WHEREAS by *The Juries Statute 1876* (No. 560) it was amongst other things enacted that on any Court of Assize or of General Sessions or any County Court, being appointed to be newly held, the Clerk of the Court of Petty Sessions held at or nearest to the Court House of such Assize, Sessions, or County Court town, and the clerks of all courts held elsewhere within the jury district of such Assize, Sessions, or County Court town, and all clerks, constables, sheriffs, and Clerks of Petty Sessions should, in manner therein provided, and at and within the times and intervals which the Governor in Council should order, do, with respect to that district, all acts and things therein required to be by any clerk, constable, sheriff, or Court of Petty Sessions ordinarily done with respect to a jury district; and all jurors' books made out under the now reciting section should be brought into use, and the persons whose names were therein set down should be liable to serve immediately after such books should have been so made out; and the said books should be used until new books should have been completed under the provisions thereinbefore contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order the undermentioned times and intervals at and within which the provisions of Part III. of the said Statute are to be carried out with respect to the Jury District of the County Court Town of Donald, that is to say:—

The provisions of Sections 16 and 17 to be given effect to on or before Monday the 8th March instant.

The provisions of Section 19 to be given effect to before Saturday the 13th March instant.

The provisions of Section 20 to be given effect to before Saturday the 20th March instant.

The provisions of Section 21 to be given effect to before Sunday the 28th March instant, and the notice therein specified to be kept posted one day only.

The provisions of Section 22 to be given effect to before Friday, 9th April next.

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## Rate of Speed in confined waters.

"Steamers navigating the ports of Queensland are not to proceed at more than half-speed while passing among shipping, nor in the rivers of the colony, while within two miles of a town-ship approaching from seaward, and one mile approaching from the interior; and at no greater rate than five knots while within the limits of any municipality."

*Lanterns.*—The back and side of the lanterns are not to be less than nine inches, and the height of the lantern inside, exclusive of the dome, is not to be less than eleven inches.

*Lens.*—The chord of the arc made by the lens in any lantern must not be less than eight inches. The lens must not be less than five inches in height, and must not be less than one-third of a circle.

*Wicks.*—The wicks of the burners must not be less than 1½ inches in width for vegetable, nor less than one inch for mineral oil.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1869 power is given to the Governor in Council, from time to time, to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: And whereas by the Land Act 1878 it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall be read and construed as part of the Land Act 1869: And whereas by the Land Acts Amendment Act 1880 it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall be read with and construed as part of the Land Act 1869: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the Regulations following, and such Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of March 1880:—

CONSOLIDATED REGULATIONS, CHAPTER VI., SECTION 9.

1. In Chapter VI., Section 9, of the Consolidated and Amended Regulations, dated 1st April 1879, the words "before the 31st December 1880" shall be inserted in lieu of the words "on or before the 30th April 1879."

REGULATION TO BE READ AS SECTION 1A, CHAPTER VII., OF THE CONSOLIDATED REGULATIONS.

2. Any lessee under Part II. of the Land Act 1869, Section 20, who may desire to take advantage of the provisions of Section 3 of the Land Acts Amendment Act 1880, shall apply before the 31st December 1880, in the form prescribed in Schedule XVI.A hereto, to surrender his lease and to obtain a new lease in lieu thereof.

REGULATION TO BE READ AS SECTION 9A, CHAPTER XIII., OF THE CONSOLIDATED REGULATIONS.

3. Any holder of a license under Section 49 of the Land Act 1869, or of a lease under Section 47 of the Land Act 1862, who may be desirous of exercising, under the provisions of Section 4 of the Land Acts Amendment Act 1880, the exclusive right of purchasing the land so held, shall apply in the form prescribed in Schedule XLV.A hereto.

