TREATIES OF COMMERCE AND NAVIGATION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND FRANCE.

SIR,

I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your government, a copy of a Declaration between this country and the French Government, prolonging the duration of the existing Treaties of Commerce and Navigation between Great Britain and France, which was signed at Paris on the 10th of October 1879.

DECLARATION BETWEEN THE BRITISH AND FRENCH GOVERNMENTS PROLONGING THE DURATION OF THE EXISTING TREATIES OF COMMERCE AND NAVIGATION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND FRANCE.

Signed at Paris, October 10, 1879.

THE Government of Her Britannic Majesty and the Government of the French Republic, foreseeing the case in which the commercial and maritime relations between Great Britain and France should not have been settled by fresh arrangements before the 31st December 1879, the period at which the existing Commercial Treaties and Conventions are to expire, and wishing to secure for the manufacturers and merchants of both countries a sufficient delay to conclude the operations in course of execution,—

LE Gouvernement de Sa Majesté Britannique et le Gouvernement de la République Française, prévoyant le cas où les relations commerciales et maritimes entre la Grande Bretagne et la France n'auraient pas été réglées par de nouveaux arrangements avant le 31 Décembre 1879, époque à laquelle les Traités et Conventions de Commerce actuellement existants doivent prendre fin, et désirant assurer aux industriels et aux négociants des deux pays un délai suffisant pour terminer les opérations en cours d'exécution,—

Have agreed to prolong, for a period of six months before their definitive termination, the Conventional Acts in force between Great Britain and France.

Sont convenus de proroger, pour une période de six mois avant leur cessation définitive, les Actes Conventionnels en vigueur entre la Grande Bretagne et la France.

Considering, besides, that, according to the terms of the Law passed in France on the 4th August last, which confers on the Government of the Republic the power of prolonging the Commercial Treaties and Conventions, the duration of their prolongation cannot exceed six months from the promulgation of the new General Customs Tariff submitted to the approbation of the French Chambers,—

The High Contracting Parties agree that the stipulated delay of six months shall commence from the day either anterior or posterior to the 1st January 1880, on which the new General Customs Tariff shall have been promulgated.

PART I. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normandy, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normandy, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the most distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council might by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and might define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and might revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed should extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to

HEARING OF REASONS AGAINST THE FORFEITURE OF CERTAIN LICENSES AND LEASES BY PERSONS APPOINTED UNDER 100 SECTION OF "THE LAND ACT 1869."

WHEREAS by a regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the 16th day of April 1880, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order of the 2nd of April 1880 as a site for affording access to Water in the parish of Corack, and hereinafter styled "Windmill Tank Reserve": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, having framed the following Regulations for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*—

III. For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Threepence.

2. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the said reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the Committee of Management, or their officer duly appointed.

3. No person shall climb or jump over, or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.

Every person offending against these regulations or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c.

Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labor may be required in the packing of stores.

The prices must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and total amount of tender stated.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favor of the Deputy Postmaster-General, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Deputy Postmaster-General, for the amount of the deposit required (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security will be calculated at Ten per cent. upon contracts not exceeding £1000, and at Five per cent. over that sum; but the amount will in no case exceed the deposit above stated.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Postmaster-General will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles, and such quantities of the articles, as the Postmaster-General may order from time to time; neither will the Postmaster-General be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will he be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Postmaster-General require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacturers indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality be equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery as a rule is to be of the full quantity ordered.

4. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Controller of Stores, General Post Office.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in condition 5, or the head of the department, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer named in condition 5. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Postmaster-General may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Postmaster-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized.

13. It will be competent either for the contractor on his own behalf, or for the Postmaster-General, to terminate the contract by giving notice in writing of three full calendar months to the opposite party; it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

14. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Postmaster-General or the contractor, as the case may be, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from, or increase to, the price of the item so affected.

15. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Electric Telegraph Service, or by any contracts made by the Imperial Commissariat or the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for

any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works, or the Tender Board, or on account of other Governments; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment; or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

1. 2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers as below the mail services for which they tender. Such numbers to be stated in the tender itself and endorsed on the cover enclosing the tender.

3. Every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *boni fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.
