DISTILLATION ACT 1862.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of the 71st section of *The Distillation Act 1862*, has directed the adoption of the following method of ascertaining, by means of an improved instrument called a "Revenue Testing Distillation Apparatus," the quantity of alcohol according to the standard of proof contained in any wines, spirits, or fermented liquor, holding in solution any article which prevents the true strength from being ascertained, viz. :—A liquid quantity of any of them may be taken for examination, and the alcohol extracted therefrom by means of the improved instrument referred to; that such extract shall then be mixed with pure water until it becomes in volume equal to the original quantity operated upon, and that the strength of such volume, when tested by Sykes's Hydrometer, shall be deemed to be the true strength or percentage according to the standard of proof contained in such wine, spirits, or fermented liquor, as the case may be.
