PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Hor Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

With EREAS by The Licensing Act 1876 (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advise of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the districts hereinafter mentioned to be districts where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:

1. The area within a radius of three-quarters of a mile from

2. The place known by the name of Delvin, on the main road from Sale to Bairnsdale.

3. The parish of Buchan.

4. One mile square at the junction of the Glenlee road and Main Adelaide road, in the parish of Gerang Gerung.

5. Allotment 43a, in the parish of Gerang Gerung.

6. Paynesville, comprising land to the east of the road between lots 142, 136, 138, and 148, 140 and 137, parish of Bairnsdale.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE EDUCATION ACT 1872."

THE Governor in Council has directed that the first portion of Subdivision IX. of the Regulations made in pursuance of The Education Act 1872 (sec. 18), and the first paragraph of the said subdivision, be read as follows:—

The Minister of Public Instruction will annually award Exhibitions to eleven scholars of State Schools, in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned:—

1. Exhibitioners will be selected upon competitive Examinations held during the last three months of the preceding year. No competitor will be permitted to attend the Examination without having produced a certificate of birth, showing that he will not have completed his fifteenth year before the first day of January succeeding the Examination; and no competitor will be selected unless he shall at the same date have been during the two years immediately preceding continuously on the rolls of, and in attendance at, a State School.

In clear weather, with the eye 15 feet above the water, it may be seen at a distance of 17 miles $(4\frac{1}{4}$ geographical miles).


