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REGULATIONS IN REGARD TO THE IMPORTATION OF WHEAT AND EXPORTATION OF FLOUR.

ACT 43 VICT., No. 646, SECTION 9.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

Importers of wheat will be allowed to take delivery thereof without payment of duty on importation, subject to the following regulations and conditions:—

1. Any importer of wheat desirous of availing himself of these Regulations must make an application in writing to the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, submitting the names of two persons willing to become sureties to the bond, of which form is hereto annexed, in the sum of Two thousand pounds each.

2. Wheat imported under these Regulations must be specially entered and so described on the entry, as with goods entered for the warehouse, and the same number of copies of such entry, and will be treated in all respects as goods warehoused.

3. A Dr. account will be kept of all wheat entered by such importer, and all flour, bran, and pollard exported by such importer will be credited to such account, provided that a special export entry be passed for such flour, &c., to be weighed in the presence of an officer of Customs, at the expense of the applicant.

4. On the 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December, or on such other days as may be approved of by the Commissioner of Customs, a balance will be struck of all such wheat imported, or of flour, &c., exported by any approved importer; and if such flour, bran, and pollard, in the proportion of 75 per cent. of flour, and 23 per cent. of bran and pollard, for every hundred pounds of such imported wheat respectively, be exported, no import duty will be charged in respect of the wheat the equivalent of which has been so exported.

5. Provided that, in accordance with section 9 of the Act No. 646, all wheat imported by any such importer in excess of the proportion of flour, bran, and pollard as aforesaid exported shall be chargeable with the usual import duty.

Now the condition of this obligation is such that if the said _____ shall pay on demand to the Collector of Customs at the port of _____ such duty as may become payable on such wheat as may be imported by him in excess of such proportion of flour, bran, and pollard exported by him, in accordance with the provisions of any Act in force for the time being relating to the Customs, and any regulations thereunder in force for the time being; and that if the said _____ shall always comply with the provisions of such Acts and regulations, then this obligation to be void, otherwise to be and remain in full force and virtue.

REGULATIONS AUTHORIZING THE PAYMENT OF DRAWBACK ON MEAT PRESERVED IN AND EXPORTED FROM VICTORIA.

Act 43 Vict. No. 646, sec. 8.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. Any person or company engaged in the preservation of meat in Victoria from imported sheep may, on compliance with the regulations hereinafter set forth, be allowed such amount of drawback of such preserved meat as is specified.

2. Any such person or company shall give at least six working hours' notice to the Collector of Customs of the intention to export and pass the necessary export entry for any preserved meat intended for export, specifying whether beef or mutton, to be verified at the time of being passed, by the following declaration :—

I, _____, do hereby declare that I am the exporter of the preserved meat mentioned in this entry, and that the quantities and weights herein specified are correct, and that such meats were preserved in my factory situated in _____

Witness my hand this _____ day of _____ 18 _____

This should be signed by the proprietor of the factory wherein the meat has been preserved, or, if by a company, by the secretary or other person duly authorized under seal to sign on its behalf.

The entry should be sent by the collector to such drawback or other officer for verification as he may approve.

3. In respect of preserved mutton any such person or company should keep an account showing the number of imported sheep which have been purchased by such person or company, the number slaughtered and preserved, with the dates of their purchase and their being slaughtered and preserved, and shall render an abstract of such account made up for every three months ending 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December, respectively, duly verified by such person, or, in the case of a company, by the chairman and secretary of such company, subscribing to the following declaration :—

I hereby declare that the above statement, showing the number of imported sheep which have been purchased by me, the number slaughtered and preserved, and the date of their purchase and of their being slaughtered and preserved, is true and correct in every particular.

4. A drawback of $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per lb. may be paid on the actual quantity of such preserved mutton exported by any such person or company, provided always that the quantity on which such drawback may be allowed shall not exceed the proportion of 11 lbs. weight of preserved mutton exported for every imported sheep appearing in said return as having been slaughtered and preserved during the aforesaid period.

