DISTRICTS WHERE PUBLICANS' LICENSES MAY BE SPECIALLY GRANTED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the districts hereinafter mentioned to be districts where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

1. The area within a radius of three-quarters of a mile from the Railway Station at Arcadia.
2. The place known by the name of Delvin, on the main road from Sale to Bairnsdale.
3. The parish of Buchan.
4. One mile square at the junction of the Glenlee road and Main Adelaide road, in the parish of Gerang Gerung.
5. Allotment 43A, in the parish of Kellalac, county of Borung, near Kellalac Bridge.
6. Paynesville, comprising land to the east of the road between lots 142, 136, 133, and 143, 140 and 137, parish of Bairnsdale.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twentieth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and in the forty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE EDUCATION ACT 1872."

THE Governor in Council has directed that the first portion of Subdivision IX. of the Regulations made in pursuance of *The Education Act 1872* (sec. 18), and the first paragraph of the said subdivision, be read as follows:—

The Minister of Public Instruction will annually award Exhibitions to eleven scholars of State Schools, in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned:—

1. Exhibitions will be selected upon competitive Examinations held during the last three months of the preceding year. No competitor will be permitted to attend the Examination without having produced a certificate of birth, showing that he will not have completed his fifteenth year before the first day of January succeeding the Examination; and no competitor will be selected unless he shall at the same date have been during the two years immediately preceding continuously on the rolls of, and in attendance at, a State School.

At Edam (Java North Coast, Bay of Batavia) a white fixed light of the second order shall burn from this day, every night from sunset till sunrise.

It is elevated 172 feet above the level of the sea and illuminates the whole horizon, except where it is eclipsed by the islands in the bay.

In clear weather, with the eye 15 feet above the water, it may be seen at a distance of 17 miles (4½ geographical miles).

The temporary red light on Alkmaar Island (Bay of Batavia) will be discontinued on the 28th March.

Rules and Regulations.

- 1st. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.
- 2nd. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, upon an order of a justice under Act 310, or on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the cost and charges.
- 3rd. The name, age, date, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
- 4th. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

5th. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary, at the office of the trustees; such notice to be given between the hours of ten a.m. and four o'clock p.m. the previous day.

6th. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the directions of a surveyor appointed by the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7th. Any person making a vault or erection, and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules and upon the payment of the charges hereinafter mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault or monument or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their heirs representative for ever.

8th. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees, when a certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on the payment of the proper charges.

9th. All monuments, vaults, or graves, and tombstones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10th. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed, without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees; and no fencing, tombstone, monument, or tablet allowed without the grave being purchased.

11th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab stone, slate, or iron.

12th. A plan or drawing of every stone, pedestal, tomb, monument, or tablet proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 8th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

13th. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14th. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.

15th. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, will be kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule; and register of all grants are kept by the secretary.

16th. Unless otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from ten o'clock a.m. to six o'clock p.m. Any other time, extra charge will be made.

17th. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by law. *The Cemeteries Statute 1864.*

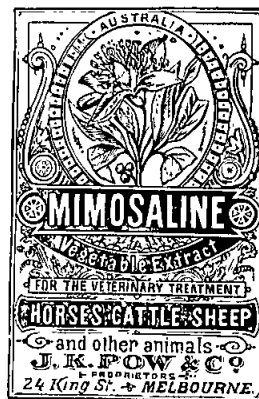
