VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by The Public Works Scante 1865, doth hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing the charges on goods carried on the Melbourne Junction Railway, that is to

say:—
Goods of the First, Second, Third, and Fourth, and Miscellaneous Classes, as shown in the goods Classification and Tariff dated 18th October 1878, consigned from Stations on the Gippsland line to Stations on the other Main lines and their branches, and circ versa, shall, in addition to the through mileage rates shown in the said Goods Classification and Tariff, be charged 1s. per ton for conveyance between Princes Bridge and Spencer street, or vice versa.

Goods of the Special and Agricultural Produce Classes, Hay and Straw, Sawn Timber and Firewood, shall be charged 6d. per ton additional, with a minimum of 2s. 6d. per truck.

Sheep, Cattle, or Pigs, and Horses. 2s. 6d. per truck in addition to the Live Stock Rates in Bye-law dated 18th October 1878. Wool, 1d. per bale in addition to rates in Bye-law dated 4th August 1879.

Returned Empties which are charged at so much each in the Goods Classification and Tariff of 18th October 1878 to be charged as follows, viz. :—Crates and Pipes, 2d. each additional; Puncheons, Hogsheads, Quarter-casks and Barrels, Kegs, Tubs, and Demijohns, 1d. each additional.

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council: Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Fisherics Act Amendment Act 1878 it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, might add to the names of the species of fish mentioned in the second schedule to The Fisheries Act 1873, the names of any other species of fish, and set opposite thereto any weight which might be deemed expedient: Now therefore I,

The births of 762 children, viz., 377 boys and 385 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of December. In the month of November 682 births were registered, or 80 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in December numbered 438, viz., 212 of males and 226 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 321. The deaths were more than those in November by 76, but were less than the average of December during the previous ten years by 33; and if, moreover, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been 88 less than the average of those ten years.

^{*} In cases where the minus sign (-) is prefixed to any number it implies that the deaths exceeded the births by that number.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 98.0° on the 18th, and the lowest was 46.1° on the 9th. The mean temperature of the month (62.4°) was nearly one and a half degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (36.5°) took place on the 17th, viz., from a maximum of 87.5° to a minimum of 10°. The least range (7.5°) was on the 11th, viz., from a maximum of 64.1° to a minimum of 56.6°. The mean daily range was 20.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.766 inches) was below the average.

Deaths of males during the month were in the proportion of 48 per cent., those of females in the proportion of 52 per cent. to the total mortality. This is only the third time within the last ten years that the deaths of females in any month exceeded the deaths of males. Deaths of children who had not attained the age of 5 years averaged 46 per cent. as against 48 per cent. in December 1878; 50 per cent. in December 1876; 46 per cent. in December 1876; 45 per cent. in December 1873; 55 per cent. in December 1873; 55 per cent. in December 1873; 55 per cent. in December 1873; 57 per cent. in December 1873; 58 per cent. in December 1874; 48 per cent. in December 1878; 59 per cent. in December 1879; and 58 per cent. in December 1879; and 58 per cent. in December 1879; and

The deaths of 17 persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month. The following are the particulars:—A retired civil servant, aged 75, died of cystitis; a female aged 75, of ileus; a female, aged 75, of hepatitis; two females, aged 76 and 77, of cancer; a farmer, aged 77, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 77, of penumonia; a gardener, aged 79, of hepatitis; a farmer, aged 80, and a female, aged 80, of bronchitis; a female, aged 76, a waiter, aged 77, a female, aged 79, a farmer and a female, each aged 80, and a female, aged 88, of old age.