5. Any such person or company desirous of availing themselves of these regulations shall at all times furnish any information required by the Collector of Customs, or permit him, or any officer deputed by him, to have access to the books, invoices, or other documents relating to the purchase or slaughtering of sheep or cattle, and the preservation of meat, and shall afford every facility for enabling such Collector of Customs to check the claims which may be rendered by such person or company.

6. Should a special officer be, in the opinion of the Collector of Customs, required to examine and superintend the shipment of any meat for exportation, any such person or company shall, on demand by any such collector, pay for the services of such officer at the rate of 1s. 6d. per hour.

7. The claim for any drawback should be rendered for fixed periods as aforesaid, and shall be in the following form :—

No drawback will be due or payable unless the debenture be tendered duly completed; within six months after completion of any quarter to which such debenture relates, to the Collector of Customs at the port of export, nor until such drawback debenture has been examined by the proper landing surveyor and found correct by him, nor until such drawback debenture has been approved under the hand of the Collector of Customs or other officer duly authorized by the Governor in Council.

DRAWBACK REGULATIONS.

ACT 36 VICT. No. 434 AND ACT 41 VICT. Nos. 594 and 597.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the following Regulations, which are in lieu of all others hitherto in force.

REGULATIONS.

1. A drawback of duty paid on importation may be paid on the exportation of the goods mentioned in Schedule I. hereto attached, and at the rate respectively specified against any item exported.

2. In order to entitle the exporter to claim any such drawback he shall comply with the following conditions:—

Form A. (a.) A notice in the Form A hereto must be given to the Collector of Customs at the port of export, at least two working hours before, of the intention to pack.

(b.) The usual export entry must be passed (or if desired such may be deposited with the proper officer before the vessel by which the goods will eventually be shipped has been entered out, the name of the ship being subsequently filled in prior to shipment of the goods), accompanied by invoices as regards the undermentioned, distinguishing—

Goods—Frée;
 „ Liable to *ad valorem* duty, specifying the rate;
 „ Boots and Shoes;
 „ Clothing, &c., manufactured in Victoria [from material liable to duty];
 „ And all goods re-packed from original packages;

setting forth legibly in respect to each specific class of articles the actual cost price received, or to be received, from the purchaser of the goods, and in respect to boots and shoes the respective sizes, number of pairs, &c. The entry having been passed or deposited, and invoices in duplicate as required having been stamped, an officer of Customs will attend, before whom the following declaration must be made and subscribed by the exporter, or if by a firm, by a member thereof:—

“I, _____, do hereby declare that I am the exporter of the goods mentioned in this entry, that the quantities or sizes [as the case may be] are correct; and with regard to the goods on which an *ad valorem* drawback is payable, I further declare that the invoice dated _____ and signed by me represents the true value of the goods and the actual price paid to me or to be paid on the following terms _____ without any discount, rebate, or other allowance, by the purchaser thereof, trading at _____, in the colony or port of _____, under the style and title of _____; and I further declare that these goods were properly cleared at the Customs, and duty paid on importation at the rate specified in this entry, and that none of the said goods were the produce of or manufactured in Victoria, except as specified in the said invoice.”

Goods liable to a fixed rate of duty, if in original packages as imported, are always liable to examination, and cannot be shipped without the authority of the Landing Surveyor or Jerquer; but on any goods, though specified to be exported in original packages, if re-packed from the original packages in the presence of an officer, drawback may be allowed.

- (c.) Every facility, and especially any desired facility, must be given to the officer to superintend the packing of these goods and take a correct account according to such invoice.
- (d.) Upon the completion of the packing, the goods must be secured and sealed by the officers of Customs, and despatched in charge of a carrier duly licensed under the Customs laws into the Customs shed, and delivered to the custody of the export officer for shipment; or if not so forthwith removed, they must be deposited in some secure room approved by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, under the lock of the Crown, until removal.
- (e.) No claim for drawback of duty will be entertained unless the debenture in the Form B or Form C, as the case may be, be rendered duly completed with the necessary certificates thereon, unless otherwise authorized by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.
- (f.) If the exporter cannot specify the number of packages in the entry, such may be inserted, and the officer in charge is hereby required to see that such is inserted prior to the removal of the packages.
- (g.) Such proof shall be given to the Landing Surveyor or Jerquer as may be required that full duty had been paid on importation.
- (h.) Words and expressions used in these regulations and the schedules hereto shall have the meanings assigned to them respectively in any Act relating to the Customs.

