SHIRES OF RUTHERGLEN AND CHILTERN.

TRANSFER OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act* 1874 (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 39th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:-

The petitioners are seventeen in number, and purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Rutherglen which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Rutherglen and attached to that of Chiltern.

Area described in the petition :-

"Commencing at the junction of the Indigo Creek with the boundary of Rutherglen and Chiltern Shires; thence westward by the said boundary to the south west corner of allotment 32, sec. C, Parish of Gooramadda; thence direct north to the Murray River; thence eastward along that river to the western boundary of the Shire of Yackandandah and the Indigo Creek; thence southward along that creek and the western boundary of the Shire of Yackandandah to the point of commencement."

Petitioners state that the area they represent is continuous with the Shire of Chiltern, that their interests are closely connected with the towns of Chiltern and Barnawartha, and the railway stations at those places make it more convenient to transact their business at said towns. That the roads through the area referred to would be better and more thoroughly maintained if under the control of the Chiltern Shire, thereby assisting the memorialists to their markets.

"Your petitioners therefore pray that Your Excellency in Council may be pleased to exercise the powers conferred on you by sub-section 5 of section 19 of *The Local Government Act* 1874, by severing the above area from the Shire of Rutherglen and attaching the same to the Shire of Chiltern."

PROPOSED ANNEXATION OF AN OUTLYING DISTRICT TO A SHIRE.

IN accordance with the provisions of *The Local Government Act* 1874 (No. 506, § 46) the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which have been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:-

The petition is under the common seal of the Council of the Shire of Howqua, and sets forth that the council is desirous that the outlying district hereunder described, which forms with the shire one continuous area, may be annexed to the Lauraville and Howqua Ridings of the Shire of Howqua, in accordance with sections 19 (6), and 39 (4) of *The Local Government Act* 1874.

Area described in Petition.

Commencing at the Bald Hills, north-west of Wood's Point; thence west to the 146 degree east longitude; thence south by that degree to the boundary of the Buln Buln and Narracan shires; thence following the boundary of Narracan Shire to Mount Baw-Baw; thence by a line to the south-west corner of the municipality of Wood's Point; thence following the west and north boundaries of said municipality to its north-east corner; thence in a direct line to Mount Selma; thence by a direct line to Mount Howitt, and thence following the boundary of the Shire of Mansfield westerly to its junction with the boundary of the Shire of Howqua.

The petitioners pray as follows :-

"That Your Excellency in Council may be pleased to exercise the powers conferred on you by sub-section 5 of section 19 of the *Local Government Act* 1874, by annexing to the shire of Howqua the outlying territory herebefore described and prayed for."

AUSTRALIA.—EAST COAST.

(1.) *Fixed Light on Crowdy Head and discontinuance of Manning River Head Light.*

THE Government of New South Wales has given Notice that, on 1st December 1879, a light was exhibited on Crowdy Head, north-eastward of Harrington Inlet:—

The light is a *fixed* white light, visible in all directions seaward, but is masked over Mermaid Reef and from that reef to the land northward; it should be seen in clear weather from a distance of about 11 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses of the fourth order.

Position approximate, latitude 31° 51' 10" S., longitude 152° 46' 0" E.

Also, that on the exhibition of Crowdy Head Light, the light previously shown from the pilot station on the north side of entrance to Harrington Inlet (Manning River), was discontinued.

NEW ZEALAND.—MIDDLE ISLAND.—COOK STRAIT.

(2.) *Harbor Light at Wairau River entrance.*

The Government of New Zealand has given Notice that, on 21st January 1880, a harbor light would be exhibited from the flagstaff at the western side of Wairau River entrance, Cloudy Bay:—

The light is a *fixed* white light of the sixth order, elevated 38 feet above high-water, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of about 11 miles.

MIDDLE ISLAND.—WEST COAST.—DUSKY SOUND.

(3.) *Reported Sunken Rock in Nine-fathom Passage.*

Also, of the existence of a sunken rock in Nine-fathom Passage, between Cooper Island and the mainland.

This rock is reported by Mr. Garrard, commanding the steam vessel *Albion*, to lie about 30 yards from the shore of the mainland.

AUSTRALIA.—EAST COAST.—GREAT SANDY STRAIT.

(1.) *Leading Lights on Inskip Point.*

The Queensland Government has given Notice that on 10th January 1880 two leading lights would be exhibited from the western end of Inskip Point, south side of southern entrance to Great Sandy Strait:—

The low light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 10 feet above high-water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 6 miles.

Position, latitude 25° 48' 30" S., longitude 153° 4' 5" E.

The high light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 43 feet above high-water, and should be visible 9 miles; it bears S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. from the low light, distance 417 yards.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors.
NOTE.—These lights kept in line bearing S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. lead through Wide Bay Harbor and up to the Fairway Buoy.

(2.) *Mary River Entrance—Leading Lights at the Quarantine Station.*

Also that, on 10th January 1880, two leading lights would be exhibited from the Quarantine Station, near the White Cliffs, Tyroon Road:—

The low light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 30 feet above high-water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 8 miles.

Position, latitude 25° 24' 20" S., longitude 153° 2' 5" E.

The high light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 80 feet above high-water, and should be visible from a distance of 9 miles; it bears N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. from the low light, distant 460 yards.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors.

NOTE.—These lights kept in line bearing N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. lead northward of the Middle Bank Buoy and to Mary River Entrance. (The bearings are magnetic. Variation 9½° easterly in 1880.)

AUSTRALIA.—SOUTH COAST.—GULF OF ST. VINCENT.

Port Adelaide—Exhibition of Beacon Lights.

The Government of South Australia has given Notice that, on 1st March 1880, twelve gas lights would be exhibited from beacons erected in Port Adelaide Creek. Vessels bound in must leave them all on the starboard hand.

DIRECTIONS.—Vessels approaching the outer bar and entering Port Adelaide at night should bring the outer beacon (No. 12) to bear N.E. by E. This course will lead over the outer bar in not less than 18 feet at low-water, and clear of Gloucester Bank Buoy. After passing Gloucester Bank Buoy, a course should be shaped to pass No. 12 Beacon, at the distance of a quarter of a cable; the other beacons can then be passed at a reasonable distance.

CAUTION.—Masters of ships should not attempt to enter at night without a pilot, unless they are well acquainted with the navigation, and then great care must be exercised, as some of the lights may be extinguished.

(The bearing is magnetic. Variation 5½° easterly in 1880.)
