PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the county of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WEDNESDAY THE 17TH OF MARCH INSTANT

a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Bairnsdale, Blackwood and Trentham, Daylesford, Inglewood, Kilmore, Merino, Rutherglen, Taradale, Woodend, and Yackandandah;

WEDNESDAY THE 17TH OF MARCH INSTANT

to be observed as a Bank Half-holiday at Ballarat, Sebastopol, and Charlton, from the hour of Twelve noon;

WEDNESDAY AND THURSDAY THE 17TH AND 18TH MARCH INSTANT

to be observed as Bank Half-holidays at Beechworth, from the hour of Twelve noon each day. Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One

thousand eight hundred and eighty, and in the forty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.