*Regulations fixing the amount to be paid by persons using or carrying away water from the reserve for Public purposes in the parish of Witchipool known as "Hoban's Tank," and for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve.*

WHEREAS by a regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the nineteenth day of January 1880, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by order of the fifth day of January 1880 as a site for Public purposes in the parish of Witchipool, and hereinafter styled "Hoban's Tank": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, having framed the following Regulations for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

## Regulations.

1. Every person using or carrying away water from "Hoban's Tank" shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the committee in that behalf, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—

- I. For one hoghead of water taken away in any one day, Sixpence.
- II. For every hoghead of water after the first hoghead taken away in any one day, One shilling.
- III. For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Threepence.

2. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the said reserve, any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals without the written authority of the committee, or their officer duly appointed.

3. No person shall climb or jump over, or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.

Every person offending against these regulations, or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR AFFORDING ACCESS TO WATER IN THE PARISH OF CORACK EAST.

WHEREAS by the 103th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind the Regulations made by the Board on 1st December 1879 and 19th January 1880 respectively in regard to that portion of the reserve for affording access to water in the parish of Corack East known as "Cherrup Swamp Tank," and doth hereby make the Regulations following to be observed and enforced in respect of such reserve:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be under the control of the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud as a committee of management thereof.

2. Every person using or carrying away water from the reserve shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the committee of management in that behalf, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—

- i. For one hogshead of water taken away in any one day, Sixpence.
- ii. For every hogshead of water after the first hogshead taken away in any one day, One shilling.
- iii. For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Threepence.

3. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals without the written authority of the committee of management or their officer duly appointed.

4. No person shall climb or jump over, or break, or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.

Every person offending against these Regulations or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein shall, in accordance with section 103 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

#### CITY OF BALLAARAT.

##### BYE-LAW No. 61.

*A Bye-law of the City of Ballarat, made under Section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered Sixty-one (61), for preventing injury and damage being done to footpaths formed, or partly formed, with asphalt, or tar, or other material, within the City of Ballarat.*

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Ballarat order as follows:—

Every person who rides or drives any horse or other animal, or permits and suffers any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal to be ridden or driven, or who drives or wheels any carriage or other vehicle upon, along, or across any footway (other than rights-of-way) made or formed, or partly made or formed, of tar, asphalt, or other material, within the City of Ballarat, save in each such case upon, by, or at some crossing made for the purpose of obtaining access to any land abutting on such footpaths, or who injures such footway by making holes therein, or by allowing gravel, garden refuse, or other material to be deposited, swept, or carelessly placed thereon or to remain thereon, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and shall also pay to the council such sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5) by way of compensation for any damage done by him to such footway as the justices adjudicating upon the complaint shall upon the hearing thereof order.

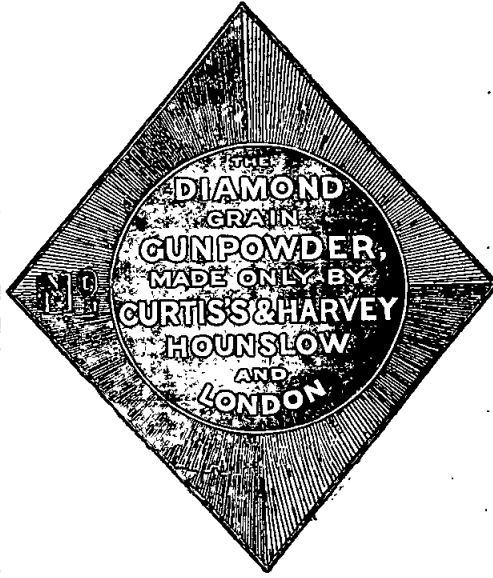

## BYE-LAWS OF THE CRESWICK DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

### OBJECTS.

1. That the objects of the institution be to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, and for casualties; but no person who shall meet with casualties and shall be found able to pay for surgical aid shall receive further than temporary assistance.

