58°2'. The least range (8°5') was on the 21st, viz., from a maximum of 72°0' to a minimum of 63°5'. The mean daily range was 22°4'. The mean atmospheric pressure (29°857 inches) was almost the same as the average of January for the previous ten years.

Males and females died during the month in the proportions of 52 and 48 per cent. respectively. The mortality of children under 5 years of age was in the proportion of 43 per cent. to the total mortality as against 44 per cent. in January 1879; 47 per cent. in January 1878; 49 per cent. in January 1877; 52 per cent. in January 1876; 66 per cent. in January 1875; 57·5 per cent. in January 1874; 49 per cent. in January 1873; 56 per cent. in January 1872; 57 per cent. in January 1871; and 58 per cent. in January 1870.

Twelve of the persons who died during the month were stated to have been of the age of 75 years or upwards at the time of their decease, viz. :—A gentleman, aged 75, who died of heart disease; a gardener, aged 80, of bronchitis; an ex-Government officer, aged 87, of pneumonia; a female, aged 75, a wheelwright, aged 78, a leather-merchant and a female, each aged 79, a female, aged 80, an ironfounder and a widow, each aged 82, a hawk, aged 83, and a female, aged 87, of old age.

Twenty deaths from external causes were recorded during the month, of which 14 were ascribed to accident and 6 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths :—A male infant, aged 1 hour, died of concussion of the brain, caused by a fall at birth; a boy, aged 5, died of fracture of the skull, caused by being struck with a quill; a schoolboy, aged 12, died from the effects of a kick from a horse; a draper, aged 50, died of fracture of the skull, the result of being knocked down by a cart; a boot-finisher, aged 20, accidentally shot himself; a youth, aged 15, died of burns; a boy, aged 11, and a brassfounder, aged 22, two boys, each aged 10, and an able seaman, aged 32, a female, aged 18, and a street-musician, aged 24, were accidentally drowned—the two first whilst bathing and the two last by the upsetting of a boat; and a house-painter, aged 31, was "found drowned." Of the suicidal deaths :—A fireman, aged 28, shot himself; a vine-grower, aged 39, cut his throat; a fireman, aged 27, and a dealer, aged 45, poisoned themselves, the first with carbolic and the second with muriatic-acid; a female, aged 40, and a laborer, aged 55, drowned themselves. All these are stated to have been laboring under temporary insanity at the time they committed self-destruction.

Ninety-one deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz. :—56 in the Melbourne Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 200, of which 99, or 49·5 per cent., were of males, and 101, or 50·5 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 149 were under one year of age, 34 were between one and two, 7 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 263. Of these, 140, or 53 per cent., were males, and 123, or 47 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 20 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 30 were between fifty and fifty-five, 22 were between fifty-five and sixty, 20 were between sixty and sixty-five, 12 were between sixty-five and seventy, 8 were between seventy and seventy-five, 5 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 7 were upwards of eighty.

More than a ninth of the deaths recorded in the month under notice were due to diarrhoea. Deaths from that complaint increased from 42 in December to 54 in January; but deaths from whooping-cough and typhoid fever decreased from 24 and 12 respectively in the former, to 5 and 8 respectively in the latter month. Under the head of local diseases a decrease of 10 appeared in deaths from apoplexy, but an increase of 8 in those from heart affections. Forty-four deaths in January and 45 in December, or more than a fifth of the deaths of children under 5 years, were ascribed to want of breast-milk, premature birth, or debility. Six deaths were set down to childbirth in the month under notice, or an average of 1 death of a mother to every 112 births registered.
