**REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE PAYMENT OF
DRAWBACK ON BEEF PRESERVED IN AND
EXPORTED FROM VICTORIA.**

Act 43 Vict. No. 646, sec. 8.

THE Governor in Council, in pursuance of the power and authority conferred by *The Duties of Customs Act 1877*, No. 646, sec. 8, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. Any person or company engaged in the preparation in Victoria of beef from cattle imported into Victoria, on compliance with these regulations, will be allowed a drawback on the exportation of preserved beef, and such drawback shall be allowed on an amount of preserved beef bearing such proportion to the total amount of preserved beef exported by such person or company as the total number of cattle imported into Victoria may bear to the total number of cattle sold in the Melbourne market for slaughtering purposes during the quarter of the year in respect of which such drawback is claimed; and the amount of such drawback shall be at the rate of Five shillings on every three hundred pounds weight of the amount of preserved beef in respect of which the drawback will be allowed as hereinbefore provided.

2. Notice in writing of the intention to export any such preserved beef shall be given to the Collector of Customs at least six working hours before making the entry hereinafter mentioned.

3. The exporter of any such preserved beef shall then pass the necessary export entry for the same, which shall be verified by a declaration to be made by the proprietor of the factory wherein such beef shall have been preserved, or, if by a company, by the secretary or other person duly authorized under seal to make such declaration, in the form or to the effect following :—

I do hereby declare that I am the exporter of the preserved beef mentioned in this entry, and that the quantities and weight herein specified are correct, and that such beef was preserved in my factory situated at _____ in the colony of Victoria.

Witness my hand this _____ day of _____ 188 .

Such entry shall then be sent by the Collector to such officer as he may direct for inspection.

4. Any such person or company shall keep an account showing the number of quarters of beef purchased by him or them, and the weight thereof, as also the number of pounds weight of beef preserved or exported by him or them, and shall also render to the Collector of Customs an abstract of such account made up to the end of the respective months of March, June, September, and December in each year, and verify the same by a declaration made by such person, or the chairman and secretary of such company, in the following form :—

I hereby declare the above statement to be true and correct in every particular to the best of my knowledge and belief.

5. Any such person or company desirous of availing themselves of these regulations shall at all times furnish any information required by the Collector of Customs, or permit him, or any officer deputed by him, to have access to the books, invoices, or other documents relating to the purchase or slaughtering of cattle and the preservation of beef, and shall afford every facility for enabling such Collector of Customs to check any claim made by such person or company.

6. Should a special officer, in the opinion of the Collector of Customs, be required to examine and superintend the shipment of any beef for exportation, any such person or company shall, on

demand made by any such collector, pay for the services of such officer at the rate of 1s. 6d. per hour.

7. The claim for any drawback must be rendered for fixed periods as aforesaid, and shall be in the following form :—

MERCHANT SEAMEN DESERTERS—GREAT BRITAIN AND GERMANY.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your government, a copy of an agreement between the Governments of Great Britain and Germany, for the mutual surrender of merchant seamen deserters, together with a copy of the Order of the Queen in Council of the 18th of March giving effect to the agreement.

AGREEMENT between the Governments of Great Britain and Germany relative to Merchant Seamen Deserters.

Signed at London, 5th November 1879.

THE Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of His Majesty the German Emperor, King of Prussia, being desirous, for the benefit of the commerce of the two countries, to facilitate the discovery, apprehension, and surrender of seamen who may desert from merchant vessels of either country, on the basis of a full and entire reciprocity, have agreed as follows:—

It is mutually agreed that if any seamen or apprentices, not being slaves, should desert from any ship belonging to a subject of either of the Contracting Parties, within any port in the territories or in the possessions or colonies of the other Contracting Party, the authorities of such port and territory, possession or colony, shall be bound to give every assistance in their power for the apprehension and sending on board of such deserters, on application to that effect being made to them by the Consul of the country to which the ship of the deserter may belong, or by the deputy or representative of the Consul.

It is understood that the preceding stipulations shall not apply to subjects of the country where the desertion shall take place.

Each of the two High Contracting Parties reserves to itself the right of terminating this Agreement at any time, on giving to the other a year's notice of its wish to that effect.

In witness whereof the Undersigned have signed the present Agreement, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the "Foreign Deserters Act," 1852, it is provided that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to a subject of such Power when within Her Majesty's dominions shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications (if any) as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas it hath been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen (not being German subjects) who desert from British merchant ships in the territories belonging to His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of Germany will be given under an Agreement between the Governments of Great Britain and Germany signed at London on the 5th November 1879:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act," 1852, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette* seamen, not being slaves (and not being British subjects), who desert from merchant ships belonging to subjects of the Emperor of Germany within Her Majesty's dominions shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships; provided always, that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent Court, and until his sentence (if any) has been fully carried into effect.

And Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act," 1852, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is further pleased to order and declare that, upon and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, the Order in Council made, by virtue of the said Act, on the 16th day of October 1852, and published in the *London Gazette* on the 20th day of October 1852, so far as it relates to seamen who desert from merchant ships belonging to citizens of the Free Hanseatic Cities of Lubeck, Bremen, and Hamburg, and the Order in Council relating to seamen who desert from the merchant ships belonging to subjects of the King of Prussia, made by virtue of the said Act, on the 16th day of October 1852, and published in the *London Gazette* on the 26th day of October 1852, and the Order in Council relating to seamen who desert from the merchant ships belonging to subjects of the Grand Duke of Oldenburg, made, by virtue of the said Act, on the 13th day of June 1853, and published in the *London Gazette* on the 14th day of June 1853, and the Order in Council relating to seamen who desert from the merchant ships belonging to subjects of the Grand Duke of Mecklenburg-Schwerin, made, by virtue of the said Act, on the 9th day of March 1854, and published in the *London Gazette* on the 10th day of March 1854, and the Order in Council relating to seamen who desert from the merchant ships belonging to subjects of the King of Hanover, made, by virtue of the said Act, on the 8th day of June 1854, and published in the *London Gazette* on the 13th day of June 1854, shall be revoked, and the same are hereby revoked accordingly.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India, in Council, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE BLENDING OF COLONIAL WINES IN BOND FOR EXPORTATION.

Act 43 Vict. No. 646, sec. 10.

THE following Regulations have been approved by the Governor in Council.

- REGULATIONS.
- Persons desirous of blending colonial wines for exportation should apply to the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, in writing, specifying the premises wherein they propose to blend such wines, and submitting the names of two persons willing to become sureties with the applicant to a bond of £2000 in the form hereto annexed.
 - The premises in question shall consist of an apartment securely partitioned off from any other building, or portion of a building, by brick or stone, or by wood lined with iron, and the doors properly secured with bars, &c., to the satisfaction of the proper officer; or, if in a store already appointed for bonding purposes, the partition may be of lattice-work or boards not less than 3-inch thick.
 - Wine imported from, and being the produce of, other Australian colonies may be entered for such warehouse as may be approved by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or such wine may be removed from any other bonding warehouse thereto, subject to the usual regulations. A correct stock account in gallons shall be kept by the officer in charge of such warehouse of wine placed therein and of wine exported therefrom.
 - Wine the produce of Victoria may be placed in such warehouse, but a correct account must be kept of the number of gallons of such wine so taken in, and, in stock-taking, the quantity so introduced will be allowed for in the account.
 - Any such wines may be bottled into reputed quarts and pints, but no labels nor seals shall be used except such as are specially permitted by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.
 - Stock shall be taken at the end of every six months, and, on any deficiency in gallons then found to exist (after allowing for the quantity of Victorian wines placed in the warehouse and for any loss or waste which have been inspected and allowed by the landing surveyor), duty shall be paid forthwith, unless otherwise accounted for to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Customs.
 - Should the premises be in any bonding warehouse the Commissioner of Customs may dispense with the attendance of any special officer; but, if a special officer is required, the fee payable shall be at the rate of 1s. 6d. per hour or for any hour before Eight a.m. or after Four p.m. Should the premises be separate from any bonding warehouse, the fee shall be at the rate of £160 per annum, payable quarterly in advance.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

From that time storage will be charged, and strictly enforced, at the rate of One penny per bale per diem until the wool is removed by the consignee, or sent to store by the department at the consignee's cost and risk. All wool is carried at owner's risk as to condition, and will be signed for accordingly. If detailed weight lists are furnished by the department for the use of consignees, the charge for weighing will be Fourpence per bale; if weighed by the owners, One penny per bale will be charged for the use of the scales. Consignors requiring weight lists must pay for same at sending station. Rebate sheets must be rendered within two months of date on which wool is consigned, or no claim will be recognised.

All previous wool rates are now cancelled.

LAKE BULOKE COMMON.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined amendment of clauses 5 and 11 of the Regulations for the management of the Lake Buloke Common within the Shire of St. Arnaud.

WHEREAS in pursuance of chapter XIII. of the regulation made under *The Land Act 1869* by the Governor in Council, on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, as managers of the Lake Buloke Common, in the parish of Witchipool, did submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval certain Regulations for the management of the said common; and whereas such Regulations, having been revised by the Board of Land and Works, were approved by the Governor in Council on the 17th day of June 1873; and whereas, among other matters, clause 5 of the Regulations was as follows :—

"The herdsman of the common shall be in attendance at a place to be named on the seven days immediately preceding the first day of each quarter, for the purpose of registering cattle and receiving the fees thereon; and due notice of such attendance, and the time and place thereof, shall be given by the managers."

And clause 11 of the Regulations was as follows :—

"All stock on which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid within ten days after date for renewal of license will be impounded."

Now, therefore, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, as managers of the said Lake Buloke Common, considering it necessary for the proper working of the said common, submit the following amendment of clauses 5 and 11 of the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works for approval :—

"5. The herdsman of the common shall be in attendance at a place to be named on the first Tuesday in each quarter, for the purpose of registering cattle and receiving the fees thereon; and due notice of such attendance, and the time and place thereof, shall be given by the managers."