3. No drawback of duty will be due or payable until the Collector of Customs at the port of export has received the drawback debenture duly completed, nor until such drawback debenture has been examined by the proper Landing Surveyor and found correct by him, nor until such drawback debenture has been approved under the hand of such Collector of Customs or other officer duly authorized by the Governor in Council.

4. No drawback will be paid unless the debenture be tendered, duly completed, within twelve months from the date of the exportation of the goods mentioned therein. Debentures, in the case of goods liable to a fixed rate of drawback, excepting with respect to goods exported across the Border, will be paid one week after the departure of the vessel by which such goods have been exported, but as regards other goods on completion of the forms herein provided.

5. No drawback will be paid unless a charge of One shilling and sixpence per hour during the time of an officer being employed under these regulations, or other expense incurred, as certified by the Landing Surveyor or Jerquer, shall have been paid.

6. Exporters of goods for drawback *via* any New South Wales or Victorian port on the River Murray must specify on the entry the name of the consignee and final destination of the goods, and at each port on the River Murray the Coastwaiter in charge will attend at his office on such day and at such hour as may be directed by public notice from the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, to pass such goods for drawback in respect to which he may have received notice on the previous day, in which case no charge will be made for the officer's attendance.

Claims for drawback under this regulation must be made to the Collector of Customs at Melbourne, who will, if they are correct, pay them at the Custom House, Melbourne, or remit the money to the claimant less the cost of remittance.

7. No drawback will be payable on goods except on packages re-packed in the presence of, or inspected by, an officer of Customs, who will in the latter case cause such to be examined, as may be directed by the Landing Surveyor or Jerquer, and certify on the entry that such has been done, specifying whether the quantities, values, weights, &c., as the case may be, were correct or not on such examination.

8. The persons before whom declarations under these regulations shall be made in Victoria shall be a justice of the peace of the said colony or an officer of Customs. The Commissioner of Trade and Customs is also hereby empowered to cause any debenture to be passed for payment though not strictly in accordance with the forms required by these regulations. Provided also that the Commissioner of Trade and Customs may, if he shall think fit, authorize the payment of claims for drawback on goods entered and exported under these regulations which may not be landed or be landed in a damaged state, upon such satisfactory proof as he may require that any such goods have been lost or damaged in consequence of shipwreck.

9. Should the consignee be unable to sign the declaration, the signature of a Custom House agent at the port of arrival, who must sign as such before the Collector of Customs, will be accepted.

10. Extra Weighers in attendance at the re-packing of goods for drawback shall be officers of Customs before whom the declarations in clause 8 may be made.

11. The attention of exporters is directed to the second section of Act No. 594, as follows:—

2. If any person shall commit any of the next following offences, namely—

Pass or attempt to pass for drawback any goods—

Not specified in any Order in Council under the provisions of the Act No. CCCCXXXIV., or
At a higher rate for drawback than is allowed under any such Order, or

At a higher value for drawback than the fair market value of such goods in Melbourne, or
As of a greater quantity or weight than appears in any invoice or entry of such goods, or
Which, on being shipped or brought to any quay, wharf, or other place to be shipped for exportation, shall on examination by the proper officers of Customs be found not to agree with the entry thereof in the shipping bill or other proper document for allowance of drawback on shipment, or to be of less value for home use than the amount of drawback claimed,

every such person shall in any and every such case forfeit the sum of One hundred pounds or treble the amount of the drawback claimed, at the election of the Commissioner, and all such goods and the package containing the same with all other the contents therein shall be forfeited.

