IMPORTATION OF STOCK INTO NEW ZEALAND.
(Notice No. 21.)

Wellington, 21th January 1880.

THE attention of intending importers of stock into New Zealand is called to the provisions of the following sections of *The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act 1873*, which required that, before any cattle shipped from any foreign port can be landed in New Zealand, the owner must produce at the port of arrival a certificate, duly attested, that such cattle were free from any infectious or contagious disease when shipped :-

"6. From and after the 1st day of April, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, no cattle shipped to New Zealand from any foreign district shall be landed in New Zealand unless the owner of such cattle shall produce to the cattle inspector at the port or place in New Zealand where the same shall arrive a certificate in writing, signed by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon, to the effect that such cattle were inspected and examined by him immediately before shipment, and that they were at the time of such examination and shipment free from any contagious or infectious disease whatever, and which would be likely to propagate amongst men or animals any such contagious or infectious disease, or any other disease.

"7. Every such certificate of inspection and examination shall be attested before a justice of the peace or a notary public.

"Every such certificate so attested before a justice of the peace or a notary public as aforesaid shall, for all purposes, be receivable in the colony as sufficient evidence of compliance with the provisions of this Act by any such owner as aforesaid."

Cattle inspectors at the various ports have been instructed to strictly enforce the provisions of the Act above referred to.

The word "cattle," as interpreted by the Act, includes horses, sheep, goats, and swine.

RULE AND REGULATION FOR THE CARLTON GARDENS.

WHEREAS it is enacted by *The Victorian Exhibitions Act 1878* that a public Exhibition of works of industry and art shall be held in Melbourne in the year 1880: And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that the Governor in Council may from time to time appoint or remove such persons as he may think fit to be Exhibition Commissioners, one of whom he shall appoint to be President, and that on such appointment such Commissioners shall for the purposes of the said Act be a body politic and corporate by the name of the "Exhibition Commissioners": And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that the land described in the first schedule thereto, known as Carlton Gardens, shall be used for the said Exhibition of 1880, and that the Commissioners appointed to act in respect of such Exhibition shall have the exclusive possession and control of the said land until the 30th day of September 1881: And whereas it is further provided that the said Commissioners, or a majority of them, at any general meeting assembled, shall have power from time to time to make, repeal, alter, and re-enact such rules and regulations as they may think fit for the purpose of providing for, among other things, the temporary admission or exclusion of the public, or any individual to and from the Exhibition, or buildings, or grounds, or any part thereof, and the behaviour to be observed therein; and it is therein declared that every person who shall be guilty of a breach or contravention of any such rules or regulations shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds: And whereas His Excellency the Most Honorable the Marquis of Normanby, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, did, under his hand and the seal of the colony, on the 20th day of March 1879, appoint certain persons to be Commissioners for the said Exhibition of 1880, and did also appoint one of them to be the President: Now, therefore, a majority of the said Commissioners have, at a general meeting assembled on the 13th day of February 1880, made the following rule and regulation :-

Any person who lights or assists in lighting any match, paper, wood, straw, or any other combustible material on the grounds or in the buildings of the Commission, except by the direction of the Commission, and any person who is found using any lighted pipe or open light on the ground or in the buildings, shall be liable to prosecution for a breach of this regulation.

LIGHT AT POVERTY BAY, EAST COAST OF NORTH ISLAND, NEW ZEALAND.

NOTICE is hereby given that, on and after the night of Thursday the 1st day of July next, a light will be shown from the Flagstaff at the west side of the entrance to the Turanganui River, Poverty Bay. The light will be a fixed red light, and will be elevated about 38 feet above high-water mark. SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD.—"SKINNER'S TANK RESERVE."

Regulations fixing the amount to be paid by persons using or carrying away Water from the reserve for affording access to water in the parish of Wooronook, known as "Skinner's Tank Reserve," and for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve.

WHEREAS by a regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the 26th day of April 1880, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by order of the 2nd of February 1880 as a site for affording access to water in the parish of Wooronook, and hereinafter styled "Skinner's Tank Reserve": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud having framed the following Regulations for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

Regulations.

1. Every person using or carrying away water from "Skinner's Tank Reserve" shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the Committee of Management in that behalf, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—

I. For one hogshead of water taken away in any one day, Sixpence.

II. For every hogshead of water after the first hogshead taken away in any one day, One shilling.

III. For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Threepence.

2. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the said reserve, any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals without the written authority of the Committee of Management, or their officer duly appointed.

3. No person shall climb or jump over or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.

Every person offending against these Regulations, or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and willfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

TALLYGAROPNA COMMON.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the Management of the Tallygaroopna Common.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the Managers of the Tallygaroopna Common having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common.

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licensees, carriers' licensees, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles of the above-named common may depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle shall be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle.

A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock upon the common shall be as follow, viz. —

For every horse	6s. per annum.
For every head of large cattle	5s. "
For every sheep or goat	5s. "

Such fees shall be payable half-yearly in advance to the herdsman, the half-years to terminate on March 31st and September 30th.

3. All licenses applied for during the currency of a term will be charged the full rate, but, in case of the removal of any stock already licensed, an equivalent number will be allowed to be

placed in their stead for the unexpired term of the license, provided that the licensee deliver to the herdsman in writing an account of the number and description of the same.

4. Before any cattle are turned out upon the common, they shall be duly registered and given into the hands of the herdsman, who will be in attendance at the mustering yards.

5. No cattle will be allowed to be turned out unless the same are marked with the proper brands of the person registering, and with the common brand in pitch or tar.

6. It shall be the duty of all persons using the common to assist at the bi-annual mustering, or in default pay 6d. for every head they may have turned out.

7. Any person turning out more cattle than he has registered will be liable, at the discretion of the managers, to have his license cancelled.

8. No entire horses or bulls over (6) six months old will be allowed on the common without the consent in writing of the managers.

9. No person shall remove cattle, horses, sheep, or goats from the common without first applying to the herdsman.

10. All cattle suspected to be diseased shall be removed by the owners within twenty-four hours after notice to do so has been served upon them, and, in default of compliance with such notice, the managers shall have power to destroy such cattle at the cost of the owner or owners thereof.

11. The managers will not be held responsible for any neglect or irregularity of the herdsman.

12. Any stock put on the common will be entirely at the risk of the owners, and must be the *bona fide* property of the persons registering the same.

13. The term "cattle" shall mean and include horses and other animals.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.
