PUBLIC HIGHWAY IN THE TOWN OF EMERALD HILL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantion, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the county of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majestry's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the Government Cazette to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Town of Emerald Hill has requested that the street hereinafter mentioned within the Town of Emerald Hill be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the land acquired or used for the street hereinafter named and described, and situate in the Town of Emerald Hill, to be a Public Highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

THE Governor in Council has approved of the Order in Council dated 17th December 1878, and published in the Government Gazette of 3rd January 1879, being cancelled, and of the following being substituted therefor:

The following shall be the material to be used for admixture for the coloring of "mineral oils refined," which may give off an inflammable vapor at a temperature of less than 100' Fabrenheit, and in the proportion hereinafter set forth:

Alkanet Root, in the proportion of not less than 20 grains to each pint, or one ounce to every three gallons of such "mineral oils refined."

Such root is to be put into the vessels containing such oils, which shall be delivered by the Customs Officers with such material immersed therein.

Such refined mineral oils may be imported and delivered by the Customs Department upon payment of the duty chargeable thereon, or free of duty if the point of ignition is not above 80° Fahrenheit, if it shall have been duly colored prior to importation, to the satisfaction of the Landing Surveyor, by the admixture of the material and in the proportion above set forth.

SHIRE OF BELLARINE.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE UNDERMENTIONED COMMONS WITHIN THE SHIRE OF BELLARINE, VIZ.:—

DRYSDALE COMMON, PORTARLINGTON TOWN COMMON, and MOOLAP COMMON.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Bellarine, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the above-named Commons, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, such regulations, so far as the same relate to the Drysdale Common and the Portarlington Town Common, to be in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect thereof.

Ist. Ratepayers in the shire, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five miles of any of the above-named commons may respectively depasture on the common nearest to their residences four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle.

A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2nd. No person shall be permitted to graze more than four goats on the common.

3rd. The fees to be paid in advance for depasturing shall be as follow:—

For every horse, ten shillings per annum (sucklings free).
For every foal, ten shillings per annum.
For every head of horned cattle of the age of twelve months and upwards, six shillings per annum.
For every calf under twelve months old, four shillings per

annum.

For every goat, four shillings per annum.

For every sheep, eight shillings per annum.

4th. The depasturing of sheep upon the commons shall be restricted to such portions thereof respectively as may from time to time be set apart by the managers.

5th. No pigs shall be permitted to run on the commons or be depastured thereon.

6th. The year to be computed from the beginning of the quarter during which cattle, &c., are entered.

7th. The quarters to commence on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October.

ss day or April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October.

Sth. The managers shall appoint times and places for registering and branding cattle, &c., and shall give notice thereof by placard, at the nearest pound within the shire, at the branding yard, and at the office of the shire council, and shall by their herdsman attend at such times and places for the purposes aforesaid; and all persons desirous of depasturing cattle, &c., shall be in attendance with their cattle, &c., at the places and times appointed, for the purpose of assisting to brand the same, and shall bay the prescribed fees for such cattle, &c., before the same shall be branded.

[Sth. All cattle, &c., famel assisting to the same shall cattle, &c., at the places and the same shall be branded.

9th. All cattle, &c., found upon the commons not registered, and without the commons brand, shall be deemed to be trespassing thereon, and may be forthwith impounded, and all sheep, unless on such portions of the said commons as may be set apart by the managers as aforesaid, and pigs found on the commons, may be forthwith impounded, or the owners of such cattle, sheep, or pigs, &c., may be proceeded against by summons.

10th. No bull or entire horse shall be depastured on the commons without the sanction of the managers.

11th. The managers shall not be responsible for any loss or injury of or to any cattle, &c., depasturing on the commons.

12th. The managers may destroy any goats found upon the commons, unless such goats are registered and branded with the commons brand, and unless the fees for depasturing such goats be duly paid.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small, will, for the convenience of the contractor, be

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied, the contractor will be required to move them when delivery is taken. At other stations notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender, it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Telegrams will not be entertained.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality.
- 2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses be required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.
- 3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.
- 4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own accounts in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.
- 5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
- 6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.
- 7. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

 8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.
- 9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.
- 10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.
- 11.