In the event of any of the above stated offences being detected, the goods connected therewith, and also any goods included in the same package, are liable to be seized. Should the Collector of Customs desire it, any goods may be re-opened or re-examined after having been passed by the drawback officer; the unpacking or re-packing to be conducted by or at the expense of the exporter.

12. Travellers' samples may be exported for drawback, subject to the following special conditions:—

- (1.) The traveller in whose charge any such samples may be sent must be a party to the bond required.
- (2.) The declaration in the export entry and in the claim for drawback must be signed according to forms D and E respectively.
- (3.) The said traveller must, on his return to Victoria, present himself to the Landing Waiter of the vessel by which he may arrive, and submit all his luggage and baggage for examination and verification with the invoices deposited at the time of his departure.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE NAVIGATION ACT OF 1876."

His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations under the 80th and 106th sections of *The Navigation Act of 1876*.

C. HARDIE BUZACOTT.

SHIPS, whether steam ships or sailing ships, when at anchor in roadsteads or fairways, shall, between sunset and sunrise, exhibit where it can best be seen, but at a height not exceeding twenty feet above the hull, a white light in a globular lantern of eight inches in diameter, and so constructed as to show a clear, uniform, and unbroken light, visible all round the horizon, and at a distance of at least one mile.

No vessel shall anchor near or drag her anchor across the line of the Edward street or Middle Ferry, so as to injure or endanger the water-pipe between North Brisbane and Kangaroo Point, nor near the line of the Upper Ferry so as to injure or endanger the telegraph cable between Alice street and South Brisbane.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council, from time to time, to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind section 3 of chapter III of Regulations dated 1st April 1879, and doth make, in lieu thereof, the Regulation following, which shall be read as and taken to be section 3 of the said chapter III of the aforesaid Regulations: And doth further order that such rescission and regulation shall take effect on and after 1st March 1880 proximo:—

The distinction as to the charge for survey between surveyed and unsurveyed land is hereby abolished.

When surveyed lands are applied for in such a way as to necessitate another survey, the applicant shall pay cost (to be fixed by the Surveyor-General) of such modification in addition to the charge for the original survey.

Mileage fees are abolished, but whenever it shall appear that the survey of any land is exceptionally difficult or expensive, from its isolated position or any other cause, such extra charge as the Minister may deem fit shall be imposed for the survey.

The fees deposited by applicants for survey shall be paid over to the authorized surveyor, on the certificate of the Land Officer, countersigned by the Inspecting District Surveyor, when satisfied as to the accuracy of the survey.

1. Assaulting any other person.
2. Being drunk.
3. Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket match or sports or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
4. Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
5. Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
6. Behaving improperly or riotously.
7. Being found in any part of the first, second, or third divisions and not producing upon demand, or (if required) not surrendering to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to that part where such person shall be so found.
8. Obtaining admission to any part of the first, second, or third divisions when disentitled to such admission under these regulations.

12. The following is the scale of fees which shall be charged and taken for admission to the third division :—

For admission of each person to the third division during any cricket match or sports, such a sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding 2s. 6d.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and may be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

That the said baths shall be open for the use of the public during the following hours in the months of October, November, December, January, February, and March:—On week days, from 6 o'clock a.m. to 8 o'clock p.m., excepting an interval of an hour between 12 o'clock noon and 1 o'clock p.m.; and for the remaining months of the year the baths shall be opened at daylight and closed at 6 o'clock p.m., excepting on Saturdays, when they shall remain open until 8 p.m.; and on Sundays throughout the year the baths shall be open from 6 o'clock a.m. to 9 o'clock a.m.
3. That no person shall smoke in any part of the baths.
4. That no person shall use soap in the swimming baths.
5. That no person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be permitted to use the baths.
6. That no person shall deface the walls in any portion of the baths by writing or drawing thereon.
7. That no person shall use obscene language within the baths.
8. That no person shall spit in the swimming bath, or on the floor or walls of the building.
9. That the Council shall have power from time to time to regulate the fees for the baths.
10. That the Council shall have power from time to time to give such directions as they may consider necessary for the proper internal management of the baths.
11. That the Council shall have power from time to time to set apart the baths for the use of ladies.
12. That no dogs shall be allowed within the precincts of the baths.
13. That any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

BOROUGH OF STAWELL.