"11. All stock upon which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid within two days after date for renewal of license will be impounded."

The foregoing amendment of clauses 5 and 11 of the Regulations for the management of the Lake Buloke Common was made and approved by the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud this 3rd day of June 1880.

HOUTMAN'S ROCKS NEAR CHAMPION BAY, AND ISLANDS IN SHARKS BAY.

THE Government of Western Australia invites tenders from persons desirous of obtaining the right to remove guano from the group of islands known as Houtman's Rocks, and from the islands in Sharks Bay. Such tenders must be sent in to the Surveyor-General, Perth, Western Australia, on or before the 1st October next, but the Government does not bind itself to accept the highest or any tender.

2. Tenders may be made for all the guano on the islands in Sharks Bay, and on the islands forming the group called Houtman's Rocks, together or separately, and may specify for a lump sum to be paid in advance annually, for the right to remove some given quantity within a time to be agreed upon.

3. The contractor will be required, within twenty-one days after receiving a notification that his tender is accepted, and before the issue of any license, to deposit in the hands of the Western Australian Government 10 per cent. on the value tendered for, as security for the due performance of the contract, and this sum will be retained by the Government until the ter-

mination of the contract. The contractor will at no time be at liberty to remove any guano unless the royalty agreed upon has been paid.

4. All the vessels employed must be provided with a license issued under the authority of the Colonial Act 40th Victoria, No. 9, and such may be obtained through the Collector of Customs at Fremantle, or the Government Resident at Geraldton.

5. The contractor will be at liberty to erect on any or all of the islands any buildings, jetties, tramways, &c., and, subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed as to forfeiture, to remove the same at any time within six months of the termination of the contract.

The contract to be entered into in pursuance of this notice shall be deemed to commence on the date of acceptance of tender.

6. Each tender, unless otherwise expressed, shall be deemed to be open to acceptance by the Government, for the space of fourteen days from the 1st October; and the Government shall be at liberty to accept any tender by notifying to the person making it, by telegraph, that his tender is accepted. Any person who shall tender, and, on his tender being accepted, shall fail to deposit the 10 per cent. as hereinbefore set forth in paragraph 3, shall be deemed to have broken his contract, and the Government shall thereupon be at liberty to accept any other tender, and to hold such person responsible for all loss consequent on his breach of contract.

7. Tenders will also be received for the removal of guano, on payment of royalties, to be calculated as under :—

The quantity of guano taken by each ship on which royalty has to be paid shall be ascertained by adding 25 per cent. to the registered tonnage of timber-built ships, and 40 per cent. to the registered tonnage of iron-built ships; provided that, if the captain or agent of any ship, or the Government, shall in any instance be dissatisfied with the foregoing arrangement, the ship shall be exactly measured according to Lloyds', and the number of cubical feet so ascertained divided by 40 shall be taken to be the tonnage capacity of the ship.

8. The attached reports give the information in the possession of Government respecting the islands alluded to in this notice, but no guarantee will be given as to the quantity or quality of the guano existing on either or any of the islands alluded to, and the beds of guano shall be worked in a regular and systematic manner, in accordance with instructions that may from time to time be issued by the Government. All guano removed will be at the contractor's risk after payment of the royalty agreed upon.

9. In case of any breach of the conditions mutually agreed upon, the contract or contracts will be deemed to be at an end, and the agreement null and void, and any money paid, on account of licenses or otherwise, forfeited, and in such case the Government reserves the right of taking such proceedings against the contractor as the law provides.

10. Further particulars can be obtained, and charts of the islands seen, at the Survey Office, Perth; at the Customs House, Fremantle; or at the Office of the Government Resident at Geraldton.

Report on Houtman's Rocks, by Capt. W. E. Archdeacon, R.N., Admiralty Surveyor.

The chart of the "Houtman Rock," and sailing directions referring thereto, published by the Admiralty, are so explicit as to enable the cautious mariner to approach and enter the anchorages with implicit confidence.

The anchorages thoroughly surveyed were Recruit and Good Friday Bays and Batavia Roads.

The two former are perfectly accessible and safe at all seasons. The space in Recruit Bay is, however, very limited; that in Good Friday Bay is very commodious and suitable for vessels of any draft.

Batavia Roads can only be used as a temporary anchorage, and to load guano from the south end of Pelsart Island or from islets in its vicinity the vessels would have to anchor inside "Pelsart Lagoon" (or the space between Mangrove and Square Islets), from which anchorage the guano deposits appear to be some five miles distant; cargo boats or other small craft could, however, work at all seasons between the anchorage and adjacent islets, the outer and continuous reefs rendering perfect protection from any sea.

The chart and sailing directions compiled from the surveys of two of the ablest surveyors in H.M. Service should be sufficient to satisfy Lloyds' agent, or any careful shipmaster, as to safety of these anchorages.

The opinion of the Government Resident, Champion Bay, is that :—

The Admiralty chart of the Houtman's Rocks is so clear that a master ought to have no difficulty in taking his vessel by it in any part of the group.
