CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH STATUTE" ENFORCEABLE THROUGHOUT VICTORIA.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of April 1880.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the thirty-first year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health (31 Vict. No. 310, § 30), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Orders from time to time directing that the provisions thereinafter contained for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases be put in force in Victoria, or in such parts thereof or in such places therein as in such Orders respectively may be expressed; and may in like manner from time to time revoke, alter, or vary any such Order; and all Orders for any of the purposes in the now reciting section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the said Act; and all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the now reciting section shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such Order direct, and such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: And whereas diseases known as Diphtheria and Measles are prevalent in several towns in Victoria, and it is expedient that the Central Board of Health should be enabled to enforce any regulations that may appear to be necessary for preventing the spread of the said diseases: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the provisions contained in the said Act for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases be put in force in Victoria until this Order in Council shall be revoked.

And the Honorable Robert Ramsay, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