Twenty-five deaths from violent causes were registered during the month, of which 19 are ascribed to accident, 2 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. Of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 3, died from injuries caused by a fall from the tower of the Emerald Hill Town Hall; a boy, aged 8, and a laborer, aged 40, died of fracture of the spine, the result of falls; a laborer, aged 70, died of injury to the hand, also the result of a fall; a laborer, aged 26, died of fracture of the spine, caused by the branch of a tree falling on him; a fireman, aged 32, died of fracture of the the interpolate of the skull, through being jammed in the machinery of the Golden Crown; a laborer, aged 70, died of fracture of the tenur; a female child, aged 1, died of scalds; a boy, aged 5, and a female, aged 46, were burned to death; a seamstress, aged 66, died of the effects of lead poisoning; a female child, aged 1, was drowned in a tub of water; a boy, aged 6, another, aged 41, an assistant draper, aged 19, a woolsorter, aged 35, and a female, aged 41, were accidentally drowned; a gentleman, aged 51, and an artist, aged 61, were found drowned, the latter in the River Yarra. The homicidal deaths were those of a male and of a female infant, who were sufficated at birth. Of the suicidal deaths:—A storeman, aged 54, poisoned himself with an acid; a bootmaker and an hotelkeeper, aged 34, drowned themselves whilst laboring under temporary insanity; and a tailor, aged 20, hanged himself in his cell at Pentridge.

Eighty-one deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—35 in the Melbourne Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Alfred Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in Hospital, 3 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 9 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 1 in the Protestant Orphanage.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 202, of which 90, or 45 per cent., were of males, and 112, or 55 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 155 were under one year of age, 29 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 236. Of these, 122, or 52 per cent., were males, and 114, or 48 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 14 were between twenty and twenty-five, 14 were between twenty-five and thirty, 17 were between thirty and thirty-five, 16 were between thirty-five and forty, 15 were between forty-five and fivty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 24 were between fity-five and sixty, 15 were between sixty and sixty-five, 15 were between sixty-five and seventy, 10 were between seventy and seventy-five, 11 were between seventy and 6 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases increased from 67 in November to 104 in the month under notice. This increase was chiefly due to diarrhoza, which, as is usual in the summer months, was, in point of fatality, the most prominent of all diseases, causing 42 deaths as against only 12 in November. Deaths from whooping-cough and typhoid fever also show increases of 9 and 7 respectively in December as compared with the previous month.

During the year 1879 the number of births registered in Melbourne and suburbs amounted to 8,829, and the number of deaths to 5,006, being in the proportions of 34.43 births and 19.87 deaths to every 1,000 of the living population. The gain to the population of the district by excess of births over deaths was 3,733 as against 3,518 in 1878, 2,985 in 1877, 2,806 in 1876, and 1,910 in 1875.

I HAVE the honor, by direction of His Excellency the Minister of Foreign Affairs at the Hague, to inform you that fresh regulations have been issued by His Excellency the Governor-General of Netherlands-India for the prevention of the introduction of containing disease.

have been issued by His Excellency the Governor-General of Netherlands-India for the prevention of the introduction of contagious diseases.

All vessels and men-of-war, on board of which contagious diseases exist, shall, on arrival at a port in the Netherlands East-India, show a yellow flag at the fore truck or at the head of the fore-royal mast, and in the event of no such flag being on board the national flag to be hoisted instead.

Should a boat have to be sent, such boat shall carry a yellow flag or the national flag at the bow.

All men-of-war, merchant vessels, boats, &c., carrying the yellow flag, or the national flag as aforesaid, shall have no communication with the shore, nor with any ship or boat; shall await the visit of the authorities, and conform to the quarantine regulations, on penalty of fines ranging from 100 francs (£8 6s. 8d.) to 5000 francs (£416 13s. 4d. sterling), payment of which may be enforced by the seizure and sale of ship and cargo, or by holding such ship and cargo as security until the money shall be paid.

It is also further enacted that all vessels coming from a country beyond the Netherlands-Indian Archipelago shall, on their arrival at a port of the Netherlands East-Indies, produce a bill of health granted or stamped by the consular officer or his substitute at the port of departure. A copy of the regulations drawn up with respect to the bills of health I have the honor to enclose.

Provisions for the prevention of importation of contagious diseases into the Netherland East-Indies.