### CONSTITUTION.

2. The institution shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, governors, and subscribers.

### QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

3. The following shall be the qualifications of governors and subscribers:—

- Life governors.—A personal contribution of £20 in one year.  
A society, association, or company giving a donation of £40 to nominate life governor.  
Governors for one year.—The first-named executor of bequest of £10 under will.  
A minister of a church collecting £20 in one year.  
A society, association, or company collecting £20 in one year to nominate a governor for one year.  
Subscribers.—A yearly contribution of £1 and upwards.

### PRIVILEGES.

4. The above shall be entitled to be members of committee, to vote at all general and special meetings of governors and subscribers, and have power to recommend patients according to the undermentioned scale:—

	In-patients.	Out-patients.
Life governor	2	6
Governor for one year	10	20
Subscriber of £10 and upwards	6	14
Subscriber of £5 to £10	4	10
" £2 to £5	2	6
" £1 to £2	1	3

5. That the annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription is paid; and no governor or subscriber will be entitled to any privilege until the subscription be paid.

6. That no person shall vote at any meeting of subscribers while he is a salaried officer of the hospital, nor any new subscriber, unless his subscription shall have been paid three days preceding the meeting.

7. That no new law or regulations, or any repeal or alteration in the existing laws shall be valid unless the same shall have been passed at a special or general meeting of the governors and subscribers.

### COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

8. The administration of the affairs of the hospital shall be entrusted to a committee, consisting of a president, two vice-presidents, and twelve others, to be elected by governors and subscribers of £1 and upwards, and in accordance with the provisions of the Hospital and Charitable Institutions Act, No. 220, 1864, clause 11.

9. The committee shall direct the general business of the hospital; frame rules for its internal regulation, the same not being repugnant to the general bye-laws; enter into contracts for the supply of provisions and other articles for the use of the hospital, and direct payment to be made for the same; appoint and discharge all servants and paid officers of the institution; and superintend and give all necessary directions for the admission, discharge, and dismissal of patients, in accordance with the terms and spirit of the general bye-laws. They shall meet at least once in every month, on such days as they may appoint; the chairman of committee (who shall be the president, if present, one of the vice-presidents in his absence, or some other member in their absence) shall have a casting vote in addition to a deliberative vote.

10. The committee of management shall choose from among themselves at each monthly meeting a visiting committee of three, who shall meet on such days and at such hour each week as they may appoint, and have power to audit the house accounts and, if necessary, engage or discharge servants (subject to the consent of the committee of management), and to regulate the internal management of the institution.

11. Any member of the committee absenting himself from four (4) consecutive meetings (except those residing more than four miles from the building), without showing cause to the satisfaction of the committee, shall cease to be a member of it.

12. All vacancies in the committee—occurring between the annual meetings in January—shall be filled up by the remaining members of it, at a special meeting of committee, to be summoned by the secretary, under the authority here given; if more than one person be nominated the election to be by ballot.

13. All ordinary meetings of the committee shall be summoned by circular (by the secretary) three days at least before the day of meeting; five members of committee to form a quorum.

14. It shall be competent at any time for the committee of management (at which at least five members shall be present), or for nine or more governors and subscribers (by a writing under their hands) to require the president to summon, at the expiration of not less than seven days, a special meeting of governors and subscribers, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every such meeting to be called by the president, and notice given in the local paper.

15. The committee shall present a general report of the affairs of the institution, together with a duly audited balance-sheet, at the annual meeting of governors and subscribers in January in each year; such balance-sheet to be published in the local paper before such meeting.

### TREASURER.

16. All moneys received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the treasurer, and be deposited by him in such bank as the committee of management may from time to time appoint.

17. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the treasurer, two of the committee, and countersigned by the secretary.

18. Previous to signing any cheque the treasurer shall require a statement of the account, which must be signed by the chairman of the meeting at which the account was passed, and countersigned by the secretary.

### SECRETARY AND COLLECTOR.

19. The secretary and collector, who shall enter into an approved bond for £100, shall convene and attend all general, special, and committee meetings, keep minutes of the proceedings, carry out the directions of such meetings, conduct the correspondence and the clerical business of his department, enter and keep the accounts of the institution, compile all reports that may be ordered, fill up all cheques, and perform the clerical duties connected with the office of treasurer.

