NOTE.—The increase during the quarter by excess of births over deaths was 2,764, viz., 1,232 males and 1,532 females. WHEREAS by *The Juries Statute* 1876 (No. 560) it was amongst other things enacted that on any Court of Assize or of General Sessions or any County Court being appointed to be newly held, the Clerk of the Court of Petty Sessions held at or nearest to the Court House of such Assize, Sessions, or County Court town, and the clerks of all courts held elsewhere within the jury district of such Assize, Sessions, or County Court town, and all clerks, constables, sheriffs, and Courts of Petty Sessions should, in manner therein provided, and at and within the times and intervals which the Governor in Council should order, do, with respect to that district, all acts and things therein required to be by any clerk, constable, sheriff, or Court of Petty Sessions ordinarily done with respect

to a jury district; and all jurors' books made out under the now reciting section should be brought into use, and the persons whose names were therein set down should be liable to serve immediately after such books should have been so made out; and the said books should be used until new books should have been completed under the provisions thereinbefore contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order the undermentioned times and intervals at and within which the provisions of Part III. of the said Statute are to be carried out with respect to the Jury District of the County Court Town of Coleraine, that is to say:—

The provisions of Section 15 to be given effect to on or before Friday the 18th June instant.

The provisions of Sections 16 and 17 to be given effect to on or before Friday the 25th June instant.

The provisions of Section 19 to be given effect to on or before Wednesday the 21st July next.

The provisions of Section 20 to be given effect to on or before Saturday the 24th July next.

The provisions of Section 21 to be given effect to on or before Monday the 2nd August next, and the notice therein specified to be kept posted one day only.

The provisions of Section 22 to be given effect to before Friday the 13th August next.

"THE EXPLOSIVES ACT 1877."

EXEMPTION FROM CERTAIN PORTIONS OF THE REGULATIONS FRAMED UNDER "THE EXPLOSIVES ACT 1877."

THE Governor in Council has exempted the safety blasting powder manufactured by Messrs. Henry Charles Terry and Henry Bainbridge, whose works are situated at Back Creek, parish of Strathfieldsaye, from the operation of the following portions of the Regulations framed under *The Explosives Act* 1877, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 13th December 1878, No. 127, viz.:—

That portion of clause 4 commencing with the word "other" in the fourth line of the second paragraph, and ending with the word "building" in the eighth line thereof.

That portion of clause 8 commencing with the word "and" in the fourth line of the first paragraph, and ending with the word "thereof" in the seventh line thereof.

The whole of the first and ninth paragraphs of clause 11. And has made the following Regulation to apply only to the safety blasting powder above mentioned, in lieu of the ninth paragraph of clause 11 aforesaid, viz.:—

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Any person making a vault, grave, or tombstone, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment

of the proper charges, is entitled to have maintained and kept up such vault, grave, monument, or tombstone according to the terms of such permission to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving, to the satisfaction of the trustees, that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Orders for interment to be given at the office of the trustees; such notice to be given between the hours of Ten a.m. and Three p.m. the previous day.

6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault the consent of the party (in writing) entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

8. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

12. A plan of every monument and tombstone proposed to be erected and placed shall be exhibited to the said trustees before permission for the erection thereof is given, and the said trustees shall be at liberty to withhold such permission, and prevent the erection of any monument or tombstone which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming; and shall determine and fix the position of any monument or tombstone which may be proposed to be erected according to the description, size and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

13. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of, the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

15. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

16. It is hereby notified that any person who shall wantonly and wilfully destroy, or do, or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the said cemetery will be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, being convicted thereof, will be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £20, or, at the discretion of the justices, to imprisonment for any period not exceeding three months; and any person who shall do, or cause to be done, any injury to any such monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, whether the same be done wilfully or wantonly, or otherwise howsoever, shall be liable to pay a reasonable sum of money by way of damages and compensation, which said sum of money shall be recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction in the colony by the trustees of the said cemetery, or any person injured by such damage.

17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations.