THE decree of the 21st of February 1879 (official journal, No. 99) has enacted new provisions for the prevention of importation of contagious diseases into the Netherland East-Indies. In virtue of the 23rd article of that decree, of which you will find a copy enclosed, the regulations hereafter mentioned have been drawn up with respect to the bills of health, with which every vessel must be provided.

Art. 1. Vessels coming from a country beyond the Netherland-Indian Archipelago shall, on their arrival at a port of the Netherland East-Indies, only be allowed to communicate with the shore if they have an authorization of the commander of the guardship, or, if no such vessel is stationed there, of the harbormaster.

Art. 2. Masters of vessels shall produce before the authorities.

Art. 2. Masters of vessels shall produce before the authorities mentioned in art. 1, and before the physician referred to in art. 5 of the decree of the 21st of February 1879 (O. J. 1879, No. 99), a bill of health granted or vised by the Consular Officer or his substitute in the port of departure,

Art. 3. Masters of vessels are not allowed to deliver up their bill of health until their arrival at the ultimate port of destination.

Art. 4. If a vessel touches at a port during her voyage, the Netherland consular officer residing there, or his substitute, shall affix a visa on the bill of health, which has been granted to the master at the port of departure, and at the same time state the sanitary condition of the first-named port. That officer shall also mention whether the vessel has been allowed to pratique or not.

Neither the consular officer nor his substitute, nor any medical authority, is allowed to keep back the bill in question or to grant another instead of it.

Art. 5. Every vessel shall have one bill of health and no more. Art. 6. A bill of health shall only be valid if it has been granted within the 48 hours preceding the departure of the vessel.

Art. 7. Every vessel referred to in art. 1, and which has not a bill of health, or is provided with a foul one, will, on arrival at a port of the Netherland East-Indies, be subjected to the prescriptions of the decree above named, having in view to prevent the introduction of contagious diseases into the Netherland East-Indies. Eluders of these regulations will be prosecuted according to them.

Art. 8. No physician being on board, the master shall render to the medical officer mentioned in art. 2 all information required about the cases of disease on board, and also about the other events at sea, that may be of influence on the general sanitary condition.

Art. 9. Vessels navigating between the ports of Singapore or Penang and a port of the Netherland East-Indies need not have

a bill of health, unless the port of departure or the port touched at has been declared infected by contagious disease.

The consular officers are requested to observe these regulations carefully, and to communicate them to masters of vessels and to all other persons whom they may concern.

SINGAPORE ROCE, K ISLANDS AND OUTLYING DANGERS, ROCKS OFF CAPE CONWAY, AND REEFS IN REPULSE BAY.

OFF CAPE CONWAY, AND REEFS IN REPULSE BAY.

THE following information relative to Singapore Rock, the K Islands, and outlying dangers, Rocks off Cape Conway, and Reefs in Repulse Bay, has been supplied by Staff Commander Bedwell, R.N., the Admiralty Surveyor.

Singapore Rock.—This danger, which is of very small extent, uncovers at ordinary spring tides, and lies half-a-mile south of the west point of L I Isles.

There are from 9 to 18 fathoms close to.

Clearing mark.—Linné Peak, seen through the passage or gap between M. Isles on a N.W. ½ N. bearing, leads two-thirds of a mile outside Singapore Rock.

K 1 Isle (Peak) and outlying dangers.—East 12 miles from K 1 Island lies a rock 3 feet above high-water springs, and nearly in the passage between these is another rock, uncovering at low-water neaps.

K 1 Isla (I'ent) and outlying dangers.—East 12 miles from K 1 Island lies a rock 3 feet above high-water springs, and nearly in the passage between these is another rock, uncovering, at low-water neaps.

This latter danger bears E. by S. \(\frac{1}{2} \) S., \(\frac{1}{2} \) miles from the Peak. There are 17 to 28 fathoms round these dangers.