20. He shall also collect subscriptions for the institution, pay over the same to the treasurer once in every week, and render a progress balance-sheet, showing the actual position of the funds of the institution, at each monthly committee meeting.

### HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

21. The honorary medical officers, who shall be elected at the annual meeting, shall attend at the hospital for consultation or operation whenever requested by the resident surgeon, and shall have access to the institution at all times.

### RESIDENT SURGEON.

22. The resident surgeon shall receive the recommendations for admission from applicants; examine and decide on their fitness for admission; discharge such patients as he considers fit to be discharged; he shall have charge of all patients in the hospital, and their treatment; shall, if necessary, in cases of difficulty or danger, request the attendance of any or all of the consulting medical officers; but in all cases of emergency shall act to the best of his judgment. He shall perform all surgical operations and post mortem examinations.

23. He shall superintend and control all wardsmen, nurses, and servants in the hospital; and have power in cases of insubordination and neglect of duty, to suspend any of them until the decision of the committee, and (if necessary), to hire temporary substitutes for servants thus suspended; he shall receive, examine, take charge of, and distribute all articles supplied for the use of the hospital; shall keep all accounts of such, and carry out all regulations made by the committee for the internal management of the hospital.

## PATIENTS.

24. Recommendations for admission shall be subject to the approval of the committee, and be made by tickets only, to be issued by the collector (who shall keep a proper record of the same), provided that whenever any recommendation cannot be acceded to—from want of room, or other cause—the ticket used shall be reclaimable by the issuer. Governors and subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the collector, of exchanging out-patients' tickets for in-patients, and *vice versa*; one in-patient's ticket being equivalent to three out-patients'. These tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance, and shall not be valid beyond twelve months from the date of issue.

25. All recommendations must be properly filled up by the issuer, and signed by the applicant, in accordance with the printed forms supplied by the institution.

26. Members of the visiting committee shall have a discretionary power of recommending both in-patients and out-patients, subject to the revision of the committee.

27. Accidents, and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the resident surgeon, shall be received at any time; but the admission of patients in ordinary cases, on the recommendation of a governor or subscriber, shall be restricted to between the hours of 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. (Sundays excepted).

28. In all cases where an application for admission to the hospital is refused by the resident surgeon, he shall endorse his reasons for such refusal on the back of the order presented, and every such case, together with the endorsement, shall be reported to the first meeting of the committee.

29. No pregnant female (for the purpose of confinement), no child under five years of age (unless suffering from serious injury, or for the purpose of undergoing a surgical operation, or in case of accident), no insane person, no person afflicted with primary syphilis, or suffering from chronic paralysis, nor any person who—in the opinion of the resident surgeon, or of the committee—is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances.

30. Persons unable to pay for medical attendance, but not requiring admission to the house, shall be treated as out-patients on producing the recommendation, in proper form, of a governor or subscriber; such recommendation to be in force for two months only, from the date of issue, but a small charge shall be levied for medicine—limited to a minimum of 6d., at the discretion of the resident surgeon—who shall, however, have power to remit the charge altogether in indigent cases.

31. Any person wishing to be received into the hospital, and being in a position to pay for medical aid, may be admitted, with the sanction of the committee; he shall be charged 50s. per week, and in the event of any operation being performed, a fee shall be paid by him to the hospital, the amount of such fee to be decided by the resident surgeon, but in no case shall it exceed five guineas; paying patients shall pay one week in advance.

32. Patients quitting the hospital at their own desire, shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving.

33. In the event of any person in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice elsewhere being detected in the receipt of the charity of the institution, such person, if an in-patient, shall be liable to be prosecuted, and shall be charged at the rate of £3 per week from the date of admission, or if an out-patient, he may also be prosecuted, and shall be charged the sum of ten shillings (10s.) for each occasion upon which he consulted the resident surgeon; and the committee may order the removal of any such person from the hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.