BYE-LAW No. 9.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Stawell, made under section 481 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 9, for the management of the Corporation Cattle Market.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Stawell order as follows:—

1. That in this Bye-law, save where there is something in the context inconsistent therewith, the word "stock" shall include horses, mares, foals, geldings, colts, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, goats, and swine. The word "inspector" shall mean the collector, or person appointed to collect the stallages, rents, or tolls authorised by "The Local Government Act 1874," and shall include the assistants of the inspector.
2. That the Cattle Market situate at and adjoining the Agricultural Reserve, within the said borough, shall be open for the reception and delivery of stock on every lawful day, from sunrise to sunset.

3. That there shall be appointed for such Cattle Market an inspector thereof, whose duty shall be as follows:—

- i. To see that the Bye-law and the provisions of "The Local Government Act 1874," relating to markets, are duly observed.
- ii. To demand and receive all market tolls and dues.
- iii. To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of the parties bringing stock to the market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient.

iv. To preserve order and cleanliness within such market, and to summarily eject therefrom any person creating a riot or disturbance, or cursing or swearing, or using any gross or indecent language, or being guilty of gross or indecent conduct therein.

4. That no person shall release any stock from the market, or remove the same from one part of the market to another, without the authority of the inspector.

5. That every person placing stock in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls, dues, and charges accruing therefor, and in no case shall any stock be taken out of the market until all tolls, dues, and charges payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied.

6. That if any stock brought to the market for sale, and not removed within twenty-four hours after the close of the market, such stock shall be provided with sufficient food by the person placing or entering them in the market for sale.

7. That the owner or agent of stock intended to be brought to the market-place for sale on every Thursday shall notify the number in writing to the inspector by 2 p.m. on the previous day, and shall be responsible for the dues payable in respect to the number of stock so notified. Provided that, if from accident or some other good and sufficient cause, a delay should arise in bringing such stock to market, the inspector shall have power of not enforcing payment of said dues and charges.

8. That all owners or agents of stock intended for sale, desiring to have the privilege of drawing lots for priority of sale, must have such stock at the yards by 7 a.m. on the morning of sale, from the 1st day of September to the 30th day of April, and by 7.30 a.m. from the 1st day of May to the 30th day of August in each year, and that all stock arriving after the hours above stated will be sold in the order of their arrival, and in no case shall the number of horned cattle in one pen exceed twelve.

9. That the inspector shall give out publicly the order of the auction sales at the hour appointed for the arrival of stock in the market.

10. That the sale by auction of sheep shall commence at 9 a.m.

11. That the sale by auction of fat lambs shall commence so soon as the sale of fat sheep by auction is concluded.

12. That the sale by auction of fat cattle shall commence at 1 p.m.

13. That the sale by auction of calves shall commence at half-past 12 p.m., provided the sale of lambs shall be then concluded.

14. That the sale by auction of store cattle shall commence so soon as the sale by auction of calves is concluded.

15. That any owner or agent withdrawing his stock from auction sale, or not being present by his auctioneer punctually to commence his auction sale, shall not be allowed to sell by auction until the remaining auction sales shall be completed.

16. That no agent or auctioneer shall be allowed to draw lots for more than 300 fat sheep or 500 store sheep, 100 fat

lams, or 20 fat cattle, in one sale, unless the property of one owner.

17. That every agent or auctioneer shall be allowed to occupy at his sale by auction at the rate of fifteen minutes for every 300 fat sheep, or for each 100 fat lambs, and 20 cattle, and should he not complete his sale at such rate of time the stock remaining unsold shall not be sold by him at auction until the completion of all other auction sales on that day.