A dangerous reef, nearly 4 miles in circumference, with 3 feet of water on its shallowest parts, and 21 to 29 fathoms close around, exists 16 miles E. \(\frac{1}{2} \) N. from K 1 Island.

E. by N. \(\frac{1}{2} \) N. \(\frac{1}{2} \) Miles from K 1 Island is another dangerous reef about 3 cables in extent, which covers at a quarter flood, with 20 to 30 fathoms within a cable's length. The detached reef shown on the chart, learning E. by N. \(\frac{1}{2} \) N. \(\frac{1}{2} \) N. \(\frac{1}{2} \) Miles from K 1 Island, may possibly be intended for this latter danger.

The shoal shown as sand and rocks on the Admiralty charts, bearing E. by N. \(\frac{1}{2} \) Miles from K Island, was found to be a low sandy cay of small extent, covering at H.w. neaps, forming the northern edge of a coral reef 1 mile in circumference. It bears E. \(\frac{1}{2} \) N. \(\frac{1}{2} \) miles from K Island, the old position baing 3 miles too far to the N.E. There are from 25 to 30 fathoms close to the edge of this reef.

K \(\frac{1}{4} \) Island, about 2 cables in extent and 93 feet high, with a few bushes on the summit, was found to be 1 mile E.N.E. of the position assigned to it on the charts. It bears E.N.E. distant 9\) miles from K Island.

This islet lies at the western edge of a large encircling coral reef, covering at quarter flood, 6 miles in circumference, the north extreme of which is 1\(\frac{1}{2} \) mile north of the islet. On the same reef and near the western edge, \(\frac{1}{2} \) of a mile north of K \(\frac{1}{2} \) Island, as how bushy islet not shown on the chart. It is fronted by a white sandy beach.

K 2 (Hummocky) is steep to all round, and the encircling dangers shown on the published charts do not exist.

Three Rocks are also steep to, and the reef reported half-a-mile off their N.W. extreme does not exist. There are from 13 to 23 fathoms close round these rocks. The dry sand marked on the chart as having been seen by Captain Flinders in 1802 is 6½ miles W.S.W. of its true position.

It covers at half-flood, and lies at the northern edge of a coral reef half-a-mile in extent, with from 16 to 29 fathoms close to.

Cape Conway and Repulse Bay.—Half-a-mile E.N.E. of Cape Conway, and 4 cables S.E. of the rock to the N.E. of the Cape, is a small rock awash at low-water neaps, with 11 and 12 fathoms close to the outer edge.

A quarter of a mile south of the Cape is another detached rock covering at half-flood. ½ miles south of Cape Conway, close to soundings of 15 fathoms on the chart, is a shoal of 3 fathoms; its vicinity is marked by strong tide rips.

At a distance of 5 miles N.W. of North Repulse Island, and somewhat less than a mile from the shore, are two reefs covering at half-flood, with from 3 to 5 fathoms close to.

3. No person shall carry firearms through the gardens, or shoot, snare, or destroy any wild fowl, either in the gardens, or in or on any water adjacent thereto, or bathe within such distance from such gardens as shall be fixed by any regulation of the council to be made on that behalf in such water.

4. No cart or other vehicle used for the conveyance of goods shall, without the authority of the proper officer of the council, be driven through the gardens.

5. Such plants, seeds, or cuttings as are commonly purchaseable at nurseries in Victoria, shall not be supplied from the gardens to any person unless in exchange, or for public institutions, or benevolent purposes.

6. No visitor shall interrupt the gardeners or laborers by conversation or otherwise.

7. Children under the age of ten years, not being under the control of some competent person, shall be removed from the gardenes.

8. All dogs and goats, and all poultry, found within the

8. All dogs and goats, and all poultry, found within the gardens shall be destroyed, and the owners shall make compensation, to be recovered before any justice, for any damage

done.

9. In addition to the provisions herein contained, it shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make such regulations for the proper maintenance and management of the gardens as shall seem to them fit.
